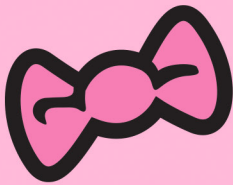

SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the SeaWolves, 10-5, in the finale of a three-game series for their first series loss at CarMax Park this season. **Jack Payton** gave Richmond a 1-0 lead with an RBI single in the second. The Senators scored five in the third to pull ahead. In the fifth, **Trevor Cohen** scored on a wild pitch to close the score to 5-2. **Sabin Ceballos** and **Maui Ahuna** brought in runs with groundouts in the eighth to cut the deficit to 5-4. Josue Briceno hit a grand slam for the SeaWolves to extend the lead to 10-4. **Gavin Kilen** singled in a run in the bottom of the ninth. **Logan Martin** pitched 2.1 scoreless innings.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels continue a nine-game homestand with the first of six games against the Hartford Yard Goats, Double-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies. Richmond won four-of-five in Hartford from April 14-18 and the series finale on April 19 was canceled. This series is the first of three consecutive home sets for Richmond against opponents from the Northeast Division.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 54-34 record is the best in team history through 88 games, passing a 53-35 record in 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split six and lost three so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 26-27 in their last 53 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 54 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 27 of them. In 18 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 10 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in each home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has three wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie and has the Eastern League's best overall record this season. Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.270) and sacrifice flies (37) this season and rank tied for second in doubles (170) and third in hits (799). The team has combined for 97 homers this year, surpassing 10 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, stolen bases, OBP, SLG, OPS, sacrifice flies and hit by pitches. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown eight shutouts this season, which is tied for first in the Eastern League and tied for second in Double-A. At 32-13, the Flying Squirrels have the second-best home record in MiLB this season, trailing only High-A Bowling Green (32-9).

THE YARD GOATS won the Northeast Division's first-half title with a 39-29 record, 2.5 games ahead of second-place Somerset. The Yard Goats will appear in the Eastern League playoffs for the second time in franchise history and the second time in the last three seasons. Hartford's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Rockies prospects, including RHP Jackson Cox (No. 8), LHP Griffin Herring (No. 12), 2B Roc Riggio (No. 15) and C Cole Messina (No. 23). MLB.com's top-30 Rockies prospects list features five Hartford players, including Herring (No. 9), Riggio (No. 10), Cox (No. 19), Messina (No. 21) and LHP Konner Eaton (No. 25).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Greg Farone** makes his 18th Double-A start and his second against the Yard Goats. In his last start on July 9 at Altoona, he picked up his second straight win, allowing one run over five innings. He threw six scoreless innings in a win at Harrisburg in his previous start on July 3. Farone is 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA (1 ER/11.0 IP) in two starts this month. He faced the Yard Goats on April 15 in Hartford and allowed four runs over 2.2 innings in a no-decision. Farone was Richmond's Opening Day starter on April 4 at Erie in his Double-A debut and allowed one run over 4.2 innings. He had eight strikeouts, tying the franchise record for the most strikeouts on Opening Day. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene. He made 12 starts for San Jose, going 2-1 with a 3.73 ERA. At the time of his promotion in June, he ranked third in the California League in strikeouts (73). Farone closed the year with 11 starts at High-A, going 4-2 with a 4.25 ERA. Farone began his college career at Herkimer College in New York, where he led the team to the program's first NJCAA national title in 2022, going 7-0 with a 1.65 ERA and was named the NJCAA Division III Player of the Year and MVP of the World Series. He transferred to the University of Louisville for the 2023 season and pitched at the University of Alabama in 2024 before being selected by the Giants in the seventh round of that year's MLB Draft. **For more on Farone, see page two.**

FOR HARTFORD: Right-hander Connor Staine makes his 16th start of the season and the third of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched on July 8 against Binghamton and allowed one run over five innings in a win, his first winning decision since May 28. Staine was the starting pitcher for Hartford in the final game at The Diamond on September 14, 2025, and allowed two runs over 6.1 innings. He also faced the Flying Squirrels on April 14 in Hartford and allowed five runs over three innings in a loss. For his career against the Flying Squirrels, Staine is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (7 ER/9.1 IP). Staine was selected by the Rockies in the fifth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of the University of Central Florida. He is in his second season with Hartford.

THE NEW GUYS: The Flying Squirrels added three players from High-A Eugene on Friday for their Double-A debuts: **Gavin Kilen**, **Dakota Jordan** and **Trevor Cohen**. Kilen, who was the 13th-overall pick in last summer's MLB Draft, was leading the Northwest League in doubles (27) and also ranked tied for second in extra-base hits (37), fourth in total bases (144), tied for fourth in hits (88), eighth in batting average (.282) and tied for eighth in runs scored (49). Jordan led the Northwest League in RBIs (66), extra-base hits (41) and total bases (171) and ranked tied for first in homers (18), second in SLG (.533), second in hits (93), third in doubles (22), fifth in batting average (.290), fifth in OPS (.879) and seventh in runs (50). Cohen led the league in hits (97) and runs (72) and ranked second in doubles (26), third in stolen bases (26), fourth in batting average (.297), tied for fourth in walks (48), sixth in total bases (136), seventh in extra-base hits (31) and eighth in OBP (.387).

JACK ATTACK: In his last 28 games since June 5, **Jack Payton** is batting .356 (36-for-101) with a homer, five doubles, a triple, 10 RBIs, nine walks and 12 runs scored. He has 10 multi-hit performances in his last 26 games dating back to June 9, including seven two-hit games and three three-hit games.

GO, DIEGO, GO! In his last 15 games since June 28, **Diego Velasquez** is batting .447 (21-for-47) with a homer, three doubles, eight walks, seven RBIs and four stolen bases. Since joining the Flying Squirrels in July 2024, Velasquez has played 244 games. In Richmond's franchise history, Velasquez ranks second in sacrifices (19), third in walks (119), sixth in OBP (.373, min. 400 PA), tied for fourth in stolen bases (40) and sixth in hits (240).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 314 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is sixth in batting average (.296) and sixth in OBP (.386). **Bo Davidson** is third in homers (19), sixth in RBIs (54), tied for seventh in total bases (147) and eighth in SLG (.521). **Parks Harber** is tied for sixth in doubles (20), ninth in batting average (.284) and 10th in OPS (.879). **Jonah Cox** is first in triples (5) and tied for fifth in stolen bases (27). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for first in saves (12). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1), sixth in ERA (4.04) and tied for fifth in BAA (.228). **Cesar Perdomo** is first in WHIP (1.11), first in BAA (.216), fifth in ERA (3.98) and seventh in strikeouts (89).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Dakota Jordan** (No. 7), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 8), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 9), **Yunior Marte** (No. 19) and **Diego Velasquez** (No. 29). **Adrian Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 4), Jordan (No. 5), Cohen (No. 8), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 18) and Marte (No. 25).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1969: The Richmond Braves beat the Louisville Colonels, 2-1, at Parker Field. Jack Damaska hit a bases-loaded single in the bottom of the ninth. Darrell Evans drove in Richmond's first run with a homer in the first inning. The second scheduled game was rained out. **1971:** The Richmond Braves beat the Louisville Colonels, 8-3, at Parker Field. Richmond trailed, 2-0, until Dusty Baker hit a three-run homer in the fifth inning. Louisville tied the score, 3-3, in the top of the seventh. Richmond scored five runs in the bottom of the seventh, starting with a go-ahead double by Baker. **2000:** The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens. In Game 1, Richmond won, 8-7, in the completion of a suspended game. Richmond won the second game, 4-3. Trailing, 3-1, in the seventh, Mark DeRosa tied the game with a two-out, two-run triple and scored the walk-off winning run on a single by Wes Helms. **2013:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 6-5, in 11 innings. Down, 5-2, entering the ninth, Jarrett Parker tied the score with a homer. Brett Krill won it with a walk-off single in the 11th. Parker finished the game with three hits.
