Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP Kirk McCarty to the mound tonight, looking to avoid the first five game losing streak since 8/24-8/28/19 (last time five below .500: 6/1/17, 24-29). Nashville will counter with RHP Jesus Castillo. The Clippers are 7-10 (.412) against right handers this year. Castillo has pitched against the Clippers once in his career, on Wednesday (0.2IP, 2H, 1R, 1ER, 0BB, 1K).

vs. the Sounds

Columbus has not played Nashville in the regular season since 1991, when the Sounds played in the American Association. From 1988-91, the two leagues played crossover games with the Clippers winning 11 of 21 against Nasvhille (also went 11-10 against Omaha and 11-10 against lowa), including six of 10 in Columbus (2-0-2 series record in Columbus).

Get What You Pay For

The Clippers are the only team in the IL that has seen every game played to completion in nine innings, as they are one of two (Toledo) that has not experienced extra innings this year. Detracting from the drama is the fact that the Clippers have played in an IL-low four games decided by a single run (1-3). Tonight's opponent, Nashville, is tied for 3rd in the IL with nine 1-run games (8-1).

Quite a Slide

Since starting the season 5-1, the Clippers have been beaten down to the tune of a 3-11 record, getting outscored 93-57 in that time. The last time the Clippers had a 14 game stretch with only three wins was 4/13-4/28/17, after a 5-2 start to the season (outscored 73-48). The 2017 Clippers sank to eight games under .500 (5/26) and climbed to nine over (7/20) before ending the year at an even 71-71.

Back to the Top

Daniel Johnson is returning to the leadoff spot tonight after last night's first multi-hit game since 5/11 (.167, 9x54 over 13G between multi-hit games). Johnson has been sharing leadoff duties with Oscar Mercado over the last two weeks, but Mercado has also fallen on hard times, batting just .136/.224/.136 over 44AB since 5/15 (Clipper leadoff hitters have only 7R on the season, worst in IL).

Second Best

Following an 0x5 Triple-A debut on 5/21 at Toledo (had 78G in the Majors under his belt at the time), Andres Gimenez put together four consecutive 2-hit efforts and extended his hitting streak to five with a 1x3 game last night. His 0x5 came at the leadoff spot (first batters in the Clipper order are hitting .232, 11th in the IL), while he has been 9x21 batting second.

Double Time

Ernie Clement returned to the lineup last night and extended his hitting streak to seven games (.478, 11x23), while also extending his streak with an XBH to seven games. Of his 12 hits on the season, Clement has 8XBH, resulting in a .677SLG. However, not counted among those hits is a homer, as Clement is the only player in the IL (of 62) with at least 33PA and a .450+SLG that has yet to go deep.

The Rock

Bobby Bradley will man the cleanup spot after getting scratched last night (through 19G, had been the only player in the IL to start every game at cleanup). After a solid Toledo series that saw his average climb to .200 (6x24, 2HR, 4RBI), he is 0x7 with an HBP against Nashville, dropping back to .181. When playing first base this year, Bradley has 2HR in 61AB, compared to 4HR in 11AB as a DH.

Swinging Hard

Heading into today, the Clippers have three players among the top five in the IL in strikeouts, as Nolan Jones leads the league (35K) and Bradley Zimmer is tied with Bobby Bradley for 5th (26K). Jones has seen 44% of his plate appearances end with a strikeout (1HR), while Zimmer is at 35% (1HR) and Bradley is at 31% (6HR, tied for 5th in the IL). As a team, the Clippers rank 8th with 202K in 20G.

But Still.

Despite the heavy strikeout numbers, Bradley Zimmer (13G, .472OBP) and Nolan Jones (12G, .408OBP) each enter tonight's contest with double digit on base streaks (Zimmer was recalled to Cleveland yesterday, having gone 9x21 since 5/19). Jones leads the team with 13BB (T7th in IL) and Zimmer ranks 2nd with 10BB, resulting in three true outcome rates of 62% and 49%, respectively.

Columbus Clippers Game Information

This Date in Clipper History

The Clippers hammered Norfolk by a score of 13-6 at Huntington Park, scoring in six of eight innings (three multi-run innings). Eric Stamets was 4x5 with a pair of doubles, a pair of homers and 6RBI (set career highs in HR and RBI). Nellie Rodriguez homered for the second straight day, taking a left-hander deep for the second straight at bat (grand slam on 5/27; started the year 0x24 with 16K vs. lefties).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (938 to 903).

Record Destruction

The Clippers broke the established mark for homers in a season (182 in 1983) on 8/7/19 and finished with a total of 213 (most in the IL). From 5/14-6/2, they homered in 20 straight games (44HR total) and they had seven straight multi-HR games from 6/14-6/21 (22HR). On the mound, they broke the record for homers allowed (156 in 1998) on 7/31/19, giving up 198 for the year (2nd most in the IL).

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

Since the start of the 2014 season, no team has had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus (35 last season) and no team has produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB ranks 2nd in win percentage at .338 and wins, 192).

Walk-Off Magic

Columbus was 5-2 in walk-off games last season, winning four thanks to the courtesy runner in extra innings (Columbus pitching did not allow a run through first 9.0IP in extras last year). On 6/29/19 at Louisville, they suffered their first walk-off loss of the year, snapping an 81 game streak without (previous loss was 5/31/18 at Buffalo). Additionally, the Clippers ranked 1st in the IL with a 16-8 (.667) record in games decided in the last at bat.

Trending Downward

While ranking in the top three of the IL with a 4.71ERA (3rd), the 2019 Clippers registered their worst mark since the 1998 season (4.85ERA). In 2018, they ranked dead last in the IL with a 4.34ERA, marking the third straight (now fourth) season that the team ERA had gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 30 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016).

Doing Damage

In 2019, the Clippers ranked tied for 5th in the IL with 112RBI with the bases loaded, while carrying a .252 average (10th, 36x143, 4HR). In both 2017 and 2018, the Clippers led the IL in RBI with the bases loaded (243RBI total) and paced the circuit in grand slams (16 total, no other team had more than eight).

Free Swingers

After two straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup was atop the IL again in 2019 (1,392K, 60 more than 2nd place). They obliterated the franchise record (1,297, set in 2017; 2018's total of 1,290 was 2nd worst in franchise history), passing it on 8/22/19 (reduced strikeout rate to 8.3 per game after setting record, 10.1 prior). On the season a Clipper was punched out at least four times in a game on 15 occasions (**Eric Haase** led the team with three golden sombreros).

That's More Like It

In 2019, the Clippers were 50-30 (.625) when playing errorless baseball, while turning in a 31-29 (.517) mark with at least one error. Contrary to logic, in 2018 they actually had a worse winning percentage when playing mistake free (.514), than when committing at least one error (.530). The Clipper defense finished 1st in 2019 (.983) after falling to 6th in the IL in 2018, ending a run of three consecutive seasons ranked among the top three (2015-17 resulted in the three best seasons in franchise history).

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). From 4/13-4/20/19, the Clippers hit 16 leadoff doubles over 72 innings, including four straight innings in a win at Louisville on 4/15/19.

Good Baseball

Ernie Clement advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 5/8 at Louisville and the runner came around to score in the win. During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department (12 successes), but when the advanced runners did score, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt (54 successes; won 17 in a row from 4/12-7/31/18).

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes, Eric Haase, Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 38-58 (.396), 8-12 with Columbus (.400).

Off the Board:

Starting with his last 2.0IP in the season opener on 5/4 at Louisville and continuing through his first 2.0IP vs. Omaha on 5/16, McCarty fired 10 straight scoreless innings (4H, 0BB, 4K). On the season, McCarty has started 24 innings (retired the first batter 20 times), allowing a single tally in seven of them with zero multi-run innings allowed.

Lack of Lefties:

Over the course of 140 games in 2019, the Clippers trotted out a lefty starter just 15 times (**Logan Allen-** 5, **Scott Moss-** 4, **Tanner Tully-** 3, **Sean Brady-** 2 and **Kyle Nelson-** 1), as right handers made 68 consecutive starts from 4/18-6/30. Including the bullpen, lefties accounted for 15.5% of the innings pitched for Columbus in 2019 (191.1IP) and only Louisville had fewer. **Josh Smith** (52.2IP) was the only Clipper with at least 25.0IP.

2019 Season:

Started the year on Lynchburg's DL with a strained lat... activated on 6/12 and threw 42 pitches at Wilmington (3.0IP, 2H, 4K)... gave up 24H in 16.0IP over next 4GS (10ER)... allowed 1H in 6.0IP (2BB, 6K) at Down East on 7/11, then had a brief stint on the DL (7/18-7/23)... returned from the DL and had 7GS to finish the season, posting a 7.37ERA (30.2IP, 25)... had 10K in 5.1IP at Wilmington on 8/13 (also had 5BB, career high 93 pitches)... following the season, pitched in 6G for Mesa in the Arizona Fall League (24.0IP, 17H, 8R, 8ER, 6BB, 19K).
