## FISHER CATS WALK OFF PATRIOTS WITH BASES-LOADED BASE ON BALLS:

A career-high five RBIs from Gabriel Moreno, including a walk-off walk in the bottom of the ninth inning, led the Fisher Cats to a 6-5 win over the Somerset Patriots in the home opener at Delta Dental Stadium last night. Moreno followed a Jordan Groshans single with his first homer of the season to give New Hampshire a 2-0 lead in the third inning. He singled home two runs to extend the lead to 5-1 in the fifth. Moreno then finished his night by drawing a walk on four pitches in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

## WOODS RICHARDSON IMPRESSIVE

20-year old RHP Simeon Woods Richardson allowed only one hit and one run in his five inning start last night – a solo homer by Thomas Milone in the fifth inning. Woods Richardson matched his career-best with eight strikeouts. He left the game with a 5-1 lead.

**WELCOME SOMERSET:** The Patriots join the Double-A Northeast League as a Yankees affiliate, with the team moving from Trenton. The team is located in Bridgewater Township, N.J.---in Somerset County. The team played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball from 1998 to 2019, with home games at TD Bank Ballpark since 1999. The Patriots won six Atlantic League titles.

**SENDING THEM HOME HAPPY:** The 98<sup>th</sup> walk-off win in franchise history last night was only the third to end with a walk. The other two both occurred in 2015, when both Kevin Nolan and Matt Newman drew walks to end games. In 2019, Santiago Espinal stole home to end a game, and in 2011 a game ended with a balk. There have been 26 walk-off home runs in Fisher Cats history.

**ROSTER MOVES:** There have been roster moves involving relief pitchers. RHP Cre Finrock was placed on the IL Sunday, retroactive to 5/8. RHP James Dykstra transferred Monday to Triple-A Buffalo, and RHP Andrew McInvale added from Adv. A Vancouver.

**BOB LIPMAN'S THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS HISTORY:** May 12, 2013 – In Trenton, the Fisher Cats earned a split of a four-game series with the Thunder with a 4-0 win. LHP Sean Nolin (1-0) won his second Double-A start by working six scoreless frames with eight strikeouts. A three-run homer by Jack Murphy and a solo blast by Ryan Schimpf accounted for the runs.

**FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS:** The Blue Jays opened a series in Atlanta, rallying for a 5-3 win. Vladimir Guerrero Jr. homered. His three RBIs on the game give him 26 RBI. Jordan Romano allowed a hit and a walk in the ninth, but finished up for his first save of 2021. – Buffalo lost to Rochester 6-3 (10 innings). Nash Knight hit a three-run homer, his first at the Triple-A level. – Vancouver also lost in 10 innings, falling 4-3 to Spokane, and it was Bradenton over Class A Dunedin 11-4.

**ON THE HILL:** RHP Elvis Luciano is scheduled for the Fisher Cats tonight. Started in the second game of last Thursday's doubleheader, and allowed three runs in four innings at Portland. The 21-year old Luciano, a Rule 5 selection by the Blue Jays from Kansas City, spent all of 2019 with Toronto.

For the first time this season, the Fisher Cats will face a left-handed starter in Matt Krook. The 26-year old was selected by the Giants in the fourth round of the 2016 draft (Oregon). Was traded to the Rays as part of the Evan Longoria deal 12/20/17, then claimed by the Yankees in the Minor League Rule 5 draft last December. Krook started last Thursday against Harrisburg, allowing a pair of runs in 2.2 IP. This is his first start against New Hampshire.

**2017:** In Arizona's system, pitched for Arizona League Diamondbacks and Pioneer League Missoula.

**Career/Personal Notes:** On the opening day roster for the Fisher Cats for the first time. Although he has pitched in the Majors, has not pitched higher than Rookie League level prior to this season.

**Obtained:** Signed by Arizona as a non-drafted free agent in 2017. Traded to Kansas City, and picked up by Toronto in the Rule 5 draft 12/12/18. On Toronto's 40-man roster.
