Desde Temprano

Bryce Mayer and the Corpus Christi Hooks (22-25) got off to a hot start Wednesday night against the San Antonio Missions (18-29) and never looked back as a Joseph Sullivan two-run shot in the first inning and four stolen bases led to an 11-3 Hooks rout over the Missions.

Dos y Dos

Carson Tucker recorded 2 hits and 2 RBIs last night, making it his 10th multi-hit effort but just his 2nd multi-RBI game. Tucker leads the Missions with his .305 batting average, good enough for 4th in the Texas League.

Orale Dugy

Luis Verdugo reached all 4 times he came to the plate last night with 2 hits and 2 walks. After hitting .178 last year with a .257 OBP, he is hitting .238 with a .319 OBP.

De Los Mejores

The Missions have two hitters in the top 5 for batting average in the Texas League. Carson Tucker is 4th (.305) and Ethan Salas is 5th (.303).

Sigue Impresionando

Ethan Salas, the No. 52 prospect in baseball according to MLB Pipeline, hit his team-best 7th home run on Tuesday, a two-run shot that broke a 0-0 tie in the 6th. He also leads the team in RBIs (26). It took Salas 34 games to hit his 1st Missions homer, but he now has 7 in his last 26 games.

El Calendario Cambio

May has been kind to the Missions' offense. The Missions are hitting .264 with a .744 OPS as they've hit 40 doubles and 20 home runs while scoring 107 runs in 23 games this month (4.65 R/G). In April, they hit .221 as a team with 33 doubles, 14 home runs and just 80 runs in 24 games (3.33 R/G).

Una Racha Buena

San Antonio's 187 runs are the 2nd-fewest Double-A baseball, and their 34 home runs are tied for the fewest. However, over the last 20 games, they have scored 93 runs (4.65/game) and hit 16 homers. They have also recorded nine or more hits 8 times. They have gone 11-9 during this stretch.

Han Tenido Oportunidades

Even though San Antonio's 187 runs are the 2nd-fewest in Double-A baseball, they've left 355 runners on base, the 2nd most at the level. On the year, their .206 batting average with runners in scoring position ranks second-worst in Double-A. Last night, the Missions left 8 men on base and went 2-9 with runners in scoring position.

Un Mayo Magnifico

22-year-old Victor Lizarraga starts for San Antonio. Lizarraga is 2-4 with a 5.55 ERA in 9 games (7 starts) with 21 walks and 29 strikeouts in 35.2 innings. Lizarraga is coming off back-to-back 6 inning outings, and he allowed 1 run on 7 hits with 1 walk and 5 strikeouts against Frisco. Lizarraga picked up 2 consecutive wins out of the bullpen piggybacking MLB All-Star Lucas Giolito, going 5 scoreless innings on May 5 and winning with 3 innings of 1-run ball on May 10. In the month of May, Lizarraga is 2-1 with a 1.35 ERA allowing just 3 runs in 20 innings with 4 walks and 16 strikeouts. The righty has spent much of the past two seasons with the Missions, going 9-16 in 46 games (44 starts). Last year, Lizarraga went 4-10 with a 6.21 ERA in San Antonio before wrapping up the year with two solid starts at Triple-A El Paso, going five innings both times and allowing just one earned run in each start. Lizarraga was born in San Diego, but grew up in Tijuana, Mexico, and signed with the Padres for \$1 million while just 17-year-old. This will be the 11th time Lizarraga faces the Hooks. He is 3-2 with a 3.96 ERA with 19 walks and 43 strikeouts in 38.2 innings.

Buscando Rebote

24-year-old James Hicks gets the start for the Hooks. The Conway, Arkansas native started on Opening Day for the Hooks. He is 2-4 with a 5.59 ERA in 8 starts with 14 walks and 34 strikeouts in 38.2 innings. He is coming off his worst start, allowed 8 runs (7 earned) on 11 hits in 5 innings with 1 walk and 8 strikeouts against Midland last Thursday. Hicks spent all of 2025 with the Hooks, going 1-5 with a 5.59 ERA in 11 games (10 starts) with just 14 walks and 46 strikeouts. Hicks went on the Injured List in April and didn't return until August after fracturing his forearm when a line drive hit him on the mound. Hicks did pitch in the Arizona Fall League, winning pitcher of the year with 19 strikeouts in 14 scoreless innings. MLB Pipeline ranks Hicks as the No. 13 prospect in the Houston Astros system. The Astros drafted Hicks in the 13th round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of South Carolina, though he began his career at Crowder Junior College in Missouri. This will be the 5th time Hicks faces the Missions in his career. He is 2-0 with a 1.86 ERA with 4 walks and 28 strikeouts in 19.1 innings. On April 11 in San Antonio, Hicks allowed 3 runs on 9 hits in 3.1 innings with 1 walk and 3 strikeouts.

San Antonio Missions Coaches

Manager - Chris Tremie

Chris Tremie begins his first season in the San Diego Padres organization and as manager of the San Antonio Missions. He spent 13 seasons as a manager in the Cleveland Guardians organization and the last seven seasons as the minor league field coordinator for the Cincinnati Reds.

“Fans should expect to come out and see a team that’s going to compete on a daily basis,” Tremie said. “It will be a good brand of baseball. We’re going to play the game the right way.”

Tremie debuted as a catcher for the Chicago White Sox in 1995. He later played for the Texas Rangers, Pittsburgh Pirates and Houston Astros across a total of 22 Major League Baseball games. Tremie retired in 2005 as a member of the Round Rock Express, the Astros’ Triple-A affiliate at the time, and began his managing career in 2006 with the Cleveland organization. His time with Cleveland included two years of managing Double-A Akron and six years leading Triple-A Columbus.

The Houston native attended the University of Houston, where he helped lead the Cougars to two 40-win seasons before being drafted by the White Sox in the 39th round of the 1992 MLB Draft. As a minor leaguer in the White Sox organization, Tremie played with NBA legend Michael Jordan on the Double-A Birmingham Barons as Jordan attempted to play professional baseball.

Hitting Coach Eric Del Prado

Eric Del Prado returns for his second season as hitting coach in San Antonio. He previously worked as a hitting coach at the Arizona Complex League (ACL) in 2023 before taking on the hitting coach role with Single-A Lake Elsinore during the 2024 season.

A native of El Segundo, California, Del Prado attended Willamette University and coached for four years at Lewis & Clark College in Oregon.

Pitching Coach Erick Abreu

Erick Abreu, a native of Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, pitched for nine years in the minor leagues with the New York Yankees and Houston Astros, even making a stop with the Texas League’s Corpus Christi Hooks. Abreu then became a pitching coach in the Astros’ system for nine seasons, spending time in six different levels.

Over the last two seasons, Abreu served as the major league bullpen coach for the Atlanta Braves.

Bench Coach Brian Burres

Brian Burres brings recent leadership acumen from within the Padres organization, working as the manager for Single-A Lake Elsinore in 2025, as a pitching coach at the Arizona Complex League in 2024 and as an assistant coach with High-A Fort Wayne in 2023.

Burres also boasts the most extensive major league playing career on the staff, pitching in over 100 games for the Baltimore Orioles, Toronto Blue Jays and Pittsburgh Pirates across six big-league seasons.

Strength Coach Chandler Craig

Chandler Craig continues for a second season with the Missions after two seasons as strength and conditioning coach with High-A Fort Wayne. This will be his fourth season in the Padres organization.

Craig previously spent two seasons with the Red Sox organization, including time with Single-A Salem. Craig is a native of Lubbock, Texas and graduated from Texas Tech University.

Athletic Trainer Juan Peña

Juan Peña embarks on his second season with the Missions and second with the Padres organization. In 2024, Peña won one of only 14 Minor League Baseball Athletic Trainer of the Year awards for his work with Single-A Lake Elsinore.

Peña worked in the Detroit Tigers organization from 2018-2023, with most of his time spent at the Florida Complex League. He is from Lakeland, Florida, and graduated from East Central University.
