WILD RACE TO THE FINISH AS RED-HOT CONTENDERS CHASE 1ST PLACE CLIPPERS

With just over a week to go until the end of the 2024 regular season, the Columbus Clippers remain out in front of the 20-team International League playoff race.

With a handful of red-hot contenders keeping the pressure on the leaders, the Clippers have pulled off three straight come-from-behind victories this week to keep a 2.5-game edge on 2nd place Worcester.

None of the League's top five clubs in the standings will face each other down the stretch. Each of the top five wrap up their home schedule this weekend before finishing on the road next week.
