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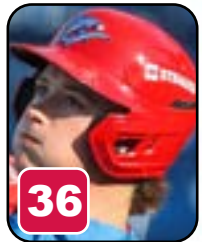

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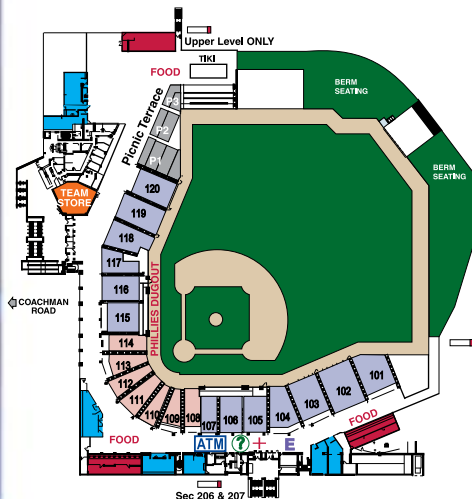
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BAYCARE BALLPARK INFORMATION



ANNOUNCEMENTS

PA and video board announcements can be arranged for a nominal fee by visiting Guest Services behind Section 106 before the end of the second inning.

ATM

The ATM is located on the first base side of the concourse behind section 105.

BAGS & BACKPACKS

Bags can be no larger than 16"x16"x8" and will be subject to inspection upon entry in accordance with Major League Baseball security regulations. Guests may discard or return the prohibited items to their vehicle.

BATS

Full-size baseball bats are prohibited from entry by guests to the ballpark.

BERM SEATING

Berm seating is limited and ticketed. Blankets are permitted to be brought into the park for berm seating. Chairs, folding chairs, camp chairs, and the like, are not permitted to be brought into the park.

CHILD TICKETS

Children 13 and younger qualify for the child's ticket price. For children 4 and younger, please see the BayCare Box Office or a ballpark gate attendant for a complimentary ticket.

CUSTOMER SERVICE & ADVANCE TICKETS

The Customer Service/Advance Tickets window is located on the first base side of the main concourse behind Section 106. Guests can report problems, check for lost and found items and claim prizes at this location. Tickets for future games may also be purchased here.

FIRST AID

The First Aid office is located on the first base side of the main concourse behind section 106. Guests can either report to this office or contact an usher if in need of medical assistance.

FOOD AND DRINK POLICY

No food, bottles, coolers or cans may be brought into the ballpark. The Thrashers reserve the right to search any medical or diaper bags entering the ballpark.

FOUL BALLS

Any foul ball hit into the stands may be kept. Guests are not permitted on the field or to reach into the playing area. Foul balls may be dangerous, so please be alert at all times and aware of the potential hazards.

GATES OPEN

Ballpark gates will open one hour prior to scheduled game time.

HANDICAPPED SEATING

Disabled seating is available all throughout the ballpark. Limited wheelchair seating is available through the ticket office in person or on the telephone. One companion seat is available for purchase with each wheelchair space. An elevator is available for disabled use on the first base side of the stadium (South Parking Lot). Drop-off is available on the West Side of the ballpark (no elevator access here). Please contact an usher for assistance entering and exiting the ballpark.

KIDS ZONE

The left-field concourse features a playground and Kids Zone for our younger guests.

LOST AND FOUND

Located at Customer Service behind Section 106.

SENIOR TICKETS

Seniors 55+ may purchase discounted tickets.

SMOKING

Smoking is prohibited in most areas of the ballpark. Special smoking sections are marked. Smoking is permitted only on the concourse bridge by the right field foul pole and the Tiki Pavilion in left field. For resources to help quit smoking, call 1-877-U-CAN-NOW (1-877-822-6669).

TEAM STORE

The Thrashers Team Store, Diamond Outfitters, is located next to the ballpark's west entry, and features hats, apparel and collectibles to satisfy Thrashers fans of all ages. Merchandise available 24 hours a day on-line at ThrashersBaseball.com.

TIKI PAVILION

The Frenchy's Tiki Pavilion is located beyond the left field wall. It features a variety of mixed drinks, beer and wine for guests 21 and over. Seats in this section are first-come, first-serve during Thrashers season.

WEAPONS

Firearms, weapons, knives, tasers and other dangerous or hazardous devices or substances (collectively "weapons") are prohibited at BayCare Ballpark, unless carried by an on-duty police officer or otherwise expressly approved by The Thrashers. Anyone bringing such a weapon to the premises must return it to their vehicle immediately.

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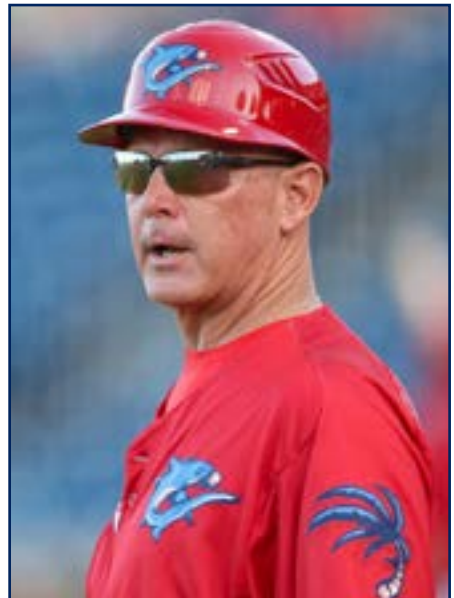


MARTY MALLOY MANAGER

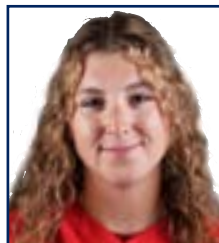

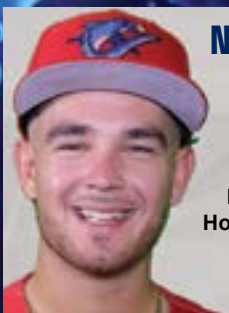

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HOW TO KEEP SCORE

Scoring Basics...

Different fans have different methods of keeping a scorecard, and many use their own notations. But here's a simple method...

If the hitter grounds out to shortstop, for example, write in "6-3," which shows the shortstop threw him out at first base. If the hitter flies out to left field, write a "7."

If the batter gets a hit, write in the hit according to which base he reached. Each corner of the box represents a base, with the lower-right corner being first.

If he singles, put a "-" in the lower right. If he doubles, write a "=" in the upper right, and so on. For a walk, use "BB" in the lower right. As the runner advances, mark the appropriate symbol in the appropriate corner.

If a runner scores, put a circle at the bottom of the box, and inside the circle put the symbol of the play and/or the player that drove him in. For example, if the No. 5 hitter drives in two runs with a single, mark his single in the bottom right of his box and mark a circle with the number "5" in it in the boxes of the runners who score (Some people like to use uniform numbers here, so you can tell who did what, even after lineup changes).

At the end of each inning, total the hits and runs for that inning only. At the end of the game you'll be able to add the innings total to get the game score.

Example Scorecard...

1st Inning

- ① Singled, advanced on next batter's walk; took 3rd on fielder's choice; scored on #4 batter's double.
- ② Walked; later forced out, shortstop to 2nd base.
- ③ Reached on fielder's choice; advanced to 3rd on next batter's double; scored on #5 batter's single.
- ④ Doubled; scored on #5 batter's single.
- ⑤ Singled; advanced to 2nd on next batter's single; stole 3rd base; thrown out on grounder, shortstop to catcher.
- ⑥ Singled; stole 2nd base.
- ⑦ Reached 1st base on fielder's choice.
- ⑧ Popped out to 2nd base.

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Player Spotlight: John Spikerman

How John Spikerman Exemplifies the Success of College Baseball in the Pros

Many young baseball players dream of moving up the ladder and playing in the major leagues, however, that road is long and difficult for any young athlete who chooses to take it. Some players dream of being the top pick out of high school while others dream of NCAA glory before they decide to turn pro. The hard work and confidence of John Spikerman are two traits that can help any young athlete learn to traverse and survive the journey of turning pro.

John Spikerman hails from Texas, a state known for strong high school athletics that has produced numerous superstars across all major sports in the United States. There was already a coach in



his family, as Spikerman's grandfather was a high school baseball coach before he retired after coaching Spikerman's dad in high school. Though his grandfather was no longer coaching, both the elder men in his family made themselves constantly available to John whenever he wanted to play catch in the backyard or get some extra support.

Though his grandfather coached and his sister is soon starting her college career in track and field at the University of Oklahoma, there are currently no professional athletes in the Spikerman family. John was determined to change that, falling in love with baseball from a very young age. Despite his obvious talent, Spikerman was smaller than his teammates growing up, and he wasn't sure his talent would be enough for some schools to overlook his size. It didn't seem to be much of an issue, as Spikerman had begun his recruitment process early on in his high school career.

Before his junior year in high school, Spikerman committed to one of the first schools that gave him an offer; the University of Oklahoma. "I just really felt wanted there," said Spikerman of his choice to play college baseball. "I didn't have any other offers, that was the only place that gave me a scholarship to go play there. They took me on a visit shortly after that, and I committed there." With some MLB teams already scouting Spikerman in high school, he felt that playing college baseball at one of the top sporting institutions in the US would be a big step forward to achieving his ultimate goal of becoming a professional baseball player.

Spikerman was a contributor right out of the gate in Oklahoma, making 30 starts and hitting .317 in his first season as a Sooner. He made an immediate impact, showcasing a strong fielding ability in the outfield and stuffing the stat sheet in the batter's box. He helped





the Sooners make a postseason run in his first season and established himself as a starter in his first collegiate season. “I was fortunate enough to play on a really good team, I played in the College World Series, and I proved to myself, and a lot of people, that I was a good baseball player and I could play against good competition at a high level,” said Spikerman of how his time at Oklahoma helped him get ready for the pros.

“I kind of carried that over to my sophomore year, and it just kept slowly progressing and building some momentum into the draft after my junior year. I think myself and everyone else knew that I was only going to be at school for three years.” Spikerman had been a standout player in high school, but having success in his first year in college was a whole different level of success for him. With his newfound success, there seemed to be nothing in Spikerman’s way as he continued to develop

his game in college and get ready to take the next step.

By Spikerman’s third season in college, it was clear that he was ready to take the next step from college ball to pro ball. He became the Sooners’ everyday centerfielder in 2023 when he was an All-Big 12 Honorable Mention and a member of the All-Big 12 Tournament team. In 2024, he had multiple hits in almost half of his games and proved to be one of the best college outfielders in the country despite missing some games due to injury.

Once the draft rolled around, Spikerman was confident he would hear his name called. “I knew I was going to get drafted, and I was pretty comfortable with that,” said Spikerman of his mindset entering his final season at Oklahoma. “At that point, it was just a matter of where I went in the draft or how high, so I really didn’t worry too much...I knew if I

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just go out there and played, that everything else would take care of itself.” He never had a dream school when he was picking colleges, and it was similar to when he was ready to get drafted. Spikerman spoke with representatives from every single major league team before the draft, solidifying the expectations that his own confidence had set for him.

When draft day finally came, Spikerman was relaxed, and he and his family didn’t make a huge deal of it. Some prospects have big parties, but John and his father got away from the house on the morning that he was drafted. John was unsure which team was going to pick him and was just ready to be a professional baseball player. “They were one of the teams that scouted me a little bit in high school, so we were kind of familiar with the area scouts and stuff, but they didn’t really stand out as far as I thought they were going to pick me,” said Spikerman of his pre-draft talks with the Phillies.

With the uncertainty of his draft future, Spikerman and his dad went out to get breakfast on the second day of the draft. Of course, Spikerman’s mother was still locked into the draft while they were out. “I was about ten minutes away from home and my mom called me and said that she was crying because they had just called my name and she was very upset that I wasn’t home to be there with her.” Fortunately for the Spikerman’s, John and his dad were close to their house, and raced home as soon as they heard the good news. It may not have been the storybook draft moment with the pick and their family gathered around the TV to hear the announcement, but it was still a special moment for John and the Spikerman family.

After draft day it was a quick turnaround for Spikerman, as he joined the Threshers for his

professional debut around two weeks after being taken by the Phillies in the third round of the 2024 MLB Draft. “I think it’s humbling once you get here and see how good the other guys are and you really start to learn what it takes to be a true professional,” Spikerman said of his first experiences at the Carpenter Complex training with the FCL Phillies. “Signing the paper was a relief, but then it’s





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like when you get on campus as a freshman for the first time, it's pretty eye-opening."

He saw the talent in the system around him, and Spikerman quickly realized that he was in the top tier of the Phillies minor leaguers. He was one of the first four members of the Phillies' 2024 Draft Class to make his professional debut, debuting with the Threshers on the first of August. "It was great to start playing right away," said Spikerman of his debut with the Threshers last season. "I think you kind of get a head start on some guys that didn't get the opportunity to play. So, whether you did good or bad, it's all in the past and it was just great to get out there and play." He reached base in almost every one of his first 17 games with the Threshers and was identified as the best defensive outfielder in the Phillies minor league system after the end of the 2024 season by Baseball America.

Through all the obstacles, trials and tribulations, Spikerman's belief in himself never wavered as he continues to pursue his dream of making the major leagues. Talent and work ethic are certainly important characteristics in professional athletes, but self-confidence may be the most important one. And that self-confidence may be the biggest factor in Spikerman's rise through the Phillies' minor league system. In his first year as a pro, Spikerman has proved that he has elite talent and the drive to succeed. However, it is sometimes the mental side of sports that can provide the x-factor. John Spikerman knows that he is capable of being a professional baseball player for just about any team on the planet, and in Clearwater, we get a front row seat to watch it start to happen.



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Player Spotlight: Alirio Ferrebus

Hard Work and Dedication has Alirio Ferrebus Rising Rapidly in the Phillies Organization

Baseball has truly become a global game. Countries in Central and South America have developed a vibrant baseball culture with loud, supportive fans and passionate players who are all bonded by their love for all things baseball. For nearly one hundred years, the best of those passionate players have sought opportunities in the major leagues and waves of talented Latino prospects have lit up the minors en route to major league success. Over the last few seasons, the Philadelphia Phillies have acquired some of their top prospects, including players like Johan Rojas and Eduardo Tait, from abroad. Alirio Ferrebus, signed by the Phillies out of Venezuela in 2023, has designs of being the next top prospect for the Phillies, and bigger plans to achieve his childhood dream of reaching the major leagues.

Alirio Ferrebus was the first baseball player in his family, but he grew up to be a baseball fan thanks to his father. Alirio credits his dad for passing on his rabid baseball fandom, starting his playing career at six years old in a Venezuelan Little League. Ferrebus' imposing size was evident



from a young age, and his stature and strength kept him at catcher or first base from the beginning of his career. He idolized two of the best players at those positions when he was growing up, Venezuelan legends Miguel Cabrera and Salvador Perez. “I love how he always seems ready for any situation and his strong desire to compete,” said Ferrebus of how he tries to emulate Salvador Perez’s game behind the plate. It wasn’t long before those qualities were noticed in Ferrebus himself, as his road to the show began.

Before long, Ferrebus had outgrown Little League, and was recruited to the Delta Players Academy in Venezuela to accelerate his development. Becoming a professional baseball player was Alirio’s goal from the beginning, and the Delta Academy had already signed numerous players to professional contracts. Liking what they saw in Ferrebus from a young age, he was enrolled in Delta at the age of twelve. Within the next three years, Ferrebus would begin trying out for MLB teams. “I had to show my fundamental abilities at the plate, on defense, and on the bases,” said Ferrebus of the skills he needed to show scouts during his showcases and tryouts for big league scouts.

“It really helped me realize just how hard I had to work to get to the point where I am right now.” The Phillies certainly were not the only team that developed an interest in Ferrebus, but they were persistent in their pursuit. Alirio really admired the care that the Phillies take of their players and the importance of winning to the organization. In 2023, at just 17 years old, Alirio Ferrebus signed his first professional contract with the Philadelphia Phillies.



Ferrebus was thrown right into the fire after his signing, inking the deal in January of 2023 and beginning spring training a few months later in the Dominican Summer League. Joining two of the Phillies most highly touted prospects, Ferrebus began his professional career in the DSL the season following the first ever Dominican Summer League Championship for the Phillies Organization.



With the pressure and hope of a repeat coupled with his own expectation, the newly minted Phillies prospect was never fazed by the pressure. "All I wanted to do was to do my job, but I was still proud of myself for getting to this point," said Ferrebus of his feelings when he put on his Phillies jersey for the first time. "At the same time, I knew that this is just the beginning, and I need to keep working hard to achieve my goals." Play on the field is always a big part of that, and Ferrebus wasted no time impressing the Phillies brass in his opening season. Alirio recorded four multi-hit games and reached base in 14 of his first 15 games in the DSL, eventually leading the team to a playoff appearance in the second-straight season.

Ferrebus' DSL tenure was excellent, finishing with a .888 OPS and nine RBIs in 21 games in his first season as a pro. His second season in the DSL began scorching hot, with Ferrebus amassing a 1.196 OPS in the first 14 games of the 2024 DSL season. He recorded 15 hits in that span, with eight of them going for extra-bases. His stat lines are even more impressive

when adding in the fact that Ferrebus was learning to read and speak English while beginning his professional baseball career.

"At first it was really hard because I only knew the basics, and I could barely understand English," said Alirio of the challenges learning English while beginning his professional career. "Thanks to my coaches and my professors I can now communicate with any of my teammates, in English or Spanish." With help from a great group of teammates and professors, Alirio now speaks close to fluent English. He said that the new language has really helped his adjustment and is much less of an issue now that he has been immersed in baseball in the United States for over a year.

Shortly into his second season, it was clear that Ferrebus was ready to move up. In a rare occurrence, Ferrebus was sent to the United States to continue his 2024 season in the Florida Complex League. "It was really great to see my hard work pay off," Ferrebus said of his emotions when he was called up from the Dominican Summer League to the Florida Complex League. "I had worked the whole year to have an opportunity at the Complex. It was inspiring when my coaches told me that my hard work would be worth it and I got to see that so soon into my career." Alirio credits the DSL for getting him more disciplined and better acclimated to the schedule and demands of professional baseball. He finished the 2024 season leading all Phillies Rookie-Level players in batting average, combining for a slash line of .351/.424/.558 with ten extra base hits and 19 RBIs in 24 games across two different levels of rookie ball.

Ferrebus began this year as one of the top prospects in the Phillies system, ranked inside the organizational top 30 at the start of the season and chosen as one of three catchers to



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represent the Phillies in the Spring Breakout game at BayCare Ballpark in March of 2025. There was some speculation that he would begin the season with the Threshers, but he started in the FCL in his third season as a pro. He slugged four home runs with 18 RBIs in 25 games in the FCL, and halfway through the season, it was clear that Ferrebus was one of the best players in the FCL. At the beginning of June, Ferrebus became the third position player to earn a call up from the FCL to the Clearwater Threshers.

Now a relatively well-known prospect in a full-season club, there are higher hopes and expectations for a young talent like Alirio Ferrebus. The discipline he has learned throughout the early goings of his minor league career have clearly helped Ferrebus control his mindset heading into games. "I try not to think about the nerves and the pressure," Ferrebus says of his mindset going into games. "Whenever I get nervous going into a game, I try to focus on having fun and enjoying myself out there on the field." His talent and energy have been on prominent display with the Threshers, with Ferrebus playing a big role in the resurgent second half the Threshers are enjoying as they make a push for their third straight season in the playoffs.

Roughly ten percent of minor league players make it all the way up to the major leagues. The players who exhibit their passion and can handle all the inevitable obstacles and uncertainty that is a part of every baseball season. Despite joining the Threshers midseason, Ferrebus has established himself as a key player for Clearwater. From his strong arm behind the plate to his powerful bat at the dish, he is certain to be a point for success with the Threshers and in the Phillies system for years to come.





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Player Spotlight: Nikau Pouaka-Grego

How Nikau Pouaka-Grego's Baseball Career Has Taken Him Around the World

Baseball has long been recognized as America's National Pastime, but lately the sport has grown a much larger following internationally. The sport spreading into Latin America and Japan has been well-publicized, and its popularity has rapidly grown in Europe and the other side of the world as well. For the past decade and a half, there has been a popular winter league in Australia for top prospects, local Australian baseball stars, and other players looking to get a shot at Major League affiliated ball. The Australian Baseball League has produced major league players like Liam Hendriks, the 2024 top pick Travis Bazzana, and numerous other players who have gone on to have success in the major and minor leagues. Originally hailing from New Zealand, Nikau Pouaka-Grego is looking to be the next star from down under to make the long trip across the ocean to play professional baseball at the highest level in the United States.

Nikau's mother is from Australia and his father from New Zealand, where Nikau was born. While that area of the world is now a budding hotbed for baseball talent, when Pouaka-Grego was growing up, that was not the case. In fact, softball was more popular among boys than baseball was at the time of Nikau's youth. Having taught his son baseball, Nikau's father started a four-team baseball league in New Zealand to help grow the game among him, his friends, and classmates.



Weekly doubleheaders in the grassroots league led to so much more for Nikau Pouaka-Grego. He joined the Australian national baseball circuit when he moved to Melbourne as a teenager, joining the Melbourne Aces at 15 years old. By then he was entrenched with the Australian National Teams but was too young to play in the Australian Baseball League. He trained with Allen De San Miguel in one of his youth clubs, a former minor leaguer who reached Triple-A in multiple major league organizations and is now a coach on the Kansas City Royals staff. Allen was instrumental in bringing Nikau to the Melbourne Aces, starting Pouaka-Grego's professional baseball career as a teenager.

Nikau attributes part of his rapid rise at a young age to his time with the Australian National teams, consistently making national teams while still a teenager and high school student. "I was fortunate enough to play for

Australia in the U16 and U18 nationals, which is kind of a big reason why I'm here with the Phillies," said Pouaka-Grego of his start with some of the Youth National Teams in Australia. "[The Phillies] sent two of their international crosscheckers out to watch me play and they liked what they saw." While his performance at the international level may have sealed the deal, it was no secret that the Phillies were interested in signing Nikau from an early age.

In Little League, Nikau played against the son of a member of the Phillies' scouting staff. Though he was there to watch his own son play, the scout liked what he saw in Nikau's game from the start. "He followed my progress essentially the entire way, from when I was around 13 until the day I signed," said Nikau of his experience being scouted as a youth in Australia and New Zealand. "Even throughout my injury, he was there every step of the way watching how I came back, tracking





my progress because I was already in serious talks with the Phillies before I got hurt.” On Australia’s national team Nikau played against future top prospects Manuel Beltre, currently in the Toronto Blue Jays organization, as well as future teammates of Nikau’s in the Phillies Organization, including 2022 Threshers Hao-Yu Lee and Andrew Painter.

Showcases and tryouts still reigned supreme in terms of international baseball recruiting, and the Pouaka-Gregos were all over that while Nikau was growing up. Nikau grew up playing with Clayton Campbell, an infielder in the Detroit Tigers organization who would often accompany Nikau on recruiting trips when they were looking to get signed to a major league team. Pouaka-Grego was preparing for a showcase with Campbell shortly before the Phillies extended him an offer. “My dad let the Phillies know about my upcoming showcase in Miami in case they wanted to send a scout out there,” Nikau said of his final days before the Phillies signed him. “Next time the scout talked to my dad, the Phillies had an offer on the

table because they didn’t want me to be seen by anyone else...We were at the cages hitting and my dad called me, and he told me the Phillies had offered me a deal, and I couldn’t believe it.” Two weeks after Nikau signed his first contract with the Phillies in 2022, Clayton signed for the Detroit Tigers, and the two friends have already faced off on numerous occasions in the Florida State League over the past three seasons.

One complication of the deal was the Australian professional ranks, where Nikau had a partial agreement with the Melbourne Aces. However, the Phillies had an agreement with the Adelaide Giants of the ABL to send some of their minor league players there. Phillies prospects like Rixon Wingrove (a Thresher in 2021 and 2022) and current Double-A pitcher Mitch Neunborn were signed by the Phillies from Adelaide, and Chris Adamson is on the coaching staff for both the Adelaide Giants (Manager) and as the bench coach for the Lehigh Valley IronPigs, the Triple-A affiliate of the Phillies.

Nikau was primed to play in his hometown of Melbourne for the Aces in 2022 for his mentor Allen De San Miguel, who was the Aces manager that season. With some help from Chris Adamson, Nikau came up with a simple reason to join Adelaide instead in his first professional season in 2022: “Why wouldn’t I want to play with my teammates here while I’m in Australia?” Said Nikau of his decision to move to Adelaide after training with the Aces. That season, Nikau made his professional debut in the Florida Complex League, starting with a .890 OPS, three homers and 16 RBIs in 35 games. He then went back home to Australia for his first ABL season, set to start with the Adelaide Giants instead of the Aces. Despite flipping his commitment to Adelaide, Pouaka-Grego ended up playing just four games due to

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injury for the Giants in the 2022-23 season. His decision made him a champion, as the Giants won their first ABL Championship in 43 years. Despite missing the 2023 minor league due to injury, Pouaka-Grego joined 2023 Threshers Braeden Fausnaught and Cade Fergus on the 2023-24 ABL Champion Adelaide Giants as well.

Though he is still in the early stages of his professional career, Nikau is set to become part of the next wave of Australian baseball. With the ABL in full swing and a multitude of Australian prospects joining the professional and NCAA ranks, the sport of baseball has never been more popular in the land down under. Pouaka-Grego has a goal of suiting up for Team Australia in the 2026 World Baseball Classic, three years after the 2023 Australian team finished second to eventual winners Japan in the group stage of the WBC and made the knockout round for the first time in their nation's history.

"Especially because we come from somewhere where baseball isn't as big of a sport and we come over here and turn heads and show people what's up on the other side of the planet," Nikau commented on the emergence of Australian baseball. "I'm lucky to have already played Clayton twice this year [in the minor leagues]. I'm sure in a couple of years there's going to be some more Aussies floating around, hopefully in higher leagues." Pouaka-Grego trained with 2024 top draft pick and fellow countryman Travis Bazzana and is one of a small handful of Australian players currently signed to a major league organization.

There is still some growing to do for Pouaka-Grego as he continues his professional career. Going from typically the best player on whatever team he played for growing up in



Australia to another talented baseball player on a team of minor leaguers looking to get their shot is not easy. Furthermore, Pouaka-Grego alternates at second and third base, giving him even more roles for which to train on a daily basis. "I just know I have to go out there and do what I know I can do because, at the end of the day, the numbers will speak for themselves. I just know what I'm capable of and what I can do, that's all I can control and all I try to do when I'm out there." The confidence and the skills are there, and Nikau puts in hard work every day he comes to BayCare Ballpark, but a long journey that began across the planet still has a long way to go before he can complete his rise from the Complex League to the Australian League to the majors.

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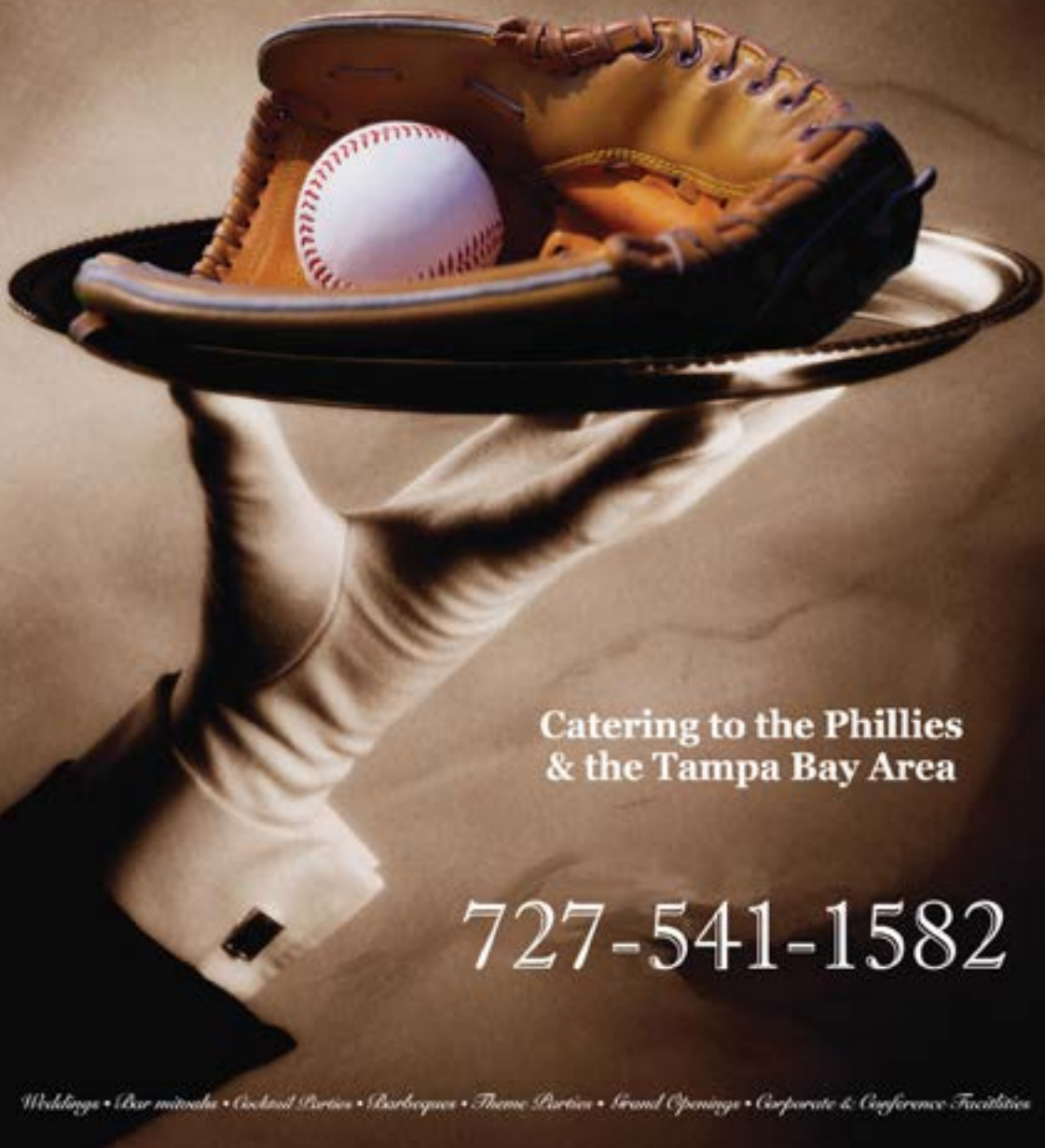
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
