## SHARK FISHING

The Blue Jays went 1-5 in Clearwater last week, with their sole victory coming in an extra-innings thriller on Friday night. Two of the games went to extra-innings, two games were decided by a margin of one run, and Dunedin was walked off on twice.

The Blue Jays dropped their first three of the series at BayCare Ballpark directly after taking four straight from Fort Myers.

## GAX MACHINE

Aldo Gaxiola concluded his stellar May by batting .370 across six games in Clearwater last week with two homers and 10 RBI.

He ripped a three-run opposite-field home run in the series opener, then clobbered a 102.5 MPH, 424 ft. home run in the 10th inning to help secure the Blue Jays 8-3 extra-innings win on Friday night.

After batting .174 in April, Gaxiola hit .318 in May with four homers while sporting only a 21% strikeout rate.

Gaxiola paces Dunedin with 31 RBI this season. His seven home runs this season are tied with Yorman Licourt for tops on the team.

## TURN UP THE WATTS

Dunedin Blue Jays RHP Dylan Watts was named Florida State League Pitcher of the Week for his performance on Friday, May 29 in Clearwater in Dunedin's 8-3 win in 10 innings.

Watts tossed 5.1 no-hit innings in relief against the Threshers, striking out five. He began his outing by retiring the first 14 batters he faced before a hit-by-pitch, then the one baserunner he allowed was subsequently caught stealing, meaning Watts to face the minimum 16 batters over his outing.

Selected by Toronto in the seventh round of the 2025 MLB Draft out of Auburn University, across 10 appearances (four starts) this season, Watts owns a 3.58 ERA with 35 strikeouts in 32.2 innings pitched. Watts has allowed just one run over his last two appearances spanning 9.1 innings.

## THE CHOSEN JUAN

Blue Jays No. 7 prospect Juan Sanchez had a hit in all five games he played in last week's Clearwater series. He went 8-for-20 (.400) with three doubles, a triple, and four RBI over the series.

Over his last 12 games, Sanchez is batting .340 with seven RBI and a .900 OPS.

Sanchez is the second youngest player in the FSL behind only Mets' Elian Pena. He is just one of 12 position players who are 18 years old or younger who have 100 or more plate appearances in all of Single-A.

## SAMS CLUB

Sam Shaw continues his rehab assignment with Dunedin from High-A Vancouver. Last week in Clearwater, Shaw batted .385 in three games with a double and two RBI. Three of his five hits came at 104+ MPH.

Shaw is recovering from thoracic outlet syndrome (TOS), a rare condition causing blood clots which required an extensive surgery and prematurely ended his 2025 season.

He enjoyed a breakout season for Dunedin in 2025, where he batted .253 with 7 HR and a .801 OPS before being promoted to High-A Vancouver at the All-Star break, but after seven games that included an 0-for-18 stretch, he went on the IL, ending his season.

## LET HIM COOK

Blue Jays No. 11 prospect Jake Cook reached base five times in six plate appearances, and stole a pair of bases in Dunedin's win on Friday night.

He had back-to-back multi-hit performances on Thursday and Friday. Cook enters the series 5-last-12 with four runs scored and two RBI, having stolen six bags in his last seven games.

# 2026 DUNEDIN BLUE JAYS COACHING STAFF

## Ryan Casteel | Manager *Year with Toronto: 1 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Chattanooga, TN*

Casteel makes his managerial debut in 2026, joining the Blue Jays organization after a 14-year professional playing career. Casteel spent time in the Colorado Rockies, Seattle Mariners, and Atlanta Braves farm systems, while also playing winter ball in Australia and Puerto Rico. A four-time minor league All-Star, he was named Australian Baseball League MVP in 2013 after earning California League Catcher of the Year honors that summer with the Mariners' High-A Modesto Nuts. Casteel spent parts of six seasons at the Triple-A level, including the final four years of his career with the Gwinnett Strippers. After being placed on the Gwinnett Development List for much of the 2024 season, Casteel was activated for a July series against Jacksonville and delivered a ninth-inning, walk-off home run on July 12 in his first game in nearly two months, lifting the Strippers to a 7-6 win after entering as a late-game defensive replacement. Two days later, on July 14, he announced his retirement following a nearly 900-game minor league career. Casteel immediately transitioned into a coaching role with Gwinnett and served as a coach with the FCL Braves in 2025 before stepping into his first managerial role. Was Arizona Fall League teammates with Blue Jays Farm Director Joe Scalfani in 2014 for the Salt River Rafterers on a team that won the AFL Championship and also included Byron Buxton, Trevor Story, Taylor Rogers, Max Kepler, and Tyler Heineman.

## Brett Kennedy | Pitching Coach *Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Galloway, NJ*

Kennedy enters his first season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach and second with the Blue Jays organization after leading the Complex League Champion FCL Blue Jays pitching staff in 2025. Kennedy enjoyed a nine-year professional playing career, including MLB service time with the San Diego Padres in 2018 and the Cincinnati Reds in 2023. A Fordham University graduate, Kennedy takes over for fellow Ram Cory Riordan, who was named the Blue Jays' Pitching Coordinator after three seasons in Dunedin.

## Nash Knight | Hitting Coach *Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Denton, TX*

Knight returns for his third season as Dunedin's Hitting Coach. Under Knight's guidance in 2025, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League's top offensive clubs, finishing fourth in batting average (.244) and home runs (85), second in slugging percentage (.371), and third in OPS (.716). Through the first 46 games of the 2025 season, the Blue Jays led the league in home runs (41), on-base percentage (.368), slugging percentage (.416), OPS (.784), and runs scored (292). Eight position players earned their first promotions to High-A in 2025 under Knight, including JR Freethy, who reached Double-A by season's end. The Denton, Texas native spent six seasons as a player in the Blue Jays organization from 2015–2021, reaching the Triple-A level. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Knight suited up for Dunedin in parts of two seasons, playing 105 career games at TD Ballpark in his career, notably playing all nine positions in a game on Sept. 2, 2018 for a team managed by Casey Candaele. Was a member of 2017 FSL Co-Champion Dunedin team which was managed by current Toronto skipper John Schneider and included future big leaguers including Vladimir Guererro Jr, Bo Bichette, Lourdes Gurriel Jr, Jordan Romano, and Ryan Borucki. Majored in kinesiology at DBU. Brother, Austin, has coached at DBU, Texas A&M, and most recently coached in the Mariners organization.

## Ashley Stephenson | Bench Coach *Year with Toronto: 4 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Mississauga, ON.*

Stephenson returns for her second season on Dunedin's coaching staff and fourth with the Blue Jays organization. Stephenson spent the 2025 season as a Position Coach for Dunedin, primarily working with the outfielders. She spent the prior two seasons in the same role with the High-A Vancouver Canadians, where she helped guide the club to a Northwest League championship in 2023. Inducted into the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. She starred collegiately in hockey at Wilfrid Laurier University, winning four conference titles and a CIS National Championship before playing professionally in both the National Women's Hockey League and Canadian Women's Hockey League. On the diamond, Stephenson represented Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004–2018, earning two Team MVP honors, an All-Star selection at third base at the 2008 IBAF World Cup, and the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was later renamed in her honor. In 2022, she became the first woman to manage a Canadian national baseball team, leading her squad to two victories over Team USA in the Friendship Series, before joining the Blue Jays organization.

## Andy Fermin | Position Coach *Year with Toronto: 9 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Cleveland, OH.*

Fermin joins the Dunedin staff as a Position Coach in his first season with the club. A former infielder in the Blue Jays farm system from 2010–2016, Fermin has remained with the organization in a coaching capacity following his playing days. He served as a coach with the Double-A New Hampshire Fisher Cats from 2017–2019 and was part of the 2018 Eastern League championship staff under current Toronto Manager John Schneider. He served as Hitting Coach for the DSL Blue Jays in 2021 and managed the club from 2022–2023. He returned stateside as manager of the FCL Blue Jays in 2024 before serving as the club's Bench Coach in 2025. Fermin returns to Dunedin after spending parts of three seasons at TD Ballpark as a player in 2014–2016. His father, Felix, played mainly shortstop over 903 MLB games from 1987–1996 while with Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Seattle and Chicago (NL).

## Antonio Caceres | Ast. Pitching Coach *Year with Toronto: 26 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Cotui, DR*

Caceres spent the past three years as the Pitching Coach for the FCL Blue Jays. A lifelong member of the Blue Jays organization, Caceres was signed out of the Dominican Republic by Toronto when he was 17. He played in their minor league system from 1995–1998, before he transitioned to a pitching coach role in 2000. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

**2026:**

- Was slated to pitch for Team Cuba in the WBC this spring before injuries.
- After spending the first month of the 2026 season on the injured list recovering from right elbow soreness that plagued him last fall and throughout spring training, Hechavarria made five rehab starts for Dunedin. In his first start on May 4 vs. JUP, Hechavarria dazzled over four perfect innings, retiring all 12 batters he faced on a super-efficient 37 pitches.
- Allowed at least four runs in next four rehab starts, 11 BB/10 K in 7 IP.
- On June 2, he was activated from his rehab assignment and transferred from the High-A Vancouver roster to Dunedin.

**2025:**

- Made stateside debut, opened season in the FCL where he pitched to a 2.12 ERA in four games.
