SUGAR LAND TAKES THE OPENER

The E-Train took an early lead with a run on two hits in the first. CF Evan Carter singled on a grounder. DH Trevor Hauver doubled sending Carter around for a 1-0 lead. In the second, a solo shot from SS Jesús Bastidas and a three-run homer by DH Zack Short sent the Space Cowboys ahead, 4-1. Round Rock cut into the Sugar Land lead in the third. 1B Blaine Crim scored from first on Carter's triple into the right-center gap. The Express still trailed 4-2 in the third. Bastidas notched his second extra-base hit in the bottom of the third scoring 3B Luis Guillorme who got on with a walk. The Space Cowboys extended their lead to 5-2. In the fifth, Sugar Land 1B Collin Price put another on the board with a solo home run for a 6-2 Space Cowboys advantage. The Express plated two in the top of the seventh. C Tucker Barnhart sent a double into the right field corner scoring Hauver from first. Later, with runners at the corners, LF Jonathan Ornelas hit a sacrifice fly to center field and Tucker Barnhart came across cutting the Round Rock deficit to 6-4 but the Express were kept quiet the rest of the way falling 6-4.

BOUSHLEY TAKES THE BALL

Round Rock RHP Caleb Boushley is set to make his first appearance with the Express since April 3. The right-hander had his contract selected by Texas on April 8 but was optioned back to Round Rock on April 28. In three relief appearances for the Rangers he owned a 5.87 ERA (5 ER/7.2 IP) with two walks and six strikeouts. For the Express he is 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA (2 ER/8.2 IP) in two starts.

CRIMMING FROM EAR TO EAR

1B Blaine Crim has a hit in eight of his nine and 23 of his last 27 games. He owns a nine-game on-base streak and has reached base in 26 of 27 games (April 18 at Reno). He is two home runs away from 50 in his Express career and is three RBI away from 200. He'd become just the seventh Express player to reach 50 home runs in a career and the eighth to reach 200 RBI. Last night, he went 1-for-3 with a run scored. All three baseballs he hit were over 95.0 mph.

STARTING SLOW

In the last four games, Round Rock has had only one starting pitcher make it past 2.0 innings of work and it was RHP David Buchanan who went 4.0 innings on April 26. During the four-game skid, Round Rock starters own a 22.68 ERA (21 ER/8.1 IP). On the season, they are 2-6 with a 5.83 ERA (68 ER/105.0 IP).

FESTA KEEPS GOING

Round Rock RHP Matt Festa has not allowed an earned run in 14.2 innings this year. He went 1.2 scoreless frames yesterday. He has issued seven walks with 20 strikeouts. Teammate, RHP Cole Winn has not allowed an earned run in 17.2 IP which is the longest streak in the PCL this season and ties RHP Daniel Robert for the longest streak of any pitcher from last season. He has issued five walks with 18 strikeouts.

BIG LEAGUE EXPERIENCE

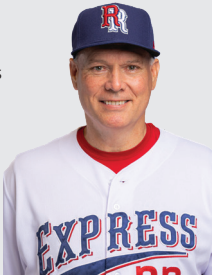

EXPRESS MANAGER DOUG DAVIS

The 2025 season marks Round Rock Express Manager Doug Davis's third season with the E-Train. In 2024, Davis secured his 800th win as a manager on July 12 at Reno. In his first season with the Express in 2023, he guided the E-Train to a PCL Second Half title and the club's first playoff appearance since 2019. The team's 89 total wins were the most regular-season wins in franchise history and just the seventh 80-win campaign in club history. Davis oversaw the longest winning streak in franchise history when the Express won 14 consecutive games from August 8-23.

Prior to Round Rock, Davis spent two seasons as the manager for the Scranton Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, the New York Yankees Triple-A affiliate. Davis brings over 25 years of coaching experience to the Express dugout. Since he began coaching in 1995, he has led a minor league team for 10 total seasons and has accumulated a career 744-665 record. He spent the 2003-2004 seasons as the bench coach for the Florida Marlins, where he won the 2003 World Series.



In two seasons as the manager for Scranton Wilkes-Barre, Davis led the RailRiders to a combined record of 158-119. Last season, he helped oversee a pitching staff that led all Triple-A teams with a 3.89 ERA. Prior to his time as skipper, Davis spent three years in three different roles with Scranton Wilkes-Barre from 2017-2019. In 2017, he was the defensive coach before moving over to bullpen coach in 2018. In 2019, Davis was named the bench coach.

Before joining the New York Yankees organization, Davis spent 11 years in the Toronto Blue Jays system in a variety of roles. Before he was named manager of the RailRiders in 2021, Davis hadn't held a manager title since 2008. He has also been a minor league field coordinator for the Montreal Expos (2001) and Florida Marlins (2002, 2005). His coaching career began in the Yankees system in 1995.

A catcher and infielder in his playing days, Davis was a ninth-round selection by the California Angels in the 1984 MLB Draft. He played professionally for 11 seasons between the Angels, Rangers and Kansas City Royals organizations. He appeared in seven games in the big leagues and tallied six games in 1988 with the Angels, while appearing in one game for the Rangers in 1992. He is a native of Bloomsburg, Pennsylvania.
