TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes hold a 3-2 series advantage after claiming game five last night, 11-8. A win would give Albuquerque their first series triumph since taking five of six in El Paso Sept. 12-17, 2023 ... The club has won four of its last six contests ... Karl Kauffmann is scheulded to make his second-straight start against the CHihuahuas while Daniel Camarena is set to take

FOUR-STRAIGHT: Hunter Goodman's homer in four-straight is the 13th time in Isotopes history a player has homered in at least four consecutive games. There have only been three instances in which someone did it in five or more ballgames in a row: Mike Colangelo (Aug. 24-31, 2005 - six), Scott Seabol (July 22-25, 2007 - five), Dallas McPherson (June 18-27, 2008 - seven, which is still tied for the Minor League record).

FIRST FRAME: The seven-run first was the largest opening frame for Albuquerque since they also plated seven on April 2, 2023 at Round Rock, in the third game of the campaign (also: highest scoring inning of year).

IT IS HIGH, IT IS FAR: Hunter Goodman's drive last night traveled 464 ft., the second-longest home run in the Pacific Coast League in 2024. Reno's Adrian Del Castillo hit a 474-foot blast on Thursday at Salt Lake.

DINGERS: The Isotopes have homered in seven-straight games—longest streak of the year. They have 11 clouts during the seven-game stretch, five by Hunter Goodman. It's the longest streak since a seven-game streak from Aug. 19-26, 2023.

VS. EL PASO: The Isotopes have won 25 of their last 36 games against El Paso, dating back to Sept. 11, 2022, in the Duke City. Prior to that, the Chihuahas had claimed 15 of the prior 16 contests ... With a victory today, the Isotopes will claim their sixthstraight series win over El Paso (since Sept. 26-28, 2022), a feat never accomplished against one team in club history.

ERROR 404: Albuquerque committed two errors last night, increasing their total to 25, most in Triple-A. The Isotopes have multiple miscues in eight contests, a mark not reached until their 42nd game in 2023.

RUNS: The Isotopes have scored nine or more runs in five of their last 10 games, while simultaneously being held to three or fewer on three instances during the same timeframe.

THREE-BAGGERS: Julio Carreras swatted his third triple on the year Tuesday and the Isotopes Triple-A-leading 12th of 2024. The club has a three-bagger in eight of 20 games. IT'S ALL GOOD, MAN: Hunter Goodman belted his sixth home run of the year, fifth of the series and fourth-straight contest ... Goodman has launched 13 long balls in 20 road games with Albuquerque ... Of his 57 batted balls hit into play this year, 24 have an exit velocity over 100-MPH.

HOMER STREAK: Goodman's four-game homer streak is the fourth-longest active in Triple-A (long: five, Danny Mendick, Charlotte). During the stretch, he has 10 RBI, one strikeout and a 1.590 OPS. It's his first four-dinger stretch since homering in a career-high five-straight games from Aug. 17-21, 2022, with Single-A Spokane.

MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck has gone hitless in two-straight for the first time since a three-game stretch from Aug. 17-18, 2023 (DH) ... On Triple-A leaderboard in four categories (see below)

BECK EXIT VELO: Out of Beck's 54 batted balls in play, 21 have left the bat over 100-MPH. Highest EV: 108.6 MPH, 1B (3/29

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron extended his hitting streak to nine games (tied with Romo for team lead) with a single Friday. The nine-game streak is also tied for the fifth-longest active hit streak in Triple-A (longest active: 14 Orelvis Martinez, Buffalo). During the stretch he is slashing .294/.385/.500 with two doubles, one triple, a homer, seven RBI and five walks. **TONY**: Drew Romo also extended his streak to nine games (tied with Herron for team lead) with a double Friday. The nine-game streak is also tied for the fifth-longest active hit streak in Triple-A (longest active: 14 Orelvis Martinez, Buffalo). During the stretch, he is slashing .371/.389/.429 with two doubles and four RBI. It was just his second extra-base hit of April and first since tallying a double April 10 vs. Sugar Land. FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes has drawn a walk in sevenstraight games, the second-longest active walk-streak in Triple-A (long: eight, Cade Marlowe, Tacoma). REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk delivered a pair of runscoring singles last night and is 11-for-33 with four doubles and nine RBI during a current eight-game hit streak TRIPLE-A LEADERBOARD: Jordan Beck is T-5th in XBH (13), T-6th in RBI (20), T-7th in runs (17) and T-8th in total bases (45) ... **Hunter Goodman** is 1st in XBH (15), T-3rd in doubles (8), T-5th in total bases (48) and T-7th in homers (6) ... **Greg Jones** is T-4th in stolen bases (10) ... **Julio Carreras** is T-3rd in triples (3). **ISOTOPES 2024 HIGHEST** BY THE NUMBERS **EXIT VELOCITY**

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
