Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders RHP Adam Kloffenstein (1-1, 3.72) vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Seth Martinez (1-1, 4.70)

All Tied Up – The Worcester Red Sox and the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders (AAA-New York Yankees) – who have split two entertaining games to begin this series and thus remain tied atop the International League East division with identical 19-15 records – bid for the upper hand in both this series and the IL standings when they play game three of their 6-game set tonight at 6:05 pm. Tonight’s game is live on NESN and can be heard on NASH 98.9 FM and the rest of the WooSox Radio Network.

The Series So Far – The clubs played a see-saw affair that started Wednesday morning and ended by mid-afternoon with the RailRiders outlasting the WooSox, 9-7 in 10-innings. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RF Yanquiel Fernandez had a huge day going 4-for-5 with a single, double, 2 HR and 5 RBI. Ernesto Martinez Jr.’s 2-run double in the top of the 10th inning was the game-winner. Worcester would load the bases with no outs in the bottom of the 10th, but a strikeout and two pop outs ended the threat and the game. Nathan Hickey (2 hits, 2-run HR), Mickey Gasper (2-run HR), and Nate Eaton (solo HR) accounted for 5 of the 7 Sox runs.

On Tuesday night, the WooSox rallied for a 7-6 come-from-behind victory in the initial meeting of the year between the clubs. Kristian Cambell led the way with three hits including a double & a homer for 1 RBI and 2 runs scored. Allan Castro’s RBI single snapped a 6-6, 8th inning tie. Kyle Keller (1-1) was the winner with 2 hitless innings of relief. Tommy Kahnle notched his 2nd save. LHP Carlos Rodon made a rehab start for the RailRiders and was not involved in the decision – 6.1 IP, 7 H, 6 R, 5 ER, 2 BB, 4 SO. Spencer Jones crushed a 3-run HR and SS Anthony Volpe went 2-for-4 with a double in his first game since being optioned from NY.

The Rest of This Series – The Sox and RailRiders play tonight and tomorrow (Friday) evenings both at 6:05 pm and then continue and conclude this 6-game set over the weekend with usual Saturday (4:05 pm) and Sunday (1:05 pm) Polar Park start times.

Crowded at the Top – Worcester is currently tied for 1st-place in the International League East division with Scranton/WB and Syracuse as all three clubs have a 19-15 record.. The WooSox have been alone or had a share of first since April 30. Memphis is in 1st-place in the IL West division and owns the overall league lead with their 23-12 record.

Come out and Play – Heading into action tonight, Worcester has played each of their first 17 scheduled home games – their longest stretch to open a season without a home postponement since their inaugural 2021 campaign. During Worcester’s inaugural season in 2021, which did not commence at home until May 11 due to Covid-restrictions, it took until their 28th home game before they finally had a home game postponed (July 2, 2021 vs. Scranton/WB). Next on the list was 2023 when the Sox were also able to play their first 16 scheduled Polar Park games until a rainout on May 3, 2023 vs. Buffalo. In 2022 the Sox had their third home game postponed due to rain and in both 2024 & 2025 the WooSox had their second home games each year postponed due to inclement weather. This week/weekend we hope to stop a streak that has seen Scranton/Wilkes-Barre have at least one postponement in each of their first six series played to date resulting in six make-up doubleheaders already this season.

What Have You Done For Me Lately – Prior to their 7-6 victory Tuesday night, Worcester had dropped back-to-back games last Saturday & Sunday for the first time in 13 games since their season-long 5-game losing streak from April 14-18. They have still won 6 of their last 10 games and they are 9-6 since that losing streak (all those in Nashville). They were 10-4 on April 12th for the best start in franchise-history. The WooSox have been above .500 since April 1st.

Six Pack – The Sox (currently 19-15) have been a season-high 6-games over .500 three different times this season...April 10 (9-3) & April 12 (10-4), and May 2 (18-12).

Winners Home & Away - The WooSox are 10-7 here at Polar Park compared to 9-8 on the road.

Day Dream Believers – The WooSox are an excellent 14-7 in day games compared to a 5-8 record in night games this season.

Walk This Way – WooSox batters continue to lead the 20-team International League in walks (202). They had led for much of the season in on-base pct. but are now 4th in OBP (.372).

Stay on 21 – These long-time Red Sox & Yankee affiliates will meet 21 times this season (1-1 so far). The teams play this 6-game set through Sunday afternoon here at Polar Park, play another 6-game series in Moosic, PA to finish this month (May 26-31), return to Pennsylvania for a 3-game weekend series from July 17-19 just after the All-Star break, and then close out the month of August with a 6-game set in Worcester from August 25-30.

Against Scranton/WB Last Season – Scranton/Wilkes-Barre won the 2025 season series over Worcester, 15 games to 6 as the RailRiders went 7-2 here at Polar Park after finishing 8-4 vs. the Sox at PNC Field in Moosic, PA.

Yanks Lead the Rivalry - Worcester is 49-62 all-time vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre including a 28-30 mark at Polar Park compared to 21-32 at PNC Field in Moosic, PA. As mentioned, Scranton/WB won the season-series last year, 15-6. The clubs split their season-series each of the prior two years as they finished 9-9 against each other in 2024 and finished 12-12 during the 2023 season series. Worcester went 10-14 vs. Scranton/WB in 2022 and during their inaugural 2021 season, the WooSox were 11-12 vs. the RailRiders.

An Enjoyable April – After going 2-2 to begin the season from March 27-31, Worcester posted a winning April going 15-10. The Sox finished April alone in 1st-place in the International League East Division. Last year on April 30th the WooSox were 14-14, tied for 4th-place in the division and already 6½ games behind. The 15 wins this April equal the most Worcester won in any month last season when they went 15-10 in June and 15-13 in August.

April Stats Leaders – As a club the WooSox batted .252 in April with 19 HR while Sox pitchers had a 4.63 ERA with 24 HRA. Worcester out-scored their opponents during the month, 127-122. Vinny Capra led the Sox in average in April hitting .322 in 18 games with 7 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI, and a team-high 18 runs scored. Matt Thaiss (.324 in 11 games with 2 HR & 11 RBI), Nate Eaton (.301 in 23 games with 5 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR & 10 RBI), and Kristian Campbell (.294 in 23 games) all enjoyed fine Aprils. Leading pitchers during the month were Payton Tolle (2-0, 0.82 in 2 GS) and Jake Bennett (2-0, 1.00 in 4 GS) – although both are currently or reportedly in Boston – while Tayron Guerrero was the best out the bullpen posting a 1.13 ERA in 7 relief appearances with 2 saves.

Series Matters – Worcester has a 3-2-1 series record thus far...3 wins, 2 losses, and 1 split. Last year, Worcester went 8-9-10 in their 27 series played... 8 wins, 9 losses, 10 splits.

Low Five After a High Five – The WooSox had a season-high 5-game losing streak from April 14-18 (all in Nashville). It was their first 5-game losing skid since April 25-30 of last year. Prior to going to Nashville, the Sox had not dropped back-to-back games all season (they went their first 15 games before losing two in a row in Nashville on April 14 & 15). Worcester had a season-best 5-game winning streak from March 31 – April 5 all in St. Paul, Minnesota.

A Winning Tradition – The 2025 Worcester Red Sox went 76-73 to post a winning season for the fifth time in as many years of existence (and for the fourth year in a row under former manager Chad Tracy). Worcester finished 41-33 during the first half last year and then 35-40 in the second half. Overall the 2025 WooSox went 40-34 at home compared to 36-39 on the road. The Pawtucket Red Sox posted five straight winning seasons just once in their 47 years as Boston's Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000.

How the WooSox Have Won - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and as mentioned the 2025 squad went 76-73. Heading into this season, the WooSox were 383-339 all-time for a .530 winning pct. including a 195-168 record at home compared to a 188-171 mark on the road.

Fun Fact – Of the 283 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their 5+-year history (up to today), 207 of them have played in the Major Leagues (72%) including 142 with the Boston Red Sox (50%).

Portland Sea Dogs Update – The Double-A Portland Sea Dogs (13-15) were rained out at home vs. New Hampshire last night. The clubs will play a make-up doubleheader tonight beginning at 5:05 pm.

WOOSOX ROSTER MOVES – The Boston Red Sox have signed LHP **Raymond Burgos** and he was added to the WooSox roster today. The Red Sox also transferred RHP **Cade Feeney** from Double-A Portland to Worcester. To make room for Burgos and Feeney, the WooSox placed INF **Nathan Hickey** on the development list and transferred LHP **Erik Rivera** back to Portland.

Burgos, 27, has been pitching for Guerreros de Oxaca of the Mexican League this season going 0-0 with a 5.25 ERA in 3 starts – 12 IP, 12 H, 7 R, 7 ER, 2 BB, 8 SO. He also pitched for his native Puerto Rico in the 2026 WBC this past March tossing 3.2 innings while allowing 1 run with 4 strikeouts. Burgos split last season between a pair of San Francisco affiliates making 9 relief appearances for Double-A Richmond (0-0, 2.89) and 17 relief appearances for Triple-A Sacramento (1-0, 3.63). Overall in seven seasons in the Minor Leagues, he has posted a 22-15 record with a 3.32 ERA in 144 games (22 starts) with 306 strikeouts in 295.1 innings.

The 6'4", 209 lbs. lefty from Rio Grande, Puerto Rico, was originally selected by Cleveland in the 18th round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft. He signed with San Francisco in 2024 and made his first and only Major League appearance with the Giants in 2024 (1 inning, 1 run, 1 strikeout).

Feeney, 24, has appeared in 7 games (1 start) for Portland this season going 1-2 with an 8.59 ERA – 14.2 IP, 19 H, 14 R, 14 ER, 6 BB, 14 SO. Feeney did not pitch last season while recovering from Tommy John surgery. A 13th round selection of the Red Sox in the 2023 First-Year Player Draft out of North Dakota State University, he made 20 relief appearances for Greenville (high-A) in 2024 going 0-1, 3.66 with 3 SV. He was the 2019 Gatorade Baseball Player of the Year in North Dakota and was also a star quarterback and basketball player for Bismark Century High School in North Dakota.

The Boston Red Sox yesterday optioned LHP **Alec Gamboa** to Worcester when they reinstated RHP Sonny Gray from the injured list. Gamboa will be added back on the WooSox roster this week. Gamboa, 29, made his Major League debut Tuesday night against the Tigers, striking out two batters in a perfect ninth inning. The left-hander has struck out 15 batters and walked five in 13.0 innings across three starts with Worcester this season. Originally selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the ninth round of the 2019 First-Year Player Draft, the California native owns a 4.30 ERA (178 ER/372.2 IP) with 330 strikeouts in 134 career minor league games (44 starts).

Worcester has made at least one player move during 25 of the last 31 days (including today) between April 7 – May 7 for a total of 44 moves during that stretch. They have not gone three consecutive days without a player transaction since the first four days after the season-opener (March 28-31).
