### LHP RYAN CARPENTER (NR) vs. LHP TY BLACH (NR)

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Isotopes and Chihuahuas square off in the rubber game of the three game set with Albuquerque's 6-5 triumph Saturday night ... Ty Blach is scheduled to take the ball for the home team while former Isotope Ryan Carpenter is expected to start for El Paso ... With an Isotopes win, the club claim will claim their sixth-straight series victory over the Chihuahuas (extending the team's longest series winning streak vs. El Paso), while a loss would give El Paso its first series victory since taking six of seven in Albuquerque from Sept. 6-11, 2022 (Chihuahuas won first six games of set).

**SPLITS:** The Isotopes have split their first two contests of a season for the third-straight year and 13th time in club history, all coming since 2006. They have started 2-0 five times and 0-2 on two occasions.

**SITI FOR THE SAVE:** Despite surrendering two runs in the ninth yesterday, Matt Carasiti became the first pitcher in Isotopes history to record a save in four different seasons (2016, 2017, 2023 and 2024).

**EXIT VELO:** The Isotopes tallied eight of the 15 batted balls registering a 100 MPH-plus exit velocity last night, including five of the top six. Top three Isotopes exit velocities from yesterday: Grant Lavigne, 108.8 MPH, double; Julio Carreras, 106.8 MPH, groundout; and Julio Carreras, 106.6 MPH, triple.

**HE'S GOOD, MAN:** Hunter Goodman has doubles in consecutive games for the second time as an Isotope (104.2 MPH off the bat last night). He accomplished the feat in three-straight contests from Aug. 16-18 last year vs. El Paso.

**BOUCHIE THE BRUIN:** Sean Bouchard delivered a triple last night, his first since since Aug. 19, 2022 at Tacoma.

**FAN FAVORITE:** Coco Montes registered his second-straight two-hit game to start the season. He has hit safely in 15 of 16 games dating back to Sept. 3, 2023, with six multi-hit contests during the stretch. Over his last 16 games (all with the Isotopes), he's batting .348 (24x69) with four doubles, three homers and 18 RBI.

**BY WAY OF THE K:** The Isotopes reached double digits in strikeouts at the plate (15 Friday, 10 yesterday) in the first two games of a season for the third time in club history (also: 2021 vs. Sugar Land, 2023 at Round Rock) ... The 26 strikeouts in 2021 over the first two games of season is a team high.

**RADIO WAVES:** Due to the NCAA Tournament, this weekend's Isotopes games will air on KKOB 96.3 FM/770 AM.

**TRIPLE-A DEBUT:** Grant Lavigne made his Triple-A debut last night and went 2-for-4, including a double to left-center that was clobbered at 108.8 MPH, the hardest-hit ball of the evening.

**NEW GUY:** Greg Jones set the table from the leadoff spot last night with three walks (first time since June 16, 2022 at Rocket City) and two stolen bases (18th time in his professional career).

**KAUFFY:** Karl Kauffmann pitched at least five innings with zero or one run allowed for just the third time in 33 starts for Albuquerque (also: Aug. 4, 2023 vs. Las Vegas; Sept. 21, 2023 vs. Oklahoma City). He induced 13 swing and misses of 78 total pitches last night.

**HBP:** Albuquerque's pitching staff plunked four Chihuahuas yesterday, their most hit-by-pitches since Aug. 10, 2023 at Round Rock (also four).

**SACRIFICE:** Connor Kaiser laid down a sacrifice bunt in the fourth inning last night. In 2023, Albuquerque only registered eight sacrifices during the entire campaign.

**PROSPECTS:** Four players on MLB.com's top 30 Rockies prospects list will start the season with Albuquerque: Beck, Drew Romo (No. 9), Hunter Goodman (No. 12) and Greg Jones (No. 23).

**MLB EXPERIENCE:** The Opening Day roster features 16 players who have seen time in the Major Leagues. Right-handed reliever John Curtiss has registered the most MLB service time (three years and 137 days).

**RUN IT BACK:** Second-year manager Pedro Lopez welcomes a record-setting 21 returning players back to Albuquerque, including 20 that played on the 2023 squad.

**WHAT'S MY AGE AGAIN?:** Ty Blach and Matt Koch will share the role of elder statesmen at the outset, as both are 33-years-old.

**EL PASO TIES:** Ryan Carpenter pitched for the Isotopes in 2016 and 2017. He was chosen as the club's Pitcher of the Year in 2017 while registering 10 wins and 161 strikeouts, the second-most punchouts in a campaign in club history.

**2024 FIRST-HALF SCHEDULE:** The Isotopes will face six teams over the 75 games in the first half, which ends June 23, with 45 contests against Oklahoma City (24) and El Paso (21) ... Of the 21 games against the Chihuahuas this season, nine contests will be played at RGCU Field at Isotopes Park

### THIS DAY IN BASEBALL HISTORY

**1969:** The \$1.4 million Albuquerque Sports Stadium was christened with an exhibition game between the San Francisco Giants and Cleveland Indians before a crowd of more than 13,000 fans. The game ended in a 5-5 tie, due to darkness. It started at 4pm because the commissioner ordered no baseball activities until one hour after the funeral ended for former president Dwight Eisenhower. Bobby Bonds scored the ballpark's first run. Future Hall of Famer Willie Mays hit leadoff, batted three times, and declared it was, "the greatest minor league ballpark I've ever played in."

## NUCLEI NOTES

**SKIPPER:** Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**HOMETOWN KID:** Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

**CHRIS MICHALAK:** Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

**MICHAEL RYAN:** Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

**SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT:** For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

**BALLS AND STRIKES:** The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
