TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes hold a 1-0 series lead after a 12-2 win last night ... Albuquerque has won four of its last six contests ... Chase Dollander is expected to make his third start for Albuquerque while Trevor McDonald is slated to take the hill for the River Cats.

MARGIN: The 10-run margin of victory yesterday was the seventh time this season the club has won by double-digits (last: 13 on July 2 vs. El Paso).

-It's also the third time the Isotopes have won a game by double-digits against the River Cats in team history (others: May 25, 2018, 12-2, and April 28, 2022, 13-2).

VS. SACRAMENTO: Albuquerque has won 10 of its last 14 games against the River Cats in the Duke City.

RUNS: The Isotopes plated 12 runs last night, the most tallies in a game since scoring 18 on July 2 vs. El Paso (last time the club plated double-digit runs).

HOMERS: Albuquerque belted three homers in the third inning Tuesday, third time in 2025 with three-plus dingers in one frame (others: April 5 vs. Salt Lake, three, and May 25 at Reno, four).

-For the game, the Isotopes swatted five homers, the second-most in a contest this season (most: seven, May 25 at Reno).

TOPES STARTER: Anthony Molina tossed 5.1 shutout frames last night and allowed just four hits and one walk while fanning four. He's the second Isotopes starter in 2025 to tally 5.0-plus shutout innings (other: Jack O'Loughlin, April 2 vs. Salt Lake).

RUNS ALLOWED: The Isotopes limited the River Cats to two runs Tuesday, the 16th time in 2025 holding their opponent to two runs in a game and fifth in July (last: July 24 at Salt Lake).

SWIPES: Since July 1 (21 games, Braiden Ward's promotion to Albuquerque), the Isotopes have stolen 29 bags, tied for the ninth-most in Triple-A and tied for the fourth-most in the PCL after swiping just 56 in their first 80 games.

STERLIN: Sterlin Thompson went 0-for-5 last night, ending his nine-game hit streak. During stretch he slashed .342/.405/.5474 with two doubles, one homer and four RBI ... T-1st in triples (7) in the PCL.

-Over his last 54 games, is slashing .319/.406/.562 with 15 doubles, six triples, eight homers and 34 RBI, increasing batting average from .178 to .271.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard went 2-for-4 last night with his seventh triple of the year, tied for the most in the PCL ... Has a seven-game hit streak, slashing .321/.424/.750 with two doubles, two triples, two homers and five RBI ... Has an XBH in five-straight games ... Has franchise record 85 home runs with the Isotopes.

VEEN, VEEN: Zac Veen went 1-for-4 yesterday with a homer and two RBI to extend his hit streak to eight games, slashing .303/.395/.515 with two doubles, a triple, a homer and seven RBI. Has a hit in 23 of his last 25 games, slashing .376/.439/.594 with six doubles, two triples, four homers and 21 RBI.

THE KID: Kyle Karros went 2-for-4 Tuesday with a walk, his fourth multi-hit game in his last five contests and second-straight. Has a six-game hitting streak, going 10-for-25 after tallying just one hit in his first 11 Triple-A at-bats.

BRAX: Braxton Fulford swatted his 13th four-bagger of the year and third in his last five games. Since being sent back down to Albuquerque on July 1 (11 games), is slashing .450/.500/1.000 with one double, seven homers and 14 RBI.

AMADOR: Adael Amador went 2-for-4 last night with his seventh homer and three RBI. Was his first homer in 16 games (last: July 27 at Las Vegas). Has five multi-hit games in his last 11 contests.

KESTDADDY: Keston Hiura belted his 13th homer of the season yesterday and second in his last three games after not homering in 12-straight contests.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk extended his hitting streak to 10 games with a first-inning double Sunday, becoming the ninth Isotopes player to record a double-digit hit streak this season. During streak is slashing .368/.366/.632 with three doubles, two triples, one homer and six RBI.

-Has a hit in 17 of his last 18 games, slashing .371/.373/.677 with four doubles, three triples, three homers and 15 RBI, only hitless game in one pinch-hit at-bat ... T-6th in triples in PCL (5).

SPEEDSTER: Braiden Ward went 2-for-4 Sunday and is 4-for-8 in last two games ... Reached base in 11 of 12 Triple-A games with a plate appearance.

-Has 184 swipes since the beginning of 2022, third-most in MiLB during span (Chandler Simpson, 225 and Jonatan Clase, 192).

IT'S DREW: Drew Romo is hitting .316 in July (18x57) after hitting .222 over first 22 contests ... Has a five-game hit streak (6x16) ... Has 13 walks on the year after tallying 16 over 85 games in 2024.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

AARON MUNOZ: Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
