The teams split a series at Somerset from Apr. 8-13 and then the Patriots took five-of-six games in a split series from July 1-6. Somerset leads the season-series 9-4 after going 10-8 in 2024.

The Somerset Patriots edged the Reading Fightin Phils 7-6 in 11 innings on Tuesday morning. Somerset took an early 1-0 lead in the first, but Reading quickly he contense t actions eaged the recaming Fighth Films 7-6 in 11 minings on fuestary morning, somerset took an early 1-0 feat in the first, but reading quickly tied it. The teams traded runs through the middle innings, with Dylan Jasso collecting two sac flies for the Patriots and Caleb Ricketts hitting a game-tying homer for Reading in the 8th. Tied 4-4 after nine, both teams scored in the 10th. Somerset regained the lead in the 11th on an RBI single by Brendan Jones and a double from Jace Avina. Reading cut the lead to 7-6 in the bottom half, but Felix Reyes struck out to end the game, sealing the Patriots' extra-innings win. The Fightin Phils committed five errors in the loss, their most in a game since committing six on Apr. 30, 2024, when they had six.

Eastern League Honors for Felix Reyes
Major League Baseball announced on Monday that Felix Reyes was named the Eastern League Player of the Week. This came after Reyes was tabbed as the league's Player of the Month for August last Thursday. Over six games at Hartford last week, Reyes slashed .423/.429/.692 (1.121 OPS), while adding three runs, 11 hits, two doubles, one triple, one home run and 12 RBI. Reyes had a hit in all six games, including three multi-hit games and a three-hit contest on Sept. 3, He also drove in a season-high five runs last Wednesday and added four RBI on Saturday. Reyes now has a RBI in six-straight games. Entering play today, Reyes holds the following Eastern League ranks: 1st AVG (.339), 9th RBI (63), 5th OBP (.369), 1st SLG (.571), 1st OPS (.940), 3rd hits (120), 1st 2B (32), T-1st XBH (50) and 1st TB (202). Last Wednesday, Reyes became the 23rd Fightin Phil all time to have 30-or-more doubles in a season and he leads the league in two baggers. The last R-Phil to lead the league in doubles was Darick Hall (38) in 2019. It's happened five times sine 1967.

Felix Reyes is on track to win the Eastern League batting title this season, as his .339 average leads second place in the Eastern League by 33 points. He also leads all of Double-A and is first amongst all of Minor League Baseball in batting average for the season. Reyes' .339 average would be the third highest single-season batting average in R-Phils history. The last R-Phil to win an Eastern League batting title was Tagg Bozied in 2010. A R-Phil has won a batting title four times, dating back to 1967.

Miller on the Way Up

One year and six days after joining the Fightin Phils, Phillies No. 2 Prospect Aidan Miller was promoted to Lehigh Valley (AAA) on Tuesday. Miller finished his time with Reading red-hot. Since August 1 (28 games), Miller slashed .361/.485/.630 (1.115 OPS), with 31 runs, 14 doubles, five home runs, 18 RBI and 15 stolen bases. The Phillies No. 2 prospect had 12 multi-hit games over that stretch, including four three-hit contests. At the time of his promotion, Miller's Eastern League ranks were: 3rd OBP (.382), 8th OPS (.809), 10th hits (105), T-7th 2B (25), 1st BB (73), kh XBH (40), T-9th TB (173), 2nd runs (74) and 1st SB (52). With his 52 stolen bases, Miller is the eighth player in franchise history to steal 50-or-more bags in a season and sits at 7th all-time in single-season stolen bases. He was the first R-Phil since Jose Leiva in 1987 to steal 50+ bases in a season. Miller currently leads the Eastern League and Phillies organization in stolen bases. The last time an R-Phil led the Eastern League in stolen bases was Anderson Machado (49) in 2003. Since 1967, four Reading players have finished the vear leading the league in stolen bases. year leading the league in stolen bases.

New Faces in Baseballtown

The Philadelphia Phillies have promoted outfield prospects Dante Nori and Aroon Escobar to the Double-A Reading Fightin Phils from High-A Jersey Shore. Nori, 20, appeared in 120 games this season between Clearwater and Jersey Shore, slashing .262/.363/.381 with 63 runs, 16 doubles, 11 triples, four home runs, 43 RBI, and 50 stolen bases. The 2024 first-round pick ranks among Phillies minor leaguers in hits (2nd), triples (1st), walks (1st), and steals (2nd). Escobar, also 20, batted .274/.366/.420 across 115 games between Clearwater and Jersey Shore, collecting 80 runs, 15 homers, 61 RBI, and 24 stolen bases. At the time of his promotions, both players ranked among the Florida State League leaders in multiple offensive categories. Escobar, originally from Venezuela, signed with the Phillies as an international free agent in 2022 and has quickly become one of the system's top performers, ranking top five among all Phillies minor leaguers in average, homers, RBI, runs, and total bases. Both Nori and Escobar have been standouts at every level they've played in this season and now bring their strong offensive production to Reading as they continue their development in Double-A.

Sup Somerset

Somerset enters play today with a 71-62 record and 36-28 mark in the second half. The Patriots are 3.5 games up on Hartford for the final Northeast Divison Playoff Spot and have a magic number of two. Somerset has won six games in a row after sweeping New Hampshire at home last week. The Patriots roster has 10 of the Yankees' top-30 prospects: George Lombard Jr. (1), Carlos Lagrange (2), Elmer Rodriguez-Cruz (5), Ben Hess (6), Chase Hampton (8), Brock Selvidge (10), Kyle Carr (13), Brendan Jones (15), Dylan Jasso (23) and Jace Avina (24).

Righty, and Yankees' No. 6 prospect, Ben Hess makes the start tonight for Somerset. Over six starts with the Patriots, Hess is 3-1, with a 2.93 ERA (10 ER, 30.2 IP), along with 39 strikeouts (11.45 SO/9.0 IP). Hess allowed one run over five innings last Thursday against New Hampshire, with seven strikeouts in a win. Hess began the season with Hudson Valley (A+) and went 4-3, with a 3.51 ERA over 15 starts, along with 94 strikeouts in 66.2 IP (12.69 SO/9.0 IP). The Yankees selected the 23-year old in the first round (26th overall) in 2024 out of Alabama, where he piched from 2022-24.
