YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Fightin Phils, 6-4. In the bottom of the first, Sabin Ceballos hit a two-run double to open an early lead. Reading tied the game, 2-2, in the second with a run scoring on a wild pitch and another on a sacrifice fly by Aidan Miller. Victor Bericoto hit a go-ahead, solo homer in the third to give Richmond a 3-2 lead. In the top of the seventh, Alex Binelas hit a two-run homer to give the Fightin Phils a 4-3 lead. In the bottom of the eighth, Thomas Gavello reached on a sacrifice bunt that scored Turner Hill. Justin Wishkoski scored the go-ahead run on a wild pitch. Diego Velasquez singled in an insurance run for a 6-4 lead. Braxton Roxby threw two scoreless innings to finish the game and picked up his third win of the season. Nick Sinacola threw 3.1 scoreless relief innings.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play third of a six-game series against the Reading Fightin Phils, Double-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies. This is the only series between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels are 14-3 against the Fightin Phils since the start of the 2023 season, including an 9-2 record at The Diamond. In 2023, the Flying Squirrels swept Reading in three games to open the season and won five-of-six in a series at FirstEnergy Stadium. Last year, they went 5-1 in a six-game series in their only series against Reading, with the Fightin Phils avoiding a sweep with a win in the fifth game.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,726 fans per home game, which ranks fifth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won their first series of the season last week, taking three-of-five against Altoona on the road. In that series, both teams were held to two-or-less runs in four-of-five games. Of Richmond's 47 losses this season, 25 of them have been by two runs or less (17 by one, eight by two). Their 17 one-run losses are the most in the EL, one ahead of Reading (16). The Richmond offense is last in the Eastern League in runs scored (226). Richmond's pitching staff has a league-high 4.68 ERA.

THE FIGHTIN PHILS: went 2-4 in last week's home series against the Yard Goats and finished the first half 25-42, last in the Northeast Division. Reading's roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 prospects list, including SS Aidan Miller (No. 2), RHP Jean Cabrera (No. 13), SS Carson DeMartini (No. 16), RHP Daniel Harper (No. 23), OF Hendry Mendez (No. 27) and RHP Griff McGarry (No. 29). There are also five players featured in MLB.com's top-30 Phillies prospects list, including Miller (No. 2), Cabrera (No. 11), DeMartini (No. 15), Mendez (No. 25) and C Caleb Ricketts (No. 29).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 16, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.00 ERA (19 ER/57.0 IP) in seven games. The Richmond bull-pen has posted a 0.96 ERA (3 ER/28.0 IP) in that stretch. Richmond's 2.08 ERA (9 ER/39.0 IP) in last week's road set at Altoona was their lowest of the season for a series and the best in the Eastern League for the week. The previous low was a 3.17 ERA (19 ER/54.0 IP) in their six-game series from April 15-20 against Chesapeake at The Diamond.

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Seth Lonsway makes his 14th start of the season and the first of his career against the Fightin Phils. In his last start last Friday at Altona, Lonsway tied a season high with four runs allowed over 4.1 innings in a no-decision. In his first eight starts of the season through May 20, Lonsway went 2-2 with a 2.40 ERA (11 ER/41.1 IP). In his last five starts since May 25, he has gone 0-3 with a 5.63 ERA (15 ER/24.0 IP). On the season, Lonsway is ranked ninth in the Eastern League in innings pitched (65.1) and 10th in ERA (3.58). Since joining the team last summer, Lonsway has not allowed an earned run nine-of-19 Double-A outings. Lonsway was selected by the Giants in the sixth round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Ohio State. FOR READING: Right-hander Koyo Aoyagi makes his Double-A debut. He began the season with Triple-A Lehigh Valley and went 0-1 with a 7.45 ERA (16 ER/19.1 IP) in 19 outings, including two starts and walked 23 batters with 16 strikeouts. He was assigned to Double-A Reading this week. After allowing a run in his debut on March 29, Aoyagi did not surrender another run over his next eight outings from April 1-May 1, spanning 8.1 innings. He also threw 11 consecutive outings without allowing an earned run from April 1-May 14, spanning 9.2 innings. In seven appearances from May 16-June 14, he posted a 15.00 ERA (15 ER/9.0 IP) with 15 walks and 16 strikeouts. In Japan, Aoyagi pitched nine seasons with NPB's Hanshin Tigers and was selected as an All-Star three times. He was also part of Japan's gold-medal team in the 2020 Tokyo Olympics (played in 2021). Aoyagi signed a minor-league contract with the Phillies in January.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 38 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 25 runners caught stealing. Morgan, who was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on June 10, is sixth in the Eastern League with 12. Perez threw out his first base-stealing attempt on Wednesday.

G0, **DIEGO**, **G0!**: **Diego Velasquez** is batting .356 (21-for-59) in his last 15 games since June 6 with two doubles, two RBIs, eight walks and seven runs scored. In that span, he has at least one hit in 13-of-5 games and multiple hits in seven games. He is currently riding a team-leading 12-game on-base streak since June 10, which is one shy of tying his own 13-game on-base streak from April 18-May 5 and another by **Jairo Pomares** from April 4-18 for the longest by a Richmond player this season. In the Eastern League this season, Velasquez is fifth in hits (69), seventh in OBP (.384), eighth in walks (35) and 10th in batting average (.288).

BERI BOMBS: Outfielder/first baseman Victor Bericoto returned to the Richmond roster on June 3. He was placed on the injured list with Triple-A Sacramento on May 9 and played six games with the ACL Giants on a rehab assignment before returning to the Flying Squirrels. Bericoto opened the season with Richmond and hits .319 with three homers, four doubles and eight RBIs in 13 games before being promoted to the River Cats on April 20. He hit his fifth Double-A homer of the year on Wednesday afternoon. In his Richmond career dating back to 2023, Bericoto has homered 27 times, which is locked in a five-way tie for fourth place in franchise history (Devin Harris, Sean Roby, Shane Matheny and Will Wilson).

NIGHT AT THE ROXBY: Reliever Braxton Roxby closed his third save of the season on Sunday in Richmond's 2-1 win at Altoona In that outing, he allowed an earned run for the first time since April 29 after throwing 13 consecutive games without surrendering an earned run, spanning 18 innings. In that stretch, the only two runs he surrendered were a pair of unearned runs in the 10th inning on May 27 against the Senators. In his last 15 outings since April 29, Roxby is 3-0 with a 0.43 ERA (1 ER/21.0) with 24 strikeouts and six walks. Among Eastern League relievers (min. 20 IP) this season, Roxby's 1.24 ERA is ranked fourth.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is ranked fifth in hits (69), seventh in OBP (.384), eighth in walks (35) and 10th in batting average (.288). John Michael Bertrand is second in innings pitched (72.0) and ninth in ERA (3.50). Seth Lonsway is ninth in innings pitched (65.1) and 10th in ERA (3.58). Jack Choate is sixth in strikeouts (67).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 226 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Joe Whitman (No. 5), Diego Velasquez (No. 10), Sabin Ceballos (No. 21) and Jack Choate (No. 26). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND **BASEBALL HISTORY**

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1884: Ed Dugan threw Richmond professional baseball's first no-hitter for the Virginias against the Newark Domestics in the Eastern League. 1964: The Richmond Virginians beat the Toronto Maple Leafs, 2-0, at Parker Field. Mel Stottlemeyer threw a three-hit shubut. Horacc Clarke and Art Lopez each hit RBI singles in the eighth. 1967: The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 7-1, at Parker Field. Jim Beachamp homered twice and had four RBIs. Jim Britton went into the ninth with a two-hit shutout before allowing a run. 1968: The Richmond Braves beat the Buffalo Bisons, 8-7, at Parker Field. Down by three in the ninth, they rallied to tie the score. In the bottom of the 13th, Santiago Rosario hit a single before stealing second and third base. With two outs, pitcher Conrad Noessel brought him in with a single to win the game. 1973: The Richmond Braves swept a doubleheader against the Peninsula Whips, 3-0 and 1-0. Tom Kelley and Tom Phoebus each threw two-hit shutouts. It was Guaranteed Win Night at Parker Field and if the R-Braves didn't win, fans would take home a rain check for a ticket to another game. 1974: The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 4-3, at Parker Field. After Toledo Scored a run in the top of the 12th, Larry Howard won the game with a two-out, two-run single in the bottom of the inning, 1992: The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 6-5, at The Diamond for their sixth straight win. In the bottom of the ninth, Vinny Castilla drove in Ryan Klesko with a walk-off double. 2013: The Flying Squirrels beat the Altona Curve, 20-9. Richmond set then-franchise records for the most runs (20), RBIs (20) and the longest nine-inning game in team history (3 hours, 55 minutes). The team also tied the then-franchise record for most hits in a game (22). Jarrett Park-rer went 4-for-5 with two homers and set the team's single-game RBI record with seven. 2022: The Flying Squirrels beat the Portland Sea Dogs, 7-2, at The Diamond. Kyle Harrison started and all
