YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Senators, 7-2. In the first, **Sabin Ceballos** hit an RBI single, **Maui Ahuna** singled in a run and a run scored on a sac fly by **Jack Payton**. In the second, Ceballos hit another RBI single for a 4-0 lead. Caleb Lomavita singled in Harrisburg's first run in the bottom of the second. In the fourth, Richmond scored a run on an error. **Jancel Villarroel** hit an RBI single in the top of the fifth. Caleb Lomavita brought home a run with a sac fly in the eighth to close the score to 6-2. Ceballos hit an RBI single in the ninth. **Gavin Kilen** had two triples and a double. **Yunior Marte** allowed one run over five innings for his first Double-A win. **Tyler Vogel** picked up his league-leading 14th save of the season.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals, in the fifth of a seven-game, six-day series. This is the third and final series between the two teams this season. Richmond went 4-2 against Harrisburg at CarMax Park from June 9-14. The Senators won three-of-five in Harrisburg from June 30-July 5, the second of three series losses this year for the Flying Squirrels.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 65-45 record the second-best in team history through 110 games, trailing only a 66-44 record in 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split nine and lost three so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 38-38 in their last 76 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 65 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 32 of them. In 20 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 11 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in all but one home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has four wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels are batting .284 in the ninth inning this year, which leads the EL and is fifth in MiLB. The Flying Squirrels have won 26 one-run decisions this year, the most in the EL.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie and has the Eastern League's best overall record this season. For the year, Richmond is first among all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.270), second in sacrifice flies (45), third in doubles (204) and third in hits (987). The team has combined for 108 homers this year, surpassing 11 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, stolen bases, OBP, SLG, OPS and sacrifice flies. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown nine shutouts this season, which is tied for first in the Eastern League and tied for second in Double-A. Richmond's No. 9 batters have combined to hit .322 this year, which leads the minors. The Flying Squirrels have scored 10-or-more runs 12 times this year, passing 2023 (11) for the most in a season in franchise history.

THE SENATORS are 4-8 in their 12 August games. They went 3-4 in seven games at Chesapeake last week, closing the series with a 1-0 shutout on Sunday, tying Richmond for the most shutouts in the EL this season. Harrisburg's roster features seven players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Nationals prospects list, including 2B/SS Devin Fitz-Gerald (No. 4), RHP Jack Cebert (No. 17), LHP Alex Clemmey (No. 19), RHP Ben Grable (No. 20), RHP Yoel Tejada (No. 23), OF Ethan Petry (No. 25) and LHP Josh Hartle (No. 26). MLB.com's top-30 Nationals prospects list features eight Harrisburg players, including Fitz-Gerald (No. 6), Cebert (No. 13), Clemmey (No. 14), Petry (No. 15), Tejada (No. 16), C Caleb Lomavita (No. 24), Grable (No. 25) and Hartle (No. 28).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Charlie McDaniel** makes his 12th Double-A start and his third against the Senators. He last pitched last Friday against Reading and allowed three runs over 3.2 innings in a no-decision. He faced the Senators on June 11 at CarMax Park and picked up his first Double-A win, allowing two runs over six innings. On July 5 in Harrisburg, he allowed three runs over 6.1 innings. Against the Senators, he is 1-0 with a 3.65 ERA (5 ER/12.1 IP). McDaniel went 3-1 with a 3.99 ERA in nine starts with High-A Eugene before being promoted to Double-A on June 2. He was the Northwest League Pitcher of the Month for April after going 1-0 with a 1.10 ERA (2 ER/16.1 IP) in four starts. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the season between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 8-6 with a 3.68 ERA in 23 outings (12 starts). McDaniel signed with the Giants as a non-drafted free agent out of Presbyterian College in 2024 after being named First-Team All-Big South in his senior season. **For more on McDaniel, see page two.**

FOR HARRISBURG: Left-hander DJ Herz makes a rehab start for the Senators. He has worked four rehab appearances this year between the FCL Nationals and Low-A Fredericksburg, posting a 1.04 ERA (1 ER/8.2 IP). Herz was selected in the eighth round of the 2019 MLB Draft by the Chicago Cubs. He was traded to the Nationals on July 31, 2023, along with SS Kevin Made for 3B Jeimer Candelario. Herz made eight starts for the Senators in 2023 after the trade, going 2-2 with a 2.55 ERA. He made his MLB debut the following season with the Nationals and went 4-9 with a 4.16 ERA in 19 starts. He underwent Tommy John surgery prior to the 2025 season.

KILEN IT: In his first 24 Double-A games, **Gavin Kilen** is batting .330 (30-for-91) with a homer, nine doubles, three triples and 14 RBIs. For the season, he is tied for first among all MiLB hitters with 36 doubles. He is tied for first among all Giants minor league hitters with 79 RBIs this year. His 10-game hit streak was snapped in the second game of Wednesday's doubleheader. After playing in the All-Star Futures Game in Philadelphia, Kilen was promoted to Double-A on July 17. He has at least one hit in 20 of his 24 games in the Eastern League. Kilen was selected by the Giants last year out of the University of Tennessee with the 13th overall pick in the MLB Draft. He is tied for the third-highest pick in the MLB Draft in Flying Squirrels franchise history with Patrick Bailey (2020) and trailing only Joey Bart (2, 2018) and Hunter Bishop (10, 2019). On Thursday, he became the sixth player in Flying Squirrels franchise history to triple twice in the same game.

JACK ATTACK: In his last 43 games since June 5, **Jack Payton** is batting .336 (49-for-146) with two homers, eight doubles, a triple, 20 RBIs, 17 walks and 20 runs scored. He has 14 multi-hit performances in that span, including 10 two-hit games and four three-hit games. On August 1, he hit the first grand slam of the season for the Flying Squirrels and the second of his professional career.

SIZZLING: In his 12 August games, **Charlie Szykowny** is batting .356 (16-for-45) with a homer, two doubles, two RBIs, four walks and four stolen bases. He clubbed a solo homer last Wednesday, his 12th of the year and his first since June 30. On Sunday, he went 4-for-5, setting a new seasons high for hits and tying his career high. For the year, he leads the Flying Squirrels in hits (101), extra-base hits (37) and total bases (166).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 325 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is fifth in batting average (.295) and sixth in OBP (.384). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for second in triples (4), ninth in hits (101) and tied for eighth in total bases (166). **Bo Davidson** is tied for sixth in homers (19), fifth in SLG (.521) and 10th in OPS (.861). **Parks Harber** is ninth in batting average (.284), sixth in OPS (.879) and seventh in SLG (.510). **Jonah Cox** is first in triples (5) and ninth in stolen bases (27). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (14) and tied for eighth in wins (7). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1) and tied for seventh in ERA (4.34).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Dakota Jordan** (No. 8), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 9), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 11) and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 23). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 4), Jordan (No. 5), Cohen (No. 11), **Jancel Villarroel** (No. 25), Marte (No. 27).

1967: The Richmond Braves beat the Toronto Maple Leafs, 3-2, at Parker Field. With the bases loaded and one out in the eighth, Bobby Cox hit a go-ahead, two-run single to give Richmond the lead. Pinch-runner Skipp Guinn scored the winning run. **1968:** The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 3-2, at Parker Field. Van Kelly and Dave Nicholson hit homered to give Richmond an early 2-0 lead. Toledo tied the score with a two-run homer by Gary Neibauer in the eighth. Santiago Rosario won the game with a walk-off single to the left-field fence in the bottom of the ninth inning. **2015:** The Richmond Flying Squirrels beat the Altoona Curve, 5-4, at The Diamond. In the bottom of the ninth, Devin Harris scored on a wild pitch by Jhondaniel Medina, Rando Moreno tied the game with a single and Austin Slater worked a walk from Medina to bring home the walk-off winning run.
