Lansing is 6-8 against the Caps this year, with the first 12 meetings taking place in Michigan's state capital. Tonight sees right-hander **Reid Birlingmair** make his team-leading 14th start of the season, taking on the newly activated **Tanner Burns**, the 36th overall selection of the 2020 draft.

**Last Night: Captains 8, Lugnuts 4.** Lansing received two-run homers from **William Simoneit** and **Patrick McColl**, but **George Valera** countered with two roundtrippers of his own as the Caps grabbed the lead immediately and never let up on their way to the Wednesday night win.

**On Deck:** The Lugnuts play the Captains through Sunday, returning home to host Dayton on August 20-25.

**What's New in 2021:** Entering this season, the Lugnuts' stadium name changed from Cooley Law School Stadium to Jackson® Field™, Lansing moved up to the High-A Central and the ballclub accepted an invitation to affiliate with the A's, the Nuts' fourth MLB partner, following the Royals (1996-98), Cubs (1999-2004) and Blue Jays (2005-2020).

### LUG•NOTES: HEADLINES AND POINTS OF INTEREST

**All-Time Roster History:** Catcher **Cooper Uhl** is in the starting lineup tonight, becoming the newest Lugnut to debut -- which makes him the 47th different player on the ballclub this season and the 851st Lugnuts player all-time.

**UDFA Love in Lansing:** Speaking of Uhl... The Oakland Athletics signed five undrafted free agents following the five-round 2020 draft in catchers **Cooper Uhl** (Loyola Marymount) and **William Simoneit** (Wake Forest), outfielders **D.J. Lee** (Richmond) and **Jake Suddleson** (Harvard), and pitchers **Grant Judkins** (Iowa) and **Garrett Acton** (Illinois). With Uhl joining the Lugnuts Tuesday, Lansing has now welcomed five of these six players this season, with only Judkins, a member of the Low-A Stockton rotation, yet to reach the High-A level. Uhl, Simoneit, Lee and Acton are all currently on the Lansing roster; Suddleson earned a promotion to Double-A Midland, where he is hitting .279/.366/.443 in 41 games.

**Three Nuts Go to Washington:** On July 30, catcher **Drew Millas** and pitchers **Richard Guasch** and **Seth Shuman** were traded by the Oakland Athletics to the Washington Nationals in exchange for catcher **Yan Gomes** and utilityman **Josh Harrison**. Guasch and Millas were each assigned to the High-A Wilmington Blue Rocks (with Shuman yet to receive an assignment), and Millas makes his debut tonight, starting at catcher and playing 6th.

**Alumni Report: Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.,** who played for the 2017 Lansing squad at 18 years old, is fourth in the Majors in batting average (.324), second in home runs (34), first in RBIs (85), second in on-base percentage (.419), third in slugging (.650), first in total bases (245), first in OPS (1.068) and tied for first in runs scored (82) with 2017 Lugnuts teammate **Bo Bichette**. Additionally, former Lansing Lugnuts outfielder **Kevin Pillar**, who was named the 2012 Midwest League MVP, was named the New York Mets' winner of the Heart and Hustle Award.

**Going Yard:** With yesterday's pair of two-run homers, the Lugnuts have now slugged 16 roundtrippers in 14 games against Lake County this year, balanced among nine different players. For **Patrick McColl**, it wasn't just the second homer he's hit against the Captains this year, it was the second time he had taken Caps reliever **Nathan Ocker** deep.

**Master Thief:** On June 15, **Max Schuemann** set a new single-game franchise record with five stolen bases in a 9-7 Lugnuts win against Great Lakes. Last night, Schuemann equated the feat with five steals (accomplished in the first five innings!) for the Double-A Midland RockHounds, albeit in a 6-5 loss to Wichita.

### TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

**2014:** 19-year-old Miguel Castro made his Lugnuts debut at Fort Wayne, allowing a first-inning home run to TinCaps shortstop Trea Turner en route to allowing five runs on three hits and one walk, striking out five, in four innings. The Lugnuts lost, 7-1. Whatever happened to that Turner guy?

**Root, Root, Root for the Home Team:** July 4th's Lugnuts/Dragons series finale drew a season-high attendance of 10,109. That's higher than the average attendance in MLB for the Baltimore Orioles, Pittsburgh Pirates, Tampa Bay Rays, Miami Marlins and Oakland Athletics. Only nine of the 119 other Minor League teams have drawn a larger crowd to a game this season: Albuquerque, Nashville, Salt Lake, Charlotte, Fresno, Indianapolis, Round Rock, Durham and Las Vegas.

**Pitching is an Art... and So is Sculpting:** **Blake McFarland**, who pitched for the 2012 Lansing Lugnuts, is now a professional sculptor who competed on NBC's reality show "Making It," hosted by Nick Offerman and Amy Poehler, but was eliminated in the fifth episode.

**Major League Lugnuts:** Five former Nuts have made their Major League debuts this season, bringing the total to 159 all-time - pitcher **Ty Tice** '18, outfielder **Josh Palacios** '16-'17, pitcher **Taylor Saucedo** '16-'17, pitcher **Conner Greene** '15 and pitcher **Kirby Sneed** '16-'17. Tice and Palacios made their first MLB appearance in the same game for the Toronto Blue Jays on April 9th. It was the seventh time in team history that two Lugnuts made their MLB debut in the same game, with the first occurring on September 14, 1998: **Carlos Febles** and **Carlos Beltrán** for the Kansas City Royals. Sneed most recently debuted, appearing in relief for the Blue Jays on July 28.

**Star of Stars:** The 2021 MLB All-Star Game MVP Award was won by 2017 Lugnut **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.**, who went 1-for-3 with two RBIs, including a 468-foot home run, in the American League's 5-2 victory. Fellow 2017 Lugnut **Bo Bichette** came off the bench for the A.L. as reserve shortstop.

**Record-Setting, Single Game, Stolen Bases:** On June 15, **Max Schuemann** broke **Samad Taylor's** franchise single-game record of four steals in a game (set July 1, 2018) with five stolen bases against the Great Lakes Loons.

**Record-Setting, Single Game, Home Runs Allowed:** On June 20, **Stevie Emanuels** broke the franchise single game record, tied many times before, of three homers served up in a game, giving up four HRs to the Loons - two apiece by Deacon Liput and Andy Pages.

**Record-Setting, Single Game, HBPs:** On July 14, Lansing Lugnuts pitchers hit seven Lake County Captains, breaking the franchise single game record, and the second-highest single game HBP total for a team plunked by one pitching staff behind the 1993 Gulf Coast League Braves, who were hit eight times on June 18, 1993.

**Representing His Country:** 1B/3B **Jordan Diaz** played for Colombia in Olympic Baseball Qualifying play, blasting a game-tying home run in the 9th against Venezuela, but Colombia lost all three games in opening pool play and was eliminated. Team USA won the tournament, punching a ticket to Japan.

**Front Office Connections:** Lugnuts pitching coach **Don Schulze** was drafted 11th overall by the Chicago Cubs in 1980, 12 picks before Oakland Executive Vice President of Baseball Operations **Billy Beane** was drafted by the New York Mets. Lugnuts first baseman **Patrick McColi** set a new Harvard baseball single season record with 70 hits in 2019, breaking the previous record held by Athletics General Manager David Forst.

**International Appeal:** Seven nations are represented on the Lugnuts' roster: USA, Colombia, Cuba, Dominican Republic, Japan, South Africa (**Anthony Phillips**) and Venezuela (**Javier Godard**).

**Finally:** Pitchers **Jeff Criswell**, **Stevie Emanuels** and **Shohei Tomioka**, catchers **Jared McDonald**, **Drew Millas** and **William Simoneit**, first baseman **Patrick McColi**, and outfielder **Michael Guldberg** have all made their pro debut this season with the Lugnuts.

**So Many Starters:** The Lugnuts have used 15 different starting pitchers this season, specifically **Brady Basso**, **Reid Birlingmair**, **Jeff Criswell**, **Jack Cushing**, **David Leal**, **Stevie Emanuels**, **Richard Guasch**, **Jorge Juan**, **Rafael Kelly**, **Bryce Nightengale**, **Colin Peluse**, **Leudeny Pineda**, **Seth Shuman**, **Shohei Tomioka** and **Brock Whittlesey**.

**Personal:** Reid's last name is pronounced "BIR-ling-MY-er"... instructor at the K's Training Academy in the offseason, located in Normal, as is college/Lugnuts teammate and best friend Charlie Cerny (pronounced "Cher-nee").

**Last Outing:** July 30 vs. Fort Wayne, knocked out in the third inning due to wildness, walking five and allowing three hits... gave up two runs, both scored in 3rd... Lugnuts then knocked out TinCaps starter Connor Lehmann in the bottom of the 3rd inning with a six-run rally, going on to win 9-6... the full 3rd inning lasted 57 minutes.

**2021 with Lansing:**

- Allowing 5.83 ERA, .264 OBA in 7 home starts (29 1/3 IP)... 2.67 ERA, .227 OBA in 6 road starts (30 1/3 IP).
- Allowing .264 / .373 / .438 w/ 3 HR to left-handed hitters compared to .222 / .345 / .313 w/ 1 HR to right-handers.
- ERA by month: 3.54 in May (20 1/3 IP), 8.80 in June (15 1/3), 1.88 in July (24 IP), allowing season low .198 avg..

- Started fourth game of the season, May 7th vs. Lake County: allowed solo home run to Austen Wade... picked Joe Naranjo off first base in the 4th inning... departed with Nuts trailing 3-0... Lugnuts lost, 6-2.
- May 14th at Dayton: only run scored came inherited, vs. Charles Hall in the 5th on a Jacob Hurtubise sac. and Brian Rey SF.
- May 21 at Fort Wayne: pitched brilliantly, shutting out the TinCaps through six innings, allowing only one hit.
- May 28 vs. Great Lakes: all four runs allowed came in the 3rd, thanks to five straight hits... set down final seven batters.
- June 4 vs. South Bend: unraveled in the 3rd, allowing a leadoff single, walking three consecutive Cubs, an RBI single, a double-play ball, and then departing after hitting Caleb Knight... the Nuts erased the 3-0 deficit with 17 unanswered runs.
- June 11 at West Michigan: Lugnuts built leads of 3-0 and 4-1, but Birlingmair allowed one run in the 4th (Torkelson triple/ Dingler RBI groundout) and two runs in the 5th (Packard RBI fielder's choice, Torkelson SF)... Whitecaps then scored six runs in the 6th against Charles Hall and Aiden McIntyre, capped by a three-run Torkelson HR and Dingler solo HR.
- June 18 vs. Great Lakes: gave up three-run homers to Ryan Ward in both the 1st and 2nd innings... had only allowed one home run in 122 batters faced before Ward took him deep in the first inning.
- June 25 at Cedar Rapids: gave up solo home run to Jair Camargo in the 2nd inning... departed in the 5th with the bases loaded, and reliever Dalton Sawyer balked an inherited runner home before stranding the other two runners.
- July 3 vs. Dayton: Lugnuts won in a one-hitter, with Quin Cotton's third-inning double denying the Lugnuts a no-hitter.
- July 10 at Great Lakes: shut out Loons for five innings before allowing two runs in the 6th.
- July 17 vs. Lake County: allowed one unearned run in five innings... bullpen collapsed, blowing a 7-1 lead going to the 7th inning and an 8-7 lead heading into the 8th... pen allowed 12 runs in the final three innings in a 13-9 Lugnuts loss.
- July 23 vs. West Michigan: pitched around four walks, taken out one walk away from five full innings (hit pitch count at 92 pitches, 52 strikes), but only allowed one run... Lugnuts fell, 6-5, after bullpen allowed five runs in 6th.

**Professional Career:** Made his professional debut in the AZL in 2018 (1.45 ERA, 18 2/3 IP, 5 R, 6 BB, 25 K) before moving up to Vermont on August 8 (2.25 ERA, 5 G, 3 GS, 16.0 IP, 10 BB, 8 K)... spent full 2019 in Beloit (4.02 ERA, 123 IP, 108 H, 50 BB, 120 K), pitching at least six innings in nine games, topping out at 7-IP, 1-R, 8-K on July 24th... faced the Lugnuts once (3 IP, 0 R) on May 4th... had overall numbers skewed by one bad month: 1.46 ERA in 24.2 IP in May, 10.72 ERA in 22.2 IP in June, 2.78 in 35.2 IP in July, 2.36 in 34.1 IP in August.

**Draft Day:** Selected 833rd overall in the 28th round from the University of Illinois at Chicago (the "Flames") in 2018... signed by Derek Lee... drafted 21 rounds after Charlie Cerny... the 2018 draft was fruitful for the Lugnuts roster, also producing Bryce Nightengale (16th round), Cobie Vance (18th round), Max Schuemann (20th round), Aiden McIntyre (22nd round).

**Life as a Flame:** Reid struggled as a freshman at the University of Illinois, Chicago (8.81 ERA, 17 G, 3 GS, 31 2/3 IP, 33 R, 24 BB, 27 K, 11 HBP) but bounced back to have a strong sophomore season (3.10, 15 GS, 1 ShO, 93.0 IP, 34 R, 25 BB, 81 K, 5 HBP) and better junior season (2.12, 10 G, 8 GS, 51.0 IP, 12 R, 21 BB, 57 K, 5 HBP), though he missed time from March 23-April 24 with an injury.

**Baseball Over Nursing:** In an interview with White Cleat Beat, Reid shared that nursing had been his first pursuit, starting with volunteering at OSF St. Joseph Medical Center, Carle BroMenn Medical Center, and Camp Quality (serving children with cancer and their families). He applied to the nursing school at UIC as a sophomore before turning his attention fully toward baseball, majoring in liberal arts with a minor in psychology.

**Major League Standouts:** Only three UIC Flames have ever made the Majors, but each one is notable: Pete Mackanin (1973-1981), who managed the Pirates in 2005, the Reds in 2007 and the Phillies in 2015-2017; Ken Holtzman (1965-1979), who threw no-hitters for the Chicago Cubs in 1969 (despite not striking out a batter) and 1971 and was an American League All-Star with the Oakland Athletics' World Series champions in 1972 and 1973; and three-time All-Star Curtis Granderson (2004-2019), who was taken by Detroit in the third round in 2002 and collected exactly 1800 hits in his 16-year MLB career.

**High School Success, On and Off the Field:** Pitched and played shortstop at Normal West High School, where he was named 3x 1st Team All-Big 12 and the Big 12 Conference Pitcher of the year as a senior... played second base in the 2015 Illinois Coaches Association (ICA) All-Star Game... member of the National Honor Society and Spanish Honor Society.

**A Normal Background Check:** Birlingmair's hometown, Normal, was originally named North Bloomington in 1854. The name changed in 1865 to reflect its place as the home of Illinois State Normal University, a teaching school, now called simply Illinois State University. (Teaching schools were known as "normal schools" because their purpose was to instruct the students, future teachers, in properly understanding and instilling the societal norms at the time. Many state schools began as normal schools, like UCLA, which was originally named the Los Angeles California State Normal School.) Normal is the home of the Normal Cornbelters, a member of the Frontier League from 2010-2018 and now a member of the Prospect League, playing their home games at The Corn Crib.
