RACE TO THE TOP: With Clearwater's 13-4 loss to Jupiter last night, Dunedin did not lose any ground in the FSL standings. However, Bradenton downed Daytona 7-1 to propel the Marauders four games back from the Threshers. Dunedin remains 7.5 games out of a playoff spot with 14 games left.

TIGERS CANT FLY?: After winning three straight games to open the series, the Blue Jays dropped back-to-back games in Lakeland, falling 9-3 on Thursday and 3-1 on Friday. On Thursday, Lakeland struck early and pulled away behind a solo blast from Zach MacDonald and a pair of Ricardo Hurtado home runs, handing Johnny King (2.2 IP, 5 R, 4 H, 4 BB, 3 K) his second Class-A loss. Yeuni Munoz (2-for-3, 2 RBI, R, BB) supplied the offense with a two-run single in the 5th inning scorched at 112.2 MPH, the hardest-hit ball by a Blue Jay this season. Munoz has now reached base in all five games since returning from the injured list, collecting hits in four. Friday's matchup turned into a pitchers' duel, with Daniel Guerra (4.2 IP, 1 R, 2 H, 2 BB, 6 K) allowing just one run, which scored after his departure. LHP Grif Hughes added two hitless innings of relief, extending his scoreless streak to 4.2 frames. Jake Casey tied the game in the 6th with his third home run in four games and walked twice, and is 5-for-12 (.417) with three homers and four RBI this week in Lakeland.

TUSSLE IN TAMPA: The Tarpons took five of eight from the Blue Jays last week, with three of Dunedin's losses coming by three runs or less. Tampa took the first four of the series, then Dunedin rattled off three straight wins before falling in the finale on Sunday. Dunedin blew in early lead in two of the losses, and we're held to six hits or less in four games.

JR JUST RAKES: In High-A Vancouver, J.R. Freethy was named the Northwest League Player of the Week for August 11-17 after he went 11-for-24 (.458) with six doubles, a homer, seven runs scored, and eight RBI in six games played. The 22-year-old has been a dynamo at the top of the order since he was promoted from Single-A Dunedin on August 4. He's slashing .333/.444/.533 with a .977 OPS in 11 games with the C's this year.

SO LONG, TUCK: After parts of three seasons, and 283 games in Dunedin, Tucker Toman was promoted to High-A Vancouver on Friday. After batting .214 over the first 29 games of the season with a .610 OPS, in 59 games since May 25, Toman hit .285 with five homers and 38 RBI. He capped off his Dunedin career by tallying a hit in both ends of Thursday's doubleheader, and in game two went 3-for-4 with four RBI including his sixth homer of the season, a two-run shot in the 6th. Toman's six homers and 52 RBI are career-highs.

HOT TEA: MLB Pipeline released their fresh Top 100 and team Top 30 rankings on Monday. JoJo Parker debuts at #2 in the Jays system and #41 overall. Trey Yesavage gets a healthy bump, he's up to #26 overall, and the 3rd best RHP prospect in MLB. He's the Jays top prospect. Arjun Nimmala rounds out the Top 100 reps, slotting in at #51. Gage Stanifer goes from unranked to No. 6. Edward Duran goes from unranked to No. 14. Ranked the No. 27 farm system in baseball entering the season per MLB Pipeline, the Blue Jays jumped up to No. 20 in the mid-season update. After multiple pitching injuries last year, the Blue Jays have turned a weakness on the mound into a strength with impressive years from Yesavage, Johnny King and Top 30 newcomer Gage Stanifer. (This ranking doesn't factor in the breakouts from Khal Stephen and Kendry Rojas, who were moved at the Trade Deadline.) With Parker and Nimmala in the same system, there could be healthy debate surrounding Jays shortstops for years, and don't overlook Dominican Summer League star Juan Sanchez, who has placed himself squarely on the radar after signing for \$997,500 in January.

GAS IT UP: The D-Jays went 33-31 in the first half fourth in the FSL West. After Dunedin went 4-13 from May 14-June 1, they fell from two games up in first place on May 13, to 5.5 games out of first place in the FSL West on June 3.

EYE OF THE TIGER: The Blue Jays are 9-8 in their 17 meetings with Lakeland this season. They split their first series from April 15-20, then Lakeland swept Dunedin in a rain-shortened four-game set July 1-6 while the Flying Tigers were in the midst of a 12-game win streak that saw five shutouts. Lakeland outscored Dunedin 24-4 in the series and shutout the Jays twice, including a 22-inning scoreless streak by Lakeland pitching. However, in their series last series from 7/29-7/31, Dunedin took three of four, including a wild three hour 35 minute contest as part of a doubleheader on July 30 which saw Dunedin claw back from down eight runs in the 5th inning, the fall 18-11 in extras. The Flying Tigers are a league-best 36-16 at home. Lakeland went 38-26 in the first half.

Gil Kim | Manager Year with Toronto: 10 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Pottsville, PA

First-year Manager Gil Kim provides a wealth of experience as a player, coach, and executive to Dunedin. Hired in 2016 as the Blue Jays Director of Player Development, Kim transitioned from the front office to a coaching role with the organization in 2020 when he joined Toronto's major league field staff under the same job title, before becoming the Blue Jay's major league field coordinator in 2022, a position he held until 2024. Before joining Toronto, Kim spent seven seasons with the Texas Rangers in several scouting roles, culminating as Director, International Scouting. A native of Pottsville, PA, Kim also had a six-year international professional playing career as an infielder, which included stops in the Netherlands, China, Australia, Spain and Venezuela. He played one season of collegiate baseball at D3 Middlebury before transferring to Vanderbilt, where he played under Tim Corbin. In 2008 while playing in Venezuela, Kim slept on a mattress in the bathroom in the locker room to save money and learn Spanish.

Cory Riordan | Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 5 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Killingworth, CT

Cory Riordan enters his third season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach, after he held the same role with the FCL Blue Jays in 2021-22. He joined the Blue Jays organization in 2020, where he spent the 2020 shutdown assisting with the club's pitch design framework. Riordan pitched collegiately at Fordham University and went on to play 13 professional seasons, spending time with the Colorado Rockies and Detroit Tigers organizations, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time in the independent Atlantic League, and played internationally in South Korea and Taiwan, and three winter ball seasons in Venezuela and the Dominican Republic.

Nash Knight | Hitting Coach Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Denton, TX

Nash Knight enters his second season with the Dunedin Blue Jays and Jays' organization. Under Knight's guidance in 2024, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League leaders with 101 HR (3rd), 34 3B (T-1st), and a .359 SLG (3rd). Knight made the transition to coaching following a seven-year playing career where he spent six seasons in Toronto's farm system, reaching as high as Triple-A. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Knight suited up for Dunedin in parts of two seasons, playing 105 career games at TD Ballpark in his career, notably playing all nine positions in a game on Sep. 2, 2018 for a team managed by Casey Candaele. Was a member of 2017 FSL Co-Champion Dunedin team which was managed by current Toronto skipper John Schneider and included future big leaguers including Vladimir Guererro Jr, Bo Bichette, Lourdes Gurriel Jr, Jordan Romano, and Ryan Borucki. Majored in kinesiology at DBU. Brother, Austin, has coached at DBU, Texas A&M, and most recently coached in the Mariners organization.

Ashley Stephenson | Position Coach Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Mississauga, ON.

Stephenson is in her first season as Position Coach, after she spent the prior two seasons with the High-A Vancouver Canadians in the same role, helping to claim a 2023 Northwest League championship. Inducted to the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. Initially a star hockey player at the collegiate level at Wilfrid Laurier, she claimed four conference titles and a CIS National Championship, before joining the pro ranks in the original National Women's Hockey League and the Canadian Women's Hockey League. On the diamond, Stephenson starred for Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004 to 2018. She was twice named the team's MVP, earned an All-Star nod at third base in the 2008 IBAF World Cup Tournament and won the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was renamed in her honor. She was tabbed as the 2022 recipient of the Baseball Canada Lionel Ruhr Elite Coach of the Year Award after she became the first woman to manage a Canadian national baseball team when she led the women's national team to two wins over Team USA in the Friendship Series then coached Ontario teams at the Women's Invitational and 16U Girls Championships ahead of joining the Blue Jays organization. Became the second female coach in the Jays system, following Jamie Lever.

Rodrigo Vigil | Position Coach Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: David, Panama

Vigil joins Dunedin for his first season as a Position Coach. A former catcher, Vigil enjoyed an 11-year professional playing career. He spent 10 seasons in the Miami Marlins farm system before finishing with the Blue Jays in 2021, where he hit .275 in 34 games between Double-A New Hampshire and Triple-A Buffalo. Overall, Vigil played 550 career minor league games, where he hit .251. He began his coaching career as a bench coach for the ACL Mariners in 2022 before returning to the Blue Jays system, where he spent the past two seasons as a rehab position coach.

Antonio Caceres | Ast. Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 25 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Cotui, DR

Caceres spent the past three years as the Pitching Coach for the FCL Blue Jays. A lifelong member of the Blue Jays organization, Caceres was signed out of the Dominican Republic by Toronto when he was 17. He played in their minor league system from 1995-1998, before he transitioned to a pitching coach role in 2000. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

- LAST TIME OUT:** allowed two earned runs in a rain-shortened start, departing after a weather delay in the 4th. Two of the three runs on Wilkerson's line scored following his departure.
- Fired three shutout innings on July 24th before the game was suspended, then resumed the suspended game 19 days later by throwing 4.2 frames to complete his outing. Wilkerson had allowed only one run on five hits over his first 7.2 innings before allowing a go-ahead two-run homer in the 9th. Despite being broken up between 19 days, Wilkerson's 115 pitches are the 3rd most thrown in an outing in MiLB this season, and his 7.2 innings mark the 3rd longest outing in the FSL this season. The outing marked Wilkerson's personal best in innings and strikeouts, and he recorded his first quality start of the season.

2025: Began professional career as a member of the FCL Blue Jays, where he made seven appearances (two starts) and went 3-2 with a 5.40 ERA fanned 23 to only five walks in 21.2 frames. In his first professional game, Wilkerson hurled three shutout innings vs. FCL Tigers on May 23 with three strikeouts and no walks. Expected to be assigned to Dunedin out of camp and was working with the Dunedin work group, but suffered an oblique injury during spring training which held him back to rehab.

COLLEGE NOTES: Pitched three seasons at Virginia Military Institute, which was Holden's only offer out of high school as a scrawny high school junior who threw 83 MPH. As a freshman in 2022 he pitched to a 4.58 ERA in seven appearances (one start) with 23 K in 17.2 IP before a season-ending injury in early-April. As a sophomore in 2023, went 3-1 with a 9.64 ERA in 11 appearances (eight starts) with 35 K/33 BB in 28 IP. Made four starts as a junior in 2024, striking out 29 in 18.1 IP with a 7.85 ERA before was cut short by a blood clot in a vein in his throwing shoulder. In his last start before injury, threw 6 IP and earned the win vs. Binghamton, striking out a career-high 10 and allowing 1 R. Made some mechanical adjustments and gained velocity ahead of his junior season.

CAREER NOTES: Selected in the 18th round (547th overall) by the Toronto Blue Jays in the 2024 MLB Draft, signed for \$150,000.

PERSONAL NOTES: When he was drafted, got the call as he was working out at the Lab Sports Performance Center, where he has been training since he was 11 years old. After being drafted and reporting to Dunedin in the summer of 2024, he returned to VMI in the fall to complete his degree by taking an overload of credits after negotiating with the Blue Jays. Robbie Hebert, owner and trainer at Lab Sports Performance, noted, "One thing that always stood out with Holden is the perspective. He knew how important going to VMI was to get that degree, and even though a great opportunity has come, he always knew his ultimate goal was to get that degree. What makes the situation so great for him is that he gets to do both." VMI is America's first state military college, and enrolls cadets only. Abraham Lincoln first called VMI "The West Point of the South" because of its role during the American Civil War, the nickname has remained because VMI has produced more Army generals than any ROTC program in the U.S. All VMI cadets must participate in the Army's ROTC programs, but are not required to serve, although approximately 65% of VMI graduates enter the military upon graduation. VMI is a school of 1,500 students. Signed by Jays scout Coulson Barbiche (Bar-bich).

SCOUTING REPORT: Fastball: (92-95), Slider (85-87), Changeup (84-86)

2025: Began season working as a reliever for Dunedin, throwing 11 IP out of his first three games out of the bullpen without allowing an ER, yielding only 7 H with 10 K and 1 BB. Batista was moved into the starting rotation for his first start of the season on April 23 @TAM. Named Florida State League Pitcher of the Week for May 6–11, 2025. Batista earned his first win of the season on Saturday, May 10 against Fort Myers, striking out a career-high nine batters over five shutout innings. He allowed just four hits and one walk, fanning six of the final nine batters he faced and keeping the Mighty Mussels from advancing a runner past second base.

2024: Opened season with FCL Red Sox, pitching to a 3.92 ERA over eight appearances (five starts) with 23 K in 20.2 IP, before he was dealt to the Blue Jays ahead of the 2024 Trade Deadline on July 27th along with SS Cutter Coffey and SS Eddinson Paulino in in exchange for C Danny Jansen. Upon being traded, spent two weeks working out at the Blue Jays Player Development Complex for Toronto to evaluate him, since the Blue Jays weren't sure exactly what they were getting given the lack of information and in-person scouting of Batista. He made his Blue Jays organizational debut with Class-A Dunedin, going 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA and 1.14 WHIP over four appearances (three starts)

spanning 16.2 IP. In his second start with Dunedin, earned his first professional win, threw 5 shutout IP @CLR, allowing only 1 H with 3 K and 0 BB.

2023: Pitched 40.2 IP over 11 appearances (nine starts) for the DSL Red Sox, where he posted a 3.54 ERA with 54 K/8 BB, an 11.95 K/9 rate. Batista was recognized as the Red Sox' 2023 Minor League Latin Program Pitcher of the Year and honored on the field before a September game at Fenway Park. Among 94 pitchers in the DSL who threw at least 40 innings, Batista ranked fifth in K/9 (11.95), 5th in K rate (33.5%), 1st in swinging-strike rate (50.7%), and 19th in WHIP (1.03). Added 11 lbs between March and the end of the 2023 season, which he credited to his success, and an uptick in velocity.

CAREER NOTES: Signed by the Red Sox for \$10K as an international free agent on Nov. 4, 2022. Pitching Coordinator Ricky Meinhold touted his abilities as an excellent worker and a great kid who is willing to learn and ask questions. Batista is a fast worker on the mound, who often pushes the pace and catches hitters off guard.

PERSONAL NOTES: Favorite player growing up was Pedro Martinez.

Over his four collegiate seasons, Smith hit .305 across 213 college games with 20 home runs and 160 RBI. As a left-handed pitcher, he posted a 16-9 record and a 4.12 ERA in 53 college appearances and 28 starts while striking out 168 batters. Smith's final outing as a Torero saw him earn the win after pitching the final seven innings of San Diego's 14-inning thriller in the WCC Tournament Championship, allowing just three runs on four hits as he used 99 pitches to put his team in position to earn a walk-off victory. As a senior in 2025, Smith batted a career-high .353 with 46 runs, six homers, and 48 RBI. His USD career included 98 starts as a designated hitter, 27 starts in center field, 30 starts in left field, and three games in right field in addition to his 28 career starts on the mound. He finished his college career with a .987 fielding percentage that saw him commit just three errors in 232 chances.
