
SEGRA STADIUM

Segra Stadium is a baseball park in Favetteville, North Carolina, It is the home of the Favetteville Woodpeckers, Low-A affiliate of the Houston Astros playing in the Carolina League. It opened in 2019 and seats up to 4,786 people. The site is immediately surrounded by the Airborne & Special Operations Museum, Fayetteville Station, and the Prince Charles Hotel. The Woodpeckers

are the first minor league baseball team in Fayetteville since the Cape Fear Crocs moved to Lakewood, New Jersey after the 2000 season. .

On August 17, 2016, the City of Fayetteville signed a memorandum of understanding with the Houston Astros of Major League Baseball to keep a Class A team at the ballpark for 30 years. As part of the deal, Barton Malow contracted 83 percent of the construction to local and small disadvantaged business enterprise contractors.

In conjunction with the ballpark financing, Prince Charles Holdings invested \$15 million toward renovating the adjoining Prince Charles Hotel into apartments. The


Groundbreaking took place on August 21, 2017. On February 7, 2019, the team announced a naming rights agreement with Segra, an independent fiber bandwidth company, to call the facility Segra Stadium.

The ballpark's first game was held on April 18, 2019, between the Woodpeckers and the Carolina Mudcats. Carolina defeated Fayetteville, 7-5, before a sellout crowd of 6,202 people. Fayetteville starting pitcher Enoli Paredes recorded the stadium's first strikeouts as he retired the first three Mudcats batters on strikes to open the game. The first hit was a single in the bottom of the first inning off the bat of Fayetteville's Bryan De La Cruz. The first home run was hit in the top of the second inning by Carolina's Payton Henry.

ABOUT FAYETTEVILLE: Fayetteville is a city in Cumberland County, North Carolina, United States. It is the county seat of Cumberland County, and is best known as the home of Fort Bragg, a major U.S. Army installation northwest of the city. Favetteville has received the All-America City Award from the National Civic League three times. It is the 6th-largest city in North Carolina. Fayetteville is in the Sandhills in the western part of the Coastal Plain region, on the Cape Fear River.

With an estimated population in 2019 of 526,719 people, the Fayetteville metropolitan area is the largest in southeastern North

Carolina, and the fifth-largest in the state. Suburban areas of metro Fayetteville include Fort Bragg, Hope Mills, Spring Lake, Raeford, Pope Field, Rockfish, Stedman, and Eastover. Fayetteville's mayor is Mitch Colvin, who is serving his second term.

Stadium Features: Segra Stadium, a new \$40 million baseball stadium in Fayetteville, North Carolina, is the home of the Fayetteville Woodpeckers, a Minor League Baseball team playing in the Carolina League. The ballpark accommodates about 5,290 spectators for in-season baseball games, and possibly more during special events happening year-round. The stadium features real turf grass and a large digital video board, measuring 75 feet in width. There are a variety of viewing options in park: regular seats, picnic style relaxation on the left outfield berm, and even a section of rocking chairs past the center outfield wall. Enjoying a night out at the ball field is possible for the whole family. A dedicated Kids Zone keeps young ones busy while tring them out and adults can relax with a drink in hand at the Healy's Bar in right field. Concessions are located conveniently throughout the concourse. The site is immediately surrounded by the Airborne & Special Operations Museum, Fayetteville station, and the Prince Charles Hotel.

Other Uses: Besides being the home field for the Woodpeckers, the ballpark hosted the Big South Tournament as a neutral site in 2019 and 2021. The 2020 tournament at Segra Stadium was cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic. From February 28 to March 1, 2020, Segra Stadium hosted the Armed Forces Invitational Baseball Tournament between Army West Point Black Knights, the Air Force Academy Falcons, and Campbell University Fighting Camels. In 2022, Segra Stadium hosted the four-team All-American Classic featuring Campbell University, Ohio State, Army.

Healy's Bar: Healy's Right Field Bar is the perfect space to host an outdoor, relaxed event. Guests can enjoy a variety of seating arrangements, including high top bar seats, couches, and outdoor furniture.

Segra Stadium Video Board: The left field board is full color LED and is 75' x 20'.

Truist Box Office: The Truist Box Office is located on the south side of Segra Stadium off of Hay Street. There are five ticket windows available in the main box office.

Seating Arrangement: Reserved Seats (1,546 Total Seats), ADA Seating (50 Total Seats), LF 4-Topps Seating (92 Total Seats), LF Seating Berm (364 Total Seats), RF Field Boxes (80 Total Seats), Concourse Suites (96 Total Seats), Rocking Porch/Park (36 Total Seats), RF Grill & Bar (156 Total Seats), Standing Room Only (238 Total Seats).

RICKY RIVERA. MANAGER



Rivera was named the fourth manager in Woodpeckers history manager in February following the promotion of former Fayetteville manager Joe Thon to Corpus Christi (AA). Prior to this year, Rivera spent the previous two seasons as manager of the Florida Complex League Astros after joining the organization in June of 2020.

As a player, Rivera began his college career at Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College in 2012, helping the Golden Norsemen to back-to-back regular season championships as a freshman and sophomore. Rivera then transferred to the University of Central Missouri and pitched two seasons for the Mules, tallying a 12-3 record with a 3.90 ERA and receiving an All-MIAA Honorable Mention in 2014. Rivera is no stranger to Fayetteville either as he spent the summer of 2014 playing for the Fayetteville SwampDogs of the Coastal Plains League.

A native of Dorado, Puerto Rico, Rivera attended Dorado Academy where he was a two-time All-Country team selection and helped Dorado to a conference title. He was also a volleyball standout in high school, attracting interest from college programs. Rivera grew up a Yankees fan and idolized Roberto Clemente as a kid.

ZACH WILKINS. PITCHING COACH



Wilkins joins the Astros organization as the fourth pitching coach in Woodpeckers history. He spent the previous three seasons as pitching coach for Utah Tech University under head coach Chris Pfatenhauer. Prior to his time at Utah Tech, Wilkins was a graduate assistant coach at the University of Arizona for two years.

While earning his bachelor's degree, Wilkins pitched two seasons at the University of Nevada. He recorded a 5.64 ERA and 55 strikeouts with the Wolf Pack and helped the program win its first-ever Mountain West Championship as a junior in 2015. Wilkins began his college career at Palomar College in San Marcos, California, posting an 8-1 record and

1.41 ERA over 12 career starts.

A San Diego native, Wilkins attended Scripps Ranch High School where he was a two-sport letter winner in baseball and basketball. He is the son of former Astros pitcher Dean Wilkins, who spent the 1991 season in Houston. His older brother Ryan pitched in the College World Series in 2013 for NC State.

Luis Reynoso, Hitting Coach



Reynoso takes over as the hitting coach after spending several years within the Astros organization, both as a coach and a player. Last season, the 28-year-old served as hitting coach of the Florida Complex League Astros following two years as the hitting coach of the Dominican Summer League Astros.

As a player, Reynoso signed a minor league contract with Houston in July 2011. He spent the 2012 season as a middle infielder with the DSL Astros before playing the following two years in the Complex League. Reynoso got his first taste of affiliated ball when he was promoted to then-Single-A Quad Cities for the 2015 season, batting .226 with a

home run and 16 RBI over 50 games with the River Bandits. His final season was in 2016 with then-High-A Lancaster, hitting .209 while driving in eight runs in 35 games with the JetHawks.

Reynoso grew up in the Dominican Republic in the city of San Francisco de Macoris.

DYLAN MAZZO, DEVELOPMENT COACH



Mazzo begins his first season with the Woodpeckers and his second season with the Astros organization after serving as the development coach for the Corpus Christi Hooks in 2022. Before joining Houston, he spent three seasons as a defensive coach with the Los Angeles Angels organization and six years coaching collegiately at four different schools.

Mazzo earned his bachelor's degree at Misericordia University in 2013 and received his Master of Science Administration degree at Lindenwood University a year later.

JENNIFER BARDALES, ATHLETIC TRAINER



Bardales enters her third season with the Astros organization and her first in Fayetteville. She spent last season as a part of Rivera's staff with the Florida Complex League Astros and was an athletic training intern for the Astros in 2021.

Prior to her time with the organization, Bardales was an Orthotic Fitter and ATC Liaison for AdaptHealth. She also was a student athletic trainer while she earned her bachelor's degree at the University of Texas at San Antonio and her master's degree at the University of Houston.

KEVIN RIVERA, STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING COACH



Rivera starts his third season with Houston and his first in Fayetteville after spending 2022 with the Florida Complex League Astros staff under Ricky Rivera. He has also worked at the Astros Dominican Summer League Complex, training the Houston's youngest Latin American signings. Prior to his time with the Astros, Kevin worked in strength and conditioning with the Detroit Tigers as well as USA Field Hockey.

Rivera earned his bachelor's degree in 2017 at Franklin Pierce University while being a member of the Ravens' track and field team. He later

List the first and last names of all members of your outlet who will require a season credential, including photographers.

Read and sign the 2023 Media Credential Application which includes the Fayetteville Woodpeckers and MiLB media regulations. Send a completed copy to achapman@astros.com prior to the first game you're covering. The completed form may be emailed, faxed or brought to the Fayetteville Woodpeckers offices. For outlets with multiple credentialed members, please have each member sign and print their name on the back of the sheet.

A member of the media relations staff will contact you when your season credential is ready to be picked up.

SINGLE-GAME CREDENTIALS

Fayetteville Woodpeckers single-game credentials will be issued to legitimate news-gathering outlets that plan to cover the team on a limited basis, as well as area outlets making last-minute changes in coverage. All working media members must adhere to listed Fayetteville Woodpeckers media regulations while covering a Woodpeckers game. To obtain a single-game credential in 2023, please follow these directions:

Submit a single-game credential request to a member of the media relations department (information below). You must submit your request at least 24 hours prior to the game you're covering.

List the first and last names of all members of your outlet who will require a single-game credential, including photographers.

Read and sign the 2023 Media Credential Application which includes the Fayetteville Woodpeckers and MiLB media regulations. Send the completed copy to a member of the media relations department prior to the game you're covering. The completed form may be emailed, faxed or brought to the Woodpeckers offices. For outlets with multiple credentialed members, please have each member sign and print their name on the back of the sheet.

Pick up your single-game credential at the Segra Stadium Will Call using a valid photo ID.

If your outlet is interested in covering a 2023 Woodpeckers game at another Carolina League stadium, please submit your request to a member of the Fayetteville Woodpeckers media relations department. Arrangements will be made with other Carolina League teams on a first come, first served basis.

MEDIA REGULATIONS

PREGAME CLUBHOUSE ACCESS

The Segra Stadium home clubhouse will be open 3 ½ hours before the scheduled game time (excluding start times before noon). The clubhouse is CLOSED when the team takes the field for batting practice. Following batting practice, the clubhouse will remain open until 1 hour before the scheduled game time. All media members are required to check in with a member of the Fayetteville Woodpeckers media relations staff prior to entering the clubhouse. The training room, weight room and player lounge areas of the clubhouse are OFF LIMITS AT ALL TIMES. There is no video or still photography permitted in the home clubhouse unless authorized.

POSTGAME CLUBHOUSE ACCESS

Following a 10-minute "cool down" period, a member of the Fayetteville Woodpeckers media relations staff will escort media members into the home clubhouse for a brief post-game interview session. Players and coaches will be obtained upon request. Media members are not to enter the home clubhouse without being accompanied by a member of the Fayetteville Woodpeckers media relations staff. The same restricted areas of the clubhouse during pregame availability are also off limits after the game.

REQUESTING INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with a Fayetteville Woodpeckers player, coach or front office member should be booked through the media relations department. All requests are encouraged to be made 24 hours prior to the interview. No interviews are to be conducted while a game is in progress. No interviews may be conducted during a team workout, unless otherwise authorized. Interviews on gamedays are best conducted after the team takes batting practice. Video cameras are not permitted to be used inside the home clubhouse, nor any areas of the player parking or player entrance/loading dock area. Interviews may also be shot on the field or in the dugout if weather and player/coach availability permits. Starting pitchers will not be available for pre-game interviews on days they are starting.

HOUSTON ASTROS REHAB ASSIGNMENTS

Players on minor league injury rehab assignments for the Houston Astros will be made available to the media when possible with their schedule. All interview requests with rehabbing players must be authorized by a member of the Fayetteville Woodpeckers media relations staff. In accordance with Major League Clubhouse Policy, no starting pitchers will be made available for pre-game interviews on days that they are starting. Starting pitchers on rehab assignments will be made available for interviews 20-30 minutes following the conclusion of their outing (subject to availability).

VISITORS' CLUBHOUSE INTERVIEW REQUESTS

The visiting team's clubhouse is to be considered CLOSED at all times (prior to and after the game) unless a specific request has been authorized by a member of the Fayetteville Woodpeckers media relations staff. No media members shall access the visiting clubhouse without permission from the Fayettevillle Woodpeckers media relations staff, who will work in conjunction with that team's media relations department to handle the request.

FIELD/DUGOUTS

Media members holding credentials that grant field access may be present in the foul territory/dugout areas up to 1 hour prior to the scheduled game. At no time are media members allowed to cross the foul lines into the field of play. Foul territory and dugout areas must be clear of ALL media exactly one hour prior to the start of the game unless a special request has been made to the Fayetteville Woodpeckers Media Relations staff.

PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Photographers and videographers may utilize the on-field camera well next to the dugout on the first base and third base side of Segra Stadium. Space is limited, and all photographers/videographers must accommodate the space needs of Fayetteville Woodpeckers staff in this area. No photography is permitted on the field of play while the game is in progress. Special photo requests must be authorized by a member of the Fayetteville Woodpeckers Media Relations staff.

PRESS BOX

Limited space in the Segra Stadium press box is available for WORKING MEDIA ONLY. Game information, as well as a wireless internet connection, will be provided to you. There will be no cheering or rooting for either team at any point during the game. Individuals who violate press box rules will be removed and credentials revoked upon the discretion of the Fayetteville Woodpeckers media relations department.

FAYETTEVILLE WOODPECKERS BROADCAST NETWORK

During the 2023 season, Woodpeckers fans will be able to catch all 132 games on the Fayetteville Woodpeckers Broadcast

Fans will be able to listen to games for free on the Woodpeckers website and by using the MiLB First Pitch app on their mobile, desktop or home devices. Additionally, home games played at Segra Stadium, as well as select road games, will be available in

HD on MiLB.TV, a subscription-based service provided by Minor League Baseball.

FAYETTEVILLE

Home Runs:

The following on-field actions will be considered home runs:

- · Batted ball flies over the outfield fence.
- Batted ball strikes the scoreboard, scoreboard netting, batter's eye or outfield drink rails.
- · Batted ball strikes foul pole above outfield fence level.

Dead Ball vs Live Ball:

The following on-field actions will be considered dead balls:

- Any ball going into the dugout is dead.
- · Any ball lodged in, on or behind the backstop netting is dead.
- Any ball lodged under, on top of, behind or inside the tarp is dead.

The following on-field actions will be considered live balls:

- · Any ball bouncing off the tarp.
- Any thrown ball hitting the dugout rails or dugout netting and rebounding onto the field.

Fly Balls:

The following on-field actions will govern fly balls:

- If a player catches a fly ball in the dugout one foot must remain on the dugout's top step/field level.
- Players may lean across the tarp to catch a fly ball, however players must not sit upon, step on or use the tarp as an aid in catching the fly ball.





MEDIA

BASEBALL TERMS OF INTEREST

Assists: An assist shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects a batted or thrown ball in such a way that a putout results, or would have resulted except for a subsequent error by any fielder. Only one assist and no more shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects the ball in a run-down play which results in a putout, or would have resulted in a putout, except for a subsequent error.

Batting Average: Divide the numbers of hits by the number of official at-bats.

Batting Title Qualifications: To qualify for the Carolina League batting or slugging title, a player must have a minimum of 378 plate appearances (the equivalent of 2.7 plate appearances for each of the 140 scheduled games). However, a player with fewer than the required number of plate appearances whose average would be the high if he were charged with the required number of official at-bats shall be awarded the batting championship.

Consecutive-Game Hitting Streak: A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if all of a player's plate appearances result in a walk, hit batsman, defensive interference or a sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if the player has a sacrifice fly and no hit.

Consecutive-Game Playing Streak: A consecutive-game playing streak shall extend if the player plays one half-inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running appearance shall not extend the streak. If a player is ejected from a game by an umpire before he complies with the requirements of this rule, his streak shall continue.

Day or Night Game: Any game scheduled to start after 5:00 p.m. is considered a night game. A game scheduled to begin before 5:00 p.m., which is delayed by rain or any other reason, is still considered a day game. However, both games of a two-night doubleheader will be considered night games.

Designated for Assignment: When a player is taken off a Major League roster and is designated for assignment, such player must be released, traded, or his contract assigned within 10 days of the notice given.

Earned Run Average: Multiply the number of earned runs by nine; take the resulting number and divide it by the number of innings-pitched.

Earned Run Average Title Qualifications: To qualify for the Carolina League ERA crown, a pitcher must have the lowest earned run average after at least 115 innings-pitched (the equivalent of 0.8 multiplied by the number of scheduled games- 140).

Fielding Average: Divide the total putouts and assists by total putouts, assists and errors.

Free Agency: If a player has six years of Major League service, he is eligible for free agency. A player has 15 days from the first day following the World Series to file for free agency. A player is also eligible for free agency if he has played seven seasons or more in the Major or Minor Leagues and is not on a Major League team's 40-man roster as of October 15.

Injured List: In the Minor Leagues, players placed on the injured list must remain there a minimum of ten consecutive days. There is no limit to how many players can be on the injured list at one time and those on the injured list do not count toward the team's roster limit.

Magic Number: Determine the number of games yet to be played, add one, then subtract the number of games ahead in the lost column of the standings from the closest opponent.

Major League Rehabilitation: A Major League player may be assigned to a minor league affiliate for the purpose of injury rehabilitation for a maximum of 20 days for non-pitchers, and 30 days for pitchers. The player continues to receive his Major League salary. Any service with the minor league club shall be deemed Major League service. Rehabilitation assignments do not count as optional assignments. Players on rehabilitation assignment do not count against a team's roster limit.

On-Base Percentage: Take the total number of hits, walks, and hit-by-pitches and divide by the total number of at-bats, walks, hit-by-pitches, and sacrifice flies. Times awarded first base on interference or obstruction are not figured into on base percentage.

Options: An optional assignment of a player contract shall be permitted for not more than three seasons between Major League and Minor League clubs. Players optioned for less than a total of 20 days in one season, shall not be charged with an optional transfer. Players who, prior to the start of the season, have been credited with less than five seasons in professional baseball, shall be eliqible for a fourth optional assignment, without waivers, during that season.

Pitch Clock: A pitch clock is used in college baseball and Minor League Baseball to limit the amount of time a pitcher uses before he throws the ball to the hitter. This is one measure that has accelerated the pace of play. Major League Baseball (MLB) will begin using a pitch clock in the 2023 season

BASEBALL TERMS OF INTEREST

Player Limits: In Low-A, rosters are limited to 30 active players for the duration of the entire season and the playoffs. Players on the disabled list or on rehabilitation assignment do not count against the 30-man active roster. In the Major Leagues, rosters are 40 until Opening Day, at which time they decrease to 26 players. On September 1, Major League rosters increase to 28 active players.

Recalled: When a player is on a Major League team's 40-man roster and added to the team's 25-man active roster during the season from the Minor Leagues, he has been recalled. If a player is not on the Major League 40-man roster, the Major League club must purchase his contract from the Minor League team and add him to its 40-man roster.

Rookie Qualifications: A player shall be considered a rookie unless; he has exceeded 130 at-bats or 50 innings-pitched in the Major Leagues or accumulated more than 45 days on the 25-man active roster of a Major League club or clubs. Time in military service and time on the disabled list is excluded.

Rule 5 Draft: A player not on a Major League 40-man roster as of November 20 is eligible for the Rule 5 Draft if the player was 18 years of age or younger when he first signed a professional contract and this is the fourth Rule 5 Draft held since he signed. Or if the player was 19 years of age or older when he first signed a professional contract and this is the third Rule 5 Draft held since he signed.

Save Rule: Credit a pitcher with a save when he meets all three of the following conditions:

- · He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club; and
- · He is not the winning pitcher; and
- He qualifies under one of the following conditions:
 - 1. He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning; or
 - 2. He enters the game, regardless of the count, with the potential tying run either already on base, at bat, or on deck, or
 - 3. He pitches effectively for at least three innings.

No more than one save may be credited in each game.

Slugging Percentage: Divide the total bases of all safe hits by the total number of at-bats.

Suspended Game: In the Carolina League, any regular season game that is called before it is completed or is called at any point with the score tied shall become a suspended game. In accordance with Official Rule 4.12 (c), a suspended game must be resumed and completed from the exact point of suspension and must be played the number of innings it was originally scheduled to include. If the suspended game is called before becoming a regulation game (before the fifth inning), the regular game following the suspended game shall be a seven-inning game. If the suspended game is called after becoming a regulation game (from the fifth on), the regular game following the suspended game shall be a nine-inning game. Attendance reporting from suspended game shall reflect the number of fans present when the contest started, not when it was completed and does not qualify as a lost opening.

Waivers: If a player placed on Major League waivers is not claimed by another team after two (2) business days after waivers have been requested, the player has "cleared waivers" and the team has secured waivers for the remainder of the waiver period. The team then can send him to the Minor Leagues, trade him to another team (even if the trade deadline has passed), or do nothing at all. Any trades involving a 40-man roster player from July 31 (the trade deadline) to the end of the season may only involve players who have cleared Major League waivers. If a player does not clear waivers- he is claimed by another team or teams- the club requesting waivers may withdraw the waiver request. If the club does not withdraw the waiver request, the player's contract is assigned as follows: If only one claim is entered, the player's contract is assigned to the claiming club; if more than one club in the same league makes a claim, the club currently lower in the standings gets the player; if clubs in both leagues claim the player, preference shall always go the club in the same league as the club requesting waivers.

Winning Pitcher: The starting pitcher will be credited with the win only if he has pitched at least five complete innings and his team not only is in the lead when he is replaced, but remains in the lead the remainder of the game. When the starting pitcher does not meet the preceding criteria and more than one relief pitcher is used, the victory shall be awarded on the following basis:

- When, during the tenure of the starting pitcher, the winning team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game, credit the victory to the relief pitcher judged by the scorer to have been the most effective.
- · Whenever the score is tied, the game becomes a new contest insofar as the winning and losing pitcher is concerned.
- Once the opposing team assumes the lead, all pitchers who have pitched up to that point are excluded from being credited with the victory except the current pitcher.
- The winning relief pitcher shall be the one who is the pitcher of record when his team assumes the lead and maintains it to the
 finish of the game.

MEDICAL GLOSSARY

AC Joint: Acromioclavicular joint of the shoulder where acromion process of the scapula and the distal end of the clavicle meet; most shoulder separations occur at this point.

Anterior: In front of: the front surface of.

Anterior Cruciate Ligament (ACL): A primary stabilizing ligament within the center of the knee joint that prevents hyperextension and excessive rotation of the joint. A complete tear of the ACL necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Anti-inflammatory: Any agent which prevents inflammation, such as aspirin or ibuprofen.

Arthrogram: X-ray technique for joints using air and/or dye injected into the effected area; useful in diagnosing meniscus tears of the knee and rotator cuff tears of the shoulder.

Arthroscopy: A surgical examination of the internal structures of a joint by means of viewing through an arthroscope. Arthroscopic procedure can be used to remove or repair damaged tissue or as a diagnostic procedure in order to inspect the extent of any damage or confirm a diagnosis.

Bone Scan: An imaging procedure in which a radioactive-labeled substance is injected into the body to determine the status of a bone injury. If the bone at the injury site takes up the radioactive substance, the injury will show a "hot spot" on the scan image. The bone scan is particularly useful in the diagnosis of stress fractures.

Cartilage: Smooth, slippery substance preventing two ends of bones from rubbing together.

Cat Scan: Use of a computer to produce a cross-sectional view of the anatomical part being investigated from x-ray data.

Concussion: Jarring injury of the brain resulting in dysfunction. It can be graded as mild, moderate or severe depending or loss of consciousness, amnesia and loss of equilibrium.

Deltoid Muscle: Muscles at the top of the arm, just below the shoulder, responsible for shoulder motions to the front, side and back

Dack.

Disc: A flat, rounded plate between each vertebrae of the spine. The disc consists of a thick fibering which surrounds a soft gellike interior. It functions as a cushion for the spinal column.

Epicondylitis: Inflammation in the elbow due to overuse.

Femur: Thigh bone; largest bone in the body.

Fibula: Smaller of the two bones in the lower leg; runs from the knee to the ankle along the outside of the lower leg.

Fracture: Any breach of continuity of a bone. Types of fractures include simple, compound, comminuted, greenstick, incomplete, impacted, longitudinal, oblique, stress, and transverse.

Inflammation: The body's natural response to injury in which the injury site might display various degrees of pain, swelling, heat, redness and/or loss of function.

Labrum: An edge, rim, or lip-shaped structure found in the shoulder joint.

Lateral: To the outside of the body.

Ligament: Band of fibrous tissue that connects bone to bone, or bone to cartilage and supports and strengthens joints.

Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI): Imaging procedure in which a radio frequency pulse causes certain electrical elements of the injured tissue to react to this pulse and through this process a computer display and permanent film establish a visual image. MRI does not require radiation and is very useful in the diagnosis of soft tissue, disc, and meniscus injuries.

Medial: To the inside of the body.

Meniscus: Crescent shaped cartilage, usually pertaining to the knee joint; also known as "cartilage." There are two menisci in the knee: medial and lateral. These work to absorb weight within the knee and provide stability.

Metacarpals: Five long bones of the hand running from the wrist to the fingers

Metatarsals: Five long bones of the foot running from the ankle to the toes

Posterior: At the back part, or rear of the body.

Posterior Cruciate Ligament (PCL): A primary stabilizing ligament of the knee that provides significant stability and prevents displacement of the tibia backward within the knee joint. A complete tear of this ligament necessitating reconstruction could require up to 12 months of rehabilitation.

Quadricep Muscles ("Quads"): A group of four muscles of the front thigh that run from the hip and form a common tendon at the patella; they are responsible for knee extension.

Rotator Cuff: Comprised of four muscles in the shoulder area that can be irritated by overuse. The muscles are the supraspinatus (most commonly injured), infraspinatus, teres minor, and subscapularis.

tus (most commonly injured), infraspinatus, teres minor, and subscapularis.

Shin Splint: A catch-all syndrome describing pain in the shin that is not a fracture or tumor, and cannot be defined otherwise.

Sprain: Injury resulting from the stretch or twist of the joint and causes various degrees of stretch or tear of a ligament or other soft tissue at the joint.

Strain: Injury resulting from a pull or torsion to the muscle or tendon that causes various degrees of stretch or tear to the muscle or tendon tissue.

Stress Fracture: A hair-line type of break in a bone caused by overuse.

Tendon: Tissue that connects muscle to bone.

Tendinitis: Inflammation of the tendon and/or tendon sheath, caused by chronic overuse or sudden injury.

Tibia: Larger of the two bones of the lower leg and is the weight-bearing bone of the shin.

Transverse Process: Small lateral projection off the right and left side of each vertebrae that functions as an attachment site for muscles and ligaments of the spine.

Ulnar Nerve: Nerve in the elbow commonly irritated from excessive throwing.

Ultrasound: An electrical modality that transmits a sound wave through an applicator into the skin to the soft tissue in order to heat the local area for relaxing the injured tissue and/or disperse edema.

2022 in Review: In their 17th season as the Astros' Double-A affiliate, the Space Cowboys, finished with a 63-74 record and in fifth place in the Texas League South Division. Former Fayetteville Woodpeckers outfielder Justin Dirden was the top slugger, hitting a team-high 20 HR's and batting .324 over 92 games before a promotion to Triple-A. Shay Whitcomb hit 19 homers, tallied 60 RBI. Collectively, the Corpus Christi offense batted .247 and finished fourth in the league with 174 homers. On the mound, the Hooks had the fourth highest combined ERA (5.34) but the third most strikeouts (1,293) in the league. Yainer Diaz began his Minor League career with the Cleveland Guardians organization after being signed as an international free agent in 2016. Diaz joined the Astros when he was traded to Houston during the deadline on July 30, 2021, and played 12 games with Fayetteville before a promotion to High-A Asheville. In 2022, his first full season with the organization, Diaz batted .316 with nine home runs and 48 runs batted in over 57 games with Double-A Corpus Christi. After being promoted to Triple-A Sugar Land on June 20, the Dominican Republic native continued to have success at the plate, hitting .294 with 16 HR and 48 RBI across 48 contests with the Space Cowboys. His prolific offensive output led to him making his Major League debut on September 2 in Anaheim, where he drew a bases-loaded walk to record his first MLB RBI.

Hunter Brown was drafted in the fifth round of the 2019 MLB Draft after three seasons at Wayne State University. Following a strong 2021 season, Brown was assigned to Triple-A Sugar Land to start the 2022 campaign. He quickly became one of the most dominant arms in the Pacific Coast League and earned PCL Pitcher of the Week honors on May 31. Brown was selected to the All-Star Futures Game and finished with the lowest ERA (2.55) out of any qualified pitcher in the PCL. He was called up to Houston on September 1 shined in his debut four days later, tossing six shutout innings against the Texas Rangers. Brown also made three postseason appearances for the Astros, helping the club win the 2022 World Series.





The Fayetteville Woodpeckers carried their inagural season into the 2019 postseason with a 3-2 series victory over the Down East Wood Ducks, earning the Carolina League South championship. In a double-header at Segra Stadium on September 4th, the Woodpeckers recovered from a 3-0 shutout loss in Game One with a 3-0 victory in the night cap. Austin Hansen and Humberto Castellanos combined for the 7-inning shutout while Jeremy Pena provided a big two-run home run in the bottom of the third inning to even the series. Another double-header split followed on September 7th, as Down East walked off Game Three in the bottom of the eighth inning on a Yohel Pozo RBI single off Riley Cabral. With the season on the line, Fayetteville took the second game behind a 6-inning 10-strikeout performace from Luis Garcia, forcing a Game Five in Kinston. In the only nine-inning game of the series, Fayetteville trailed 1-0 until Chandler Taylor evened the game with a solo HR in the sixth inning. Marty Costes jumped Fayetteville ahead with a two-run double in the 7th, and David Hensley helped ice the series with a two-run single en route to the 6-3 victory and a trip to the Carolina League Championship Series.

Wilmington evened the series with a come-from-behind three-run 7th inning in Game Two as the series traveled to Segra Stadium. Hensely again left his mark on the series with a go-ahead two-run double in the sixth inning to take Game Three by a 2-1 score. Nivaldo Rodriguez delivered one of the shining pitching performances of the series, a quality start with seven strikeouts over six innings of work. Only one win shy of a league crown, the Woodpeckers offense ran a ground, getting shutout on consective nights. MJ Melendez homered in Game 4 to help lock up a 2-0 victory for the Blue Rocks and force an all-deciding Game Five. In the winner-take-all game at Segra Stadium Dennicher Carrasco broke up a scoreless tie in the fourth inning with a solo HR off Luis Garcia and Nick Pratto's RBI double in the ninth capped another 2-0 victory and a come-from-behind effort from Wilmington to take the Carolina League Championship.

WOODPECKERS FIRSTS

FAYETTEVILLE PRO BASEBALL HISTORY



FRONT OFFICE

The 2019 inagural season for the Fayetteville Woodpeckers and the grand opening of Segra Stadium marked the arrival of the first minor leafue affiliated team in the area in over 20 years since the days of the Fayetteville Generals and Cape Fear Crocs. Prior to the Generals era, the history of professional baseball in Fayetteville dates back much further to the early 1900's. Local historians have been able to piece together the story of Fayetteville baseball through newspaper archives and eyewitness accounts.

The history of minor league baseball in the Fayetteville area dates back to at least 1909, when the Class D Fayetteville Highlanders joined the Eastern Carolina League, playing at Cape Fear Fairgrounds Park in 1909 and 1911. The ballpark was located on Gillespie Street in Fayetteville. The site has a marker for a Babe Ruth home run believed to be his first professional home-run hit in a March 1914 Spring Training game for the Baltimore Orioles, then a minor league franchise. During the 1910 season, the Highlanders captured the Eastern Carolina League championship with Olympic Champion and Pro Football Hall of Famer Jim Thorpe as a member of the roster and Charles C.A. Clancy as the reported manager of the team.

With the rise of World War I, the Highlanders ended operations until 1928. North Carolina Governor Bickett pronounced himself against professional baseball at the time saying, "The man who is able to play professional baseball ought to be either in a trench or in a furrow." In 1928-29 the Fayetteville Highlanders returned to the Class D Eastern Carolina League and featured future Pittsburgh Pirates infielder Pep Young during the 1928 season and Brooklyn Dodgers pitcher Van Mugo in 1929.

After another minor league hiatus in the 30's, the Fayetteville Cubs in 1946-48 took shape as an affiliate all three seasons for the major league Chicago Cubs. The Cubs competed in the Class D Coastal Plain League in its inaugural year and shifted to the Class B Tri-State League for the 1947-48 campaigns. In 1950, Fayetteville joined the Class B Carolina Baseball League and operated as a farm team of the Philadelphia Athletics, playing in its fourth league since 1946. The Fayetteville Hilanders (correct spelling for the 1953 to 1956 team) returned from 1953-56 as part of the Class B Carolina League. Fayetteville became a Baltimore affiliate in 1955 and a Cleveland affiliate in 1956, defeating Danville in a best-of-seven championship series to win the title. The 1956 championship to this day is the last one won by a professional baseball team in Fayetteville. After the championship the Hilanders folded the following season.

Fayetteville had a 31 year absence from minor league baseball which ended in 1987 when the Fayetteville Generals, a Detroit Tigers affiliate, joined the Class A South Atlantic League. Charles Padgett, Don Koonce, and Jimmy Bunce paid \$500,000 for the franchise that struggled financially until the 1989 season but then posted several positive years financially and with attendance in the early 90's. The Fayetteville Generals' uniformes were featured in the movie "Bull Durham." They also helped develop a number of major league players to include Travis Fryman, Juan Encarnacion, Frank Caralanotto, Gabe Kapler and others, before the end of their 10-year association in 1996. During the first season of the Generals, Fayetteville also opened the gates of newly constructed J.P. Riddle Stadium. Still standing today, it has a seating capacity of about 2,500 and was the home of all professional baseball in Fayetteville until the construction of Segra Stadium.

The next team to play in Fayetteville was the Cape Fear Crocs who arrived in 1997, an affiliate of the Montreal Expos. Some of the young Crocs' players who went on to the major leagues included Milton Bradley, Brandon Phillips, Cliff Lee and Brian Schneider. The Cape Fear Crocs won the 1999 second-half Northern Division title, but were unable to claim a South Atlantic League Championship during their history. The downfall of the Crocs was facility deficiencies and sagging attendance, resulting in the franchise being sold and moved to Lakewood, New Jersey.

The Fayetteville Swamp Dogs kept baseball alive in the years that followed. Founded in 2001, the independent franchise competed in the wooden-bat Coastal Plain League. Big league alumi include pitcher David Aardsma, slugger Mark Reynolds, pitcher Carter Capps and outfielder Andy Dirks. The team announced on October 3, 2019 that they would sit out the 2020 Coastal Plain League season and relocate afterwards, having failed to reach a new lease agreement at J. P. Riddle Stadium

In August of 2016, a two-team expansion of the Carolina League was approved and the Fayetteville City Counsil approved plans to build a new stadium by 2019. The startup franchise played as the Buies Creek Astros in 2017-18 and played its home games at Jim Perry Stadium on the campus of Campbell University, winning a Carolina League Championship in 2018. The Woodpeckers then took over the newest era of baseball in 2019.


