Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Logan Allen** to the mound tonight, followed by RHP **Yorman Gomez**. The Saints will counter with LHP **Aaron Rozek**. Columbus is 18-25 (.419) versus left handers this year. Rozek has pitched against the Clippers eight times in his career, going 0-2 with a 4.73ERA (32.1IP, 33H, 20R, 17ER, 10BB, 28K), with both losses coming in Huntington Park (8.2IP, 9ER).

vs. the Saints

Columbus is 4-3 against the Saints in Ohio this year, producing a 9-10 series record, and has won 55 of the last 90 overall opposing the Saints (497-398 run differential; 15 of 35 losses by a single run, only 12 losses by more than two runs). Individually, **Kody Huff** has hit .297 (27x91) with 5HR and 18RBI in 27G against St. Paul in his career (**Kahlil Watson** has 6HR and 20RBI in 21G).

Buckle Up

The first 18G between Columbus and St. Paul saw an average of 12.1 runs on 4.1 homers, before last night's 1-0 result (third homerless game this year; second 1-0 game in 103 all-time matchups; 1-0 loss vs. St. Paul on 9/5/21). The Clippers are using the longball to score 52% of their runs against the Saints this year (34HR, accounts for 59 of 113) and St. Paul owes 60% to the bomb (39HR, 63 of 105 runs).

Start with a Bang

Over the last 41G, the Clippers have plated 272 runs (most in the IL, 6.6 per), with 171 (63%) tallied in the first four innings of the game. Opponents have only 86 in the first four innings of the last 41G, but are outscoring the Clippers 132-101 thereafter (Columbus has 80 straight wins when leading after the 8th; last loss: 8/7/25). On the year, Columbus now ranks 3rd in the IL in runs (808; 5.7 per, leads IL).

A New Record

Kyle Manzardo's walk in the 1st inning last night established a new franchise record for the Columbus offense (744BB, had 741BB in 1983). The lineup's 200HR are 2nd most in team history (213HR in 2019) and the 7SAC are tied for a team low (also in 2019). On the mound, assuming 9.0IP in each of the last 5G, if the Clippers allow more than 25ER, it will set a new season high (5.32ERA in 2023).

That's Over

Last night's shutout was the first for Columbus pitching since 4/11 at Worcester, snapping an IL-long 127G streak allowing a run (last season's long was 126G, by St. Paul). The Clippers have played in the fewest shutouts this season, going 2-3 (every other team in the IL has played in at least nine). From 2022-25, Columbus went 34-19 in shutouts (.642, 1st; 3rd most wins, 2nd fewest losses).

Always On

Cooper Ingle has lost 35 points on his average over his last 29G (.208, 22x106) and 77 points from his slugging, with only 8XBH (6XBH in last 8G), but his OBP has dipped only 15 points in that time (31BB in 137PA) and he still leads the IL in OPS by 30 points (.950). Ingle has reached base in each of his last 14G (.394OBP since 8/27) and has not been kept off the bases in consecutive games this year.

King Ralph

Dating to 7/28, **Ralph Velazquez** leads the IL in HR (18, +4), RBI (42, +7) and SLG (.787, +115) and, aside from going 0x21 at St. Paul (7/21-7/26), is hitting .328/.413/.662 since 6/18 (21HR, 56RBI). Those leads held up despite Velazquez missing the last 7G with a lower body injury and a relative power slump (2HR in last 46AB since 3HR game on 8/22 vs. St. Paul; 9BB in last 35PA, 9BB in prior 122PA).

Twenty Town

Kody Huff crushed his 22nd homer on Sunday (.338, 23x68, 3HR, .574SLG since 8/23), four more than the prior four years combined. **Cooper Ingle** poked his 20th on Friday, as Columbus has four players with at least 20 and one more with 19 (**Kahlil Watson** hit 19th last Sunday), marking the second time in history (2019) the Clippers have five players with at least 19HR (never had five with at least 20HR).

Power and Speed

Milan Tolentino swiped a pair of bases last night (20SB on the year), securing the second 20-20 season in franchise history (21HR). He scored the first such season last year (21HR, 20SB) and, since the start of 2025, he is tied for 2nd in the IL with 42HR and 25th with 40SB (only 40-40 guy). **Kahlil Watson** is sitting at 19HR (career high) and 22SB, looking to become the fourth to reach 20-20 in the IL.

**This Date in Clipper History**

9/16/1981

The Clippers beat Richmond by a score of 13-3 in what would be the decisive game of the Governors' Cup Finals. Columbus was declared the 2-1 victor after the rest of the series was cancelled due to rain, making the '81 Clippers the only team in IL history to win the Cup with just two wins (in 2001, Louisville became the only team to win the title with one win, as the remainder of the series was cancelled due to 9/11).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,496 to 1,450).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 196-154 (.560) in pitch reviews, with batters going 98-90 (.516) and pitchers/catchers going 98-64 (.605). They have run out of challenges in 49G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 836, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 170 through 142G (on pace for 176SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 52CS so far, the Clippers have the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (2024; on pace for 54CS).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 192 runs while crafting a .876OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 131 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +61 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 319-209 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 81 grand slams and 2,005RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.33 through 142G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 196HR (would be 4th most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 5th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 79G this season (45-34, .570), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 11th most last at bat wins this year (15, six off the lead) while playing in the 14th most games decided in the last at bat (29, Norfolk has 42). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 103G decided in the last at bat (3rd most in the IL), going 49-54 (.476, 17th best winning percentage; 6th most wins, 3rd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 462-472 (.495), 432-426 with Columbus (.503).

Workhorse:

Allen is the only Clipper averaging over 81 pitches per start this year, at 86.5 (has 90+ in 7GS, rest of team has 90+ in 8GS). Averaging almost 93 pitches per outing in the Majors last season, Allen hit triple digits six times (Columbus has not had a pitcher reach 100 since **Peyton Battenfield** on 9/2/22, 606G ago).

On Guard(ians):

In four stints in the Majors this season (27th man in a DH on 4/5 and 7/18, two-day excursion from 5/24-5/25, three weeks from 8/15-9/3), Allen has appeared seven times for Cleveland. He closed out the game on 5/25 vs. Washington (4.0IP, 5H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 7K), his second in relief at the Major League level (once last season). Allen then made a start in the second game of a DH on 7/18 at Pittsburgh (3.1IP, 6H, 3R, 2ER, 3BB, 3K), his first start in the Majors since last year's season finale.

Better Half:

Allen has 8GS in the second half of the season, going 4-2 with a 3.95ERA (41.0IP, 44H, 18ER, 10BB, 46K). He ranked 2nd in the IL in strikeouts this half (one behind **Trenton Denholm**), before his latest promotion on 8/15 (59th now) while placing 13th in ERA and 10th in WHIP (1.19). The first half of the season saw him 10th in strikeouts (68, 112K overall rank 8th), 22nd in ERA (5.15) and 26th in WHIP (1.58) among 29 pitchers with at least 57.0IP.

Stellar Support:

Through 20GS, the bullpen has graced Allen with a 2.95ERA in relief (73.1IP, 24ER), stranding five of nine runners inherited. The defense has committed only 14E in Allen's starts, while the offense has put forward 5.4 runs per game. That all adds up to a 16-4 record (.800) for Columbus when he takes the hill.

Month to Month:

In his first 5GS (103BF), Allen recorded 32K (31%) against only 10BB (10%), while painting the zone with strikes on 63% of his offerings. Once the calendar flipped to May, however, he made 4GS (87BF), watching his strikeout rate dip to 16% (14K) and his walk rate inflate to 14% (12BB; strikes on 57% of pitches). He found his groove in June, starting with a 10K outing (fifth of career) on 6/6 vs. Omaha (40K to 105BF last month, 38%; 5BB, 4%, 67% of pitches were strikes). In July, his strikeouts were down once more (23K to 91BF, 25%), while walks were up (6BB, 7%; still sat at 65% strikes thrown, however).

Cleaning Up:

Opposing cleanup hitters had just one hit off Allen in their first 30AB of the season, though the hit went over the wall (**Charles McAdoo**, 4/26 at Buffalo). Coming into today, they are 8x48 (.184, 4HR, 1BB, 13K) and, looking at the lineup as a whole, the top five in the order have slashed .243/.313/.412 with 10HR in 243AB against Allen, while batters 6-9 have hit .338/.401/.541 with 6HR in 148AB.

500K

Gomez surpassed 500K in his career on 8/20 vs. St. Paul (515K, 500.1IP). He has seen his strikeout rate remain steady this season (23.6%, 70K to 296BF between Rookie League and Triple-A; 23.9% in career prior), but his walk rate has increased (12.8%, 38BB; was at 9.1% prior). A month ago, on 8/1 vs. Toledo, **Trenton Denholm** picked up his 500th career strikeout (542.1IP; **Logan Allen** collected his 500th minor league strikeout two days prior, 7/30 vs. Toledo, 399.0IP).

Answered:

Over his last 6GS, the Clippers have scored in 12 separate innings for Gomez and he has allowed runs in the next half inning seven times (gave up the lead all seven times). That includes twice each on 8/8 at Syracuse and 8/26 at Indianapolis.

Injury Delay:

Gomez was slated to make his Triple-A debut during the season-opening series at Iowa, but injured his shoulder in his last preseason bullpen to wind up on the shelf (missed 72G; Clippers went 40-32). He was sent to Arizona at the end of May to rehab, appearing in 4G for the Guardians.

Bad Bookends:

On 7/19 vs. Indianapolis, Gomez gave up a career worst 7ER to add over two runs to his season ERA (5.06 to 7.08). He then locked in at St. Paul on 7/25 (5.1IP, 0ER) and 7/31 vs. Toledo (5.1IP, 1ER) to shave over two runs off his ERA (7.08 to 4.94), before allowing a new career worst of 9ER at Syracuse on 8/8 (ERA jumped back to 6.82). Gomez surrendered 4HR to the Mets on 8/8 (20BF) and gave up 2HR in each of 3GS from 7/2-7/19 (59BF; had 0HR to 40BF from 7/25-7/31).

House of Horror:

Through his first six weeks in the IL, Gomez pitched at Omaha, Lehigh Valley and St. Paul, accumulating a 1.93ERA (14.0IP, 3ER) and holding hitters to a .146 average (7x48) with a .333SLG (2HR). He was then greeted rudely in a loss at Syracuse on 8/8 (3.1IP, 9ER, 4HR). Gomez has also struggled in Huntington Park, registering a 7.01ERA (34.2IP, 27ER), while opponents have hit .289 (39x135) with a .570SLG (9HR).

Right Stuff:

While in the Rookie League, Gomez mowed down opposing right-handers, racking up 10K against 21BF (48%; 4K to 23BF on the left side, 17%). When they did put the bat on the ball (5x20, .250), righties notched 3XBH (all doubles; .400SLG), compared to 0XBH from lefties (5x17, .295). His strikeout rate in Triple-A is fairly even (30K against 126BF from the left and 26K vs. 126BF from the right), but right handers are still teeing off when they do connect (31x108, 9HR, .648SLG).
