GAME INFORMATION

LAST TIME OUT - PORTLAND 8, BINGHAMTON 4: The Rumble Ponies surrendered a seven-run second inning and gave up three home runs in the loss to the Sea Dogs. New York Mets **LHP Cionel Pérez** in his second appearance this series, pitched 1.0 perfect frame with a strikeout. **RHP Carlos Guzman** struck out four batters over 2.0 innings in relief. OF Eli Serrano III blasted his 6th Double-A home run to make it 7-1 in the fourth inning. **INF Eddinson Paulino** hit a solo home run in the seventh inning. **INF Marco Vargas** tallied a three-hit performance (3-for-5, R, 2 2B, 3B).

SCOREBOARD WATCHING: The Reading Fightin' Phis clinched a postseason berth for the first time since 2019, with a 11-10 win over the Erie SeaWolves on Thursday night from FirstEnergy Stadium. Binghamton was 10.0 games back of first place on August 1 and held a record of 10-22 at the trade deadline. The Rumble Ponies went 25-11 over their last 36 games before being eliminated from postseason contention with three games to play in the 2026 regular season.

POWER SURGE: This year, the Rumble Ponies have been live or die by the home run, going 50-39 when they hit a homer and 11-36 when they do not. Binghamton has homered in six straight games and are 2-4 in that stretch their worst stretch since July. Binghamton homered 45 times in August (27 games) and went 20-7 in that stretch which was 1st in the Eastern League. The Rumble Ponies homered in 12 straight games until game two of the doubleheader on August 29 against Reading.

RED HOT ROJAS: On Wednesday night against Portland, **INF Jefferson Rojas** (Mets No. 1 prospect) tallied his 37th multi-hit game. Rojas cashed in his 20th stolen base on Tuesday night against Portland and has joined the 20-20-20 club (24 HR, 26 2B, 20 SB). Rojas is one of five players in the Eastern League and one of 11 players in Double-A to hit that mark. He hit his 9th HR as a member of the New York Mets organization and his 24th Double-A home run on Sunday night against New Hampshire tallied. Rojas has also hit seven home runs over his last 16 games. On Sunday against New Hampshire, Rojas handed in four hits, for the third time in his career and the first time he's done it at Double-A. Rojas was acquired by the Mets from the Chicago Cubs in a trade for right-handed pitcher Clay Holmes and outfielder Tyrone Taylor on August 3. Rojas now ranks as MLB Pipeline's No. 76 overall prospect and the No. 2-ranked third baseman prospect in baseball.

STEADY SUERO: **C/OF Chris Suero** handed in his 21st multi-hit game against Portland on Wednesday night (2-for-4, R, SB). Suero ranks 5th in the Eastern League in stolen bases (37) and ranks 3rd in walks (79). Suero has reached base in 45 of his last 49 games. The 22-year old has 20 2B, and 37 SB on the year and his 18 HR are two shy of joining the 20-20-30 club. Suero would become one of six players in the Eastern League and one of 12 players in Double-A to join the 20-20-20 club and the second to join the 20-20-30 club with Josue De Paula (Double-A Tulsa). Suero would become the 11th player in Minor League Baseball to join the 20-20-30 (20+HR, 20+ 2B, 30+ SB) club if he reaches the 20 HR mark. Suero finished August with 5 2B, 5 HR and 15 RBI.

MITCH'S STICK: **INF Mitch Voit** (Mets No. 4 prospect) chalked up his 11th multi-hit game at Double-A on Thursday night against Portland (2-for-5, R, RBI, SB). Voit has a hit in four straight games. He delivered the eventual game winning two-run double in the eighth inning on September 4, his 12th 2B at Double-A. Since making his Double-A debut on July 28, Voit ranks among Double-A: 33 R (6th), 435 OBP (9th), .351 AVG (9th), 12 2B (T-4th) and among the Eastern League: 2nd in AVG, 1st in R, 2nd in 2B, 3rd in OBP, .961 OPS (4th), .526 SLG (10th), 40 H (8th) in that span. Over his first 28 games at Double-A: .351 AVG | .435 OBP | .526 SLG | .961 OPS | 33 R | 15 XBH | 18 RBI | 7 SB. Voit was named Eastern League Player of the Week in back-to-back weeks to begin his Double-A career.

MARCO POLO: Since returning from the injury list on August 4, **INF Marco Vargas** in 26 games: .352 AVG | .400 OBP | .524 SLG | .924 OPS | 19 R | 3 HR | 10 XBH | 18 RBI. Vargas ranks 1st in the Eastern League in AVG in that stretch. Vargas tallied his 6th three-hit game at Double-A on Friday night (3-for-5, R, 2 2B, 3B). Vargas has nine multi-hit games over his last 23 games and is riding a game hit-streak. Over 19 games in the month of August, INF Marco Vargas hit .333 with 3 HR, 15 RBI, .882 OPS, and 11. Vargas had six games in August with three or more hits.

DAVIS THE GREAT: **RHP Gabe Davis**, Mets No. 23 prospect and No. 8 pitching prospect is expected to make his 15th Double-A start tonight and his fifth start and sixth appearance as a member of the Mets organization. Davis started the final home game at Mirabito Stadium on Sunday vs. New Hampshire (TOR) and recorded five strikeouts over a career-high 4.1 innings pitched. Over his last 4 APP 3 GS (13.2 IP, 8 H, 2 ER, 18 SO). Davis was acquired by the New York Mets, along with pitching prospect Zach Franklin, in a trade with the Chicago White Sox for RHP Huascar Brazobán on August 3. Originally drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the fifth round of the 2025 MLB Draft out of Oklahoma State University.

MANAGER

HOMETOWN: Canberra, Australia

-Michael Collins, Binghamton's 19th manager all-time, is in his first season managing the Rumble Ponies and his first season in the Mets organization.
-Collins spent the last eight seasons (2018-25) with the Houston Astros, as a bullpen catcher in 2018 and serving as the Astros' major league catching coach for the last seven seasons (2019-25), including the 2022 World Series championship.
-Collins worked in the San Diego Padres organization as a manager for the DSL Padres (2012), AZL Padres (2013, 2016-17), High-A Fort Wayne (2014), and Single-A Lake Elsinore (2015) for six seasons between 2012-17.
-He also managed the Canberra Cavalry in the Australian Baseball League in 2012-14, right after his playing career ended. He led the Cavalry to the Claxton Shield as national champions for the first time.
-Collins debuted as a player in the minor leagues in 2001 at the age of 16 with the AZL Angels. He spent 10 seasons in the minor leagues with the Angels and Padres, and reached as high as Triple-A in 2009 and 2010. Collins also played in the ABL and was an All-Star catcher.
-Collins has coached for Team Australia in the World Baseball Classic in 2026, 2017, and 2013. He played for Team Australia in the WBC in 2009 and 2006. Born July 18, 1984 in Canberra, Australia. On May 3, 2024, he became a United States citizen.

-Mariano Duncan begins his fifth year as bench coach with the Rumble Ponies and eighth year in the Mets organization. He previously served as the bench coach for the Brooklyn Cyclones in 2021 & in the same role with Kingsport in 2019.
-Duncan has Major League coaching experience, after serving as the first base coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers for five seasons from 2006-2010. He has spent time on various minor league staffs affiliated with the Dodgers and Chicago Cubs, before joining the Mets organization in 2019.
-The former infielder played 12 major league seasons with the Dodgers, Cincinnati Reds, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Toronto Blue Jays. He is a two-time World Series champion ('90 Reds and '96 Yankees), one-time All-Star (with Philadelphia in 1994), and was part of the 1993 Phillies team that won the National League pennant. He was inducted into the Dominican Republic Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. He made his MLB debut for the Dodgers on April 9, 1975, at the age of 22. Duncan finished third for the N.L. Rookie of the Year.

-Matt Carasiti is in his first season as the pitching coach for the Rumble Ponies and with the Mets organization.
-Carasiti spent the 2025 season as the pitching coach for the High-A Everett AquaSox in the Seattle Mariners' organization.
-Carasiti pitched in the major leagues for parts of four seasons with the Colorado Rockies (2016, 2023-24) and the Seattle Mariners (2019). He made his MLB debut for the Rockies on August 12, 2016, at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia. In his MLB career, Carasiti made 53 appearances (48 in relief) and went 2-2 with 50 strikeouts in 58.1 innings.
-Pitched for parts of 10 seasons in affiliated baseball. Underwent Tommy John surgery prior to the 2020 season and missed all of 2020 and 2021 seasons. Returned and pitched for the Long Island Ducks of the Atlantic League in 2022 and also pitched professionally in Japan in 2018. Last appeared in MLB on June 7, 2024 for the Rockies.
-Was a Double-A Eastern League All-Star for the Hartford Yard Goats (Colorado Rockies) in 2016.
-Drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the sixth round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of St. John's University (N.Y.). Originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the 36th round of the 2009 draft, but did not sign.
-Pitched for three seasons (2010-12) at St. John's and made 66 appearances and 22 starts, and went 16-11 with a 4.19 ERA and recorded 137 strikeouts in 180.1 innings. He recorded eight saves in 2011, which ranked fifth in the Big East.
-Grew up in Berlin, Connecticut, and attended Berlin HS and was the 2009 Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year.

-Rachel Folden begins her first season as the hitting coach for Binghamton and with the Mets organization.
-Folden spent the previous five seasons as a coach in the Chicago Cubs organization in various roles: Arizona Complex League hitting coach (2021-22), Minor League hitting coordinator (2023), Double-A Tennessee hitting coach (2024), and Triple-A Iowa hitting coach (2025). Was the first female coach in the history of the Chicago Cubs organization.
-Folden played professional softball with the Chicago Bandits (2008-12) and Carolina Diamonds (2012) in the National Pro Fastpitch league.
-She began her coaching career in softball at Encinal High School (2009) while working as a GA at Holy Names University. Folden was also an assistant softball coach at Valparaiso University for two seasons (2010-11).
-Folden was a four-time All-American in softball at Marshall University (2005-08) and was inducted in the Marshall Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019. Folden was a two-time Conference USA Player of the Year, four-time All-Conference First Team selection, and won the triple crown (.386 AVG, 18 HR, 56 RBI) in CUSA as a sophomore in 2006. She was the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year in 2005, before moving to CUSA.

-Hager played infield for parts of two seasons in the major leagues with the New York Mets (2021) and the Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22). Hager made his MLB debut for the Mets on May 15, 2021, at Tropicana Field against the Rays. He played in five games for the Mets and totaled 42 games in his MLB career.
-Played for parts of 12 seasons in affiliated baseball, including 1,037 games in the minor leagues for six different organizations. Retired from playing in 2024 and last played for Triple-A Iowa in the Chicago Cubs organization.
-Drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (32nd overall) in the 2011 MLB Draft out of Sierra Vista HS (Nevada). Was the Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior and was committed to play at Arizona State University, before the draft.
-Played on the same 12U Southern Nevada Bulldogs travel team with Bryce Harper and Joey Gallo.

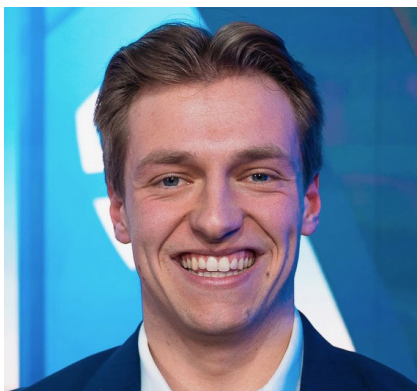


MATT LEVINE *Director of Broadcasting & Media Relations*
