YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels picked up two wins against the Curve. In the completion of Thursday's rain-suspended game, the Flying Squirrels beat the Curve, 2-1. On Thursday night, Adrian Sugastey brought in a run on a fielder's choice force out and Sabin Ceballos singled in a run to open a 2-0 lead. Altoona cut the score to 2-1 in the bottom of the first with a sacrifice fly by Nick Cimillo. After a three-hour rain delay, play was suspended on Thursday. When the game resumed on Friday, Nick Sinacola threw four scoreless innings and Evan Gates closed out his third save with a scoreless seventh, striking out two. In Friday's regularly scheduled game, the Flying Squirrels beat the Curve, 7-4. Jairo Pomares drove a three-run double in the top of the first inning. Imanol Vargas brought in a run with a sacrifice fly in the bottom of the first to cut the score to 3-1. In the top of the fourth, Onil Perez hit a double run double and scored on a single by Carter Howell. Perez added an RBI single in the fifth for a 7-1 lead. The Curve scored three runs in the fifth to close the score to 7-4. Michael Stryffeler and Tyler Myrick each threw 1.1 scoreless innings to end the game.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the fourth of a five-game series against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. The series marks the first meetings between these two teams this year. The Curve come to Richmond for a six-game series from August 12-17. The Flying Squirrels return to Altoona from September 2-7. The series has been shortened to five games with Thursday's scheduled game being canceled. It will not be made up.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,747 fans per home game, which ranks fourth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won back-to-back games on Friday, including the completion of Thursday's rain-suspended game, for their first consecutive wins since winning three straight games against the Patriots from May 1-3. Richmond went 1-4-1 in last week's series against Binghamton. Of Richmond's 45 losses this season, 24 of them have been by two runs or less (16 by one, eight by two). The Richmond offense is 11th in the Eastern League in runs scored (215). Richmond's pitching staff has a losses with 478 FD.

THE CURVE had won four-of-five prior to dropping both games on Friday night. They split last week's six-game series against the SeaWolves. Altoona's roster features five of Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects, including 2B Termarr Johnson (No. 5), OF/INF Mitch Jebb (No. 12), SS Jack Brannigan (No. 14 - on IL), RHP Wilber Dotel (No. 16) and RHP Alessandro Ercolani (No. 26), MLB. com's top-30 Pirates prospects lists features three Altoona players, including Johnson (No. 4), Brannigan (No. 11 - on IL) and Jebb (No. 13).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Joe Whitman makes his 13th start of the season and his first against Altoona. He last pitched last Saturday against the Rumble Ponies at The Diamond and surrendered six runs over 2.1 innings in a loss. After going 2-1 with a 1.55 ERA (5 ER/29.0 IP) in five May starts, Whitman has gone 0-2 with a 15.83 ERA (17 ER/9.2 IP) in his three starts in June. On May 3, Whitman threw six perfect innings against the Patriots at The Diamond, retiring all 18 batters he faced, and set a career high with 10 strikeouts. He was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on May 5. In his first full professional season last year, Whitman split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 3-8 with a 4.63 ERA in 23 starts. He finished the year ranked ninth in the Giants organization in strikeouts (108) and tied for ninth in games started. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 10 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. For more on Whitman, see page two.

FOR ALTOONA: Left-hander Blake Townsend makes his third start of the season and his fifth Double-A appearance this year. He last pitched on Sunday against the SeaWolves and threw four scoreless innings, allowing one hit with five strikeouts. He began the year with High-A Greensboro and posted went 2-0 with a 1.14 ERA in 11 relief outings. Townsend originally signed with the Seattle Mariners in 2018. He was released last August and signed with the Pirates two weeks later. He pitched five games with the Curve to finish the year, including two scoreless, two-inning outings against the Flying Squirrels on Sept. 12 and Sept. 15 at PNG Field.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 37 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 25 runners caught stealing. Morgan, now with Triple-A Sacramento, is tied for fifth in the Eastern League with 12.

BERI'S BACK: Outfielder/first baseman **Victor Bericoto** returned to the Richmond roster on June 3. He was placed on the injured list with Triple-A Sacramento on May 9 and played six games with the ACL Giants on a rehab assignment before returning to the Flying Squirrels. Bericoto opened the season with Richmond and hits .319 with three homers, four doubles and eight RBIs in 13 games before being promoted to the River Cats on April 20. In his Richmond career dating back to 2023, Bericoto has homered 26 times, which is the eighth-most in franchise history, one behind a four-way tie for fourth place (**Devin Harris, Sean Roby, Shane Matheny** and **Will Wilson**).

TAKING THE JAIRO: Jairo Pomares has picked up at least one hit in 12-of-his-last-15 games dating back to May 29, batting .345 (19-for-55) with two homers, three doubles, 10 RBIs and four walks, raising his season batting average from .185 to .226. That stretch includes five multi-hit games. He hit a solo homer on June 11 at Erie, his first since May 2, snapping a 25-game homerless streak. He went deep again June 8. Pomares leads the team with 25 RBIs this season.

YO ADRIAN: Adrian Sugastey has picked up nine RBIs over his last eight games dating back to June 8. In the series finale at Erie on June 8, he went 3-for-5 with a homer, two doubles and a career-best five RBIs. Last Tuesday, he drove in the Flying Squirrels' only run with a single. In last Wednesday's win, he belted his sixth homer of the year, a solo shot in the fourth, to set a new single-season career high. On Thursday, Sugastey drove in Richmond's first run in a 2-1 win at Altoona.

NIGHT AT THE ROXBY: Reliever **Braxton Roxby** closed his second save of the season in June 11, recording two outs in the eighth to strand two inherited baserunners before a 1-2-3 ninth. He followed with two scoreless relief innings in the ninth and 10th on Sunday afternoon before play was stopped and tossed a scoreless eighth in Altoona on Wednesday. Dating back to April 29, Roxby has pitched 13 consecutive games without allowing an earned run, spanning 18 innings with 23 strikeouts and four walks. The only two runs he has surrendered in that stretch were a pair of unearned runs in the 10th inning on May 27

SAVING THE DAY: Tyler Myrick worked 1.1 scoreless innings on Friday night to close his fourth save of the season. It was the 16th save of his Flying Squirrels career, tying him with **Patrick Ruotolo** for eighth on the franchise's all-time saves list. His next save will tie **Heath Hembree** for seventh.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is fifth in hits (65) and 10th in OBP (.375). Jack Choate is sixth in strikeouts (66). John Michael Bertrand is tied for fourth in innings pitched (66.0). Seth Lonsway is sixth in innings pitched (65.1)

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 223 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Joe Whitman (No. 5), Diego Velasquez (No. 10), Sabin Ceballos (No. 21) and Jack Choate (No. 26). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. Adrian Sugastey is ranked as the top defensive catcher. Aeverson Arteaga is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1956: The Richmond Virginians beat the Rochester Red Wings, 5-4, at Parker Field. With one out in the ninth inning, Bill Renna tied the score, 4-4, with a solo homer. With two outs, Dee Phillips hit a single to bring home Tom Hamilton and win the game. Renna had three RBIs and Phillips had three hits in the game. Rochester took a 4-2 lead in the fourth with two-run homers by Dick Rand and Eddle Kasko. The win came on Richmond manager Eddie Lopats 38th birthday. 1977: The Richmond Braves beat the Columbus Clippers, 2-1, at Parker Field. Eddie Soloman struck out 10 and allowed five hits in a complete game. Richmond scored both of its runs in the first inning. With two outs, Dale Murphy hit a triple to right field to score Bob Beall. Jeff Greach drove in Murphy with a single. 1979: The Richmond Braves beat the Columbus Clippers, 7-6, at Parker Field. Trailing 6-1 in the seventh, Richmond rallied to score six times and take the lead. After the first six batters of the inning reached, Chico Ruiz brought in the tying run with a squeeze bunt and Terry Harper plated the go-ahead run with a sacrifice fly. 1996: Team USA beat Japan in an exhibition at The Diamond, 5-1, in a pre-Olympics tour. It was part of a 32-game, 16-city tour. University of Virginia pitcher Seth Greisinger, a McLean native and the sixth-overall pick by the Tigers in that year's MLB Draft, started for Team USA and allowed two hits over 6.1 innings. Troy Glaus, who was a rising junior at UCLA, hit a homer and had two run-scoring doubles. In the 1996 Olympics in Atlanta, Japan beat eventual bronze-medal winners Team USA to advance to the gold medal game before losing to Cuba. 2015: The Flying Squirrels swept a doubleheader against the New Brit-ain Rock Cats. In Game 1, Engel Bel-tre, Mac Williamson and Angel Vil-lalona each drove in a pair of runs in a 9-1 win. In Game 2, Pedro Rodriguez pitched five the New Britmain Rock Cats. In Game 1, Engel Bel-tre, Mac Williamson and Angel Vill-Ialona each drove in a pair of runs in a 9-1 win. In Game 2, Pedro Rodriguez pitched five scoreless, two-hit innings and Josh Osich closed his 19th save of the season, second-most in team his-tory, in a 3-1 win. Williamson opened the scoring with an RBI double in the first. Ricky Oropesa had a pair of RBI singles.
