### RHP NOAH DAVIS (0-2, 6.35) vs. RHP KEVIN GOWDY (2-2, 3.68)

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Isotopes claimed game one last night with an 8-5 victory, the club's third-straight triumph, a season-high ... Noah Davis is set to toe the rubber for Albuquerque while Kevin Gowdy is scheduled to start for Oklahoma City.

**THREE-STRAIGHT DUBS:** The club hadn't won three-straight since winning the final three games of the 2023 season against Oklahoma City. Had been 0-6 vying for a third-straight win in 2024. Albuquerque last won four-plus games in-a-row from Aug. 19-26, 2023, a seven-game win streak.

**FREELAND:** Kyle Freeland, made his second rehab start with the Isotopes last night, tossed 4.0 frames and allowed two runs on two hits and four walks with four punchouts. It's the 13th Isotope start with four-plus walks in a contest.

**BOOCHIE:** In his first rehab game with Albuquerque yesterday, Sean Bouchard went 1-for-3 with two walks. His single had an exit velocity of 95.3 MPH.

**MULTI-HOMER GAME:** Grant Lavigne launched two homers last night, the Isotopes' sixth two homer game in 2024 and third in June (also: Michael Toglia, June 1 vs. Oklahoma City and Willie MacIver, June 12 vs. El Paso) ... There have been three at home and on the road.

**DINGERS:** Albuquerque connected on four homers last night, the seventh time belting at least four in a game this season and third time on the road (other: May 8 at El Paso, four, and May 9 at El Paso, six).

**LOTS OF DINGERS:** The Isotopes have hit multiple homers in three-straight contests for the second time in 2024 (other: April 23-25 vs. Oklahoma City).

**ATTENDANCE:** Over 39 home openings, the Isotopes have tallied the second-highest total attendance in all of Minor League Baseball and most in the Pacific Coast League (256,334). Highest: Dayton, 265, 131.

**MARGINS:** All five of Albuquerque's wins over Oklahoma City in 2024 have been decided by three runs or fewer.

**ISOTOPES ALL-TIME RBI LEADERS:** Jason Wood, 328 (2003-06, 2008); Jordan Patterson, 229 (2016-18); Sam Hilliard, 214 (2019, 2021-24) Coco Montes, 213 (2022-24); Mike Tauchman, 211 (2016-18).

**SERIES OPENERS:** The Isotopes improved to 2-13 in series openers and 2-4 on the road (other: May 21 at Salt Lake, 9-6).

**SAM I AM:** Sam Hilliard tallied two hits, a homer, and four RBI last night, his 26th multi-hit contest of the year and fourth in his last six games ... The four RBI is a season-high and the most in a game since May 14, 2022, with Colorado vs. Kansas City ... Has a seven-game hit streak, slashing .387/.441/.839 with a double, two triples, three homers and nine RBI.

**FAN FAVORITE:** Coco Montes recorded his second four-hit game in his last three contests last night, third on the year ... His team-leading 28th multi-hit game of year and third in his last four.

**GRANNY:** Grant Lavigne's two-homer game last night is second of his career (also: July 5, 2023, with Double-A Hartford). Tallied 13th multi-hit contest of the year and second three-hit game. Has back-to-back multi-RBI games for first time in 2024.

**TAKE FLIGHT:** Jimmy Herron belted fifth homer of year and second in his last three games last night. Has an RBI in three-straight contests for the first time in 2024. Over last three games, is 5-for-12 with two homers and four RBI.

**REAL SLIM SCHUNKY:** Aaron Schunk's 23 doubles are 3rd-most in all of MiLB.

**COOLIN' OFF:** From April 21-May 18, Romo slashed .450/.459/.725 with eight doubles, four homers, 20 RBI ... Since, over 19 games, hitting .179 (13x75).

**JC:** Julio Carreras has a five-game hit streak, slashing .500/.526/.667 with three doubles and one RBI ... His 19 steals in 2024 is tied for a career-high (also: 2022).

**BIG WILLIE STYLE:** Willie MacIver went 2-for-4 Sunday, his 11th multi-hit contest of year and second in three games. Has four-game hit and RBI streak (6-for-14 with triple, two homers, six RBI) ... Last four-game RBI streak: July 16-26, 2022.

**STOVIE:** Hunter Stovall hit fourth homer Sunday ... Has two homers in last four games, three in last nine ... Has four-game hit streak (.400/.444/.867 with two doubles, two homers, five RBI).

**PCL LEADERBOARD:** Drew Romo is 5th in average (.306) ... Aaron Schunk is 2nd in doubles (23) and T-5th in XBH (32) ... Coco Montes is 1st in average (.340), T-1st in hits (85), T-2nd in triples (6), 4th in OPS (.976), 5th in OBP (.416) and total bases (140), 6th in slugging (.560), T-8th in XBH (31), T-9th in RBI (47) and T-10th in walks (35). ... ## NUCLEI NOTES

**SKIPPER:** Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

**HOMETOWN KID:** Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

**CHRIS MICHALAK:** Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

**MICHAEL RYAN:** Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

**SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT:** For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

**BALLS AND STRIKES:** The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- Underwent "Tommy John" surgery just three appearances into his 2018 season at UC Santa Barbara
- Served as UCSB's No. 2 starter behind Shane Bieber when healthy in 2016 ... Made three starts in the 2016 postseason, going 2-0 with a 4.15 ERA ... Team was 3-0 in his postseason starts ... Was on the hill for UCSB's win against Miami in the College World Series on Jun. 20, allowing one run and two hits over six full innings
- Pitched for the 2017 Cotuit Kettlers of the Cape Cod League

### LAST TIME OUT

- ◆ Made piggyback start (behind Kyle Freeland) for Isotopes, his seventh appearance, June 13 vs. El Paso and did not factor into the decision ... Threw 3.0 innings and allowed four runs, three earned, on three hits, two hit by pitches and three walks with two punchouts ... Induced five groundouts and one flyout over 18 batters faced with five swings and misses ... Entered in the sixth inning ... Hit back-to-back batters who came around to score on two-run double by Nate Mondou ... Allowed two runs in seventh on RBI groundout and fielding error ... Escaped bases loaded two-out jam in eighth

### AGAINST OKLAHOMA CITY

- ◆ Has faced Oklahoma City four times in his career: Twice in 2023 and twice this year, three of four in Oklahoma City ... Recorded 8.87 ERA (14.2 IP, 14 ER) ... Allowed four runs in three of four starts ... In first start this year, allowed six runs, four earned over 5.0 frames; Relented two runs in the first, second and fifth ... In second start this year, allowed four runs over 2.2 innings

- ◆ Spent 33 days on the Injured List (April 22-June 1)
- ◆ Made second-straight Opening Night Start for the Isotopes March 29 vs. OKC, becoming the third hurler in Isotopes history to complete the feat (also: Stephen Fife, 2013 vs. Iowa and 2014 at Tacoma; Jeff Hoffman 2017 and 2019 vs. Salt Lake)
- ◆ Davis' nine strikeouts April 14 are the most for an Albuquerque starter since Connor Seabold on Sept. 2, 2023 at Sacramento (nine)
- ◆ Tossed Isotopes first quality start April 14 (and longest outing) since Tanner Gordon blanked Oklahoma City over 7.0 frames on Sept. 22, 2023.

### 2023

- ◆ Worked in eight games (six starts) for Colorado, went 0-4 with an 8.70 ERA (30.0 IP, 29 ER)
- ◆ Made his first Major League start April 16 at Seattle, twirled five scoreless frames of three-hit ball; first Rockie to toss five innings without permitting a run in his initial MLB start since Antonio Senzatel (April 6, 2017 at Milwaukee)
- ◆ Pitched in relief twice for the Rockies, allowed nine runs on June 24 vs. Los Angeles - AL (part of a 25-1 loss), then two scoreless frames Sept. 17 vs. San Francisco
- ◆ Missed time while on Colorado's Injured List April 30-June 1 (right elbow inflammation)
- ◆ Started 14 games for Triple-A Albuquerque, finished 1-4 with a 4.50 ERA (60.0 IP, 30 ER)
- ◆ Became the 18th Opening Day starter in Isotopes history on March 31 at Round Rock
