# Tuesday, August 17 at Omaha (8:05): TBA vs. TBA Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP Kirk McCarty to the mound tonight, looking to avoid dropping 11 games under for the first time since 7/10/13. Toledo will counter with LHP Matthew Boyd. The Clippers are 6-9 (.400) against left handers this year. Boyd has faced the Clippers four times in his career (2015 with Buffalo, 2017 with Toledo), going 1-2 with a 3.67ERA (27.0IP, 20H, 11R, 11ER, 6BB, 28K).

# vs. the Mud Hens

Columbus is 7-13 opposing the Mud Hens this season, but managed a 4-2 series when they met in HP (6/15-6/20). Individually, Nolan Jones has hit .319 (22x69) with 3HR and 11RBI against Toledo this year (20G), while Yu Chang has hit .324 (33x102) with 6HR and 21RBI in his career (27G). Renato Nunez and Aderlin Rodriguez have 6HR against the Clippers this year, Yariel Gonzalez has 5HR.

### Be Reasonable

Over the last 31G, the Clippers have pitched five shutouts and gone 2-3 in games after a shuout (gave up zero total runs in both wins after a shutout; 30 total runs in losses after a shutout, at least nine in each). In the 26G in which the Clippers have allowed runners to score (202 total, 7.8 per), they have given up at least nine on 12 occasions (had three shutouts, 9G with 9+ runs through first 53).

# One Thousand

Christin Stewart and Aderlin Rodriguez hit homers #1,000 and 1,001, respectively, for opponents in the history of Huntington Park (home team has 46 to go to reach 1,000). In the last 17G at home, Clipper pitching has given up 34HR with two 0HR games (7/22 vs. lowa, 8/8 vs. Omaha). On the year, they have given up at least 3HR in a home contest 15 times (five times on road, all since 6/29).

# Clean Slate

When beginning a new inning, only Toledo's .271 average tops that of Columbus (.267) in the IL (Clippers score in 57% of innings that start with a hit). Among players that have led off at least 50 innings, Toledo's Aderlin Rodriguez has the best average (.421, 24x57), followed by Alex Call (2nd, .372, 16x43), Yariel Gonzalez (4th, .356, 21x59) and Trenton Brooks (5th, .345, 20x58).

# **Brooks is Back**

Starting with a hitless game in which he drew 3BB, Trenton Brooks has put together an 11G on base streak since 7/30 in Nashville (.457OBP). He has a hit in nine of the 11 (.342, 13x38) and has 5XBH (.983SLG), including Tuesday's homer (first since 7/22 vs. lowa). Following a 2HR game at lowa on 6/10, his last 5HR have come in Huntington Park (last 9HR from Nolan Jones have been at home).

# Rarified Air-ias

Gabriel Arias enters tonight riding a 21G on base streak that has seen a couple of close calls recently (.407OBP since 7/18; singled in 10th on 8/6, in 9th on 8/5). His streak is tied for his career best (7/19-8/12/18 with Fort Wayne) and started with him tying his career best with a 9G hit streak from 7/18-7/28. Since 6/12, Arias is hitting .324 (61x188) and has reached base safely in 44 of 49G (.379OBP).

# DJ Scratching it Out

Daniel Johnson didn't get a hit Wednesday, but did reach base via 2BB, extending his on base streak to 9G (.390OBP since 6/30 at Toledo). If Johnson reaches tonight, and Trenton Brooks and Gabriel Arias also reach, the Clippers will have four players actively in double digits (Yu Chang is at 10G). In 4G since returning from Cleveland, Johnson is slugging .800 in 15AB (4XBH, one single).

# Month On, Month Off

Beginning on 8/4, Nolan Jones has four multi-hit games in his last seven, batting .370 (10x27) with 2HR and 6RBI. In the month prior, 7/4-8/3, Jones hit .172/.287/.368 with 5HR and 11RBI over 25G. For the month from 6/4-7/3, he hit .292/.411/.573 with 3HR and 17RBI in 27G (also had 14 doubles) and from opening day to 6/3, he struggled to .173/.313/.272 with a HR and 7RBI in 24G.

# **Bullpen Bashers**

The Clipper bullpen (Logan Allen) recorded 5.0IP with 0ER on Sunday, marking the 12th time this year the relievers have had at least 5.0IP and 0ER (no other IL team has more than eight such games). However, only one of those games has come against Toledo (5/18, first matchup), as the Mud Hens have pounded the Clipper bullpen to a 6.72ERA in the last 18G (80.1IP, 60ER)

# This Date in Clipper History 8/13/2004

Brad Halsey, Colter Bean and Juan Padilla combined for a 2-0 shutout over the Norfolk Tides with Bean picking up the win. The trio played an integral part in the Clippers' 2004 run to the playoffs with Halsey tying Alex Graman for the team lead in wins (11) while Bean finished 3rd (9). Bean and Halsey tied for 2nd on the team with 109 strikeouts, trailing Graman's 129 while Bean and Padilla finished 1-2 in relief appearances.

## **Huntington (Small) Park**

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,001 to 954).

# Homers, Homers and More Homers

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.29 per game, putting them two off of the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). On the mound they are allowing 1.55 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 42, even with the shortened season.

### Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 16-47 (.254) in games in which they trail, ranking 11th.

### **Not Close**

The Clippers have suffered the most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (27; six in 10G from 7/8-7/19) and rank tied for last in wins by at least that many (12, Norfolk). That poor ratio has led to a -94 run differential (had a -50 differential over 10G from 7/8-7/19), a figure that places them dead last in the IL.

### Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul. The Clippers were also the last team to win an extra-inning game, toppling Omaha on 8/6 (snapped 5G losing streak in extras). The 85G regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go), as was 45 straight to start a season.

# **Trending Downward**

The current staff ERA of 5.56 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.92ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

### **Under Control**

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is not threatening for a fourth, as they are currently 87K off the lead. To begin the season, they were averaging as many as 10 per game through the first 38G, but that has cooled considerably in recent weeks (8.42K per game since 7/6). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G).

# Defense Doesn't Win Anything

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is marginally higher (.467, 21-24) than when they make a mistake in the field (.410, 16-23). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 88 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .982.

# One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 52% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 25 times (on pace for 38HR).

# Good Baseball

Andres Gimenez advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 7/25 vs. lowa and the runner came around to score in the win (4-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

# No Difference

Through the first half of the season, in which the IL played with 18-inch bases (shortening the distance between bases by a whopping 4.5 inches), the Clippers saw a combined average of 1.71 stolen base attempts in their games (averaged 1.73 attempts per game over five seasons from 2015-19). However, since going back to normal bases, steal attempts are at 1.92 per game.

# Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 67-93 (.419), 37-47 with Columbus (.440).

## Go West, Young Man:

Through 7GS west of Columbus, McCarty is a perfect 5-0 with a 3.46ERA (39.0IP, 30H, 15R, 15ER, 15BB, 29K), turning in 4QS (1-2 with a 5.63ERA in 8GS at Huntington Park). The only other time McCarty pitched in a league with teams west of Columbus was in 2018 with Lake County (only team in the Midwest League east of Columbus). Things were completely opposite that year, with McCarty going 1-7 with a 5.00ERA in 13GS on the road and 3-2 with a 3.26ERA in 9GS at home.

# Inspected by Employee #15:

When it comes to quality in 2021, McCarty has been just about all there is for Columbus, as he owns five of the team's 8QS (**Heath Fillmyer**, **Kevin Herget** and **Eli Morgan** have one each). As a team, the Clippers have gone 29 straight games without a quality outing (Fillmyer on 7/7 vs. Indianapolis; longest drought of the year). McCarty has hit 7.0IP in 4GS (all quality), a feat that has been accomplished exactly zero times in 69 games started by anyone else.

### Bombs Away

In his 15th start of the season, 8/6 vs. Omaha, McCarty gave up his 17th homer of the season, establishing a new career worst. He has been taken deep multiple times in a game four times this year, all at Huntington Park (had allowed five multi-HR games in career prior). After a scoreless debut in Columbus (6.0IP vs. Omaha on 5/11), McCarty has allowed 12HR to 151BF in his last 7GS at home (6.62ERA; 34.0IP, 25ER; 16ER via HR).

# Winning Ways

McCarty began the season with wins in five consecutive decisions, after having never won more than two in a row in his career prior. While he had his share of success in the wins (31.0IP, 10ER), he needed the offense to get him off the hook in two of his no-decisions (came back from 7-0 deficit vs. Nashville on 5/28, trailed 3-1 when leaving start vs. Toledo on 6/15).

# Off the Board

Starting with his last 2.0IP in the season opener on 5/4 at Louisville and continuing through his first 2.0IP vs. Omaha on 5/16, McCarty fired 10 straight scoreless innings (4H, 0BB, 4K). Through his first 4GS, McCarty started 24 innings (retired the first batter 20 times) and allowed a single tally in seven of them with zero multi-run innings allowed. In his fifth start, on 5/28 vs. Nashville, McCarty allowed multi-run innings in each of the first three, surrendering 4HR (career high). In his next 5GS (6/3-6/26), McCarty allowed one multi-run inning in each, while producing scoreless baseball in 22 of 30.0IP.

# Lack of Lefties:

Over the course of 140 games in 2019, the Clippers trotted out a lefty starter just 15 times (McCatry hit 15GS on 8/6 vs. Omaha, team has 35GS by lefties on the year), as right handers made 68 consecutive starts from 4/18-6/30/19. Including the bullpen, lefties accounted for 15.5% of the innings pitched for Columbus in 2019 (191.1IP) and only Louisville had fewer. **Josh Smith** led Clipper southpaws with 52.2IP in 2019, a total that was surpassed by McCarty on 6/26 (was leading IL in IP through 7/2, then had a pair of brief outings and missed a turn in the rotation; currently ranks tied for 6th in the IL with 79.0IP).
