History vs. South Bend

The Lugnuts are 204-184 all-time vs. South Bend, 96-85 in Lansing and 108-99 in The Bend. Last year, the Lugnuts went 2-4 at Four Winds Field... but in the series finale, the Nuts' last road game of the year, September 4, Jorge Juan, Jack Owen, Shohei Tomioka and Osvaldo Berrios combined on a 2-1 no-hit win, the third no-hitter in franchise history.

Tonight: The Lugnuts play the fourth game in a six-game series with the Cubs, the only meetings of the year for Lansing with the defending Midwest League champions. The Nuts won the series opener with a season 13-run output, but the Cubs' pitchers have held Lansing to one run in 18 innings since.

Last Night: Cubs 3, Lugnuts 1. Max Muncy led off the game with a single, moved to second on a walk and scored on a double steal and a throwing error, but that was the Lugnuts' only run against Brandon Birdsell and relievers Didier Vargas, Tyler Santana and Sheldon Reed.

Starting Matchup: Nuts right-hander Jacob Watters, the Athletics' fourth-round selection in 2022 (and their top pitcher taken), makes his 10th start of the year, opposed by South Bend right-hander Richard Gallardo, who will be making his league-leading 12th start and ranks second in the league in innings (55 1/3), fifth in strikeouts (53) and fifth in WHIP (1.05). Watters is coming off winning his first professional game with a nine-strikeout, five-inning effort last week against Cedar Rapids.

On the Air: Today's game is available on Bally Live and MiLB TV with Brendan King and Max Thoma, and via StreamGuys with Jesse Goldberg-Strassler and Adam Jaksa on the call.

On Deck: The Lugnuts and Cubs play through Sunday, and then the Nuts return to Lansing to welcome in the Peoria Chiefs for a six-game homestand running from June 13-18.

LUG•NOTES

At the Complex Level: The Arizona Complex League A's defeated the AzCL Guardians yesterday, 20-11, for their first win of the season. Rehabbing Lugnuts shortstop Drew Swift batted seven times: two doubles, two walks, three RBIs, one run scored and one steal in a 2-for-5 showing. Rehabbing third baseman Joshwan Wright went 1-for-4 with a double and two RBIs before he was replaced. 18-year-old prospect Jefferson Jean started the game and was one of the only pitchers who escaped unscathed, tossing three scoreless innings.

Master Noda: The No. 2 pick in the 2022 Rule 5 Draft, 2018 Lugnut Ryan Noda is leading the American League with a .415 on-base percentage in his rookie season (fourth in the Majors behind only Luis Arraez, Lamonte Wade, Jr., and Juan Soto), and ranks second in the A.L. with 42 walks (sixth in the Majors). At this time, he is the likely Oakland Athletics representative for the All-Star Game in Seattle. Noda's magical year began when he made his MLB debut on his birthday, March 30. His time in Lansing was notable five years ago for setting the franchise's single season walks record at 109.

Don't Forget About Bo: 2017 Nut Bo Bichette leads the Major Leagues in total bases (144) and base hits (89) and ranks fourth in batting average (.326)

Among the MWL Leaders: Outfielder Jonny Butler is second in the Midwest League with five triples. Starting pitcher Jack Perkins is second in the league with a .188 batting average allowed, third with a 1.03 WHIP, fourth with a 2.89 ERA, and ninth with 46 2/3 innings pitched. Relief pitcher Tyler Baum is tied for ninth with five saves. Catcher Daniel Susac is tied for fifth with 53 base hits, sixth with a .293 batting average and tied for eighth with 80 total bases. Outfielder Junior Pérez is tied for seventh with 13 steals.

First-Round Pedigrees: The Lugnuts' roster boasts the A's last two first-round selections. 20-year-old Max Muncy was the 25th overall selection in the 2021 draft and enters the season ranked the A's No. 1 shortstop prospect by MLB Pipeline. 22-year-old Daniel Susac was taken 19th overall in 2022 and is the A's No. 2 catching prospect behind 1B/C Tyler Soderstrom.

They Know Their Trade: Lansing has four players acquired by the Oakland Athletics via trade on its roster: Christian Fernandez (Tampa Bay Rays, 7/9/22, for Christian Bethancourt); Euribiel Angeles (San Diego Padres, 4/3/22, for Sean Manaea); Junior Pérez (San Diego Padres, 6/30/20, for Jorge Mateo); and Alexander Campos (Seattle Mariners, 11/15/17, for Ryon Healy).

TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2012: The Lugnuts scored six runs in the bottom of the 1st inning and held on tight for a 6-5 victory over Lake County. It set the tone for a series of hot starts for the Lugnuts, who scored two runs in the 1st the next day, and then six more runs in the 1st inning in the series finale, part of a three-game sweep over the Captains.

2016: Lane Thomas homered for a third straight game and the Lugnuts built a 5-0 lead, but Martin Cervenka's three-run double helped the Lake County Captains rally for a 6-5 victory at Classic Park.

2017: Bo Bichette went 0-for-3 with two walks, ending his league-leading 17-game hitting streak, in a 5-4 loss at Fort Wayne. TinCaps starter Ronald Bolaños struck out nine in five innings for the TinCaps.

Retrospective: Watters made his Midwest League debut at Four Winds Field last year on August 31, becoming the Lugnuts' 55th different player used during the season, the 20th different starting pitcher and the 895th all-time Nut... at the time, he joined Micah Dallas (8th round) and TJ Czyz (12th round) as 2022 draftees on Lugnuts roster; both Dallas and Czyz are currently with Stockton.

Last Time at South Bend: Opposed MLB rehabber Wade Miley in his debut, 8/31/22... retired Jordan Nwogu on immediate broken-bat grounder to first, walked BJ Murray and wild-pitched him to second, RF Joshwan Wright then dropped a Luis Verdugo fly ball to allow Murray to score... issued two more walks but retired Kevin Made on a flyout to center field to end the inning, allowing one unearned run.

Pro Debut: Watters had made just one prior appearance in the minors before joining the Lugnuts on August 23 for the Arizona Complex League Athletics vs. the Ariz. Complex League Cubs: he walked Esmarly Tatis, who stole second base, retired Raino Coran on a groundout, tossed a wild pitch to move Tatis to third base, struck out Dilan Granadillo and then ended the inning with a Christian Olivo flyout to Austin Beck.

Entering Draft Day: Rated Keith Law's No. 68 draft prospect for The Athletic, with Law writing, "Watters started the year in the Mountaineers' bullpen, where he hit 99 mph a few times, so the team moved him to the rotation around midseason, where he struggled more with control (37 walks in 50.2 innings) but also showed enough that some scouts think he can start in pro ball. Watters sits 94-97 mph with a power slider in the mid-80s that can miss bats ... when he locates it. It's not a bad delivery, with a reasonably short arm stroke and strong finish, so that's not the reason he doesn't throw strikes, but it's true across all of his pitches. It's much more likely he ends up a power reliever with two plus pitches. But with enough of a changeup to start and a delivery that looks like it should work, I wouldn't be surprised to see a pro team keep him in the rotation."... Fangraphs' No. 96 draft prospect.

Inked: Selected 124th overall by the A's in the 4th round and signed for \$491,750... highest pitcher taken by the Athletics in 2022 following first-round catcher Daniel Susac and three straight outfielders (high schooler Henry Bolte in the second round, Michigan Wolverine Clark Elliott in the compensatory round B, and Mercer slugger Colby Thomas in the third round).

WVU to the Pros: First of three Mountaineers selected in the 2022 draft... the 2021 Fort Wayne TinCaps featured two WVU teammates in 2021 draftees Jackson Wolf (4th rd.) and Ryan Bergert (6th rd.)... the last West Virginia player taken in the first round was Alek Manoah by Toronto in 2019, who in 2022 joined John Means as the only two Mountaineers to be named MLB All-Stars... the last West Virginia player to suit up for the Lugnuts was Ryan McBroom, who won the 2015 Midwest League Most Valuable Player award.

Glory Days: Starred for the Bland County HS Rockets as an all-state baseball player as well as in basketball (where he regularly posted double-doubles and topped out at 45 points in one game) and football.

Off to College: Did not receive much notice before his high velocity was discovered at a tryout in Morgantown... named to the Academic All-Big 12 Rookie Team as a freshman (5 G, 4.70 ERA, 7 2/3 IP, 4 R, 6 BB, 11 K)... as a sophomore, made 19 appearances: 3.33 ERA, 27 IP, 15 H, 11 R, 32 BB, bullpen-leading 53 K, .165 avg. allowed, tied for team lead with four saves; named Academic All-Big 12 Second Team; NCBWA Stopper of the Year Midseason Watch List... made first college start in the 2021 Big 12 Championship vs. Texas: 3 IP, 0 H, 1 R, 4 BB, 8 K... as a junior in 2022, named pre-season All-American; dominated early as team closer and was moved into role as Friday starter; struck out 15 Texas Longhorns in 6 1/3 IP on May 7; overall: 18 G, 11 GS, 3-7, 6.22 ERA, 59 1/3 IP, 64 H, 44 R, 41 BB, 75 K; named All-Big 12 Honorable Mention.

Hometown Hero: Home city of Rocky Gap, Virginia, is in the Ridge-and-Valley Appalachians, located near the West Virginia border... neighboring city: Bluefield, home of the Bluefield Ridge Runners, previously known as the Bluefield Orioles and Bluefield Blue Jays, which fed such stars as Alejandro Kirk and Vladimir Guerrero, Jr. to the Lugnuts when both were part of the Jays' system... cousin is Jason Michaels, who played 11 years (2001-2011) in MLB.

Current Ranking: MLB Pipeline ranks Watters the No. 26 prospect in the A's organization and the No. 12 pitching prospect... his grades: Fastball 60, Curve 60, Changeup 45, Control 45, Overall 40... his scouting report: "Watters is a strong presence on the mound at 6-foot-4. His fastball was up to 99 mph during his junior year and touched triple digits in his time as a reliever. He also possesses a plus pitch in his power curve, missing plenty of bats as a true 12-to-6 that sits in the mid-80s. There's also a mid-80s changeup in there, though it's less polished compared to his other two offerings. Command will need to improve for Watters to have a chance to start at the next level. While the stuff was high-octane in college, he usually had little idea of how to locate it. Given his track record as a reliever, there's a strong chance he ends up back in the bullpen, where he can rear back and overpower hitters with two plus pitches."
