Double Your Pleasure – For the 8th time already this season, the Worcester Red Sox will play a make-up doubleheader today when they host the Lehigh Valley IronPigs (AAA-Philadelphia) in a twin bill beginning at 4:05 pm at Polar Park. Both 7-inning games can be seen live on NESN and heard on NASH 98.9 FM and the rest of the WooSox Radio Network. For the WooSox it will be their 8th doubleheader this season, and their 6th here at home. Worcester is 3-1-3 in their first seven twin bills this season...three sweeps, swept once, and split three others.

A Word Series Champ and Batting Champ Visits Polar Park – Boston Red Sox 2004 World Series Champion and former American League batting champion Bill Mueller will be on hand at Polar Park today to meet and greet fans during Game 1 of the doubleheader. During Mueller's appearance, presented by DCU, he will be in the Sherwood's Diner from the 2nd – 6th innings of Game 1 for photos and autographs with fans. Bill played in 1,216 Major League games during an 11-year career batting .291 with 85 HR & 493 RBI. The former third baseman played for San Francisco (1996-2000, 2002), the Cubs (2001-02), Boston (2003-05), and the Dodgers (2006). A switch-hitter, he won the AL batting title in 2003 with the Red Sox (hitting .326). After his playing career, Bill has been a front office executive and a hitting coach, most recently Miami's assistant hitting coach in 2024.

Among others, Mueller had three memorable games with the Red Sox...

- On July 29, 2003 at Texas, he hit three home runs in one game, two of which were grand slams becoming just the 12th player in Major League history to hit two grand slams in a single game. However, he is the only player to ever to hit grand slams from each side of the plate in the same game. The grand slams also came in consecutive at-bats.

-He belted a dramatic game-winning walk-off home run on July 24, 2004, against Mariano Rivera and the New York Yankees at Fenway Park in the Varitek/A-Rod brawl game. That comeback is considered to be the turning point in the Red Sox 2004 season.

-Mueller made a significant number of contributions to the Red Sox World Series victory in 2004. The most notable was his critical RBI single in the ninth inning of Game 4 against Rivera and the Yankees in the American League Championship Series that tied the game at 4-4. The rest, as they say, is history!

Hola to Nola - Philadelphia righthander Aaron Nola will make an injury rehab start for Lehigh Valley in Game 1 today. Nola has been on the Phillies injured list since May16 with a right ankle sprain and fractured rib. He is 1-7 with a 6.16 ERA in 9 starts for Philadelphia this season but in his 11-year Major League career he has posted a 105-86 record with a 3.78 ERA in 277 starts.

Double Duty – As mentioned, Worcester is 3-1-3 in their first seven twin bills this season...three sweeps, swept once, and split three others. They split a doubleheader at home vs. Columbus on April 9; swept a doubleheader in Rochester on April 17; swept Syracuse at Polar Park on April 23; were swept by the Mets later in that series on April 27; and split at home vs. Durham on May 24. Worcester then went 5½ weeks without playing another doubleheader until July 2 at home vs. Syracuse resulting in another split. The Sox swept their most recent doubleheader on July 24 in St. Paul by 4-0 & 5-2 scores. The WooSox played ten doubleheaders all of last season (going 0-2-8 in those...no sweeps, twice swept, and 8 splits). The Worcester club-record for most twin bills in a season is 11 in 2023. The Sox went 5-2-4 in their franchise-high 11 doubleheaders in 2023 and they played seven doubleheaders during each of the 2021 and 2022 seasons going 1-2-4 both those years.

Weather or Not – The rainout last night was Worcester’s 9th postponement of the year and their 7th PPD at Polar Park, thus setting a new WooSox club record for most home games either postponed or cancelled in a single season. The WooSox’ previous mark of six home postponements was set in 2021 during Worcester’s inaugural season at Polar Park. This season’s postponed or cancelled home games have come on Saturday, March 29; Tuesday, April 8; Saturday, April 12 (which was cancelled); Saturday, April 26; Thursday May 22; Tuesday, July 1; and now Thursday, July 31. Worcester has had two road games postponed (April 16 in Rochester due to snow and July 23 at St. Paul).

Goodbye to July – Ironically, the WooSox began the month of July with a home rainout on July 1 vs. Syracuse and they ended July yesterday with another home rainout on July 31 vs. Lehigh Valley. Worcester finished 10-13 in July. Sox batters hit .264 (199-for-753) with 29 HR while Sox pitchers were 10-13 with a 5.44 ERA (115 ER in 190.1 IP) and 38 HRA in July. The Sox were out-scored by their opponents, 124-122 during the month.

July Stats & Leaders –Leading WooSox batters in July were...Tyler McDonough at .342 (13-for-28); Vaughn Grissom at .324 (23-for-71) with 5 HR & 17 RBI; Blaze Jordan at .308 (24-for-78) with 3 HR & 12 RBI; Jhostynxon Garcia batted .290 (20-for-69) with 3 HR & 13 RBI; and Corey Rosier was also at .290 in July (9-for-31).

Series Results – Wednesday in a well-played and well-pitched weekday matinee at Polar Park, the IronPigs struck for 3 runs in the top of the 10th inning to defeat the WooSox, 5-3 and even this series at a victory apiece. Lehigh Valley catcher Peyton Henry had a pair of homers good for 4 RBI to lead the way for the IronPigs. Worcester’s five pitchers combined to strike out 19 Pigs which is a new WooSox club-record for strikeouts in a single game. The WooSox began this 6-game set and 12-game homestand with a rousing, 7-5 come-from-behind victory Tuesday night in the series-opener. Jhostynxon Garcia delivered the game’s two biggest blows as his towering 2-run HR with two outs in the bottom of the 8th-inning snapped a 5-5 tie and proved to be the difference. Earlier in the game, Garcia smacked a 3-run double to give the WooSox a 5-3 lead in the 5th-inning.

Home Goods – This 12-game homestand runs through Sunday, August 10 and starts with these 6-games vs. the IronPigs this week/weekend through Sunday afternoon (series is tied at 1-1). After an offday on Monday, the homestand resumes on Tuesday with the opener of a 6-game set vs. the Buffalo Bisons. Beginning July 29 through August 24, the WooSox will play 18 of 24 games at Polar Park (1-1 thus far).

What Have You Done for Me Lately – Worcester is 9-9 in their last 18 games since July 6, but they have dropped 18 of their last 29 games – corresponding to the beginning of the second half on June 24.

Above Board Barely – At 52-51 on the year, the Sox are over the .500 mark after being exactly .500 for a total of 17 different times this season...1-1, 2-2, 3-3, 8-8, 9-9, 14-14, 16-16, 18-18, 20-20, 21-21, 24-24, 25-25, 26-26, 27-27, 28-28, 47-47, and 48-48.

Series Matters – Worcester is 6-8-5 in their first 19 series played this season...six wins, eight losses, and five splits. Their remaining eight series are all 6-game sets (5 at home and 3 on the road) as the Sox have 28 home games at Polar Park (including a pair today/tonight) and 18 away games left this season.

Home is Where the Heart is – The Sox have won 15 of their last 24 games at home since May 23. Overall the WooSox are 25-21 at Polar Park after reaching a season-high 8-games over .500 at home three different times this season (on June 20 & 22 and July 2). Worcester won a club-record 8 straight at home from May 25 – June 18.

Rough Road – Worcester has won 4 of their last 6 road games after losing 10 of their previous 15 on the road between June 24 – July 13. The WooSox are 27-30 on the road after dipping to a season-high of 6-games below .500 on the road on July 5 & 12.

Second Half Adjustments – The WooSox are 11-18 to start the 2nd half (final 75 games of the year), but they are 25-23 overall since June 1. Worcester finished the first half of the season with a 41-33 good for 4th-place in the International League East (7th overall in the 20-team IL) and 5½-games back of first half champ Jacksonville.

Sox Standouts

-INF **Kristian Campbell** has a 10-game hitting streak (16-for-38, .421) with 1 2B, 3 HR, 7 RBI, 7 BB, and 12 runs scored.

-INF/OF **Nate Eaton** has hit in 10 of his last 12 games (13-for-43, .302) with 3 2B, 1 HR, 5 RBI, and 9 runs scored.

-OF **Jhostynxon Garcia** has hit in 12 of his last 14 games (19-for-60, .317) with 3 HR, 11 RBI and 12 runs scored.

-INF **Vaughn Grissom** has hit in 12 of his last 15 games (19-for-61, .311) with 3 2B, 5 HR, 16 RBI, and 12 runs scored. In his last 22 games he is batting .337 (29-for-86) with 7 doubles, 6 HR, 20 RBI, and 18 runs scored. He is tied for 9th in the International League in hits (96), tied for 8th in doubles (24), tied for 3rd in the league in runs scored (64), and 10th in total bases (156).

-1B **Nathan Hickey** has hit in 10 of his last 11 games (14-for-40, .350) with 3 2B, 1 HR & 7 RBI.

-OF **Trayce Thompson** is 13-for-46 in his last 13 games (.282) with 4 2B, 3 HR, 10 RBI, and 8 runs scored.

-RHP **Wyatt Mills** has allowed only 3 runs in his last 13 games over 21.1 innings.

-LHP **Jovani Moran** has allowed 1 ER in his last 7.1 innings with 12 strikeouts in his last 4 relief appearances.

Home Show – This current 12-game homestand is the second longest in terms of games for the WooSox this season. The WooSox went 6-7 on a 13-game homestand this past April 22 – May 4 that included a 7-game series vs. Syracuse thanks to a make-up doubleheader (Sox went 3-4) and then a 6-game set vs. Toledo (Sox went 3-3). Worcester has played eight extended homestands of 12 games or more - featuring two series each - during their first four and a half years of existence. They have had four winners and four losers during their “long” homestands in WooSox history. This week and next week marks number nine.

Welcome Pigs – Worcester is 6-8 vs. Lehigh Valley this season. The first dozen games between these two rivals all came in Allentown, PA (Sox went 2-4 from May 6-11 and 3-3 from June 10-15 at Lehigh Valley). This is the first and only visit the IronPigs make here to Worcester and this series (tied 1-1) will mark the final meetings of the year between these two clubs.

Lehigh Led Until Near the End – Lehigh Valley was well atop the International League with an 8-game lead on 2nd-place Jacksonville with just over two weeks remaining in the first half, but the IronPigs would lose 11 of their last 14 games from June 6-22 (including 5 straight at home vs. last-place Rochester to end the first half) and got surpassed by eventual first half champion Jacksonville on the penultimate day of the first half schedule. Jacksonville now awaits the 2nd half champ in the IL Playoffs in late-September.

Stats vs. IronPigs – WooSox batters are hitting .228 (107-for-470) vs. Lehigh Valley this season with 14 HR and 62 runs scored while Sox pitchers are 6-8 with a 4.23 ERA (57 ER in 121.1 IP) allowing 9 HR and 64 runs to the IronPigs.

Pigs in a Blanket – Worcester (6-8 vs. Lehigh Valley this season) has beaten the IronPigs 50 times in their last 83 meetings dating back to September 11, 2021. Last year, Worcester went 16-8 vs. Lehigh Valley as those 16 wins were their most against any International League opponent in a season in the past three years.

June was Better and not Wetter – The WooSox had two home rainouts and one road rainout in July while going 10-13. Worcester finished 15-10 in June with no postponements. The Sox went 13-14 in the month of May (with one home postponement) after going 1-1 in March (with one home postponement) and 13-13 in April (with two home postponements & one home cancellation along with one road postponement).

Tough Finish to a Winning June – Worcester posted a winning June with their 15-10 record that began with their 9-game winning streak from June 1-11 and was 14-5 prior to the start of the 2nd half (1-5 to end the month). The WooSox out-scored their opponents, 140-124 in June while batting .240 with solid production including 49 doubles, 7 triples, 34 HR and 140 runs scored. WooSox pitchers were 15-10 with a 4.72 ERA in June with 23 HRA & 124 runs allowed.

Other Month to Month - WooSox hitters batted .246 in May with 29 HR & 114 runs scored while Sox pitchers were 13-14 with a 4.84 ERA during the month with 32 HRA and 132 runs allowed. Worcester hit .273 in April with 25 HR & 145 runs scored and WooSox pitchers were 13-13 in April with a 4.74 ERA along with 26 HRA and 128 runs given up.

Highs and Lows – Worcester has been a season-high of 8-games over .500 on three different occasions (last on June 22 at 41-33). Those are their best marks since finishing last year with a 79-71 record. The WooSox have been at the .500 mark 17 different times this season...1-1, 2-2, 3-3, 8-8, 9-9, 14-14, 16-16, 18-18, 20-20, 21-21, 24-24, 25-25, 26-26, 27-27, 28-28, 47-47, and 48-48. The Sox were a season-low 4-games below .500 (4-8) on April 11.

Ups and Downs – Worcester's stretch of winning 14 of 18 from June 1-22 was one of their best of the season along with an April 13-24 stretch when they won 10 of 11 games. Their worst stretches have come recently (lost 15 of 21 from June 24 – July 20) and from April 25 – May 11 when they lost 11 of 15 games.

Doing One Better – The WooSox have won 8 of their last 12 1-run decisions since May 23 and are 12-12 in 1-run games on the year after starting the season by dropping 8 of their first dozen 1-run decisions.

Home Run Derby – Worcester has maximized their use of the long-ball all season as 62 of their total 121 HR on the year have come with runners on base. Worcester batters have belted (59) solo HR, (41) 2-run homers, (14) 3-run blasts & (7) grand slams.

Streaks Appeal – The WooSox enjoyed a season-high and Worcester club-record 9-game winning streak June 1-11. They fell two wins shy of matching the longest winning streak for a Red Sox Triple-A affiliate in 55+ years...since the Pawtucket Red Sox won 11 straight in 2014. The WooSox have also had two 5-game winning streaks (from April 13-18 and again from April 20-24). Worcester had a season-high 5-game losing streak from April 25-30.

A Winning Tradition – The 2024 Worcester Red Sox went 79-71 to post a winning season for the fourth time in as many years of existence and for the third year in a row under manager Chad Tracy. Trace is only the second Red Sox Triple-A manager to ever post three consecutive winning seasons. Darrell Johnson did so from 1971-73 (the first two years when the Red Sox Triple-A club was in Louisville before moving to Pawtucket in 1973). Worcester finished 35-40 during the first half last year but then improved to 44-31 in the second half. Overall the 2024 WooSox went 40-34 at home and 39-37 on the road. The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, and the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark.

2024 WooSox Batters Led the Way – Worcester led all 20 International League clubs in a host of team offensive categories last season. The WooSox led the league with 869 runs scored and also led the IL with 786 walks. Worcester paced the league by a wide margin with an impressive .369 on-base pct. as the WooSox were the only team in the IL with an OBP of over .359. Furthermore, Worcester had the 2nd best OPS in the league at .795.

2024 Rankings – Worcester finished 5th in the IL in team batting with a .259 average. On the pitching side, the Sox were 10th in team ERA (4.84). Sox pitchers allowed the 2nd fewest HR in the league. Defensively, the WooSox were 11th with a .979 field pct. (107 errors in 5126 total chances).

Players Aplenty - The 2024 WooSox built on a pair of all-time Red Sox Triple-A records (previously set by the 2023 WooSox) as they made 281 player transactions during the 2024 campaign and set a new all-time Red Sox Triple-A record for players appearing in a single season. The WooSox used 84 different players in 2024 (37 position players and 47 pitchers) to better the mark of 79 players in 2023. Ironically, the 2021 WooSox broke a long-standing Red Sox Triple-A record when they used 72 different players to beat the 1995 Pawtucket Red Sox (during a strike year when replacement players were used for the first month+ of that season) and the 2006 PawSox who each employed 70 different players. When Chad Tracy made his Worcester debut in 2022, the WooSox quickly set a new record using 75 different players (that was immediately topped first in 2023 and again in 2024).

WooSox to BoSox - The WooSox sent 28 different players to Boston during the 2024 season (not counting rehab players). A total of 22 different players were promoted from Double-A Portland to Triple-A Worcester last season.

PORTLAND SEA DOGS (AA) GAME RECAP – The Portland Sea Dogs (14-15)/(48-48) edged Altoona, 2-1 yesterday. Two players who are now no longer with Portland drove in the Sea Dogs runs. Mikey Romero, promoted to Worcester, ripped an RBI single in the 3rd inning and James Tibbs III, traded to the Dodgers as part of the Dustin May deal later yesterday, followed with an RBI single to make the score, 2-1 (which was the final). Caleb Bolden (2-3) was the starter and winner – 5 IP, 4 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 1 BB, 5 SO. Yovanny Cruz fired 2 perfect innings with 2 SO for his 5th save.

WOOSOX PLAYER MOVES – The Boston Red Sox today transferred INF **Mikey Romero** from Double-A Portland to Worcester. Romero, 21, has been with Portland all season and hit .254 in 66 games with 8 HR & 40 RBI. He led the Sea Dogs in a host of offensive categories including runs (40), hits (68), doubles (18), triples (4), RBI (40), and total bases (118), and was tied with 8 HR. Romero played 20 games at SS, 20 games at 3B, 9 games at 2B, and 17 games as the DH. Mikey was Boston's 1st round pick in the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Orange Lutheran High School in Orange, CA (same school as Gerrit Cole). The lefty hitter is ranked by MLB Pipeline as Boston's #8 prospect. His older sisters Sierra and Sydney were star softball players at the University of Michigan and the University of Oklahoma respectively.

The Boston Red Sox today also sent reliever **Nick Burdi** to Worcester on an injury rehab assignment. Burdi has been on Boston's injured list since June 3 with a right foot contusion. He began this season with the WooSox and was outstanding. Overall in 17 relief appearances with Worcester he is 4-0 with a 1.29 ERA along with 4 saves – 21 IP, 14 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 7 BB, 28 SO. He was promoted to Boston on May 16, optioned n May 23, recalled again on May 30 and then placed on the IL on June 3. He rehabbed with Worcester on June 13 but was taken off rehab on June 17 and remained on the Red Sox injured list. Overall in 4 relief appearances for the Red Sox he is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA – 5.1 IP, 5 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 5 SO.

On Thursday, the WooSox placed RHP **Robert Stock** on the 7-day injured list (retro to July 29) with right shoulder inflammation. And the Red Sox yesterday transferred RHP **Cooper Adams** from Double-A Portland to Worcester.

Cooper Adams, 25, spent most of this season with Greenville (Red Sox high A) where he went 2-3 with a 3.95 ERA in 21 games (1 start) – 43.1 IP, 42 H, 26 R, 19 ER, 20 BB, 55 SO. He was recently promoted to Double-A Portland and made on relief appearance for the Sea Dogs on July 23 – 2.1 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 3 SO. Signed as a non-drafted free agent in February of 2024, Adams spent all of 2024 with Greenville going 2-5 with a 5.08 ERA in 26 games (6 starts). The 6'3", 205 lbs. righty was born in Potomac, Maryland.

Worcester has made 95 player moves since June 1 (including 49 in June & 44 in July).

The WooSox have used 65 different players already this season (35 pitchers and 30 position players). Pitchers David Sandlin & Connelly Early as well as INF Mikey Romero will soon add to that total when they make their WooSox debuts. At the trade deadline last year (July 31, 2024), the WooSox had employed 64 different players (36 pitchers and 28 position players) on their way to a Red Sox Triple-A record 84 players used during the 2024 season.
