SHUT THEM DOWN: Omaha tossed their sixth shutout of the season last night and the first since June 30. **LHP Drew Parrish** started the game for the Storm Chasers, getting through 6.0 innings, allowing just two hits in his second quality start of his Triple-A career. **RHP Collin Snider** came in and pitched the seventh and eighth. He allowed just one baserunner but faced the minimum six batters in the two innings of work. **LHP Sam Freeman** finished the game for Omaha in the ninth, allowing a hit and a walk, but ultimately securing the shutout. The three pitchers used in last night's shutout was the fewest used in a Chasers shutout this season.

DEALING ON THE MOUND: **LHP Sam Freeman** lowered his already low ERA yesterday to just 0.79. His ERA is the lowest in Triple-A among players with more than 25 appearances and is the best on the team among pitchers that have had more than five outings. Freeman has allowed a run in just six games this season, with only three earned runs in 31 games. Opponents are hitting just .158 against him and he has allowed just one homer in 34.0 innings. More than half (16) of Freeman's outings have been hitless, and he has only allowed multiple hits in four games. Righties hit just .105 against Freeman with a slugging percentage of .140.

MAKING AN IMPACT: The Storm Chasers hit their fifth first-inning leadoff home run of the season last night, this time coming off the bat of **INF Maikel Garcia**. Garcia, who hit only four home runs in 78 games with Double-A Northwest Arkansas, now has three homers in seven games for Triple-A Omaha. The right-handed hitting 22-year-old was hitting leadoff as the designated hitter last night, both for the first time with the Storm Chasers. He did, however, hit leadoff in 76 games with the Naturals before getting optioned and transferred to the Chasers on August 4.

FINDING A WAY: **OF Brewer Hicklen** was held hitless in yesterday's win but extended his on-base streak with a walk in the first inning. His streak is now at 16 games and counting, the third longest on the team this season and tied for the fourth longest active on-base streak in the International League. Hicklen started his streak on July 26 and has an on-base percentage of .338 with five home runs, nine RBIs, and nine walks during the streak.

THIEVES: Omaha stole a pair of bases yesterday to bring their season total to 130, now eight bases behind Buffalo for the International League-lead. The Chasers are successful at stealing bases 85 percent of the time, the best mark in the league. **OF Dairon Blanco** stole his 28th base yesterday, now the third most in the league. **OF Brewer Hicklen** is now tied for the seventh most steals in the league with 23 after his stolen base last night.

FOR OMAHA: **LHP Austin Cox** heads to the mound to make his team-leading 19th start and 22nd overall appearance for the Storm Chasers. Cox, in his last start, went 4.0 innings and allowed two earned runs against St. Paul in the no decision. Cox is second on the team with three quality starts for Omaha, with his longest start of the year coming almost two months ago when he went 7.0 innings. During his two games in August, Cox holds a record of 0-1 with a 7.88 ERA in 8.0 innings of work. The former fifth round pick is looking for his first win since he earned back-to-back wins on July 4 and July 10.

FOR TOLEDO: **RHP Drew Carlton** gets the nod to make his second start and 29th overall appearance for the Mud Hens. His only other start of the season was a 2.0-inning outing on June 12, allowing one earned run on four hits with three strikeouts and no walks. Carlton went 2.0 innings against Omaha on July 4, giving up eight runs and two home runs on the night that the Storm Chasers broke a modern franchise record with nine homers. Carlton has bounced between The Show and Triple-A this season after making his Major League debut a year ago for the Tigers. The 26-year-old has a 2-0 record and 4.15 ERA at the Triple-A level at home this season while he is 0-2 with a 10.05 ERA in games on the road. Carlton was drafted on 2017 out of Florida State, teammates with Storm Chaser **LHP Drew Parrish**.
