TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints set suffered their largest margin of defeat in franchise history in a 21-6 loss on Wednesday night. The Saints gave up 21 runs on 24 hits to the Gwinnett Stripers in the first loss they've ever taken to the Braves' Triple-A affiliate. The Stripers had a 10-2 lead after five innings, plating 11 more in the final three frames. Chris Williams and Patrick Winkel each homered for the Saints in the loss. The Saints also used their first position player on the mound this season, sending Diego A. Castillo out for the ninth, who allowed a grand slam in his inning of work.

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: There were a number of franchise records set on Wednesday night. The 15 run deficit is the largest margin of loss in franchise history. The 21 runs and 24 hits are the most allowed in a single game in franchise history. Eli White's six hits and seven RBI are also the most ever by a Saints opponent. It's the second time the Saints have allowed 20-or-more runs, joining the June 23 game against Toledo (20-9 loss). The 24 hits allowed are the fourth-most in an IL game this season. The 13 hits allowed by Caleb Boushley are tied for the second-most by a Saints pitcher in a single game, matching Chandler Shepherd, who did so twice in 2021.

OOOOOOO, AHHHHH: The Saints are 1-2 on July 4 since becoming the Twins' Triple-A affiliate, with their lone win coming in 2022, a 4-1 win at Louisville. This will be the club's first home game on July 4 since 2021, a 10-6 loss to Omaha. It also marks the third anniversary of Drew Maggi's fourth consecutive game with a home run, the only player in franchise history to accomplish the feat.

FILLING OUT THE ROSTER: The Saints roster consisted of 24 players on Wednesday, but will fill in the holes today with some new faces and familiar ones: Matt Bowman and Diego Castillo have both re-joined the team after signing minor league contracts and have been assigned to St. Paul. On the offensive side, Payton Eeles has been transferred to St. Paul from High-A Cedar Rapids.

PUT IT ON THE MANTLE: The Saints collected another league-wide honor on Wednesday, as Matt Wallner was named the International League Player of the Month for June. Wallner hit .324/.403/.724 in 26 June games. He led the International League in extra-base hits (18), home runs (12), RBI (28), slugging percentage, total bases (76) and runs (27). He was tied for second in hits (34) with Junior Severino and finished third with a 1.127 June OPS. Wallner's 12 home runs in June are the most for any Triple-A player in any month this season and tied for the most for any IL batter in any month since 2021. Wallner is the 18th IL batter since 2021 to hit 10 home runs in a month and just the second Saint to accomplish the feat, joining Chris Williams, who hit 10 home runs in June of 2023.

Wallner is also closing in on the Saints' single-season home run record, hitting 19 long balls this season. He is currently tied for the fourth-most in a single season with Jimmy Kerrigan (2021). He trails: Brent Rooker (20, 2021), along with Jair Camargo and Chris Williams (21, 2023).

EXTRA! EXTRA! (BASES): The Saints have managed an extra-base hit in every game dating back to April 23, a streak of 62 consecutive games. That is the third-longest stretch in franchise history, trailing last year's 67-game streak from April 20-July 6. The franchise record is a 96-game streak from April 15-August 7, 2022, the second-longest streak in the IL since 2021. The club's 96-game streak in 2022 and 67-game streak in 2023 were both the longest in the league in their respective seasons. The current 62-game stretch is the second-longest in the IL this year, trailing Omaha's active 77-game streak, dating back to April 4.

SUMMERTIME SEVERINO: In Yuniur Severino's 31 games since May 21, he has hit .391 (45-for-115), with nine home runs, drawing 26 walks to 31 strikeouts, owning a 1.155 OPS. Since June 1, Severino leads the IL in batting average (.425), on-base percentage, sporting a .544 clip, and OPS, at 1.232, ranking fourth in slugging percentage at .688. His 21 walks since the start of June are the fourth-most in the league.

Severino just finished one of the best months a for a Saints hitter in franchise history. Severino's .425 June batting average is the highest for any Saints player (min. 35 PAs) in any month dating back to 2021. His .544 on-base percentage is the highest and just the fourth Saints hitter to have a .500 OBP or better in a month. His 1.267 OPS is also the fifth-highest for any month. He's also just the eighth player to register a 30-hit month in franchise history.

TWINS UPDATE: Brooks Lee went 2-for-4 with an RBI in his Major League debut, but it was not enough in a 9-2 loss to the Tigers on Wednesday. David Festa took his first MLB loss, allowing seven runs over 5.0 innings, giving up nine hits.

LAST APPEARANCE: 6/29 @ IOWA...made 10th AAA start of the season, bouncing back with 5.0 shutout innings, allowing four hits and two walks while striking out seven...gave up hits to his first two batters, then hit a man with one out to load the bases...escaped the jam with a strikeout and fly out...issued back-to-back walks with two outs in the second inning before retiring six in a row...allowed a pair of one-out singles in the fourth, then retiring his final four batters...first Saints start without allowing any runs since May 3 against Louisville...received first win since May 21 at Buffalo and third of the season in 8-2 Saints victory

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 6/23 v TOL...made ninth AAA start of the season, allowing a career-high 12 runs over 2.1 innings on 11 hits, tying his career-high, walked none and struck out five...gave up three runs in the first inning on a solo home run to Parker Meadows to lead off the ballgame...two batters later Dillon Dingle connected on a two-run homer...gave up three extra-base hits to begin the second inning: doubles to Riley Unroe and Alvaro Gonzalez before surrendering a three-run home run to Andrew Navigato...three batters later Dingle hit his second homer, a two-run blast...allowed a one-out home run to Unroe in the third inning, followed by two singles and an RBI double to Meadows to close the start...12 runs are the most allowed in a start in franchise history, as are the five home runs...Saints allowed a franchise-record seven home runs on the day...took sixth loss and fourth consecutive in AAA in 20-9 Saints defeat.

SOMEONE IS FLIPPING OVER A CHECKERS BOARD: During the 2023 offseason, Louie got engaged to Maddie Hentges, a former lacrosse player at Concordia-St. Paul (2017-20), the same school as Varland. Maddie's brother, Sam, was a star forward on the Totino-Grace HS hockey team, played at St. Cloud State, and was a Minnesota Wild draft pick. Maddie's Dad, Mark, was a Hobie Baker Award finalist in 1980 at St. Thomas, a 2x All-American (1980 & 81) and played in the Montreal Canadiens organization.

NOTHING TO RANT(Z) ABOUT X 2: Make it back-to-back years in which Varland was honored with the Jim Rantz Minnesota Twins Minor League Pitcher of the Year Award. In 2021 he received it after going 10-4 with a 2.10 ERA in 20 games (18 starts) between Low-A Fort Myers and High-A Cedar Rapids. In 103.0 innings pitched he fanned 142 while opponents hit .214 against him. In 2022, between Double-A Wichita and Triple-A St. Paul, he went 8-5, 3.06 (126.1 IP, 43 ER) with 42 walks and 146 strikeouts as opponents hit .242 against him across 24 games (23 starts). He also went 1-2, 3.81 ERA (26.0 IP, 11 ER) with six walks, 21 strikeouts, and a .261 opponents batting average in five starts.

WHO SAYS YOU CAN'T GO HOME: With the transfer from Double-A to Triple-A, on August 8, 2022, Varland returned home. He became the first player from St. Paul to play for the Saints since the team became a Triple-A franchise. Some of the players from the Independent days that were from St. Paul that played for the Saints include Jack Morris, Ryan Schlosser, Tim Thomas (1995), Chris Schwab, Steve Butler, Adam Larson, Brian Whinnery, Zach Peterson, Reid Mahon, Matt Schwab, Joe Bonfe, Jack Gohl, and Jake Esch.

HULKAMANIA: While in high school at North St. Paul High School, Varland was on the wrestling team. He was a two-time MSHSL State Tournament wrestler, two-time MVP, Most Improved, Rookie of the Year, two-time section runner up and four-time captain of the wrestling team.

GET ON THE BUS, GUS: Louie's brother, Gus, is 13 months older than him. They played together at North St. Paul High School and Concordia, St. Paul. Gus was selected in the 14th round by the Oakland Athletics in 2018 out of Concordia, St. Paul. Gus was then traded to the Dodgers along with 3B Sheldon Neuse in exchange for LHP Adam Kolarek and RF Cody Thomas on February 12, 2021. He was claimed in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 draft by the Milwaukee Brewers from the L.A. Dodgers on December 7, 2022

NOT MY BROTHERS KEEPER: - Louie faced off against his brother Gus in 2022 as the Wind Surge took on the Tulsa Drillers on May 6, 2022 in Wichita. It's the first time brothers started against each other in the Minors since at least the 2000s. Louie went 5.0 IP allowed two runs on four hits while walking two and striking out six. His brother went 3.0 IP allowing six runs on eight hits while walking two and striking out two in a 7-2 Wichita victory in game one of a doubleheader.

BROTHERLY LOVE: On June 15, 2022 the Wind Surge and Drillers met again in a doubleheader in Wichita. This time, the brothers pitched opposite ends of the doubleheader and each got a victory. Louie won Game 1 allowing two runs across 6.0 innings while walking one and striking out four in a 7-4 Wind Surge win. In the second game, Gus pitched 2.0 shutout innings of relief allowing one hit and striking out four in a 4-3 Drillers victory.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: While Louie has more than made a name for himself, he might not even be the most athletic person in his family. His Aunt's Denise and Sue were legendary softball pitchers at North St. Paul High School.
