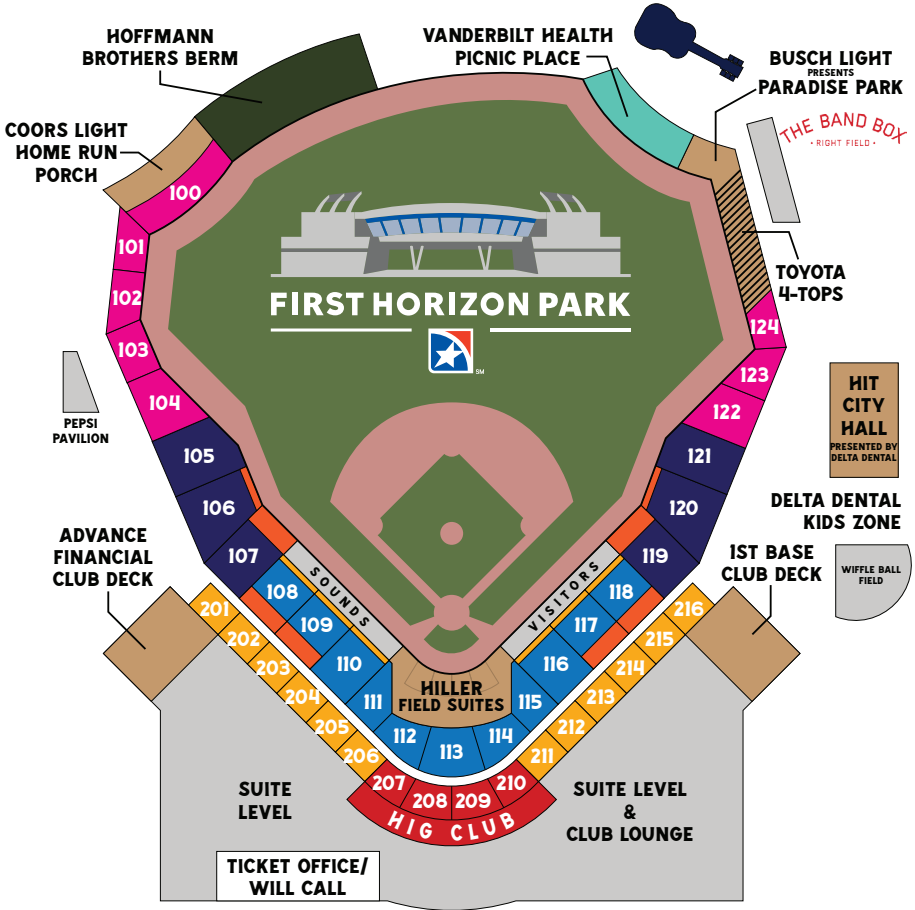

FIRST HORIZON PARK



Located just north of downtown Nashville, state-of-the-art First Horizon Park opened in 2015. With a stunning backdrop of the Nashville skyline, the ballpark has become the crown jewel of a rapidly-growing Germantown neighborhood. Through the first 10 years of game play, more than 5.3 million fans have passed through the gates. The Sounds have ranked in the top five in Triple-A attendance every year since 2021.

OWNERSHIP



FRANK WARD - OWNER

Frank Ward has three loves: his family, real estate and baseball. All three have led him and MFP Baseball to Nashville.

With more than 40 years of involvement in real estate, Ward's wide range of business experience includes restructuring corporate organizations, developing high-rise office buildings in New York City, and serving as chief operating officer of a very large commercial real estate company. After serving in the U.S. Army in Korea shortly after graduating from high school, Ward earned an accounting degree from Capitol University in

Columbus, Ohio.

Ward was hired out of college by Kenneth Leventhal & Company (now Ernst & Young) in Columbus, Ohio, in 1971 as an auditor, and he eventually moved into corporate restructuring. Ward moved to Kenneth Leventhal & Company's New York City office in 1973.

In 1982, Ward was hired as Managing Director and Chief Financial Officer of HRO International, a client of his at Kenneth Leventhal & Company that was the most active high-rise office building developer in Manhattan. Ward remained at HRO International until 1995. That year, he accepted an offer to serve as Chief Operating Officer of Hiro Real Estate Co.

One of his first responsibilities at Hiro Real Estate was to draft a business plan to turn the company around. He did, and over the next 13 years, Ward steadily decreased debt and increased profits. Ward worked at Hiro Real Estate Co. as Chief Operating Officer from 1995 to 2008 before leaving with fellow Sounds owner Masahiro Honzawa to start MFP Real Estate.

Ward is a longtime baseball card collector. Acquiring the Nashville Sounds promises to be a logical progression of his career and love of the game. Between collecting cards and his more than 25 years of experience playing fantasy baseball, Ward's hobbies may be as valuable to MFP as his real estate experience.

Ward is married and has four children, two sons and two daughters. He and his wife, Renee, live in Nashville. Ward's sons Christopher and Timothy, and daughters Danielle and Katie all live in Nashville. Frank and Renee are the proud grandparents of three grandchildren with another one the way.

Ward fell in love with Nashville during trips to visit his daughter at Vanderbilt. He is excited that Nashville is a growth market for real estate and has promise as a great baseball town.

MASAHIRO HONZAWA - OWNER

MFP President Masahiro Honzawa ran the U.S. operations of his family's Hiro Real Estate Co. from 1995 to 2008. Honzawa was also active in the company's Japanese operations.

The Honzawa family has owned and operated a privately owned, 7 million-square-foot warehouse business in Japan and extensive real estate in New York City, Chicago and Los Angeles.

Honzawa graduated from Keio University in Tokyo in 1991 and continued his education in the U.S., where he earned an MBA from Columbia

University in 1998.

Before he took the helm of Hiro Real Estate's U.S. operations in 1995, he interned with Arthur Andersen LLP in New York, where he met his future MFP business partner Steve Posner, who was the partner on the Hiro Real Estate account for Arthur Andersen at the time.

In January 2008, Honzawa sold his interest in Hiro Real Estate and started MFP Real Estate.

He and his wife, Makiko, reside in New York and enjoy traveling for business and pleasure.

ADAM ENGLISH - GENERAL MANAGER / CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER

Adam English serves as the General Manager & Chief Operating Officer of the Sounds and oversees all day-to-day operations related to the ballclub. With English at the helm, the Sounds were named the 2022 Minor League Baseball Organization of the Year.

A native of Lexington, Ky., English joined the Sounds in October 2021 after serving as the Vice President and General Manager for the Gwinnett Stripers, the Triple-A Affiliate of the Atlanta Braves. English was with the Stripers since

November 2018.

Prior to his three seasons with Gwinnett, English was previously with the Triple-A Sacramento River Cats from 2013-18. He started with Sacramento as the Director of Ticket Sales and received promotions to Senior Director of Ticket Sales and Vice President of Ticket Sales and Service.

English was with the Single-A Lexington Legends from 2010-13 as the Director of Ticket Sales and later the Assistant General Manager. He began his professional career in sports with Ripken Baseball in 2006.

English graduated from Transylvania University in Lexington with a bachelor's degree in Business Administration. He resides in Franklin, Tenn. with his wife, Kerstin, and their son, Truett.

DOUG SCOPEL - ASSISTANT GENERAL MANAGER / VICE PRESIDENT OF OPERATIONS

Doug Scopel was named the Assistant General Manager for the Sounds in December of 2021, a promotion from his title of Vice President of Operations. Scopel initially joined the staff as an intern in February of 2000 and oversees all aspects of operations for the Sounds and First Horizon Park. The 2024 season marks his 27th in professional baseball.

Scopel played a pivotal role in helping the Sounds secure the coveted 2019 Triple-A Bob Freitas Award. The Freitas Awards have been presented by *Baseball America* annually since 1989 and recognize franchises for their community involvement, long term business success and consistent operational excellence.

In August 2018, Scopel was honored by *Ballpark Digest* as Minor League Baseball's Executive of the Year. He was also honored by *Minor League News* as the 2006 Public Relations Director of the Year.

Along with team ownership, Scopel served as the Sounds point person for the design, project management, and construction teams during the planning and development of state-of-the-art First Horizon Park, which opened in April 2015.

Prior to arriving in Nashville, he served as a media/community relations assistant for the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes.

A Pittsburgh native, Scopel earned a journalism degree from Marquette University in Milwaukee. He resides in Nashville with his wife, Michelle, daughter, Bella, and son, Milo.

CORY HILBORNE - COMMUNICATIONS MANAGER

Cory oversees communications efforts for the Sounds and First Horizon Park. His duties include writing and distributing press releases and baseball information that helps promote organizational and team accomplishments both on and off the field. He also manages game day press box operations, co-manages the club's social media efforts, serves as the main contact for media requests and interviews with local and national media, and helps in producing and editing content for the team's publications and website.

Cory is in his eighth season working in professional baseball and second with the Sounds after arriving in Nashville in January 2025. He comes to Middle Tennessee after spending four seasons with the Amarillo Sod Poodles (Double-A, Arizona Diamondbacks). He served as the Director of Media Relations and Baseball Operations for the Sod Poodles from 2022-24. He joined the Sod Poodles as the Baseball Communications Coordinator prior to the start of the 2021 season. During his time in Amarillo, he oversaw the team's external communication efforts, including all materials that are distributed to fans along with local and national media outlets used to promote the team and organization.

Prior to joining the Amarillo front office, he worked as the Media Relations Trainee for the Gwinnett Stripers (Triple-A, Atlanta Braves) briefly before the minor league season was canceled in 2020. His start in professional baseball came in the 2019 season as the Media Relations Intern for the Pulaski Yankees, a former Advanced Rookie affiliate of the New York Yankees in Virginia.

A native of Golden, Colorado, he graduated with a bachelor's degree in journalism with a minor in sports media from Metropolitan State University of Denver in December 2018. He enjoys spending his free time exploring new areas outdoors with his wife and two dogs, playing golf, and watching sports. Cory and his wife, Cara, are excited to welcome twins just before the start of the 2026 season.

NISHANT BRAHME - COMMUNICATIONS ASSISTANT

Nishant enters his 3rd season in Triple-A baseball and the first with Nashville after joining the team as the Communications Assistant in February of 2026. His responsibilities consist of assisting game-day operations, game-day lineups, game notes, press releases, media credentials, and coordinating player/staff interviews with local and national media.

Brahme served as the Media Relations Intern for the Iowa Cubs during the 2025 season. He assisted their communications staff with researching baseball information, credential requests, game-day lineups, feature stories, and media interviews all while serving double-duty on game days where he handled social media and pitch clock during I-Cubs home games.



Prior to Iowa, he served as the Media and Communications Seasonal Associate with the Omaha Storm Chasers during the 2024 season. With Omaha, he assisted their communications staff with distribution of game day information in the press box and clubhouses along with coordinating player interviews and assisting with other baseball information. He was fortunate enough to be a part of Storm Chasers 2024 International League Championship as they defeated the Columbus Clippers in a three-game series.

He attended the University of Kansas from 2019-2023 and earned his bachelor's degree in Sport Management with a minor in Journalism (Strategic Communications).

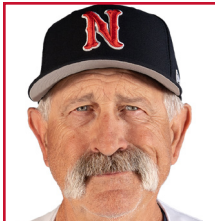

RICK SWEET CAREER NOTES

Rick Sweet, 73, enters his seventh season overall (6th consecutive) as the manager of the Nashville Sounds and the 2026 season will be his 13th overall as Triple-A manager in the Milwaukee Brewers organization. Sweet enters this season with the third-most wins in Minor League Baseball history across his 35 year managerial career and his 2,438 wins are the most among active Minor League skippers. He sits 59 wins away from moving into second place and 93 wins away from the most wins in Minor League history.

In his six years at the helm in Hit City, Sweet is the already the club's franchise leader in wins with a record of 484-379 (.561). Nashville's 85 wins in 2025 were the fourth-most in a season over his career and the second time in the last five seasons that he has guided the Sounds to 85+ wins. Across his 12 seasons as the Triple-A manager with the Brewers, Sweet owns a 846-714-1 (.542) record between stops in Nashville (2014, 2021-25), San Antonio (2019-20), and Colorado Springs (2015-18). The Sounds have posted five consecutive winning seasons under Sweet since he returned as the club's manager for the 2021 season.

Sweet is a three-time International League Manager of the Year award winner ('22, '09, '08) in addition to being named Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year in 1994. *Baseball America* also tabbed him as their Triple-A Manager of the Year in 2010. After guiding the Sounds to 91 wins (second-most in team history) in 2022, Sweet was also awarded with the Mike Coolbaugh Award, which is presented annually to a Minor League figure who has shown outstanding baseball work ethic, knowledge of the game, and skill in mentoring young players on the field.

Prior to joining the Brewers, Sweet spent nine seasons in the Cincinnati Reds organization managing Triple-A Louisville (2005-11) and working as the club's catching coordinator (2012-13). He is Louisville's all-time winningest manager with a 539-465 (.537) record. His Bats won three consecutive International League West Division championships from 2008-10.

Other career accomplishments for Sweet include managing the Triple-A All-Star game three times. He was the skipper for the Pacific Coast League in 1993 and 2003, and managed the International League All-Stars in 2009.

Sweet previously managed in the minors with the Seattle Mariners (1987-88), Houston Astros (1989-95), New York Mets (1997), Montreal Expos (1998, 2000), San Diego Padres (2001-03), and Detroit Tigers (2004) organizations. He was the first base coach for the Astros in 1996 and Field Coordinator for the Expos from 1999-2000.

A former catcher, Sweet had a nine-year playing career (1975-83), including time in the big leagues with San Diego (1978), New York-NL (1982) and Seattle (1982-83). He was drafted by the Pittsburgh Pirates in the 31st round of the 1974 amateur draft but did not sign, and by the San Diego Padres in the third round of the 1975 amateur draft. He attended and played college baseball at Gonzaga University from 1973-75.

Thornburg makes his way to Nashville for the first time as a coach at the Triple-A level, and second year coaching in the Brewers organization after serving as the associate coach for Double-A Biloxi last season. However, 2026 won't be his the first time in the Sounds dugout.

Thornburg made 23 combined starts on the mound for Nashville between 2012-13. He was the Opening Day starter and top ranked pitching prospect in the Brewers system in 2013. He was selected by the Brewers in the 3rd round of the 2010 MLB Draft out of Charleston Southern University and made a total of 346 professional appearances across 12 seasons. His playing career included 206 Major League appearances between Milwaukee (2012-16), Boston (2018-19), Cincinnati (2020), Minnesota (2022), and Atlanta (2022).

He made a career-high 67 appearances for the Brewers in 2016 and held a 2.15 ERA and recorded 13 saves as the team's closer. He also set the Brewers reliever record with 23 consecutive batters during the 2016 season.

Thornburg made his MLB debut on June 19, 2012 with the Brewers after just 46 career minor league games and skipped over Triple-A before making his big league debut. His 2018 season was spent with the Boston organization where he made 25 appearances for the Red Sox and helped Boston make the playoffs. Though he did not make a postseason appearance for the Red Sox, Boston defeated the Los Angeles Dodgers in the World Series.

Other career accomplishments include being selected to the 2011 MLB All-Star Futures Game held at Chase Field in Phoenix, Arizona.

Leslie returns to Nashville for a second consecutive season as pitching coach and his sixth overall season with the Brewers organization. In 2025, Leslie helped coach the Sounds pitching staff to the third-best overall ERA in Triple-A (3.91) and a bullpen ERA that also ranked third among all Triple-A clubs (3.80).

Primarily working with Nashville's bullpen in his first season at an affiliate in 2025, Sounds relievers went 46-26 over the course of the season and converted on 39 of 63 save opportunities. Nashville relievers allowed the second-fewest hits (519) to opponents in the International League behind Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (517) as well as the third-fewest runs (307) and HR (48). The bullpen went 38.0 IP without an earned run allowed between March 30-April 10 and the streak covered seven full games. Three different relievers posted streaks of 12+ games without allowing an earned run while RHP Craig Yoho was the only pitcher in the International League to account for multiple streaks of 12+ games. Sounds pitchers posted four streaks of 12+ games without an earned run and were the only International League to have more than two. RHP Tyler Jay had the longest scoreless streak for a Nashville pitcher, going 15 games while RHP Jesus Liranzo totaled 19.0 IP between earned runs allowed from July 6-August 24 and spanned 14 appearances.

Leslie was hired by the Brewers as the assistant pitching coordinator in 2020 and serves as the Lead Strategist of Pitching Development within Milwaukee's Player Development Staff. Prior to being hired by the Brewers, Leslie worked for three years as a throwing trainer for Driveline Baseball.

He played collegiately at Division-III Knox College in Illinois as a two-way player. He totaled 22 relief appearances on the mound between 2013-14 and played in 37 games (11 GS) as an infielder.

Prior to jumping into professional coaching, Bunnell had more than 20 years of collegiate coaching experience. After his time as a player at Mount Union College, Bunnell returned to his alma mater to begin his coaching journey. He was assistant coach for the Purple Raiders from 2005-08 before heading off to North Central College in 2009-10. 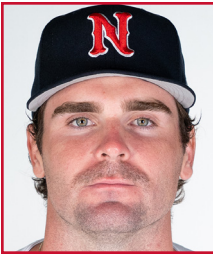

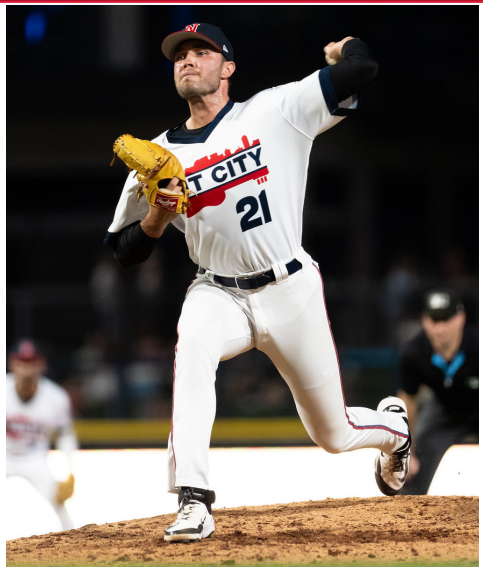

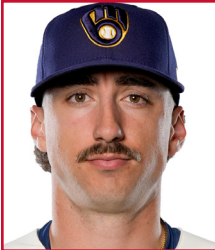

IN THE BOOKS: Nashville finished the 2025 season with a record of 85-63 and tied for the fifth-most wins in the International League with Durham. Jacksonville finished with the best record, going 89-61 and won the International League, defeating Scranton/Wilkes-Barre 2-1 in the International League Championship Series. The Jumbo Shrimp went on to beat Las Vegas in the Triple-A Championship Game with a walk-off home run to win 8-7. The Sounds finished the first half 44-29, 2.0 games behind Jacksonville (47-28) and were 41-34 in the second half, 8.0 games behind Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (49-26). Despite missing the playoffs for the third straight season, the 85 wins were the sixth-most in a single-season in franchise history. It was just the third time since 1990 with 85+ wins in a season. The Sounds are one of just two teams in Triple-A to have a winning record in all six halves since going to the split season format in 2023 along with Oklahoma City. Nashville ended the year 24-12 over their final 36 games and had the most wins in Triple-A during the span, including going 8-2 over the final 10 games and 13-5 in September.

ROSTER MAKE UP: Nashville had **74 different players** (31 position players / 43 pitchers) appear in a game in 2025. RHP Blake Holub, RHP Jesus Liranzo, RHP Garrett Stallings, INF Raynel Delgado, INF Freddy Zamora, OF Jimmy Herron, and OF Jared Oliva were with Nashville all season long while Liranzo, Delgado, and Zamora were active for all 148 games played for the Sounds. Delgado ended the season with the most games played (125 G) and Liranzo appeared in a team-high 48 games on the mound. **38 different players** played for the Sounds and Brewers. **Six players** (INF Caleb Durbin, INF Anthony Seigler, RHP Logan Henderson, RHP Jacob Misorowski, RHP Chad Patrick, and RHP Craig Yoho) made their Major League debut with Milwaukee. OF Drew Avans (Athletics) and LHP Grant Wolfram (Baltimore) also made their MLB debut in 2025 with teams other than Milwaukee. Nashville had **16 Major League Rehab assignments (5 position players, 11 pitchers)** throughout the 2025 season. Of the 16, INF Jake Bauers, OF Jackson Chourio, INF Rhys Hoskins, OF Garrett Mitchell, LHP Aaron Ashby, RHP Aaron Civale, LHP Nestor Cortes, LHP DL Hall, RHP Nick Mears, RHP Shelby Miller, RHP Brandon Woodruff, and LHP Rob Zastryzny were in Nashville strictly on rehab assignments. OF Blake Perkins, RHP Grant Anderson, LHP Robert Gasser, and RHP Tobias Myers all played for Nashville outside of rehab. **Nashville had a total of 232 roster transactions throughout the season**, 12 fewer than the 244 transactions from the 2024 season.

HONOR ROLL: RHP Craig Yoho was the lone Nashville representative on the International League Post-Season All-Star team. The Brewers' no. 16-rated prospect finished the season 6-1 with a 0.94 ERA in 43 appearances for the Sounds. The reliever converted on 8-of-10 save opportunities and allowed 26 hits and five earned runs with 60 strikeouts and 20 walks over 47.2 IP. His six wins were a single-season career-high and he finished the year tied for fourth in the International League with his eight saves. **He was the only International League pitcher with multiple streaks of at least 12 games without allowing an earned run.** He did so twice; including his first 12 games of the season from March 29-May 21, and again from June 15-August 6. **He became the first Triple-A pitcher with a sub-1.00 ERA (min. 40.0 IP) since 2015 and one of just eight Triple-A pitchers with a sub-1.00 ERA with at least 45.0 IP since 2005.** Four different players were named International League Player/Pitcher of the Week. **RHP Jacob Misorowski** was twice named Pitcher of the Week (March 28-30, April 22-27). **INF Ernesto Martinez Jr.** (April 8-13) and **OF Daz Cameron** (April 15-20) were named Player of the Week consecutively. **RHP Tobias Myers** was also named Pitcher of the Week in the International League for June 30-July 6. The five IL Player/Pitcher of the Week awards were the most Nashville has had in a season since having six during the 2003 season. Misorowski was the only Nashville player to be named a Brewers Minor League Pitcher/Player of the Month when he earned the award in May.

IF YOU BUILD IT: Nashville ended the season with the **fourth-highest attendance across Minor League Baseball.** The Sounds finished with a home attendance of 500,002 including seven sellouts (10,000+) and a season-high 11,415 on July 3rd. It was the fourth straight season with 500,000+ fans through the First Horizon Park gates, and the fifth straight season finishing Top 5 in Triple-A in attendance. The Sounds welcomed the 5-millionth fan through the First Horizon Park gates on June 8 vs. Gwinnett.

THE SWEET LIFE: Nashville manager **Rick Sweet moved to third all-time for wins in Minor League Baseball history** on August 19. At the end of his 35th season as a minor league manager, Sweet owns a career record of 2,438-2,237 (.507). Sweet finished his fifth consecutive season as Nashville's manager, and 11th year as the Brewers' Triple-A Manager in 2025. He is 484-379 (.561) during his Sounds tenure and is the Sounds all-time winningest manager. The 85 wins in 2025 were the fourth-most in a season in his career and the second time in five seasons he has guided Nashville to 85+ wins. As it currently stands, Sweet is 59 wins away from moving into second and 93 wins shy of passing Stan Wasiak (2,530) for the most wins in Minor League Baseball history.

RECORD BREAKERS: Nashville set a handful of new single-game and single-season franchise highs during the 2025 season. The team set a single-game high with **seven home runs** (6 previous high) on April 20 at Charlotte. With **eight steals as a team on September 19 at Louisville**, Nashville surpassed the previous high (7). On the season, Nashville shattered their previous single-season stolen base record as a team, finishing with **316 stolen bases** (205 previous high) to lead all Triple-A and finished third overall in the minors. Nashville had **16 shutout wins** (14 previous high) to lead all Triple-A and finish tied for fourth in the minors.

SWIPING RIGHT AND LEFT: Jared Oliva **led the International League and finished second in Triple-A with 57 steals on the season**. He became the fourth Nashville player to lead the league in stolen bases, and made it back-to-back years for Nashville after Brewer Hicklen led the league in stolen bases with 44 during the 2024 season. He set a single-game career-high with four steals and had four of the eight steals to help Nashville set their single-game franchise record on September 19 at Louisville. Oliva also broke the franchise record for most steals in a single month with 16 stolen bases in August. His 57 steals were the third-most in a single-season in franchise history and finished tied for the fourth-most in a season in the International League since 1988. Oliva and Raynel Delgado (40) became just the second pair of Nashville teammates to reach 40+ steals in the same season since 1981. They joined Otis Nixon (72) and Ted Wilborn (43) in 1981. **Nashville was the only International League team to have Seven different players with 20+ steals**. Oliva (2nd), Delgado (T-7th), and Drew Avans (T-7th) finished inside the top 10 Triple-A for steals. Avans had 24 steals with Nashville and 16 during his time with Las Vegas.

SOUNDS PLAYER AWARDS: The Nashville Sounds player awards were announced on Saturday, September 13 in a pregame ceremony. Raynel Delgado was named Most Valuable Player, Garrett Stallings was named Pitcher of the Year, Jared Oliva was honored as Community Player of the Year, and Freddy Zamora was voted as Fan Favorite.

TAKE A TRIP TO TRIPLE-A: Of the 74 different players to play a game for Nashville this year, **10 experienced Triple-A for the very first time in their careers** (three position players / seven pitchers). **RHP Alexander Cornielle** made his Triple-A debut with Nashville on September 10 after leading the Southern League in starts and ranked top 10 in strikeouts, ERA, BAA, and WHIP. He ended the year with the most strikeouts in the farm system (135) and GS (29). He was second in ERA (3.81), IP (137.0), BAA (.228), and WHIP (1.36). Fellow pitchers **Will Childers** and **Justin Yeager** ended the year 1-2 in both games and saves after beginning their seasons with Double-A Biloxi. Childers (54) led in appearances while Yeager was first in saves (10). Yeager made 18 appearances with Nashville and was 1-0 with a 0.84 ERA over 21.1 IP. He did not allow an earned run in seven straight games to end the year and yielded just two earned runs on nine hits during his time with the Sounds.

MVP! MVP! Raynel Delgado was named Nashville's Most Valuable Player in 2025. He led the team in games (125), AVG (.281), OBP (.363), SLG (.378), OPS (.741), hits (116), and total bases (156). He was tied for the team lead in doubles (19) and finished second in RBI (53), runs (58), and stolen bases (40). He was fourth on the club in walks (48) and ended sixth in XBH (27). He made starts at 1B (6), 2B (74), 3B (22), SS (10) and LF (1). It was a strong second half for Delgado who ended the second half hitting .316 (65-for-206, 11 2B, 2 3B, 5 HR, 26 RBI) over the final 61 games after hitting .246 in the first half.

REDUCE, REUSE, RAY'S CYCLE: Raynel Delgado hit for the cycle on August 19 vs. Louisville. It was Nashville's first cycle since Caleb Gindl on July 10, 2011. He became the fourth player in franchise history to hit for the cycle and the first player to complete it at home. He did it in natural reverse order (HR, 3B, 2B, 1B) and set a career-high with five-RBI and four-hits with his performance.

BREAKDOWN BY DIVISION: Though not in play for deciding postseason, the International League is broken down into two divisions – East and West, with Nashville landing in the West. However, the Sounds played 79 of their 148 games in 2025 against Eastern Division teams, going 41-38 against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, Jacksonville, Durham, Norfolk, and Charlotte. In the West, Nashville was 44-25 against Indianapolis, Louisville, Memphis, Iowa, and Gwinnett. The Sounds played more games against Gwinnett than any other team, going 16-8 in their 24 head-to-head matchups. The Sounds won all but three of their season-long series with teams. Nashville tied the season series with Durham, going 9-9. The only two season series the Sound lost were to Jacksonville (3-12) and Indianapolis (4-5)



BATTING IN RUNS: Daz Cameron went eight straight games with at least one RBI from July 10 - 23, collecting 13 RBI over his eight-game hot streak. The eight game RBI streak was tied for the second longest in the International League this season behind Columbus' Jonathan Rodriguez (9 G) and was tied with Milan Tolentino (COL). The eight-game streak was tied for the 11th-longest overall in the minors. Cameron's streak is tied for the fourth-longest for a Nashville player dating back to 2005. Only Brooks Conrad (2012), Mat Gamel (2010), and Andy Abad (2007) had longer streaks, with all three having a RBI in nine straight games. Cameron tied Isaac Collins (2024) and Josh Prince (2013) at eight games.

ERROR FREE: Jared Oliva went all 91 games he played in the field without committing an error. His 91-game streak was the third-longest error-free streak in the International League this season behind Columbus' Petey Halpin (113 G) and Charlotte's Corey Julks (96 G). Halpin did commit one error on the year though while Julks had three total errors. Among Nashville position players, only Drew Avans (55 G) and Steward Berroa (26 G) were error-free in the field with more than 25 games played. Oliva's 91-game streak was tied for the 19th-longest in all Minor League Baseball in 2025.

AIN'T IT GRAND: The Sounds hit four grand slams in 2025. Daz Cameron was the only Nashville player to hit multiple grand slams for Nashville, doing so on April 19 and July 12. After being traded to Milwaukee from the White Sox, Andrew Vaughn's first hit in the Brewers organization was a grand slam on June 17 vs. Iowa. The Sounds' fourth and final grand slam of the season came courtesy of Oliver Dunn on September 14 vs. Gwinnett. It was Dunn's first career grand slam. Nashville finished the year tied for 11th in the International League along with six other teams for the third-fewest grand slams. Columbus paced the International League with 10 while Triple-A Reno (Arizona) led all of Minor League Baseball with 11.

LONG BALL LOGISTICS: Bobby Dalbec hit the farthest home run of the season for Nashville with his 463-foot blast off Kenta Maeda and the Iowa Cubs on June 17 at First Horizon Park. Dalbec turned around the slider from Maeda with 111.3 MPH exit velocity and a 5.01 second hang time. It was tied for the 19th-longest home run hit in Triple-A during the 2025 season and the longest recorded HR of Dalbec's career. It was also the longest recorded HR at First Horizon Park over the last three seasons.

THE MANN: LHP Bruce Zimmermann led all Brewers' minor leaguers with his 138.0 IP with Nashville and finished third in the farm system in ERA (4.11). He finished the year second in WHIP (1.23), fourth in BAA (.259), fifth in strikeouts (109), and tied for eighth in games started (21). He was one of four pitchers in the farm system to reach 10 wins and was tied for the team lead in wins along with Logan Henderson.

LEAD OFF RAZZLE DAZZLE: Daz Cameron finished the season tied for the second-most lead off home runs in the minor leagues. The outfielder hit five of the six lead off home runs for the Sounds in 2025 including homering in his very first at-bat for Nashville after being traded to Milwaukee from Baltimore. Cameron finished the season with the team lead in home runs (18), RBI (54), and XBH (35).

STREAKING SEIGS: Anthony Seigler produced the longest hitting and on-base streaks of the season for Nashville in 2025. Seigler had a team-high 16-game hitting streak from May 2-28 in which he hit .431 (25-for-58, 4 2B, 3 3B, 3 HR, 11 RBI, 10 BB). It was tied for the fourth-longest hitting streak overall in the International League in 2025. Prior to starting his hitting streak, he had a six-game on-base streak working that ended up becoming a 35-game on-base streak ending on June 15. It was tied for the third-longest on-base streak of the season in the International League and tied for the fourth-longest in Triple-A overall. It was the fifth-longest by a Nashville player since 2013. Seigler was the only Nashville player to have multiple hitting streaks of 9+ games.

QUALITY + QUANTITY: Nashville starters produced 26 quality starts on the year from eight different pitchers. Bruce Zimmermann led the way for the Sounds pitching staff, producing six quality starts of his own. Jacob Misiorowski had the longest quality start of the year when he worked 7.0 IP with one run allowed on the road in Memphis on May 15. The 26 quality starts were tied for the seventh-most in Triple-A. Salt Lake led the circuit with 35 quality starts from their staff. Las Vegas had the most pitchers produce a quality start with 11. The Sounds were 22-9 when getting 6+ IP out their starters and 20-6 with a quality start. **Sounds W/L with a quality start:** Bruce Zimmermann (6-0), Garrett Stallings (4-1), Jacob Misiorowski (3-1), Tobias Myers (2-2), Logan Henderson (3-0), Chad Patrick (1-1), Carlos Rodriguez (0-1), Tucker Davidson (1-0).

BULLPEN BULLIES: Nashville relievers had the third-best ERA in the International League in 2025. The 3.80 ERA only trailed Jacksonville (3.64) and Gwinnett (3.73). Relievers were 46-26 over the course of the season and converted on 39-of-63 save opportunities. The 611.1 IP was the sixth-fewest innings tasked to cover by the bullpen in the International League. Nashville relievers allowed the second-fewest hits to opposing teams (519) behind Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (517) as well as the third-fewest runs allowed (307), and HR (48). The bullpen went 38.0 IP without an earned run allowed from March 30-April 10 and covered seven full games. Three different relievers had streaks of 12+ games without allowing an earned run while Craig Yoho was the only pitcher in the league to account for multiple streaks of 12+ games. The Sounds (4) were the only International League pitching staff to have pitchers account for more than two different streaks of 12+ games without an earned run. **Tyler Jay** had the longest scoreless streak without an earned run allowed by games (15 G) while **Jesus Liranzo** totaled 19.0 IP between earned runs allowed from July 6-August 24 and spanned 14 G.

BEST IN THE MIZ: RHP Jacob Misiorowski was on the Sounds 2025 Opening Day roster and checked in as the no. 4-rated prospect in the Brewers top 30 to start the season. Misiorowski got his season started by earning International League Pitcher of the Week from Opening Weekend after working 5.0 IP with one hit allowed and seven strikeouts. It was the first of two International League Pitcher of the Week awards for Misiorowski during his time with Nashville in 2025. His 11 strikeout performance on May 9 vs. Norfolk was the only double-digit strikeout performance by a Nashville pitcher this season. He also set a Sounds' season-high with his 7.0 IP on May 15 on the road in Memphis. In his seven starts at First Horizon Park in 2025, he went 2-0 and carried a 0.50 ERA while allowing just 14 hits and two earned runs over 35.2 IP with 51 strikeouts and 12 walks allowed.

DON'T RUN ON JORGE: Sounds' catcher Jorge Alfaro finished the season with 23 caught stealing on the season, 13 more than the next closest Nashville catcher (Jeferson Quero). Alfaro's 23 caught stealing were tied for the sixth-most overall in Triple-A and tied for fourth in the International League. Nashville ended the year with 48 total caught stealing as a team, tied for the ninth-most in Triple-A and eighth in the International League.

HOMERS? WHO NEEDS 'EM: The Sounds ended 2025 with 134 total home runs as a team, the fourth fewest in the International League. Only Buffalo (128), Indianapolis (121), and Gwinnett (111) had fewer in the league. Charlotte and Omaha paced the International League with 199 each and tied for the Triple-A lead along with Albuquerque. The Sounds went a season-long eight games without a home run from May 3 - 11 and had two other stretches of at least 6 games without hitting a home run (7 G, June 18-25 / 6 G, August 5-10).

ALWAYS FREDDY: Freddy Zamora smacked his first career First Horizon Park home run on Thursday, September 11 vs. Gwinnett. It was his 82nd career game at home with Nashville and his sixth career Triple-A home run. Zamora hit each of his first four Triple-A home runs on the road in Memphis at AutoZone Park. He finally broke his AutoZone Park streak with a home run on the road in Durham on August 16. Zamora played in 104 games with Nashville in 2025, the third-most by any Nashville player and was named the 2025 Fan Favorite after hitting .257 and tied for the team-lead with 19 doubles.

GOT FIVE ON IT: The Sounds held their opponents to five or fewer hits 39 times throughout the 2025 season, including 26 times at First Horizon Park. Nashville was 33-6 in games they limited the opposition to five or fewer hits and were 23-3 at home when doing so. The Sounds held the Memphis Redbirds to one hit on April 9, the only time the pitching staff held a team to one or fewer hits. Nashville won 23 straight games when holding opponents to five or fewer hits between April 8 - July 18. Offensively, Nashville was limited to five or fewer hits 35 times. After losing each of their first seven games of the season when failing to get 6+ hits, the Sounds won seven straight games with five or fewer hits between May 3 - June 7. 10 of Nashville's 12 wins on the season when being held to five or fewer hits came at First Horizon Park. Nashville played 16 games in which both teams were held to five or fewer hits in the same game.

NOT SO SWEEP: Nashville suffered their first six-game series sweep in franchise history at the hands of the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp August 5-10 at First Horizon Park. It was the last series the Sounds lost during the 2025 season before splitting a series on the road in Durham and winning each of the final five series of the season. In the sweep to Jacksonville, the Sounds were outscored 37-11 (-26 run differential) and suffered one of seven shutout losses on the year on August 6, losing 9-0.



2025 SEASON NOTES

BY THE NUMBERS...HOMER EDITION: Nashville hit six back-to-back home runs throughout the 2025 season. Four players were involved in multiple back-to-back instances during the season: Wes Clarke (2x), Oliver Dunn (2x), Daz Cameron (2x), and Bobby Dalbec (2x). Six different players had multi-HR games for Nashville during the 2025 campaign with Daz Cameron and Bobby Dalbec being the only two that had more than one multi-HR game. 10 players homered in back-to-back games during the year, led by Jorge Alfaro, who did it three different times while with the Sounds. Daz Cameron, Jared Oliva, and Bobby Dalbec also strung together home runs in consecutive games more than once. Daz Cameron and Anthony Seigler were the only two players to hit a home run in three straight games. Cameron did it from April 19 – 22 while Seigler homered in both games of the doubleheader on May 14 against Memphis and followed it up with a home run on the 15th against the Redbirds.

EXTRA, EXTRA: The Sounds went 6-9 in extra innings in 2025. 15 extra-innings games are tied for the fourth-most Nashville has played in a regular season since 2005. The Sounds played 17 extra-innings games in- both the 2024 and 2023 seasons, and also during the 2012 season. Eight of the 15 extra-innings games this season were at First Horizon Park with the Sounds going 3-5 at home in extras. Drew Avans (July 23) and Bobby Dalbec (July 27) hit the only two extra-innings home runs for the Sounds with Dalbec's being a two-run, walk-off homer to beat the Charlotte Knights, who Dalbec played for to begin the season. It was one of two walk-off homers for Nashville in 2025 with Eric Haase having the other on September 11 to beat Gwinnett in the ninth inning.

RUN DIFF: Nashville ended the year with the third-best run differential in the International League at +121. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre led the league at +142 with Toledo checking in at second at +123 on the season. In Triple-A, the Sounds finished fifth overall with Tacoma and Las Vegas each ending with +133 run differential on the year. Nashville's +85 difference in the first half of the year was third-best overall in Triple-A behind Las Vegas (+176) and Durham (+91). Despite winning the first half of the International League, Jacksonville finished with a +31 difference compared to Nashville's +85. The Sounds were just +36 in the second half of the year.

BETTER LATE: Nashville rarely surrendered late leads in 2025, going 63-2 on the year when holding a lead after the 8th inning, 67-6 when leading after the 7th, and 65-8 when leading after the 6th.

DAYS THAT END IN Y: The 2025 Sounds won a season-best 18 games on Saturdays, going 18-8. Wednesday, Thursday, and Fridays were tied for the second-most winningest days of the week for Nashville with 14 wins on all three of those days. Nashville went 0-1 on the only Monday they played in during the year, losing 2-1 on May 26th on the road in Indianapolis.

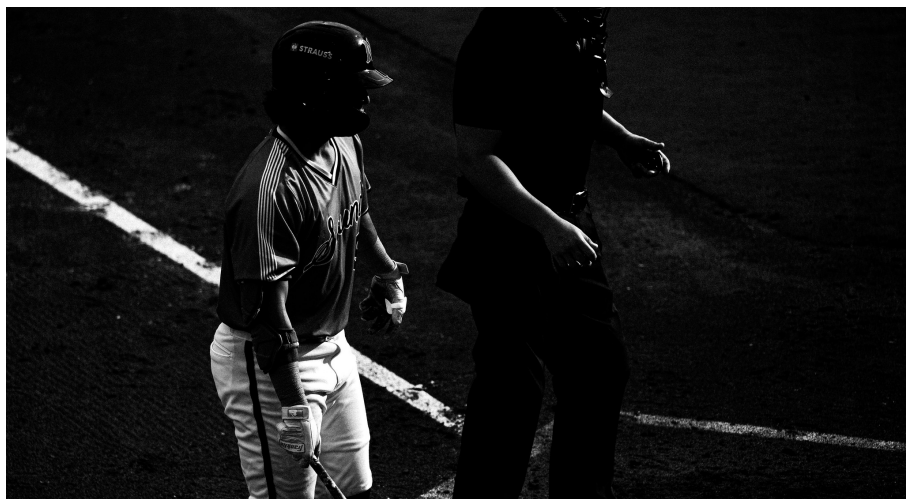

Bobby Dalbec played in 61 games with Nashville after being signed by the Brewers as a minor league free agent on May 10, 2025. He finished the year with Omaha (KC) and also played for Charlotte (CWS) during the season. He hit 12 HR and had 44 RBI with NAS.



Jared Oliva became the fourth different Nashville player to lead the league in stolen bases. His 57 steals were the third-most all-time in a single season in franchise history and tied for the fourth-most in a season in the International League since 1988.



Raynel Delgado and Jared Oliva became just the second pair of Nashville teammates to reach 40+ steals in the same season since 1981. They joined Otis Nixon (72) and Ted Wilborn (43) who accomplished it in 1981. Delgado's 40 steals set a career-high.

Born in Milwaukee, Flanagan graduated from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee with a business administration degree. Tom and his wife, Jennifer, reside in New Berlin, Wisconsin, with their son, Michael, and daughter, Molly.

HISTORY



The 2023 season marks the 45th in Nashville Sounds team history, and the second as a member of the International League. It also marks the third consecutive year as the Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, and 14th overall with Milwaukee after the two organizations spent 10 years together from 2005-14.

Baseball's roots in Nashville go back to the 19th Century. In fact, baseball has been played in Middle Tennessee since at least 1860, when the Republican Banner newspaper published a July 25th report on the game's popularity the previous fall. During the Civil War, Union soldiers temporarily based here helped spread the game in the local community. Home field was a place known as the Sulphur Springs Bottom, a half-mile north of today's state capitol.



When the original Southern League was organized in 1885, Nashville was a charter city and games were played at Nashville's Athletic Park, as the Sulphur Springs Bottom location came to be known. The city fielded several entries in the league over the next ten years -- the Americans (1885-86), the Blues (1887), the Tigers (1893-94), and the Scraps (1895) -- but was unable to claim a pennant.

When the Southern Association was formed in 1901, Athletic Park -- which was later given the name Sulphur Dell by famed sportswriter Grantland Rice -- became the permanent home to the Nashville Volunteers (or Vols, for short), who played there for the next 61 years. Under the guidance of manager Newt Fisher, the Nashville club won the SA's first two pennants. The team, which was not known as the Vols until a "name the team" contest conducted prior to the 1908 season, continued to build a solid, loyal fan base.

Over the years, Nashville would stake claim to several more pennants, 18 SA batting championships, and the all-time SA home run mark (Bob Lennon blasted 64 home runs in 1954).

The hitters weren't the only players experiencing success, however. Vols hurlers notched 16 SA strikeout titles -- more than any other team -- and Nashville produced several 20-game winners. But year after year, the league's ERA title eluded Nashville pitchers, mainly due to the extremely short 262-foot porch in right field that resulted in countless home runs for left-handed sluggers and caused pitchers to refer to the ballpark as "Sulphur Hell."

Negro League baseball was also part of the Nashville sports landscape in the early 20th century. Nashville's Thomas T. Wilson formed the semi-pro Nashville Standard Giants in 1920 and the team quickly built regional reputation throughout the South. In 1931, Wilson's team gained entry into the Negro National League and was later renamed the Nashville Elite Giants.

Wilson Park, an 8,000-seat stadium, was constructed in early 1929 in the Trimble Bottom section of Nashville, near the old Meharry Medical College and Waldon College, right in the middle of Nashville's largest Negro community. His marketing strategy, however, appealed to fans of all race and the facility was used throughout the following decade by numerous community groups and promoters, both black and white.

Unfortunately, the Negro National League disbanded the following year but Wilson kept his team alive by joining the Southern Negro League in the 1932 season. The NNL was reincarnated in 1933 and the Elite Giants rejoined the league for two additional seasons in 1933-34. Due to a declining economy, Wilson moved the club to Columbus following the 1934 campaign, ending Nashville's involvement in the Negro League scene.

In addition to the professional teams based in Nashville, Sulphur Dell also played host to countless Major League clubs and several Hall of Famers over the years. It was common for teams to stop and play games in Nashville on their route from Florida spring training to their northern homes. In addition, barnstorming teams became popular visitors to the Dell.



Among the famous names to play on this site over the years include Babe Ruth, Lou Gehrig, Hank Aaron (who made his professional debut at Sulphur Dell), Ted Williams, Minnie Minoso, Monte Irvin, Cool Papa Bell, Bob Feller, Rube Waddell, Warren Spahn, Satchel Paige, Roy Campanella, Jackie Robinson, Eddie Mathews, Josh Gibson, and Honus Wagner.

Following the 1961 season, the Southern Association disbanded and Sulphur Dell sat empty for a year. But in 1963, the South Atlantic League came to town and Nashville had its first Double-A team.

Unfortunately, the Double-A Vols had a disappointing inaugural season and the franchise folded. In 1969, Sulphur Dell was razed and a parking lot was built on the site.

After a fifteen-year hiatus, professional baseball returned to Music City in 1978 as the Southern League expansion franchise team, the Nashville Sounds. Owner and general manager Larry Schmittou, who had been involved in the Nashville baseball scene for several years as the head coach of the Vanderbilt collegiate squad, was instrumental in the re-emergence of pro baseball in Nashville.

Schmittou employed the city's entertainment scene into the nickname and country & western stars such as Larry Gatlin, Jerry Reed, Conway Twitty, and Richard Sterban (bass singer of the Oak Ridge Boys) became Sounds stockholders.

The club played their home games at a new facility, Herschel Greer Stadium, located south of downtown at the foot of St. Cloud Hill in Fort Negley Park. Fans responded to the return of baseball to the city by flocking to the ballpark. Nashville led the Southern League in attendance in each of their seven seasons as a member of the circuit.

As a Cincinnati Reds affiliate in the Double-A Southern League, the Sounds finished ninth during their inaugural campaign in 1978 but easily led the league in attendance, drawing 380,000 fans (more than double the second-place attendance). The club returned with a resurgence the following season, leading the nation in minor league attendance and capturing the Southern League crown behind manager George Scherger. The Sounds beat cross-state rival Memphis for the Western Division title, then defeated Columbus for the SL championship. Pitcher Scott Brown captured the one honor that had eluded Nashville pitchers for years, winning the ERA title with a 2.40 mark.



In 1980, the Sounds switched affiliations, becoming a part of the famed New York Yankees organization, and remained at the top of their game. Skippers Stump Merrill and Johnny Oates and players such as Steve Balboni, Don Mattingly, Buck Showalter, Otis Nixon, Willie McGee, Pat Tabler, Dan Pasqua, and Jamie Werly helped lead Nashville to first or second place finishes in their division from 1980-84. In 1982, Brian Dayett brought Music City its second Southern League championship with a dramatic 12th-inning homer. Two years later, Jim De-shaies hurled the club's first no-hitter.

In 1984, Schmittou purchased the Evansville Triplets of the American Association and in 1985 moved the franchise to Nashville. Nashville's Southern League franchise was moved to Huntsville (as the Sounds became a Triple-A franchise for the first time), but the Southern League would later make a unique reappearance at Greer.

The Sounds' initial Triple-A affiliation was with the Detroit Tigers from 1985-86. Although Nashville failed to win any titles during this two-year period, there were several individual accomplishments worth mentioning. Scotti Madison and Bruce Fields posted back-to-back American Association batting titles, and Bryan Kelly tossed the club's second no-hitter.

Sounds alumni were well-represented at the major-league level in 1985. Don Mattingly of the Yankees (1981 Sounds) picked up the American League's Most Valuable Player Award, while the National League MVP honor went to Willie McGee of the Cardinals, a Sounds player in 1980-81.

In 1987, the Sounds rejoined the Cincinnati farm system, this time as the Reds' Triple-A affiliate. Over the first three seasons (1987-89), Nashville fans enjoyed the opportunity to watch players who eventually made up two-thirds of Cincinnati's 1990 World Series championship roster. The Sounds also experienced success in 1990, winning an Eastern Division championship in a one-game playoff with Buffalo after both clubs finished the regular season in a tie. The extra-inning affair was one of the most exciting games in club history and was decided by Chris Jones' two-run homer in the top of the 18th inning.

Greer Stadium was the site of a rare baseball occurrence in 1988, when Nashville and Indianapolis exchanged no-hitters on back-to-back nights in early August. Jack Armstrong fired a no-no one night after Indianapolis' Randy Johnson registered a no-hitter against the Sounds, although Nashville was able to post a 1-0 victory in the contest due to a handful of Indians errors.

Over the early '90s, Nashville became a solid member of the American Association and set its all-time attendance mark when 605,122 fans came out to Greer Stadium in 1990. The Sounds switched affiliations again in 1993, this time becoming the top farm club of the Chicago White Sox. In their first year with the Sox, the Sounds won an Eastern Division crown and continued to enjoy excellent attendance, drawing over 400,000 fans for the fifth consecutive year.

The 1993 season also brought two additions to the Greer Stadium landscape: the signature, guitar-shaped scoreboard and a second professional team.

Following the '92 campaign, Charlotte moved up to the Triple-A level and when a proposed transfer of the Double-A franchise to New Orleans was blocked shortly before the season began, the Southern League suddenly had a homeless club. Sounds owner Larry Schmittou offered the use of Greer Stadium for the 1993 season. The Nashville Xpress -- a Twins affiliate -- would schedule home games during Sounds road trips, offering pro ball on a daily basis to local fans.

The Double-A Xpress won the first half in the West, but fell to eventual SL champion Birmingham in the playoff opener, while the Sounds went on to the American Association Championship Series before falling to Iowa in extra innings in Game 7. The Xpress were back for one more season in 1994 before relocating to Wilmington, N.C. for the 1995 season. The '94 Southern League campaign brought perhaps the most famous visitor to Greer Stadium -- Birmingham outfielder Michael Jordan, who was the talk of minor league baseball during his one-year retirement from the Chicago Bulls, made several appearances in Nashville.

On the Triple-A front, the Sounds experienced great success during their five-year affiliation with the White Sox, winning a pair of Eastern Division crowns and appearing in the 1994 American Association championship (lost to Indianapolis). Fans were provided the opportunity to watch future major-league stars such as Magglio Ordonez, Ray Durham, and James Baldwin, while many of the players who would go on to make up the 2000 AL Central champion White Sox fine-tuned their skills at Greer Stadium.

The American Association disbanded in 1997 and the Sounds joined the Pacific Coast League as a member of the Pittsburgh Pirates organization -- their fifth major league organization. Along with a new big-league affiliate came a new logo, color scheme, and uniform. The Sounds spent seven seasons as a Bucs affiliate, making the playoffs once over that span.



Outfielder Chad Hermansen blasted 92 home runs in his five seasons as a Sound (1998-2002) to become the franchise's all-time leader in that category. Left-handed slugger Ivan Cruz (1999-00) became a crowd favorite with his jaw-dropping home runs. Catcher Craig Wilson burst onto the scene in 2000, falling one short of the club record with 33 homers. The PCL All-Star tied a Sounds record in June of that year by swatting three longballs in one game. And catcher Humberto Cota led the Sounds with 71 RBI in 2001 to earn the Pittsburgh Pirates' Minor League Player of the Year award.

Journeyman right-hander John Wasdin added his name to the record book in dramatic fashion during his first start of the 2003 season. The 30-year-old tossed the Sounds' first perfect game and only the second nine-inning perfect in the 100-year history of the Pacific Coast League. Wasdin's gem against Albuquerque propelled Nashville to a 14-1 start, which they rode to an Eastern Division title (their first in 10 years) and a berth in the PCL Championship Series (where they were swept by Sacramento, 3-0).

Following the 2004 season, the Sounds changed affiliates once again, welcoming the Milwaukee Brewers to town as the sixth different major-league franchise to set up shop in Music City.

In the club's first season as a Brewers affiliate in 2005, the Sounds captured the Pacific Coast League championship -- the club's first-ever Triple-A title and the city of Nashville's first professional championship in 23 years, dating back to the Sounds' Southern League title in 1982.

Greer Stadium began showing its age in the 2000s and Sounds ownership initiated discussions with government officials about the possibility of a new ballpark for the city. Nashville Mayor Karl Dean announced in November 2013 that an agreement had been made for a new home for the Sounds.

In 2015, the Sounds moved into a brand new, state-of-the-art facility at the old Sulphur Dell site. The \$47 million dollar First Tennessee Park opened on April 17, 2015 when the Sounds topped the Colorado Springs Sky Sox, 3-2, in 10 innings. Along with the new ballpark, the Sounds enjoyed their first season with a new affiliate - the Oakland Athletics. The Sounds finished in third place in the American Southern Division with a 66-78 record and missed the playoffs for the eighth consecutive season.

The second year with the new affiliate brought a season full of success. The Sounds finished with a record of 83-59 record in the regular season, the best in the Pacific Coast League. The 83 wins were tied for fifth-most in franchise history, and were the most a Nashville team has had since the 2007 team won 89 games. They returned to the playoffs for the first time since that 2007 season and won the franchise's fifth division title since joining the PCL in 1998.

The season ended in heartbreak, however, as Nashville met the Oklahoma City Dodgers in the American Conference Finals where the season came to a dramatic end in game five. After winning game one at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark, the Sounds dropped game two the next night. They came back to win game three at home to take a 2-1 series lead, but the Dodgers won game four, 7-1, to set up a deciding game. In a game that featured five lead changes, the Sounds blew a 9-7 lead in the eighth inning and lost game five, 10-9.

In 2017, the Sounds finished 68-71, good for second place in the American Southern Division. Despite the sub-.500 record on the field, fans flocked to First Tennessee Park in record numbers. 22 sellouts were recorded during the season, and the Sounds averaged a PCL-best 8,861 fans per game at home. Prior to the start of the 2018 season, Trevor Hoffman became the first Nashville Sounds player to be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame.

2018 would be Nashville's final season as the Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics. Manager Fran Riordan led the club to a 72-68 record despite constant roster turnover. On August 3, 2018, the Sounds notched franchise win number 3,000 with a 6-2 win over Fresno. On August 28, 2018, Nashville won its 1,500th game as a member of the Pacific Coast League. The 2018 season was highlighted by Nick Martini's incredible franchise-record, 66-game on-base streak. In four years as the A's Triple-A affiliate, the Sounds finished with a 289-276 record.

Following the 2018 season, a major franchise change occurred for the Sounds. On September 20, 2018, in a press conference at First Tennessee Park, the Sounds and Texas Rangers entered into a four-year Player Development Contract, making the Sounds the new Triple-A affiliate of the Texas Rangers. The offseason of change continued when the Sounds revealed their remastered identity. The team changed all logos, marks and uniforms in a November 15 presentation at First Tennessee Park.

The new era of Nashville Sounds baseball began when First Tennessee Park hosted its first Major League Baseball exhibition game on March 24, 2019. The Sounds hosted the Texas Rangers in front of a record-breaking crowd of 11,824 on a Sunday afternoon.

Momentum continued into the 2019 season in which the ballpark hosted 23 sellouts as the Sounds finished third in average attendance in all of Minor League Baseball. On the field, Nashville finished in third place in the Pacific Coast League's American Northern Division with a 66-72 mark. The season was highlighted by several team records set by pitcher Tim Dillard and the power display from prolific duo of Matt Davidson (33) and Patrick Wisdom (31) who combined to hit 64 home runs.

Following the 2019 season, the Sounds were named the 2019 Triple-A winner of Baseball America's coveted Freitas Award. The Freitas Awards have been presented by Baseball America annually since 1989 and recognize franchises for their community involvement, long-term business success and consistent operational excellence.

2020 brought a multitude of events to both Nashville and the Sounds. In the late hours of March 2 and early hours of March 3, a tornado ravaged Nashville and the Germantown neighborhood that is home to the ballpark. The iconic guitar scoreboard was severely damaged and a large portion needed to be rebuilt. The roof to the ballpark also suffered significant damage.

During the rebuild phase of the guitar and roof repair, First Tennessee Park officially changed to First Horizon Park. In the first five years of the park, a total of 2,844,713 fans entered the gates and 98 games were sold out.

The tragic tornado was only a sign of things to come. The Covid-19 pandemic hit Minor League Baseball hard. In early July, the entire minor league season was cancelled.

The long-standing agreement between Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball ended on September 30, 2020 which meant significant changes were ahead. On December 9, 2020, the Sounds received an invitation from the Milwaukee Brewers as part of MLB's new player development structure. The organization officially accepted the invitation and became the new Triple-A affiliate of the Brewers.

The second installment of the Sounds' affiliation with the Milwaukee Brewers began in 2021. Rick Sweet, who managed the club in 2014, returned as skipper and led the Sounds to a 70-58 record. Still recovering from the pandemic, the Sounds and First Horizon Park were limited to 40% capacity for the first three home games. When the capacity restriction was lifted, fans came out with authority. The Sounds led Minor League Baseball in total attendance (436,868) and per-game attendance (6,721).

On the field, Nashville's 70-58 record was good for fourth place in the newly formed Triple-A East League Southeast Division. From May 18 to June 3, the team matched a franchise record by winning 15 consecutive games.

In their first season in the new International League, the Sounds won the West Division to qualify for the International League Championship Game. With a record of 91-58, Nashville was the only team to cross the 90-win threshold in Minor League Baseball. Just like in '21, the Sounds paced Minor League Baseball in total attendance (555,576). The season also boasted the highest single-game attendance in First Horizon Park history with 12,409 fans on July 16.

After the 2022 season, the Sounds were honored as the Organization of the Year by Minor League Baseball, receiving the award for the first time in the club's 45-year history.

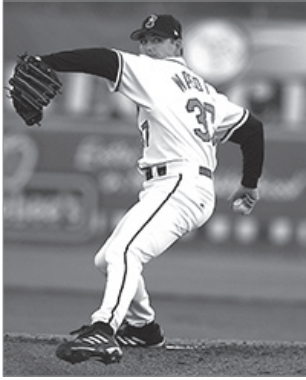


JOHN WASDIN'S PERFECT GAME

April 7, 2003 is a day that will live forever in the baseball history books. It just happened to be a perfect day for John Wasdin.

The 30-year-old Nashville Sounds starter fired the first perfect game in the team's 26-year history in a 4-0, 100-pitch victory over the visiting Albuquerque Isotopes at Greer Stadium.

The rare achievement was only the second nine-inning perfect game in the 100-year history of the Pacific Coast League. Wasdin struck out Isotopes pinch hitter Rob Stratton on four pitches to close the game before he was mobbed by his teammates just in front of the mound following his first start of the season.



Wasdin matched a Nashville individual-game record with 15 strikeouts in the contest, including the final two batters he faced, to etch his name in the record books. 72 of his 100 pitches were thrown for strikes.

Nashville manager Trent Jewett addressed the entire Sounds team about the night's significance in the Greer Stadium clubhouse immediately following the game.

"A lot of you have been in baseball a long time, but what you just witnessed, you'll never see anything more magical or more difficult," Jewett said. "Absolutely unbelievable."

Third baseman Mike Gulan provided the biggest defensive plays behind Wasdin, snaring a sharply-hit Matt Treanor line drive back-handed just inside the third-base line to record the first out of the ninth inning and making an outstanding barehand play on a Jesus Medrano bunt in the top of the fourth to nail the Isotope by a step.

Wasdin's perfect game was Nashville's first no-hit effort since Jack Armstrong tossed one against Indianapolis on August 7, 1988, and was the fourth by a Sounds hurler and eighth overall in a game involving the Sounds. Oklahoma City's Rick Helling fired a perfect game against the Sounds in 1996.

MANNY PARRA'S PERFECT GAME

Sounds left-hander Manny Parra made history on June 25, 2007 at The Dell Diamond in Round Rock, Texas, throwing a perfect game in Nashville's 3-0 victory over the Express in his second career Triple-A start.

The 24-year-old hurler was mobbed near the mound by teammates shortly after 9:43 p.m. as first baseman Brad Nelson gazed a game-ending popup off the bat of pinch hitter Jesse Garcia as Parra etched his name into the record books.

"I don't think I even watched it come down," Parra said. "I was thinking, 'Is this really happening?' It was unbelievable. It's something I never thought I'd do. I've never even seen a no-hitter in person."

Parra's teammates mobbed the Sacramento native at the mound as the remaining opposing fans at The Dell Diamond gave him a standing ovation.

"It's the greatest feeling I've ever had," Parra said.

Parra, who earned his first career Triple-A victory with the historic effort, set a new career high with 11 strikeouts in the contest. He had previously fanned 10 batters on five occasions.

The southpaw, who threw 107 pitches including 77 strikes, did not face a three-ball count against any batter until the bottom of the seventh inning and worked through three-ball counts only three times all evening.

The rare achievement was only the third nine-inning perfect game in the 104-year history of the Pacific Coast League – and the second by a member of the Nashville Sounds.

Tacoma's John Halama threw the first PCL perfect game on July 8, 2001 before the Sounds' John Wasdin duplicated the feat on April 7, 2003 at Greer Stadium.

It was the sixth no-hit effort by a Sounds hurler (second perfect game) and 11th overall no-hitter in a game involving the Sounds in the club's 30-year history.

24-INNING GAME

The Nashville Sounds were on the short end of a 5-4 loss to the New Orleans Zephyrs as the teams participated in a Pacific Coast League record-tying 24-inning marathon on May 5th & 6th, 2006 at Greer Stadium.

The 24-inning contest, which finished with a game time of eight hours and seven minutes, was the longest in both teams' histories and matched the existing PCL mark originally set on June 8, 1909 in a game between San Francisco and Oakland then equaled on September 10, 1911 in a game between Sacramento and Portland.

Zephyrs catcher Wiki Gonzalez provided the game-winner when he drove in pitcher-turned-rightfielder Chris Schroder with a one-out RBI single up the middle off Mike Meyers that glanced off the glove of Sounds second baseman Jermaine Clark. Schroder had drawn a one-out walk and moved to second on a Josh Labandeira single.

The game-deciding run was the first scored by either team in 15 innings as both teams remained scoreless from the 10th through the 23rd frames. The Sounds and Z's completed the final six innings of the contest on Saturday, May 6th after playing to a 4-4 tie through 18 innings the previous night before the game was halted due to a curfew rule.

Barnwell bounced right back with a leadoff double in the bottom of the fourth and later scored from third on a squeeze bunt by pitcher Dennis Sarfate.

Nashville added another run in the seventh on a Brent Abernathy RBI single to extend the lead to 3-1.

The visitors came back with one run in the eighth when Tyrell Godwin was hit by an Allan Simpson pitch with the bases loaded to force home Brendan Harris.

With the Zephyrs down to their final strike in the top of the ninth, Henry Mateo scored from second on a two-out, two-strike single into left field by Harris off Simpson to tie the game up at four runs apiece.

Neither team would strike again until the top of the 24th inning.

He played two stints with the Sounds, in 1979 (AA-Reds) and again from 1988-90 (AAA-Reds) and ranks among the top three in every major offensive category on the Nashville career leaderboard.

Barnes enjoyed success during both stints as a member of the Sounds. He was a member of Nashville’s first Southern League championship-winning squad in 1979, pacing the club with 145 games played in his second year as a pro.



He excelled at the plate in his second go-around in Music City, pacing the Triple-A American Association with 39 doubles in 1989 to earn a spot on the league’s postseason All-Star team and led the circuit with 156 hits in 1990, a year in which he also ranked among the league leaders with 83 runs scored and 34 stolen bases in helping guide the Sounds to a berth in the American Association championship series (Nashville lost to Omaha, 3-2).

The 16-year veteran spent time in the Cincinnati, Montreal, Philadelphia, St. Louis, Milwaukee, Pittsburgh, and Detroit organizations during his pro career after being selected by the Reds in the first round (16th overall selection) of the June 1978 draft.

Barnes spent parts of nine major league seasons with the Reds, Expos, Cardinals, and Tigers and accumulated a .259 average over 353 ML games. It was Skeeter’s versatility as a utility player that earned him a spot in the big leagues. Barnes played seven different positions at the major-league level, a feat that most cannot list on their resume.

Additional highlights of Barnes’ major- and minor-league career include:

- Hit a career-high .368 for the rookie-level Billings Mustangs during his first pro season in 1978 ... and lost the Pioneer League batting race by nearly 100 points to teammate Eddie Milner, whose .462 mark still stands as an unsurpassed standard in any minor league season of 200 or more at-bats.
- Selected as team MVP and Eastern League All-Star in 1982 after a full year with Waterbury (AA-Reds).
- Initiated a triple play for Detroit on July 3, 1992, catching an attempted squeeze bunt by Seattle’s Omar Vizquel, tagging Dave Valle and throwing to first baseman Cecil Fielder to force out Harold Reynolds in the fifth inning.

Skeeter Barnes’ #00 was retired by the Nashville Sounds in the early 1990s.

Timothy Charles Dillard will go down as one of the all-time greats in Nashville Sounds history. The former right-hander is the career leader in wins (48), innings pitched (710.0), games (242) and strikeouts (437).

He played in parts of nine seasons from 2007-14 (Milwaukee Brewers) and 2019 (Texas Rangers) and ranks among franchise leaders in nearly every major pitching category.

Dillard made his Triple-A debut with the Sounds in 2007, being rated as Milwaukee's 15th-best prospect by Baseball America entering the season. His first win in Triple-A came on May 14 at Salt Lake, pitching all nine innings in a 4-3 triumph. He helped lead Nashville to an appearance in the Pacific Coast League American Conference Finals vs. New Orleans.

In 2008, Dillard switched into a bullpen role for the first time in his professional career. He made 23 scoreless appearances for the Sounds and posted a 1.99 ERA (63.1 IP/14 ER) in 37 outings. Dillard also made his Major League debut in 2008, tossing a scoreless frame for the Brewers on May 23 at Washington.



Dillard's first breakout year with Nashville came in 2009 when he led the team with 11 wins (1-4th in PCL) and 147.2 innings pitched. He was tabbed as the PCL Pitcher of the Week from July 20-26 (8.0 IP, 1 H, 0 ER) after retiring 22-consecutive Memphis batters on July 22.

Switching to a sidearm delivery in 2010, Dillard set a new Sounds single-season record with 16 hit batters (shattering the previous high of 11). Despite this infamous mark, he allowed just five runs in final 29.0 innings over his last four starts of the campaign.

Dillard continued to bounce between Nashville and Milwaukee in 2011 and 2012. He picked up his first Major League win on June 5, 2011 at Florida after retiring the final five batters of the contest.

Despite beginning the next two seasons in the independent Atlantic League, Dillard found his way back to Greer Stadium in 2013 and 2014. A rarity in professional baseball, Dillard found his home in Middle Tennessee after playing with Nashville in eight consecutive seasons.

As affiliations changed, Dillard stayed in the Brewers system from 2015-18 and pitched for Triple-A Colorado Springs. Following a four season hiatus, Dillard returned to the Sounds in 2019 after signing with the Texas Rangers in the prior offseason. He proceeded to lead the Sounds with nine wins and the PCL with 153.1 innings. The then 36-year-old ended his Nashville Sounds career on a high note, earning the win while striking out nine over 7.0 innings on September 1, 2019 vs. San Antonio.

On the same night as his bobblehead giveaway, Tim Dillard's #17 was retired in an on-field ceremony on July 29, 2022.

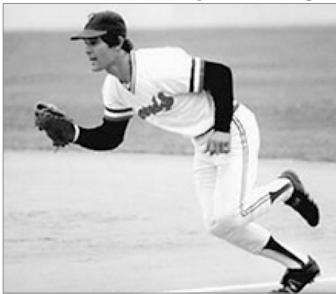
Donald Arthur Mattingly played just one season in Nashville but made quite an impression on Music City while manning first base for the New York Yankees' Double-A affiliate in 1981.

Mattingly batted .316 (173-for-547) with seven homers and 98 RBIs in 141 games with the Sounds that season. He led the team in games played, hits, doubles (35) and RBIs; his 35 doubles were also the tops in the Southern League that year.

He also ranked among team leaders in hitting (2nd), at-bats (2nd), runs scored (4th-74), homers (T-4th), and walks (2nd-64). Mattingly only struck out an impressive 55 times in his 547 at-bats that year.

At the end of the year, he was named the Yankees' Minor League Player of the Year as well as to the TOPPS and Southern League All-Star teams.

"Donnie Baseball" established himself as one of the preeminent major-league stars of the 1980s. He hit for average and power, fielded his position at first base with brilliance and displayed a work ethic and charisma reminiscent of Yankee greats of the past.



He became an everyday major league player in 1984 and hit 23 homers en route to capturing the batting title on the last day of the season with a .343 average that edged teammate Dave Winfield's .340. In doing so, he became the first Yankee left-handed hitter to bat over .340 since Lou Gehrig hit .351 in 1937.

Mattingly established himself as a dominant hitter from 1984 through 1989. In each of those seasons, he hit over .300, collected more than 186 hits, and -- except for 1988 -- drove in 100 or more runs. During that period, no major league player had more RBIs than his 684, and only Wade Boggs (1,269) had more hits than Mattingly's 1,219. Mattingly displayed his power in 1985 when, batting third in the Yankee lineup, he amassed career highs of 35 home runs and a league-leading 145 RBIs en route to being named AL MVP (note: Willie McGee, another former Sound and Mattingly's

teammate on the 1981 Nashville squad, captured the NL MVP award that year while playing for the St. Louis Cardinals).

In 1986, Mattingly set new Yankees marks for doubles (53) and hits (238) in a season, becoming the first Yankee since Lou Gehrig to log three consecutive 200-hit seasons. During the 1987 season, Mattingly set or tied five remarkable major league records. He hit six grand slams to set a new single-season mark (he had never hit one prior to 1987). He tied Dale Long's 1956 record by homering in eight consecutive games from July 8-18. His 10 homers during that period were a major league record for total homers in an eight-game streak, and his concurrent streak of 10 games with at least one extra-base hit broke Babe Ruth's 1921 AL record. The power streak ended on July 20, the night Mattingly tied the major league record of 22 putouts by a first baseman in a nine-inning game.

From 1985 through 1989, he won five consecutive Gold Glove awards at first base. Along with Chick Gandil (1916-1919) of the legendary Chicago "Black Sox," Mattingly (1984-1987) holds the record of leading AL first basemen in fielding percentage for four consecutive years. Upon his retirement in 1997, his .996 lifetime fielding percentage at first base tied him for the all-time lead. His extraordinary fielding skills allowed him to play second base and third base on a few occasions despite throwing left-handed.

Don Mattingly returned to Greer Stadium on August 12, 1999, when his #18 was retired by the Nashville in an on-field ceremony.

CREDENTIALS: Full season and daily credentials for Nashville Sounds games at First Horizon Park are available upon request for legitimate news-gathering organizations. Applications for credentials can be completed on the Nashville Sounds website. Media can select 'Sounds Game Center' under the 'Team' tab and apply for full season or single-game credential. Inquiries and questions can also be directed to Cory Hilborne (coryh@nashvillesounds.com). **Requests must be received at least 24 hours in advance** to guarantee timely processing. Members of the Baseball Writers of America Association (BBWAA) do not need to apply for credentials but are requested to reach out the Nashville Sounds communications department so that accommodations can be made in the press box. Credentials are to be picked up at the First Horizon Park will call window, located next to the suite level entrance on Junior Gilliam Way.

***Note:** No spouses, guests, or children of media members will be issued credentials. Sounds credentials are non-transferable. Only credentials issued by the Nashville Sounds, Milwaukee Brewers, Major League Baseball or Minor League Baseball will be honored. All credentials must be visible at all times.

BALLPARK ACCESS: The media entrance to First Horizon Park is the gameday staff entrance, located near the corner of Junior Gilliam Way and Rep. John Lewis Way. Media members must have their credentials in order to enter the ballpark. There is limited parking for media in the Nashville Sounds Suite Holder Parking lot across from the Right Field entrance. Gates for the event open one hour before the scheduled game time (excluding Opening Night and select specialty nights). Media access will be permitted earlier if scheduled through the Nashville Sounds communications department.

WORKING PRESS BOX: The Nashville Sounds Press Box, located on the second floor of First Horizon Park behind home plate, is for working and credentialed members of the media ONLY. Access, daily notes, lineups, and statistics will be made available at least 90 minutes before first pitch. Box scores will be made available immediately following the game. Game notes are also available for online viewing at www.nashvillesounds.com under the Sounds Game Center tab. Working space is limited – desk space will be on a first-come basis. A light spread will be available to working media only.

WORKING ACCESS: Media members attending games throughout the 2026 season who gain access with a media credential MUST be working the game/event they are at. Credentials MAY NOT be used as a game ticket or for recreational access. Team operations staff are aware of these restrictions when presented with a media credential.

REQUESTING INTERVIEWS: All interviews for Nashville Sounds players/staff will be coordinated through the Sounds communications department. All opposing player/staff requests will be coordinated through each team's media relations staff. Media members will only be allowed on the field with prior approval from the Nashville Sounds communications staff. **ALL INTERVIEWS MUST BE SCHEDULED** through the Nashville Sounds communications department. Pre-and post-game interviews can be arranged and should be requested in advance. If requested on the day of the game, the Nashville Sounds communications staff will do their best to accommodate and arrange an interview based on player/staff ability. Media requests can be made by emailing Cory Hilborne (coryh@nashvillesounds.com).

CLUBHOUSE ACCESS: Both the home and visiting clubhouse at First Horizon Park are CLOSED at all times, unless permission is granted by the Sounds or a visiting communications department. Player and manager pre-game availability will be conducted on-field during each team's batting practice. Post-game availability will be conducted at a designated area to be determined by the Sounds communications department. Clubhouse access will be granted to all media when special situations arise, as determined by the Nashville Sounds. Access to the visiting clubhouse is subject to the visiting team's guidelines. **THE TRAINER'S ROOM IS CLOSED TO THE MEDIA AT ALL TIMES.**

FIELD ACCESS: Credentialed media members will be allowed access to the playing field with prior approval. At no time will media members be allowed in fair territory or beyond first or third base. Pre-game interviews must be conducted before or at the conclusion of Sounds batting practice and during the visitor's batting practice. All non-uniformed personnel must clear the field at the conclusion of the visiting team's batting practice unless that individual has credentials for in-game privileges.

CAMERA/PHOTOGRAPHER LOCATIONS: TV cameras and photographers are available to shoot anywhere around the 360-degree concourse at First Horizon Park, if open and available, and if it does not obstruct fans. Please be mindful of the stadium staff and ballpark cameras. Field-level or dugout camera well access during a game MUST be pre-approved by the Nashville Sounds Communications Staff. Do not enter the playing field at any time. Photographers permitted to work out of the camera bays located at the far ends of each dugout must exit the field using the gate leading to the stands at the far end of each dugout. Chairs are available in the dugouts. If you wish to switch dugouts, please wait until the half-inning is complete and walk along the track behind home plate to the other side. Photographers must gain permission from Media Relations department to shoot from behind home plate area. **Please note that possession of and/or usage of drones on ballpark property and/or ballpark airspace is explicitly prohibited; violators could face local and federal penalties.**

AUTOGRAPHS/PERSONAL PHOTOS: Under NO circumstances are credentialed media members permitted to seek autographs, photos, or equipment from the playing field, dugout, or clubhouse/hallway. Violation of this policy will result in immediate termination if the media member's credential for the season.



JEFF HEM - PLAY-BY-PLAY BROADCASTER

Jeff Hem continues to serve as the “Voice Of The Sounds” for the 2026 season. He enters his 14th year in Music City and his 20th overall season behind the microphone.

In 2012, Hem arrived in Nashville with eight seasons and over 1,100 games of professional baseball experience under his belt. He spent the previous seven seasons with the Single-A Kane County Cougars of the Midwest League, including 2009 when the Cougars, then an A’s affiliate, were managed by former Sounds skipper Steve Scarson.

Career highlights for Hem include making his regular season Major League broadcast debut in June 2018 with the Oakland A’s for a doubleheader at the Chicago White Sox, being part of the radio broadcast team for the Triple-A All-Star Game in Columbus, Ohio, in July 2018, and calling the inaugural game at First Horizon Park on April 17, 2015. While with the Cougars, he

also enjoyed the opportunity to call two minor league games at Wrigley Field in Chicago and Busch Stadium in St. Louis.

His additional duties for the Sounds include sponsorship and corporate sales and performing public speaking engagements. In the baseball offseason, Hem continues to call the play-by-play action for several college and high school basketball and football games on television and radio.

A native of Aurora, Illinois and a graduate of the University of Iowa, Hem began his broadcasting career while in college before completing an internship with the Battle Creek Yankees en route to gaining his position with Kane County. He and his wife, Alissa, reside in Hendersonville, Tenn., with their two children.



On March 21, 2024, the Nashville Sounds Baseball Club and Cromwell Media announced a multi-year partnership extension that continues to broadcast all 150 regular season Sounds on both terrestrial radio and streaming apps, with 94.9 The Fan continuing to serve as the team’s flagship radio station throughout Middle Tennessee.

The vast majority of Sounds broadcasts will again be heard on 94.9 The Fan, with select broadcasts airing on Sports Talk 830-AM. Fans can also listen to all Sounds games from any location by streaming on The Game Nashville app, as well as the MiLB First Pitch app.

Jeff Hem will handle the play-by-play duties for all broadcasts in his 14th season as the “Voice of the Sounds.” Broadcasts begin 15 minutes before the first pitch.

Consecutive-Game Hitting Streak: A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if a player's plate appearances (one or more) result in a base on balls, hit by pitch, defensive interference or sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if a player has a sacrifice fly or no hit.

Consecutive-Game Playing Streak: A consecutive-game playing streak shall be extended if the player plays one-half inning on defense or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running experience only shall not extend the streak. If a player is ejected from a game by an umpire before he can comply with the requirements of this rule, his streak shall continue.

Day/Night Game: Any game scheduled to start at or after 5:00 p.m. will be considered a night game. If a game is scheduled to start before 5 p.m. and is delayed by rain or for any other reason, it shall be considered a day game. However, both games of a two-night doubleheader shall be considered night games. When afternoon and night games are played on the same day and separate admissions are charged, they will be counted as one day and one night game and will not be considered a doubleheader.

Determining Games Back in Standings: Determine the games above .500 of team in first place, minus the games above .500 of the team you're trying to figure out. Example: If the team in first is 5 games above .500 and you are trying to figure out how many games back a team is that is one game above .500, then $5-1=4$, so the team is 4 games back. Or the number of fewer wins plus the number of extra losses than the leader in the standings, divided by 2.

Magic Number: Determine the number of games yet to be played, add one, then subtract the number of games ahead in the loss column of the standings from the closest opponent.

Qualifying Marks: In order to qualify for a league batting title, a player must have a minimum of 2.7 plate appearances per team game. To qualify for an earned run average title, a pitcher must have accumulated a minimum of 0.8 inning pitched per game.

Quality Start: Defined as a start where a pitcher lasts six or more innings and gives up three or fewer earned runs.

Save Rule: Credit a pitcher with a save when he meets all three of the following conditions: (1) He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club; (2) He is not the winning pitcher; and (3) He qualifies under one of the following conditions: (a) He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning; or (b) He enters the game, regardless of the count, with the potential tying run on either base, or at bat, or on deck; or (c) He pitches effectively for at least three innings. No more than one save can be credited in each game.

Hold Rule: The hold is not an official statistic, but it was created as a way to credit middle relief pitchers for a successful outing. If a reliever comes into a game to protect a lead, gets at least one out and leaves without giving up that lead, he is credited with a hold. You cannot get a save and a hold in the same game.

Winning Pitcher: The starting pitcher will be credited with the win only if the pitcher has pitched at least five complete innings and his team not only is in the lead when he is replaced, but remains in the lead the remainder of the game. **EXCEPTION:** The "must-pitch-five-complete-innings" rule in respect to the starting pitcher shall be in effect for all games of six or more innings. In a five-inning game, credit the starting pitcher with a game won only if he has pitched at least four complete innings and his team not only is in the lead when he is replaced, but remains in the lead for the remainder of the game. When the starting pitcher does not meet the preceding criteria and more than one relief pitcher is used, the victory shall be awarded on the following basis:

1. When, during the tenure of the starting pitcher, the winning team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game, credit the victory to the relief pitcher judged by the official scorer to have been the most effective.
2. Whenever the score is tied, the game becomes a new contest insofar as the winning and losing pitcher is concerned.
3. Once the opposing team assumes the lead, all pitchers who have pitched up to that point are excluded from being credited with the victory, except the current pitcher.
4. The winning relief pitcher shall be the one who is the pitcher of record when his team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game. **EXCEPTION:** Do not credit a victory to a relief pitcher who is ineffective in a brief appearance, when a succeeding relief pitcher pitches effectively in helping his team maintain the lead. In such cases, credit the succeeding relief pitcher with the victory.

Determining Batting Average: Divide the number of at-bats by the number of hits.

Determining Earned Run Average: Take the number of earned runs, multiply by nine, and divide by innings pitched.

Determining Fielding Percentage: Divide the total number of putouts and assists by the combined total of putouts, assists, and errors.

Determining Slugging Percentage: Divide the total bases of all hits by the total times at bat (at-bats do not include walks, sacrifices, times awarded first base on interference or obstruction, or when hit by pitcher).

Determining On-Base Percentage: Add hits, walks, and hit by pitches, then divide by the combined total of at-bats, walks, hit by pitches, and sacrifice flies (times awarded first base on interference or obstruction are not figured into OBP).

Major League Rookie Status: A player is considered a rookie if he has no more than 130 at-bats or 50 innings pitched in the big leagues. He is not a rookie if he has spent more than 45 days on a major-league roster during the 25-player limit, even if he has fewer than 130 at-bats or 50 innings pitched (service time requirement excludes stints on the DL or in the military).

Options: When a player is on the 40-man roster and in the minor leagues, he is on “optional assignment.” Players have three option years and can be sent up and down as many times as the club chooses within those seasons but will only be charged with one option per season. When a player is “out of options,” he will have to clear irrevocable waivers in order to be removed from the 40-man roster and sent to the minor leagues.

Waivers: If a player placed on major league waivers is not claimed by another team within two business days after waivers have been requested, then the player has “cleared waivers” and the team has secured waivers for the remainder of the waiver period. The team can do one of three things:

1. Send the player to the minors via outright assignment; or
2. Trade the player to another team, even if the trading deadline has passed; or
3. Release the player.

Note: Any trades involving a 40-man roster player (July 31 through the end of the regular season) may only involve players who have cleared major league waivers.

If a player does not clear waivers (claimed by another team or teams), the club requesting waivers may withdraw the waiver request. If the club does not withdraw the waiver request, the player’s contract is assigned as follows:

- a. If only one claim is entered, the player’s contract is assigned to that claiming club.
- b. If more than one club in the same league makes claims, the club currently lower in the standings gets the player.
- c. If clubs in both leagues claim the player, preference shall always go to the club in the same league as the club requesting waivers.

Designated For Assignment: This transaction allows a club to open a roster spot for up to a 10-day period while waiting for a player to clear waivers, after which he must be released, traded, or assigned to the minor leagues.

Recalled vs. Contract Selected: If a player is on the 40-man roster, he is “recalled.” If not, then his “contract is selected” from the minor league team. A player must be added to the 40-man roster when his contract is selected.

Rule 5 Draft: A player not on the 40-man roster is eligible for this yearly December draft if:

1. The player was 18 or younger when he first signed a pro contract and this is the fourth Rule 5 draft since he signed; or
2. He was 19 or older when he first signed a pro contract and this is the third Rule 5 draft since he signed.

Major League Rehab Assignment: A major league player may be assigned to a minor league affiliate for the purpose of injury rehabilitation for a maximum of 20 days for non-pitchers and 30 days for pitchers. The player continues to receive his major league salary. Any service with the minor league club shall be deemed major league service. Rehabilitation assignments do not count as optional assignments.

International League Roster Limits: Triple-A rosters are limited to 28 active players throughout the entire playing season.

Minor League Injured List: Players placed on the disabled list must remain on the list for a minimum of seven consecutive days. Players on the IL do not count toward a team’s roster limit.



Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL): A primary stabilizing ligament within the center of the knee joint that prevents hyperextension and excessive rotation of the joint. A complete tear of the ACL necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Arthroscopy: A surgical examination of the internal structures of a joint by means of viewing through an arthroscope. An arthroscopic procedure can be used to remove or repair damaged tissue or as a diagnostic procedure in order to inspect the extent of any damage or confirm a diagnosis.

Capsule: An enclosing structure, which surrounds the joint and contains ligaments, which stabilize the joint.

Cartilage: Smooth, slippery substance preventing two ends of bones from rubbing together.

Collateral Ligament: On either side of, and acting as a radius of movement of, a hinge joint, as of the elbow, knee and wrist.

Concussion: Jarring injury of the brain resulting in dysfunction. It can be graded as mild, moderate or severe depending on loss of consciousness, amnesia and loss of equilibrium.

Contusion: An injury to a muscle and tissues caused by a blow from a blunt object.

Deltoid Muscle: Muscles at the top of the arm, just below the shoulder, responsible for shoulder motions to the front, side and back.

Epicondylitis: Inflammation in the elbow due to overuse.

Fracture: Any breach of continuity of a bone. Types of fractures include simple, compound, comminuted, greenstick, incomplete, impacted, longitudinal, oblique, stress and transverse.

Inflammation: The body's natural response to injury, in which the injury site might display various degrees of pain, swelling, heat, redness and/or loss of function.

Labrum: The cartilage of the glenoid cavity in the shoulder. A lip-edged or lip-like structure.

Ligament: Band of fibrous tissue that connects bone to bone, or bone to cartilage and supports and strengthens joints.

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI): imaging procedure in which a radio frequency pulse causes certain electrical elements of the injured tissue to react to this pulse and through this process a computer display and permanent film establish a visual image. MRI does not require radiation and is very useful in the diagnosis of soft tissue, disc and meniscus injuries.

Medial Collateral Ligament (MCL): Ligament of the knee along the medial aspect that connects the femur to the joint.

Meniscus: Crescent-shaped cartilage, usually pertaining to the knee joint; also known as "cartilage." There are two menisci in the knee: medial and lateral. These work to absorb weight within the knee and provide stability.

Patella: The kneecap. The patella functions to protect the distal end of the femur as well as increase the mechanical advantage and force generating capacities of the quadriceps muscle group.

Posterior Cruciate Ligament (PCL): A primary stabilizing ligament of the knee that provides significant stability and prevents displacement of the tibia backward within the knee joint. A complete tear of the ligament necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Rotator Cuff: Comprised of four muscles in the shoulder area that can be irritated by overuse. The muscles are the supraspinatus (most commonly injured), infraspinatus, teres minor and subscapularis.

Rotator Cuff Impingement Syndrome: A microtrauma or overuse injury caused by stress. The four stages are: 1) tendinitis with temporary thickening of the bursa and rotator cuff 2) fiber dissociation in the tendon with permanent thickening of the bursa and scar formation 3) a partial rotator cuff tear of less than 1 cm and 4) a complete tear of 1 cm or more.

Sprain: An injury to a ligament that results from overuse or trauma. Sprains occur when there is a stretch or tear in one or more ligaments, slightly elastic bands of tissue that keep the bones in place while permitting movement at a joint.

Strain: An injury to a tendon or muscle resulting from overuse or trauma.

Stress Fracture: A hairline type of break in a bone caused by overuse.

Tendinitis: Inflammation of the tendon and/or tendon sheath, caused by chronic overuse or sudden injury.

Ulnar Collateral Ligament: Located on the inside of the elbow - ligament that was replaced or repaired for Tommy John surgery.

Nashville is the capital of Tennessee and the entertainment, cultural, and commercial center of the Mid-South. With a metropolitan population of more than two million, Nashville has the largest population of any metropolitan area in Tennessee, which puts it among the 35 largest in the nation. Since the Sounds were founded in 1978, the metro population has grown 221 percent.

During the winter of 1779–1780, James Robertson and John Donelson founded a settlement at Big Salt Lick by the Cumberland River at the present site of the city. They built forts on both sides of the river, naming one of them Fort Nashborough in honor of Francis Nash, a Revolutionary War general. In 1784, the town was named Nashville, and it was incorporated as a city in 1806. The city serves as the final resting place of two U.S. presidents -- Andrew Jackson and James K. Polk.

Nashville is a pleasant mix of big-city entertainment and “down home” friendliness. Nashville’s location places it near the nation’s population center. Major cities such as St. Louis, Cincinnati, Memphis, Atlanta, & Birmingham can all be reached by car within 3-5 hours.

The city is also the cornerstone of the Mid-South economy. It has become a leader in printing and publishing, music and entertainment, finance and insurance, healthcare management, manufacturing, and tourism.

Internationally-known companies with corporate headquarters in Nashville include:

AllianceBernstein, Bridgestone/Firestone, Caterpillar Financial, Cracker Barrel, Ryman Hospitality Properties, Genesco, HCA Healthcare, Curb Records, Shoney’s, and Thomas Nelson Publishing.

In addition, KFC Restaurants, Dollar General, Gibson Guitar Corp., Ingram Industries, Kirkland’s, Nissan North America, Servpro Industries, Singor Corporation, Tractor Supply Company and Traingle Group also have significant corporate operations in the city.

When it comes to having a good time, Nashville has many entertainment options, offering a multitude of sporting events, recreational opportunities, the largest movie theatre east of the Mississippi River, restaurants, parks, and shopping malls.

The sports landscape in Nashville includes three major-league teams. The Tennessee Titans have brought the National Football League to Nashville. The Titans play in the 69,000-seat Nissan Stadium, which is located on the east bank of the Cumberland River across from downtown. In addition, the Nashville Predators have introduced the National Hockey League to the mid-state. They play in the 18,000 seat Bridgestone Arena. Nashville was awarded an MLS franchise that kicked off play as Nashville SC in February 2020. And, of course, the Sounds, a constant in the city since 1978, compete in the International League as the eldest active pro sports franchise in Middle Tennessee.

The city is also home to numerous special events. In the past decade alone, the city has hosted events such as the U.S. Figure Skating Championships, the NCAA men’s and women’s basketball tournaments, the SEC men’s and women’s basketball tournaments, numerous AAU national championships, and the U.S. Swimming Championships. Each year, Nashville hosts the highly-popular Country Music Marathon and the Music City Bowl, which pits teams from the Big Ten and SEC against one another each December at Nissan Stadium.

Known as “Music City USA”, Nashville is a city where music tastes range from country to rock to gospel. The city has several major concert venues and many big-name concert tours make a stop in Nashville. The city also serves as home to the Grand Ole Opry, the nation’s longest-running weekly radio show, and the Country Music Hall of Fame. Nashville also serves as the center of the country music industry and is one of the top recording centers in the nation.

The nightlife in downtown Nashville is always an intriguing scene. Along with the music clubs, where some of today’s top country music stars got their start, there is the Hard Rock Café and the Wildhorse Saloon. All of these are located around Broadway, the center of the entertainment scene in Nashville.

Nashville’s cultural environment has helped the city earn its other nickname, the “Athens of the South.” Nashville is well-known as a major education center. The area’s 18 accredited four-year and postgraduate institutions are an integral part of the economic and cultural identity of the area.

The city also offers numerous cultural and artistic venues. It is home to nine performing arts facilities, including the Tennessee Performing Arts Center which is the home to a wide range of events, including Broadway musicals and performances by the Nashville Ballet, Nashville Opera, and the Nashville Symphony, which performs in the state-of-the-art Schermerhorn Center.

The city is also home to seven art galleries, 25 museums (including the Tennessee State Museum), numerous historic sites (like The Hermitage -- home of President Andrew Jackson, an exact replica of the Parthenon, and the Natchez Trace Parkway), and an upgraded public library system that includes a \$50 million downtown library.
