LOUISVILLE LAST TIME OUT: It was a record-setting night for the Saints, amassing 22 hits and eight home runs in a 18-4 demolishing of Louisville on Thursday. The Saints plated six runs in the first inning and never looked back. Brooks Lee hit his first home run of the season to get things started. The team hit four RBI singles to round out the six-run inning. Yunior Severino hit his first of two home runs in the second inning to make it 7-0. Michael Helman and Severino went back-to-back in the fifth inning to push the lead to nine. Then in the sixth two more long balls, Matt Wallner's first of the game, followed by Jair Camargo, who hit his first since coming off the Injured List. After Louisville got a solo home run from Rece Hinds in the sixth, the Saints hit back-to-back homers again in the seventh, from Wallner and Helman making it 15-1. In the ninth, with former Saints infielder Hernán Pérez on the mound, the Saints tacked no three more runs, reaching 18 runs for the second time this season. ABOUT LAST NIGHT: There were several records set by the Saints in their 18-4 victory on Thursday:

\$\sigma\$ The 22 hits set a new franchise record, surpassing the 21 hits the team collected on June 13, 2023, also at Louisville in an 18-7 victory. Those are the only 20-hit games in franchise history. The 22 hits are tied for the fourth-most in a Triple-A game this season.

\$\sigma\$ The eight home runs hit ties the franchise record, tying the mark set on June 5, 2022 at lowa in a 16-7 win. Six of the eight home runs came from three players, marking the second time in franchise history three players had multi-homer games (also June 5, 2022 - Spencer Steer 3HR, Caleb Hamilton 2HR, Alex Kirilloff 2HR). The Saints' eight homers also tied Norfolk (April 3) for the most in a single game this year. It also marks the 21st time since 2005 a Triple-A club has homered eight times in one game.

\$\sigma\$ Of the eight home runs, there were two instances of back-to-back homers, the first time in franchise history the Saints had hit multiple back-to-back long balls

LOUISVILLE SLUGGERS: Since joining the International League, the Saints have hit well at Louisville, sporting a .260 batting average, their second-best of any road venue. Their .475 slugging percentage and .835 OPS are the best of any road venue they've played in and the 0.43 home runs per plate appearance is the best of any ballpark the Saints have played in, including CHS Field (0.38 HR/PA). It also is tied for the ninth-best of any team in any ballpark since 2021 (min 12 games) and the best for any team (including Louisville) since 2021.

WALLNER WARMING UP: In his 11 June games, Matt Wallner has hit .316/.495/.811 sporting a 1.238 OPS. He's hit a league-high six home runs in his this month, averaging a 96.2 mph exit velocity and owns a .477 ISO in that span.

NO WALKS FOR YOU!: Over the last six games, the Saints have walked just eight batters. The 216 walks issued by the Saints are the fewest in Triple-A, in addition to their 2.86 strikeouts per walk which also leads the circuit. The next closest is Durham at 2.68. Over the last six games, the Saints have struck out 52 batters to their seven walks, a 7.75 K/BB ratio, the best in all of baseball.

GO, DIEGO, GO!: Diego A. Castillo has surged again over his last 11 games, hitting .400 (14-35) with three doubles and a home run with a 1.071 OPS. In six June games, Castillo is hitting .423 (11-for-26), with four multi-hit efforts.

SUMMERTIME FEELING: Over the last three series, two players have stepped up their game at the plate: Yunior Severino and Michael Helman.

\$\mathbb{S}\$ In Severino's 18 games since May 21, he has hit .365 (23-for-63), with six home runs and a 1.151 OPS. His average exit velocity over that stretch is 93.1 mph, up from his season average of 89.7

mph. In June, Severino leagues the IL in on-base percentage, sporting a .600 clip.
Simichael Helman has turned it on again, hitting .363 (29-for-80) over the 21-game stretch. He's reached base in 18 of those 21 games. In June, Helman leads the International League in slugging percentage (.905), OPS (1.385) doubles (6), extra base hits (11) and total bases

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins got seven strong innings from Joe Ryan, taking the series opener against Oakland, 6-2. Carlos Correa went 3-for-4 with a home run, driving in three. Byron Buxton also went 3-for-3 in the win. Ryan dealt 7.0 innings, allowing a two-run home run (three total hits), walking one and striking out five to get his fifth win of the season.

MOWING THEM DOWN: In his start on May 22, 2024 in Buffalo, Festa retired the first 10 batters that he faced. After getting a flyout to center field to start the game, he then struck out the following seven batters, setting a new franchise record. With two outs in the third, Steward Berroa slapped a ball to second base to snap the streak. His seven consecutive punchouts surpassed Joe Ryan (8/20/21 vs Iowa) and Ronny Henriquez (5/28/22 v Indianapolis).

A PERFORMANCE FOR THE AGES: In just his ninth professional pitching appearance, Festa was a major part of a no-hitter. On May 10, 2022 with Fort Myers, he threw 6.0 no-hit innings, striking out a career-high 11 batters in a combined no-hitter for the Mighty Mussels. Jaylen Nowlin followed with 2.0 perfect innings and struck out three. Hunter McMahon tossed 1.0 hitless inning to finish it off, a 3-0 win.

ONE, TWO, THREE, YOU'RE OUT!: On July 24, 2022, Festa allowed three consecutive singles between the third and fourth innings. The final two batters of the third inning reached, as did the first of the fourth. Festa got three outs, but did not retire a batter because promptly picked off each of the three batters, one after the other.

He said it's sort of tough for him to do certain exercises given his height and narrowness. Last season he was listed at 185 pounds and came into Spring Training in 2024 10 pounds heavier at 195.
