LAST TIME OUT: The Cyclones earned their first win of the 2024 season with a 3-0 victory over the Tourists on Tuesday night...RHPs Brandon Sproat, Jordany Ventura, and Justin Lawson combined on a five-hit shutout and struck out 14 hitters...RF Omar De Los Santos stole third and scored on a throwing error to put Brooklyn ahead $1-0$ in the first...3B Junior Tilien added an RBI single in the fourth before 1B Ryan Clifford capped the scoring with a solo home run in the eighth... three times.

DEBUT DUO: Both RHP Brandon Sproat and RHP Justin Lawson made their professional debuts in Brooklyn's 3-0 win on Tuesday night...Sproat tossed 2.2 innings of scoreless ball, allowing just one hit and striking out five in a no-decision...Lawson earned the save in his first professional appearance, allowing one knock and whiffing four hitters.

HOME OPENER: The Brooklyn Cyclones opened up their 66game home schedule on Tuesday evening vs. Asheville with a 3-0 win...The shutout marked the first for Brooklyn in a home opener since a 3-0 victory in 11 years...The Cyclones last blanked an opponent in their home debut on June 20, 2013, vs. Aberdeen...RHP John Gant (5.0 IP), RHP Tim Peterson (2.2), and LHP John Mincone (1.1) combined for the win...The 'Clones are now 17-5 all-time in their first home game of the season.

ZEIG ZAG: After being limited to just 1.0 inning of work in 2023 due to injuries, RHP Calvin Ziegler flourished in his High-A and Cyclones' debut...The 21-year-old tied a career-high with nine strikeouts and punched out eight straight hitters from one out in the 1 st until the last batter of the 3rd...Ziegler became just the fifth Brooklyn pitcher to strike out 9 or more hitters in 4.0 or fewer innings since 2005...RHP Blade Tidwell accomplished Andrew Edwards $(8 / 30 / 19)$, LHP Martin Anderson ( $7 / 7 / 17$ ), Andrew Edwards ( $8 / 30 / 19$ ), LHP Martin And
and RHP Dawrin Frias $(7 / 31 / 13)$ are the others.

GRAB SOME PINE: RHPs Calvin Ziegler, Josh Hejka, Dakota Hawkins, and Joshua Corneilly combined to strike out 18 Wilmington hitters over 9.2 innings in Sunday's loss...The 18 strikeouts by Cyclones pitching marked the most for the franchise in a single game since July 23, 2016, vs. Aberdeen. RHP Justin Dunn (5), LHP Kyle Regnault (2), and RHP Nabil Crismatt (11) combined to whiff 18 IronBirds over 9.0 innings in a $7-2$ win...The single-game franchise mark for team strikeouts is 22 set in a 20 -inning, $3-2$ loss vs. Staten Island on June 17,
2016 . 2016.

DE RECORD SETTER: OF Omar De Los Santos stole a pair of bases on Friday night and broke INF Walter Rasquin's (32) franchise single-season stolen base record (37) in 2023...The 24-year-old entered as a pinch-runner and caught Hudson Valley napping to steal second base on July 21 to set the mark.. After a steal on Tuesday, De Los Santos is tied for second on the Cyclones' all-time stolen base list (40) with Rasquin...He is 8 steals shy of matching UTL Jaylen Palmer's (48) ail-time record...Since the start of 2022, De Los Santos is eighth across the Minors for swipes (110).
2023 IN REVIEW: Brooklyn claimed a share of the North Division Second Half crown in the South Atlantic League, but ceded the final playoff spot to the Jersey Shore BlueClaws on a head-to-head tiebreaker...Needing a win on the final day of the regular season to clinch a playoff spot, the 'Clones dropped a 6-2 contest to Wilmington...Jersey Shore would outlast the Hudson Valley Renegades, $10-9$, in 11 innings to secure the seat...After a 28-37 first-half record, the Cyclones composed a 38-28 mark in the second half to finish the season over .500 at 66-65.

GENIUNE DRAFT: Seven members of last summer's New York Mets draft class will open the 2024 season with the Cyclones... Pregent returns to the roster, while second-round selection RHP Brandon Sproat and third-round pick two-way player Nolan Hall (7th), INF Nick Lorusso (9th) RHP Ben Simon (13th) and RHP Justin Lawson (15th) round out the group RHP Dakota Hawkins, who signed as an undrafted free agent, will also start the season in Brooklyn

KING STANLEY: On the final day of the 2023 regular season OF Stanley Consuegra broke a tie with C Francisco Álvarez for Brooklyn's single-season home run record (23)...Consuegra (28) also surpassed Álvarez (22) for the franchise record in career home runs on August 23 at Asheville...He and Álvarez are the only two players in franchise history to record a 20-plus home run season... The 23-year-old also broke the franchise's single-season ecord for extra-base hits (42) and tied the mark for RBI (63) se by Ronny Mauricio in 2021...Consuegra also holds the 'Clones all-time record for RBI (90) and extra-base knocks (62).

SPRING BREAKOUT: The Willow Springs, N.C. native earned the win pitching in relief for the New York Mets prospects in their contest against the Washington Nationals' farmhands on Friday, March 15...McLean came on in support of former Cyclone RHP Blade Tidwell in the top of the fifth...The right-hander did not allow a run on one hit, did not walk a batter, and struck out a batter...Tossed only 10 pitches ( 7 strikes)...Relieved by RHP Brandon Sproat to start the sixth in the Mets' 4-2 win.

HAVE IT TWO WAYS: McLean is listed as a two-way player on the Brooklyn Cyclones roster and is expected to serve as a designated hitter during the season...During his inaugural season, McLean appeared in eight games as a position player between the Florida Complex League Mets and Single-A St. Lucie...Went 2 -for-16 at the plate (.125) with a home run, three RBI, seven walks, and a stolen base.

COWBOY UP: The second-year pro had a tremendous career at Oklahoma State before departing...In 2023, McLean served predominantly as a relief pitcher, posting a 1-2 record with a 3.30 ERA ( 11 ER in 30.0 IP ) and six saves, tallying 34 strikeouts...As a hitter, he collected a $.250 / .379 / .532$ line with a .911 OPS, nine home runs and 29 RBI...McLean was a Perfect Game/Rawlings Second Team All-American in 2022 and was a member of the Oklahoma State football team as a quarterback in 2020.

TWO TIMES: McLean was drafted for the second time last summer, as the New York Mets chose him with the 91st-overall pick...The right-hander was also selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Oklahoma State University, but did not sign... Joined teammate RHP Brandon Sproat as two of three players selected in the top 10 rounds that did not sign.
FAMILIAR FACES: While at the Oklahoma State University, McLean spent the summer of 2021 pitching for the Chatham Anglers of the Cape Cod Baseball League... During that time, the right-hander was teammates with current Cyclones RHP Brandon Sproat and former Brooklyn RHP Kolby Kubichek and C Kevin Parada.
