REHAB REVOLUTION: 1B Anthony Rizzo, RHP Cody Poteet, INF Jon Berti and RHP Ian Hamilton are all scheduled to continue their rehab assignments with Somerset tonight. 13 different Yankees have suited up for the Patriots on rehab assignment this season, including seven over Somerset's last 13 games. **PLAYOFFS?:** The Patriots have now won five straight games, matching their longest win streak of the season. Somerset has won 11 of their last 14, and is now only 1.5 games behind Portland in the Northeast Division standings with 16 games remaining. **PITCHING POINTS:** In their last nine games, Patriots pitchers have thrown to a 1.84 ERA with 98 K in 78.1 IP. Over the first three games of this week's series vs, Reading, Somerset has only allowed 6 ER in 26 IP (2.08 ERA) with 31 K. **ARM BARN COOKING:** In Somerset's last 14 games since 8/13, the Patriots bullpen has pitched to a Double-A best 1.21 ERA and

the Patriots bullpen has pitched to a Double-A best 1.21 ERA and 0.83 WHIP with 69 K in 59.1 IP and opponents' batting .131. In 52 games during the second half, Somerset's 2.49 bullpen ERA and 1.07 bullpen WHIP both lead the Eastern League.

GAME OF INCHES: Both ends of yesterday's doubleheader sweep over Reading were decided by one run. Since the All-Star break, the Somerset Patriots are 20-13. Of their 13 losses, 12 have been decided by three runs or less. Of 20 wins, 12 have been decided by three runs or less. In Somerset's 33 games post-All-Star break, 24/33 have been decided by three runs or less (record: 12-12).

SEIGING THE BALL WELL: Anthony Seigler hit safely in both ends of vesterday's doubleheader to extended his hit streak to five games and on-base streak to eight games. Seigler is 8-for-18 over his hit streak, and over his last 14 games, Seigler is batting .362 with 2 HR, 8 RBI, 8 R, and a 1.051 OPS. Since the start of June, Seigler has walked more than he has struck out (40 BB/36 K). JONESING FOR MORE: Spencer Jones has supplied the Patriots go-ahead hit in three of Somerset's last four games, including a 5th inning RBI single on Sunday, two-run triple in the 8th inning on Tuesday, and RBI double in the 5th inning of game two on Thursday. The Yankees' No. 2 prospect has a hit and RBI in five straight, and has recorded three straight multi-hit games. Jones is batting .333/.404/.524 in August with 2 HR, 16 RBI, 11 XBH, and 11 R. BASHING AND DASHING: The Somerset Patriots have had multiple stolen bases in each of their last eight games for a total of 26 SB over that span. Eight of their stolen bases in the Patriots last three games have come on double steals.

2024 SOMERSET PATRIOTS COACHING STAFF

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (2nd year)

Raul Dominguez enters his second consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 10th overall as a manager and 18th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2023, Dominguez became the third manager in Somerset Patriots Double-A franchise history and in 2024 he will become the first to serve as manager for more than one season. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015.

KEVIN MARTIR: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Kevin Martir begins his first season in Somerset and fourth in the Yankees organization, after serving in the same position for High-A Hudson Valley in 2023 and Single-A Tampa for two seasons in 2021-22. He joined the Yankees organization in 2020 and had been scheduled to serve as hitting coach for former Rookie-Advanced level Pulaski, prior to the cancellation of the minor league season. Martir began his coaching career in 2019 as a development coach for the GCL Phillies East. Martir starred at catcher during his playing career at the University of Maryland (2013-15), where he was a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award in 2015. Martir was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He played two professional seasons for the Astros with Rookie-Advanced Greeneville in 2015 and Short-Season Class-A Tri-City in 2016. A native of Brooklyn, New York, Martir graduated from the Grand Street Campus in 2012, after transferring from Xaverian High School in Brooklyn prior to his senior year.

BRETT DeGAGNE: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Brett DeGagne begins his first season with Somerset and fourth year in the Yankees organization. After making his organizational coaching debut as the Single-A Tampa Tarpons' pitch-ing coach in 2021, DeGagne most recently served as the FCL Yankees pitching coach in 2022 and 2023, his staff led the Florida Complex League in strikeouts (587) and finished fourth in ERA (4.47). DeGagne was initially tabbed to be the DSL Yankees pitching coach in 2020, before the cancellation of the minor league season. DeGagne played college ball at the University of North Dakota from 2012-2016. He moved on to grad school at St. Cloud State University, where DeGagne also began his baseball coaching career. He served as the Huskies' pitching coach during the 2017-2018 seasons. He gained additional coaching experience in 2018 as the pitching coach for the Bismarck Larks of the Northwoods League. One year prior to joining the Yankees, in 2019 DeGagne took over as pitching coach for North Iowa Area Community College.

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (3rd year)

Aaron Bossi returns for his third consecutive season as the Patriots' defensive coach. Under Bossi's leadership in each of the past two seasons, infielders Jesus Bastidas (2B, 2022) and T.J. Rumfield (1B, 2023) were each awarded Rawlings Minor League Gold Gloves for their work in the field. Bossi has also overseen Somerset's baserunning program each of the last two seasons, leading the team to an Eastern League-best 205 stolen bases in 2022 and a Double-A-best 256 stolen bases in 2023. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021. Prior to his coaching experience with the Yankees, he spent 2017-2019 assisting rehabbing players at the organization's minor league complex in Tampa. The St. Louis, Missouri native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016

2024: Broke camp with High-A Hudson Valley and started the season in the Renegades' bullpen, pitching to a 2.41 ERA over seven relief appearances (5 ER / 18.2 IP). In April, over his first six professional appearances, Shields pitched allowed only one run, pitching to a 0.54 ERA (1 ER / 16.2 IP) with 20 K and 3 BB. Transitioned to a starting role on 5/12 after injury to RHP Brian Hendry. In his first three High-A starts, he went 0-1 with a 9.00 ERA (9 ER in 9.0 IP. He ended May by being called up to Triple-A SWB for a spot start on 5/25, in which he allowed 9 R (7 ER) on 8 H in 1.2 IP. In his first full month as a starter in June, Shields was named the South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Month. In June, Shields went 2-1 with a 2.03 ERA (6 ER / 26.2 IP) in five starts while allowing 13 H and 6 BB for a 0.71 WHIP. He led the SAL with 37 K, striking out a 36.3% of BF in the month. He set and then tied his career-high with nine strikeouts in each of his final two High-A starts. On 6/8, Shields took a no-hitter into the fifth inning @WIL, combining with McKinley Moore on a one-hit shutout in seven innings. Overall with Hudson Valley, Shields posted a 2.75 ERA over 14 appearances (seven starts) with 71 K and 10 BB in 52.1 IP. He was named the SAL Pitcher of the Month the day after he was promoted to Double-A Somerset on 7/2.

College: Spent four years at UMass, pitching three seasons (2018, 20-21), before transferring to George Mason University and pitching in 2022-23. In three seasons at UMass, Shields pitched to a 6.33 ERA over 42.2 IP. During his grad season in 2023 for GMU, Shields went 7-4 with a 4.69 ERA in 17 appearances, leading the A-10 in GS (16) and K (107), while tying for first with his seven wings and ranking 6th in IP (80.2). In his lone season with GMU in 2023, Shields helped set new program records in strikeouts (516) and lowest BAA (.258).

Career Notes: Signed with the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent on 7/14/23. Did not pitch in 2023 after signing with the Yankees. During the summer of 2022, Shields pitched for the Orleans Firebirds in the Cape Cod League, where his teammates included fellow Yankees 2023 signees LHP Kyle Carr and RHP Bryce Warrecker.

2023: Began his professional career as a member of FCL Yankees. Wegner homered in his first two Professional games on 7/29 and 7/30. After going 4-for-9 with 2 HR and 6 RBI over two games with the FCL Yankees, Wegner was promoted to Single-A Tampa on 8/2. He played three games with Tampa, go-ing 3-for-12 with 2 RBI before being promoted to High-A Hudson Valley. Wegner rounded out his debut

campaign with 19 games for the Renegades, over which he hit. 254 with 2 HR and 6 RBI. **College:** Wegner was a four-year starter at Creighton from 2019-22, before transferring to Arkansas for his fifth year of eligibility. As a freshman, he earned All-Big East 2nd Team honors, batting .264 with 20 RBI and 1 HR, which came in the form of a grand slam in his first collegiate game. As a senior, he slashed .343/.459/.635 with a team-leading 11 HR and 53 RBI, earning All-Big East 1st Team honors. Overall in his four seasons for Creighton, he posted a .306 average and 14 HR. Within 30 minutes of entering the NCAA transfer portal, he was contacted by Arkansas assistant coach Nate Thompson. During his fifth college season at Arkansas in 2023, Wegner played in 43 games, missing 18 games due to a fractured thumb, and hit .313 with an 1.130 OPS, 15 HR, and 51 RBI. In his lone season as a Razorback, Wegner's team won the 2023 SEC Championship in 2023, the school's fourth in program history, leading Arkansas to the No. 3 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament. He hit home runs in his final two college games in the Fayetteville Regional of the NCAA Tournament and was named a midseason All-American by D1Baseball.

Personal Notes: Three-sport athlete at Kearney High School (Kearney, NE), Wegner was ranked the No. 13 overall prospect in the state of Nebraska by Prep Baseball Report. Prior to high school, he represented Nebraska (Kearney Little League) in the 2012 Little League World Series with his father, rad, serving as the team's head coach. He went 3-for-4 with a homer and 5 RBI in the state's first ever LLWS win, coming over Germany. During his graduate year at Arkansas, Wegner earned the nickname "Pops" from his teammates.

Career Notes: Selected in the ninth round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Yankees, signing for \$72,500 as a senior-sign.

son, he saw action at second base for the first time in his career, playing in nine games at the position. 2022: Entering the 2022 season ranked as MLB Pipeline's No. 17 Yankees prospect, Vargas spent his first full season with Single-A Tampa, hitting .203 in 100 games with a .583 OPS, 33 RBI, and 8 HR. 2021: Ranked as the Yankees' No. 13 prospect by MLB Pipeline, Vargas spent all of 2021 season with FCL Yankees, playing in 42 games, hitting 273 with a .755 OPS, 3 HR, and 26 RBI. Vargas led the FCL in runs (37) and ranked fourth in stolen bases (17).

2019: Made professional debut for the Dominican Summer League Yankees on 6/1, where he played eight games and hit .289, ahead of a promotion to the Gulf Coast League on 6/24. Played in 40 games for the GCL Yankees-East, hitting .219 with 1 HR, 16 RBI and 14 BB to only 22 K. Vargas went a perfect to Rookie-Advanced Pulaski for the 2019 Appalachian League with five triples. The Yankees acquired the extra international pool money they needed for Vargas, the 8th-ranked prospect in the class, by sending Caleb Frare to the White Sox, and both Giovanny Gallegos and Chasen Shreve to the Cardinals. Vargas played for Matanzas in Cuba's 15U national league in 2016, batting .296/.395/.449 with 14 walks and eight strikeouts in 116 plate appearances. In 2017, he jumped to the 18Ŭ league as a 15-year-old. Vargas was part of the first signing class which allowed Cuban players to be signed by MLB teams without having to defect.
