#24 Jose Tena #26 Bryan Lavastida YESTERDAY: The Captains scored seven runs in the first three innings and hung on late to beat the Fort Wayne TinCaps, 7-6. Will Brennan began the game by drilling the first pitch over the right field wall for a solo homer. José Tena doubled and later scored on a sacrifice fly by Joe Naranjo. In the second, TinCaps starter Edwuin Bencomo walked the first three hitters. Brennan knocked in two with a single, Tena drove home another with a sacrifice fly and George Valera singled home Brennan to give the Captains a 6-0 lead. Raynel Delgado then led off the third with a double off of lefty reliever Erik Sabrowski and scored on a sacrifice fly by Victor Nova. Fort Wayne chipped away with a run in the fourth on a Seamus Curran single, a two-run homer in the sixth by Justin Lopez and a wild pitch that plated Jawuan Harris in the seventh to pull the TinCaps within three runs. In the ninth, Jonny Homza reached on a one-out error by Nova at third and Chris Givin followed with a single. Agustin Ruiz then singled in Homza to cut the Captains' lead to 7-5. The Captains intentionally walked Tirso Ornelas to load the bases and Lopez pulled the TinCaps within one run on a sacrifice fly. Jerson Ramirez then struck out Curran to end the game and strand the tying and winning runs aboard.

SEASON SERIES: The Captains are 10-4 in the season series against Fort Wayne and have outscored the TinCaps, 80-52 (+28 run differential). Four different Captains have an OPS of 1.000 or greater against Fort Wayne — Mike Amditis (1.397 – 5 games), Will Brennan (1.131 – 12 games), Brayan Rocchio (1.021 – 11 games) and Quentin Holmes (1.000 – 6 games). In addition, five Captains have hit .300 or better against Fort Wayne — Amditis (.500), Brennan (.404), Holmes (.391), José Tena (.319) and George Valera (.300).

BRENNAN BASHING: Captains OF Will Brennan has crushed Fort Wayne pitching. In this series, Brennan is 6-for-8 with a home run, a double, two walks, two RBI, five runs scored and three stolen bases. During the season series, Brennan is hitting .404/.472/.660 (1.131 OPS). Seven of Brennan's 18 doubles and seven of his 10 steals have come against Fort Wayne. Brennan enters today at second in the High-A Central League (HAC) in doubles, second in hits (56), tied for fifth in extra-base hits (22), sixth in batting average (.303), tied for ninth in total bases (85) and 10th in on-base percentage (.377).

THAT WAS WEIRD: In game one of Saturday's doubleheader against South Bend, the Captains won on a walk-off error when Cubs reliever Samuel Reyes dropped the throw back from catcher Harrison Wenson and Bryan Lavastida raced home to score in the bottom of the eighth inning. The Cubs entered that inning pitching a combined perfect game with six perfect frames by starter Ryan Jensen and one by Reyes. Lavastida broke up the perfect game with a leadoff double.

HOME COOKIN' TASTES BETTER: The Captains are 18-6 at home, compared to 13-19 on the road. Captains pitchers have experienced the biggest home/road disparity. Lake County has a 3.01 ERA at Classic Park and a 4.97 ERA on the road.

HOT LAVA: Bryan Lavastida is riding a 10-game hitting streak, during which the Captains' catcher has three three-hit games. Over that stretch, Lavastida has hit .486 (18-for-37) with three homers and three doubles.

WELCOME BACK: In 18 games since returning from an oblique injury, George Valera has slashed .283/.403/.433 (.836 OPS) with two home runs, a double and a triple.

HOT, THEN COLD: Brayan Rocchio wrapped up June with hits in nine of 11 games and hit .326/.408/.581 during that span. At the start of July, however, Rocchio has gone 4-for-21 (.190/.292/.333) with eight strikeouts and one walk, but the switch-hitter went deep Tuesday night in a 2-for-5 performance. It was Rocchio's first long ball since June 20. Similarly, Quentin Holmes returned from a groin injury on June 1 and hit .386/.429/.523 (.951 OPS) in June. In July, however, Holmes is 2-for-18 (.111) with seven strikeouts and no walks.

ALUMNI UPDATE: 2017 Captains RHP Justin Garza became the 102nd former Captain to reach the major leagues when he debuted for Cleveland on June 27. A record 10 former Captains have made their major league debuts this year — OF Ka'ai Tom (2016), RHP Luis Oviedo (2018-19), LHP Sam Hentges (2016), RHP Louis Head (2012-13), RHP Nick Sandlin (2018), INF Ivan Castillo (2014), Jean Carlos Mejia (2018), RHP Eli Morgan (2018), INF Ernie Clement (2018) and Garza. That breaks the record for the most former Captains to debut in a single year, besting the nine alumni that debuted in 2013 and 2016.

DEFENSIVE FLEXIBILITY: The Captains' have shuffled their defenders in 2021. Lake County has used four different first baseman, six different second baseman, six different third basemen and two different shortstops. Raynel Delgado, Brayan Rocchio and José Tena have each played three different infield positions. Victor Nova and Daniel Schneemann have played two different infield positions and left field.

LAST TIME OUT: Coulter turned in his best performance of the season with five shutout innings in a spot start against South Bend last Saturday at Classic Park. The right-hander pitched game two of a doubleheader and limited the Cubs to three hits. Coulter struck out three, walked none and picked up the win in a 5-0 Captains victory.

2019: Across 18 appearances Coulter compiled 36.1 innings out of the bullpen in the Arizona league and finished the season with a 2.23 ERA. After allowing at least one earned run in his first four appearances Coulter found his rhythm in July, only giving up one earned run eight appearances and 14.1 innings in the month. He began to stretch his arm out in August finishing the season with three straight appearances in which he threw three or more innings.

BEAR DOWN: Coulter had an up and down career at Mercer where he finished with a career 4.74 ERA. He bounced back and forth between a starting role and the bullpen where he accumulated five saves across his four-year career, including three as a senior in the first three games of the Bears season. His best season came as a senior. After starting the year in the bullpen he was moved to the rotation where he made 11 consecutive starts before bouncing back to the 'pen to finish the season. He completed the 2019 season with a career best 3.90 ERA.

THREE SPORT STAR: While at Buford High School Coulter starred as a basketball player and runner on the cross country team as well as the diamond. In 2015 he led the Wolves to a state championship his senior season.
