TOO LITTLE, TOO LATE: The Omaha Storm Chasers allowed six runs in the second inning and trailed, 8-0, entering the bottom of the fourth, and could not overcome the deficit in an 8-5 loss to the Louisville Bats on Thursday at Werner Park. The Bats scored six runs in the second on a two-run home run by Ronnie Dawson, a three-run home run by Miguel Hernandez, and a bases-loaded walk from right-hander **Daniel Mengden**. The Storm Chasers scored five unanswered runs between the fourth and sixth innings, including three unearned runs in the sixth when Hernandez dropped a pop-up on the infield with the bases loaded. The Omaha bullpen combined to allow two runs on six hits with six strikeouts and one walk, including scoreless outings from right-hander **Andrés Núñez**, right-hander **Domingo Tapia**, right-hander **Jace Vines**, and left-hander **Sam Freeman**, while Bats' left-hander Phillip Diehl, right-hander Pedro Payano, and right-hander Fernando Cruz combined to retire the final 10 batters they faced.

COLD BREWIN': RHP **Colten Brewer** has retired all 13 batters he's faced across three relief appearance with the Storm Chasers, including striking out each of the first seven. Brewer has thrown 4.1 perfect innings to start for the season, tied for second in Minor League Baseball with Jake McSteen (ATL, A+) for the most innings without allowing a baserunner. Julian Aguilar (CIN, A) leads Minor League Baseball with 5.0 perfect innings to begin the season. Brewer signed with Kansas City as a minor league free agent on Jan. 23, 2022, after three seasons in the Boston Red Sox organization. He made his Major League debut with the San Diego Padres in 2018 and has 81 career games of Major League experience, including 70 games with Boston from 2019-2021.

OFFENSIVE OUTAGE: The Storm Chasers have scored 3.4 runs/game through nine games in 2022, batting .230 (67-for-291) with 10 doubles and seven home runs. Omaha has tallied at least one home run in seven of nine games played, accounting for 10 of the team's 31 total runs (five solo home runs, one two-run home run, one three-run home run). Omaha's 31 runs are third-least in the International League topping only Syracuse (19) and Lehigh Valley (29).

THE MIGHTY THOR: **Scott Thorman** is in his first season as the manager of the Omaha Storm Chasers, taking over for **Brian Poldberg**, who retired from managing following the 2021 season. Thorman, who played for Omaha in 2009 and 2010, is the 19th manager in franchise history and the sixth Omaha manager to have previously played for the franchise. He has won Minor League titles in each of the last three seasons, winning with Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021, High-A Wilmington in 2019, and Low-A Lexington in 2018. Thorman, 40, was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (30th overall) of the 2000 MLB Draft and later made his Major League debut with Atlanta on June 18, 2006. A Kitchener, Ontario, Canada, native, Thorman began his coaching career in 2014 as the bench coach for the Burlington Royals under manager **Tommy Shields**, who serves as the Storm Chasers' bench coach in 2022.

FOR OMAHA: RHP **Jackson Kowar** makes his season debut with Omaha after beginning the season with Kansas City. He allowed seven runs on 11 hits in 3.1 innings with four strikeouts and one walk in a relief outing with the Royals on April 10 vs. Cleveland, a game Kansas City eventually lost, 17-3. Kowar was the Storm Chasers' Opening Day starter in 2021, ultimately posting a 3.46 ERA in 80.2 innings across 17 outings (16 starts), striking out 115 and walking 34 to earn Triple-A East Pitcher of the Year honors. He was also named a Triple-A Postseason All-Star, the Royals' Paul Splittorff Pitcher of the Year, and Omaha Pitcher of the Year. At the time of his promotion to Kansas City on Sept. 1, 2021, Kowar led the league with 115 strikeouts. Among Triple-A East pitchers with a minimum of 80.0 innings, Kowar ranked first in strikeout percentage (34.0%) while ranking sixth in batting average against (.220) and eighth in ERA (3.46) among that subset. A former first-round pick (33rd overall) in 2018, Kowar pitched collegiately at the University of Florida, pitching on three College World Series teams and winning the College World Series with the Gators in 2017.

FOR LOUISVILLE: LHP **Bernardo Flores** makes his second start of the season after allowing two runs (one earned) on two hits in 2.0 innings, striking out four and walking one on April 9 vs. St. Paul. Flores began Spring Training with the Colorado Rockies organization before being released and later signing as a minor league free agent with Cincinnati on April 1. A seventh-round pick by Chicago-AL in 2016 out of the University of Southern California, Flores made his Major League debut with the White Sox in 2020 before making one MLB appearance with St. Louis in 2021. Flores spent most of the 2021 season with Triple-A Memphis before being claimed off waivers by Colorado and finishing the year with Triple-A Albuquerque.

KOWAR NOTES

- Began 2022 season with Kansas City, allowing seven runs on 11 hits in 3.1 innings in relief appearance on April 10 vs. Cleveland, a game the Royals eventually lost, 17-3
- Has made 10 career MLB appearances (eight starts), recording an 0-6 record with a 12.03 ERA in 33.2 innings with 33 strikeouts and 21 walks
- Named Triple-A East Pitcher of the Year in 2021 in addition to earning Triple-A Postseason All-Star honors as the top right-handed pitcher in the league, Paul Splittorff Pitcher of the Year in the Kansas City Royals organization, and Omaha Pitcher of the Year
- Led Triple-A East with 115 strikeouts at the time of his promotion to Kansas City on Sept. 1, 2021
- Led Triple-A East pitchers with a minimum of 80.0 innings in strikeout percentage (34.0%), while ranking sixth in batting average against (.220) and eighth in ERA (3.46) among that subset
- Made Triple-A debut as Omaha's Opening Day starter on May 4, 2021, vs. St. Paul, tying a career high with nine strikeouts across 5.1 shutout innings
- Finished May with a 1.01 ERA in 26.2 innings across five starts to earn Triple-A East Pitcher of the Month honors
- Lowered ERA to league-leading 0.85 following 5.0 innings of shutout ball on June 2, 2021, vs. Iowa
- Called up by Kansas City for Major League debut on June 7, 2021, at Los Angeles-AL, allowing four runs on three hits in 0.2 innings with two walks and zero strikeouts
- Optioned to Omaha on June 23, 2021, and made 11 more appearances (10 starts) for the Storm Chasers, posting a 5.14 ERA in 49.0 innings with 74 strikeouts and 24 walks in that span before returning to Kansas City on Sept. 1, 2021
- Spent the 2020 season at the Royals' Alternate Training Site in Kansas City, Kan. after being a non-roster invite to Royals' Spring Training
- Made 13 starts for High-A Wilmington and Double-A Northwest Arkansas in first full professional season in 2019

- Drafted with the 33rd overall pick in the 2018 MLB Draft, one pick before LHP Daniel Lynch
- Was teammates and roomates with fellow 2018 first round pick RHP Brady Singer at the University of Florida
- Played on three College World Series teams with the Gators, recording the final outs of the 2017 College World Series final to deliver the Gators' first baseball title
