TODAY'S HEADLINES

YESTERDAY'S RESULT - The St. Paul Saints got two defensive assists and catcher Caleb Hamilton threw out a base stealer and another trying to advance on a ball in the dirt. Jose Miranda and Mark Contreras added home runs in a 7-4 victory over the Louisville Bats.

LEADOFF LEADER: Jose Miranda led off the April 6 game at Louisville with a home run. It was the third time Miranda led off the game with a home run for the Saints. The Saints have led off the first inning with a home run on five occasions in franchise history. Rob Refsnyder (May 5, 2021 @ Omaha) and JT Riddle (June 4, 2021 in Game 1 at Louisville) also accomplished the feat. Miranda last homered to lead off a game with a home in the second to last game of 2021, September 3, at Toledo.

WE'RE #1: The St. Paul Saints spent exactly one day in first place in 2021. By winning the first two games of 2022 the Saints spent more days in first within the first two games of the season than they did in all of 2021.

RUN BABY RUN- The St. Paul Saints swiped three bases on April 4 @ Louisville as Gilberto Celestino, Royce Lewis, and Jake Cave all stole second. The three steals tied the franchise record, which they accomplished four times in a nine inning game in 2021.

WE COULD GET USED TO THIS: The St. Paul Saints played their first ever game in the month of April on Opening Night, April 4. Prior to the April 4 game, the earliest the Saints had ever started the season dating back to their franchises beginning in 1993, was May 5, 2021. The Saints beat the Louisville Bats 3-2 to win their first ever April game.

NINE IS JUST AS FINE: The St. Paul Saints played six games in Louisville in 2021. They won just two of them, sweeping a doubleheader in which both games were seven inning contests. The four losses were all nine inning games. The Saints win on April 4, was the first nine inning victory over Louisville at Louisville Slugger Field

F-R-I-G-I-D - The Saints are almost assuredly going to break the record for coldest start to a game. Last season their coldest start on the road was 48 degrees on May 28 at Iowa. Their coldest start at home: a balmy 61 degrees done twice, the last on September 24 against, who else, Iowa.

The Ultimate Sacrifice: The St. Paul Saints had the fewest sacrifice bunts in Triple-A in 2021 with one. That came 105 games into the season on September 5 at Columbus by Drew Stankiewicz. Overall, the Minnesota Twins organization had the fewest sacrifice bunts among the 30 Minor League systems with 12.

Top Talent in the Twin Cities - The Saints Opening Day Roster features six of the top 30 prospects in the Twins' system according to MLB Pipeline. The first, third, 17th, 19th, 24th, and 30th best prospects in the organization are: IF Royce Lewis, IF Jose Miranda, RHP Cole Sands, RHP Drew Strotman, Jovani Moran, and IF Jermaine Palacios, respectively.

Twins Update - This is the first time in the 30 year existence of the Saints that they will begin their season before the Minnesota Twins. Traditionally starting in May (or even June in the early days) as an Independent franchise, the Saints began last season on May 4, while the Twins were already a month into their 2021 year. The Twins open the 2022 season on April 7 at home vs. Seattle Mariners.

WHAT'S IN A NAME: The pitching staff could be known as the "Middle Name Club." with more than a couple of guys going by their middle name. Bryson Cole Sands is his given name, but Bryson goes by his middle name of Cole.

FAMILY AFFAIR: The Sands Family are Seminole people. Dad, David, attended Florida State and set the stage for his sons. Cole's brother, Carson, was committed to Florida State before being selected in the fourth round of the 2014 draft by the Chicago Cubs. Carson played four seasons in the Cubs organization, reaching as high as Single-A South Bend, before injuries derailed his career.

OMAHA BOUND: Cole was part of the 2017 Florida State Seminoles team that made it to the College World Series in Omaha. It was the first time since 2012 that the Seminoles reached Omaha, the longest drought since they went in 2000 and not again since 2008. The Seminoles couldn't figure out LSU, however, losing the first game of the tournament to the Tigers, 5-4, then beat Cal State Fullerton, 6-4, before bowing out with their second loss to LSU, 7-4.

RELAXING ON THE SANDS ON THE RIVERFRONT: The city of Wichita had an Independent Professional Baseball team in the Wichita Wingnuts from 2008-2018. They played their games at historic Lawrence-Dumont Stadium, built in 2012 and held the national NBC Tournament. The city decided it wanted an affiliated team and built Riverfront Stadium. They were originally scheduled to be the Triple-A affiliate of the Miami Marlins in 2020, but the pandemic shut down the season. Minor League Baseball then reorganized everything in 2021 and Wichita now was home to the Twins Double-A team. They opened the ballpark on May 11, 2021, a game Cole Sands would get the start in. He went 4.0 innings allowing two runs on three hits while walking two and striking out five. He left in a 2-2 game, but the Amarillo Sod Poodles (Arizona Diamondbacks) scored a run in the seventh to defeat Wichita 3-2 and ruin the ballparks opener. No worries, though, as Wichita went 34-26 at Riverfront Stadium in 2021.

IT'S NOT EASY BEING GREEN: Entering the 2022 season, Sands has only pitched in 37 games (36 starts). That's the fewest games pitched by anyone on the Saints pitching staff. That included Jordan Gore, who wasn't converted to a full-time pitcher until last season. Gore has pitched in 43 games, 39 in 2021 (he threw in one game as position player in 2018 and three in 2019).

AN INCREMENTAL RISE: At the 2021 midseason Cole was ranked 16th in the Twins organization according to Baseball America. To begin the 2022 season he has climbed smack dab in the middle of the Top 30, as he starts 2022 as the 15th ranked Twins prospect, 9th best pitching prospect, and 8th best right-handed pitching prospect in the organization.

MONDAY, ONE DAY, TUESDAY, TWO DAY, WEDNESDAY, HUH, WHAT DAY?: The third day of the week is one that Cole cared about in 2021. As a matter of fact, Cole LOVED pitching on Wednesday. In his four starts on Wednesday he didn't give up a run in 14.1 innings pitched while walking six and striking out 21 while opponents hit .106 against him. Of course, if you average that out it's about 3.5 innings per start, not long enough to earn a decision. Coincidentally, Sands' record on Wednesday last year was 0-0.

3-0 NO NO: Over the course of 334 batters faced in 2021, Sands only went 3-0 on a hitter seven times. He walked six of those hitters and retired the other batter. When Sands got ahead in the count hitters were hitting just .162 against him, .250 when he fell behind.
