## NEWS AND NOTES

**LORE-A:** Brewers no. 5-rated prospect Luis Lara finished Wednesday night 1-for-2, 2 BB and adding his 33rd RBI of the season for the Sounds. His first inning single was his seventh straight at-bat with a hit. His 33 RBI ranks fifth on Nashville's current active roster, while he leads in hits (83) and runs (59) among full season Brewers minor league hitters. He is hitting a .328 (83-for-253) with 18 XBH. **Lara currently leads the International League in AVG and OBP (.439) and ranks second in walks (48) and runs (59). He's tied for third in hits and T-10th in stolen bases (20).**

**LUKE RBI-WALKER:** Luke Adams recorded his sixth multi-RBI game despite finishing the night 0-for-3. He scored Lara on a fielder's choice in the first and drew a bases-loaded walk in the eighth as part of a multi-walk night. The Brewers no. 11-rated prospect has eight RBI over his last four games and he carries a .427 OBP in the month of June after drawing 11 walks and six hit by pitches in 17 games played. Adams has posted a .237 AVG (23-for-97), 12 XBH and has added 22 RBI in 29 games for the Sounds this season.

**GWINNETT SWIPERS:** The Gwinnett Stripers stole eight bags on Wednesday night against Jefferson Quero. It marked the fourth time he has allowed 7+ stolen bases in his six-year career. The Stripers stole 10 bags against Quero back on April 7, which marks the most stolen bases he has allowed in his career behind

the plate and the most allowed by the Sounds dating back to at least 2005. The 90 stolen bases Quero has allowed this season are the most in Triple-A level and the second highest allowed among full season minor league catchers behind Hudson Valley's Eric Genter (101).

**NOT SO HIT CITY:** The Sounds collected just four hits in Wednesday night's loss to the Stripers, going 1-for-5 with runners in scoring position. The four hits marked the 20th time Nashville recorded five or fewer hits in a game this season and the 10th at First Horizon Park. It marked the seventh time the team posted five hits or less during the month of June. Nashville recorded five or fewer hits in 36 games last season, with 21 of them being at First Horizon Park. **Brewers no. 3-rated prospect Jett Williams produced half of Nashville's hits on Wednesday night, going 2-for-5 with a double and two runs scored. It marked his 17th multi-hit game of the season.**

**SLAMMIN SOUNDS:** Brock Wilken and Tyler Black combined for a franchise first on Tuesday night. The duo became the first pair of Sounds teammates to hit grand slams in the same game; Nashville entered the night with 135 grand slams in team history. Wilken's grand slam in the bottom of the sixth inning was his fourth career slam and first that wasn't against the Montgomery Biscuits. He recorded a grand slam

against Montgomery in three straight seasons while with Double-A Biloxi from 2023-2025. For Black, it was the second career grand slam and first since June 2, 2024, on the road in Memphis. **Black is the 22nd Nashville player to record multiple grand slams during their Sounds Tenure**, joining Eddys Leonard and Akil Baddoo who each have hit two grand slams for Nashville this season already. **The seven grand slams hit by the Sounds this season are already the most in any single season in team history**, surpassing the six slams the Sounds hit in the 1998 and 2016 seasons.

**FIRST HALF RECAP:** The Sounds ended the first half 43-32 and in third place in the IL behind Memphis (47-28) and Rochester (45-28). Since moving to the split season format in 2023, the Sounds remain one of just two teams in Triple-A to post a winning record in all seven halves along with Oklahoma City. The Brewers farm system posted the fourth-most wins (187) of any organization through June 21. The Sounds ended with the fourth-best ERA in Triple-A (4.23) and the fewest runs allowed (328). The 54 home runs allowed by Nashville pitchers were the second fewest in Triple-A behind Sacramento (48). Offensively, Nashville had the third fewest strikeouts (584) at the plate in Triple-A behind Sacramento (494) and Las Vegas (562). The Sounds ranked sixth in triples (20), stolen bases (118), and walks (371), and led all Triple-A in hit by pitches (58).
