GAME INFORMATION

APRIL 15: RUBBERDUCKS 3, RUMBLE PONIES 0 (F/7): After a 2:43 rain delay in Akron, the game began at 9:18 p.m. Kevin Parada tallied Binghamton's only hit with a single with one out in the seventh inning. LHP Zach Thornton started (L, 5.0 IP, 5 H, 2 R, 2 ER, 2 BB, 6 K).

WILL'S HILL: RHP Will Watson, the Mets' No. 10 prospect and No. 4 pitching prospect, is expected to make his third start of the season tonight. Over his first two starts, Watson is 0-1 with a 5.14 ERA and seven strikeouts over 7.0 innings. The 23-year-old last pitched on Thursday, April 9, vs. Somerset and allowed one run on four hits and one walk over 4.0 innings with four strikeouts. Watson was drafted by the Mets in the seventh round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of USC.

WHAT'S EWING DOING?: OF A.J. Ewing, the Mets' No. 3 prospect and MLB Pipeline's No. 87 overall prospect, has gotten off to an 13-for-33 (.394 AVG) start with a .524 OBP, 1.069 OPS, 3 RBI, 10 R, 5 2B, and 5 SB. He was named the Mets MiLB Player of the Week last series. Ewing currently ranks among Eastern League hitters: T-5th (5 2B), 6th (.394 AVG), 6th (.524 OBP), T-6th (5 SB). The 21-year-old has reached base safely in all nine games that he's played in with hits in eight of those first nine games this season. Ewing was a non-roster invitee to Mets MLB camp this spring (10 G, .381 AVG, .423 OBP, 1.090 OPS, 6 RBI, 4 R, 3 2B, 4 SB).

REIMER REASON: 3B Jacob Reimer, the Mets' No. 5 prospect, hit an RBI double on Tuesday at Akron, and is riding a four-game on-base streak (3 H, 1 HR, 3 RBI, 4 R, 2 BB, 2 SB). The 22-year-old hit a two-run home run on Sunday vs. Somerset, which marked his first long ball of the season. Reimer ranks as MLB Pipeline's No. 2 overall third baseman prospect.

POWER WALK: C Chris Suero, the Mets' No. 15 prospect, has displayed his power and ability to draw walks in 2026. Suero has clubbed three home runs and one triple (.708 SLG) and has drawn 11 walks (.486 OBP) over his first eight games of the season. The 22-year-old ranks among the Eastern League: 4th (1.194 OPS), T-4th (11 BB), 7th (.708 SLG), T-7th (10 RBI). Suero has drawn five walks in the first two games of this series and is riding a five-game on base streak with 11 walks in that stretch. Suero combined to hit 16 HR in 2025 across High-A Brooklyn (13) and Double-A Binghamton (3) and he combined to draw 70 walks (41 in High-A and 29 in Double-A).

ELITE ELI: OF Eli Serrano III, the Mets' No. 13 prospect, is 9-for-33 (.273 AVG) over the first nine games of his Double-A career with 5 XBH (3 2B, 2 3B), and has reached base safely in eight of his first nine contests. He hit his third double of the season on Tuesday at Akron. The five XBH ranks 2nd on the Ponies. He ranked T-3rd-most 2B (21) in the High-A South Atlantic League last season. Serrano was drafted by the New York Mets in the fourth round of the 2024 MLB Draft out of North Carolina State.

RAMOS RADAR: OF Jose Ramos, has seven RBIs in his first seven games including two home runs (6-for-24, 8 R, 2 HR, 7 RBI). On Tuesday at Akron he extended his on-base streak to six games and has a .400 OBP. Ramos hit a walk-off home run in Game 2 of a doubleheader on April 8 vs. Somerset. On Sunday vs. SOM, he deposited his second home run of the year, a three-run shot in the 9th inning. Among Ponies' hitters, Ramos ranks: 2nd with 2 HR, T-2nd with 7 RBI, and T-2nd in R with 8. He spent the first six seasons of his career with the Dodgers, reaching as high as Triple-A.

PONIES FULLY LOADED: The Binghamton Rumble Ponies were ranked as the 10th most-loaded roster in Minor League Baseball by MLB Pipeline. Based on the list, Binghamton has the most prospect-packed roster in the Eastern League and the fourth-most loaded in Double-A. Binghamton's roster featured 10 of the New York Mets top 30 prospects, seven of the top 15 prospects, and four of the top 10 prospects in the organization. **OF A.J. Ewing** (No. 88) is the lone top 100 prospect.

2026 COACHING STAFF



18 MICHAEL COLLINS MANAGER

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Canberra, Australia

-Michael Collins, Binghamton's 19th manager all-time, is in his first season managing the Rumble Ponies and his first season in the Mets organization.

-Collins spent the last eight seasons (2018-25) with the Houston Astros, as a bullpen catcher in 2018 and serving as the Astros' major league catching coach for the last seven seasons (2019-25), including the 2022 World Series championship.

-Collins worked in the San Diego Padres organization as a manager for the DSL Padres (2012), AZL Padres (2013, 2016-17), High-A Fort Wayne (2014), and Single-A Lake Elsinore (2015) for six seasons between 2012-17.

-He also managed the Canberra Cavalry in the Australian Baseball League in 2012-14, right after his playing career ended. He led the Cavalry to the Claxton Shield as national champions for the first time.

-Collins debuted as a player in the minor leagues in 2001 at the age of 16 with the AZL Angels. He spent 10 seasons in the minor leagues with the Angels and Padres, and reached as high as Triple-A in 2009 and 2010. Collins also played in the ABL and was an All-Star catcher.

-Collins has coached for Team Australia in the World Baseball Classic in 2026, 2017, and 2013. He played for Team Australia in the WBC in 2009 and 2006. Born July 18, 1984 in Canberra, Australia. On May 3, 2024, he became a United States citizen.



25 MARIANO DUNCAN BENCH COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 5th **YEAR WITH NYM:** 8th **HOMETOWN:** San Pedro de Macoris, DR

-Mariano Duncan begins his fifth year as bench coach with the Rumble Ponies and eighth year in the Mets organization. He previously served as the bench coach for the Brooklyn Cyclones in 2021 & in the same role with Kingsport in 2019.

-Duncan has Major League coaching experience, after serving as the first base coach for the Los Angeles Dodgers for five seasons from 2006-2010. He has spent time on various minor league staffs affiliated with the Dodgers and Chicago Cubs, before joining the Mets organization in 2019.

-The former infielder played 12 major league seasons with the Dodgers, Cincinnati Reds, Philadelphia Phillies, New York Yankees, and Toronto Blue Jays. He is a two-time World Series champion ('90 Reds and '96 Yankees), one-time All-Star (with Philadelphia in 1994), and was part of the 1993 Phillies team that won the National League pennant. He was inducted into the Dominican Republic Baseball Hall of Fame in 2008. He made his MLB debut for the Dodgers on April 9, 1975, at the age of 22. Duncan finished third for the N.L. Rookie of the Year.



32 MATT CARASITI PITCHING COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Berlin, Conn.

-Matt Carasiti is in his first season as the pitching coach for the Rumble Ponies and with the Mets organization.

-Carasiti spent the 2025 season as the pitching coach for the High-A Everett AquaSox in the Seattle Mariners' organization.

-Carasiti pitched in the major leagues for parts of four seasons with the Colorado Rockies (2016, 2023-24) and the Seattle Mariners (2019). He made his MLB debut for the Rockies on August 12, 2016, at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia. In his MLB career, Carasiti made 53 appearances (48 in relief) and went 2-2 with 50 strikeouts in 58.1 innings.

-Pitched for parts of 10 seasons in affiliated baseball. Underwent Tommy John surgery prior to the 2020 season and missed all of 2020 and 2021 seasons. Returned and pitched for the Long Island Ducks of the Atlantic League in 2022 and also pitched professionally in Japan in 2018. Last appeared in MLB on June 7, 2024 for the Rockies.

-Was a Double-A Eastern League All-Star for the Hartford Yard Goats (Colorado Rockies) in 2016.

-Drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the sixth round of the 2012 MLB Draft out of St. John's University (N.Y.). Originally drafted by the Texas Rangers in the 36th round of the 2009 draft, but did not sign.

-Pitched for three seasons (2010-12) at St. John's and made 66 appearances and 22 starts, and went 16-11 with a 4.19 ERA and recorded 137 strikeouts in 180.1 innings. He recorded eight saves in 2011, which ranked fifth in the Big East.

-Grew up in Berlin, Connecticut, and attended Berlin HS and was the 2009 Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year.



5 RACHEL FOLDEN HITTING COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Baldwin Park, Calif.

-Rachel Folden begins her first season as the hitting coach for Binghamton and with the Mets organization.

-Folden spent the previous five seasons as a coach in the Chicago Cubs organization in various roles: Arizona Complex League hitting coach (2021-22), Minor League hitting coordinator (2023), Double-A Tennessee hitting coach (2024), and Triple-A Iowa hitting coach (2025). Was the first female coach in the history of the Chicago Cubs organization.

-Folden played professional softball with the Chicago Bandits (2008-12) and Carolina Diamonds (2012) in the National Pro Fastpitch league.

-She began her coaching career in softball at Encinal High School (2009) while working as a GA at Holy Names University. Folden was also an assistant softball coach at Valparaiso University for two seasons (2010-11).

-Folden was a four-time All-American in softball at Marshall University (2005-08) and was inducted in the Marshall Athletics Hall of Fame in 2019. Folden was a two-time Conference USA Player of the Year, four-time All-Conference First Team selection, and won the triple crown (.386 AVG, 18 HR, 56 RBI) in CUSA as a sophomore in 2006. She was the Mid-American Conference Freshman of the Year in 2005, before moving to CUSA.



9 JAKE HAGER ASSISTANT HITTING COACH / INFIELD COACH

YEAR WITH BNG: 1st **YEAR WITH NYM:** 1st **HOMETOWN:** Sierra Vista, Nev.

-Jake Hager begins his first season with the Rumble Ponies and first as a coach in the Mets organization.

-Hager played infield for parts of two seasons in the major leagues with the New York Mets (2021) and the Arizona Diamondbacks (2021-22). Hager made his MLB debut for the Mets on May 15, 2021, at Tropicana Field against the Rays. He played in five games for the Mets and totaled 42 games in his MLB career.

-Played for parts of 12 seasons in affiliated baseball, including 1,037 games in the minor leagues for six different organizations. Retired from playing in 2024 and last played for Triple-A Iowa in the Chicago Cubs organization.

-Drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in the first round (32nd overall) in the 2011 MLB Draft out of Sierra Vista HS (Nevada). Was the Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior and was committed to play at Arizona State University, before the draft.

-Played on the same 12U Southern Nevada Bulldogs travel team with Bryce Harper and Joey Gallo.

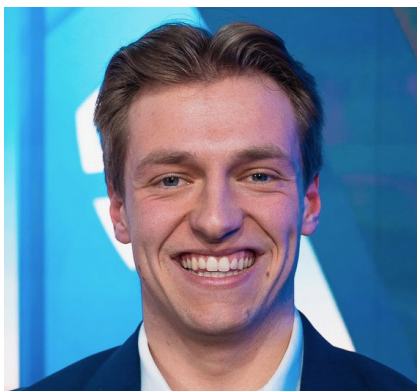
