LAST NIGHT: The Skeeters continued their offensive outburst to open the '21 season, winning 15-1 on Saturday night. It was the second straight game the Skeeters scored at least 10 runs and they logged 17 hits in their second straight game. The 15 runs matched Round Rock for the most scored in a game by a Triple A West team this season. The 17 hits are the most by a Triple A West team this season.

HEY SIRI: Jose Siri has logged multi-RBI games through the first three contests of the season. His nine RBIs lead Triple A West. Siri hit the first-ever home run in Skeeters Triple A history with a three-run shot on Friday night.

ROSTER MOVES: Following Friday night's game, the Astros announced the signing of infielder Yadiel Rivera and assigned him to Sugar Land. Infielder Colton Shaver was assigned to Corpus Christi (AA). Rivera has appeared at the MLB level each season from 2015-20 and has logged 192 MLB appearances. He last appeared in four games with Texas in '20. Rivera played in a career-high 111 games in '18.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Skeeters hit three doubles on Saturday and their 13 doubles as a team lead Triple A West, with the next closest team at nine doubles (Reno).

HIT PARADE: The Skeeters are hitting .389 (49x126) as a team through three games. It's the highest team batting average of any Triple A team, with Round Rock the next-closest (.327). Skeeters pitching has held Albuquerque to a .181 average (17x94).

PUTTING OUT THE FIRE: Skeeters relievers have tossed nine straight scoreless innings and own a 0.73 ERA this season (1 ER/12.1 IP).

MOVING ON UP: The Skeeters are in their first season in affiliated minor league baseball as the Triple A affiliate of the Houston Astros. The Skeeters are one of three independent teams rising to affiliated minor league ranks this offseason, along with the St. Paul Saints (AAA, MIN) and Somerset Patriots (AA, NYY).

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through their first nine seasons of existence, the Skeeters played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in 2016 and '18 and appeared in the postseason in five of nine seasons.

The Skeeters still hold the Atlantic League single-season record for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from their 2013 season.

CLOSE TO HOME: Based on approximate mileage, the Skeeters are located second-closest to the stadium of their parent club out The St. Paul Saints are located approximately 11 miles from Minnesota's Target Field.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey is entering his third year as the manager of the Astros Triple A affiliate. He led Round Rock to the best record in Triple A in 2019 (84-56) and to the Pacific Coast League Finals. Storey got his first managerial job in the Astros system in 2018 with Class A Quad Cities, winning the Western Division of the Midwest League. Storey appeared at the MLB level with the Astros in 2012 and the Blue Jays in 2013 as a right-handed pitcher. He still holds numerous career pitching records for Florida Atlantic University.

MAJOR TALENT: The Skeeters roster features eight players with Major League service time: OF **Ronnie Dawson**, IF **Alex De Goti**, IF **Taylor Jones**, RHP **Nivaldo Rodriguez**, RHP **Peter Solomon**, C **Garrett Stubbs**, IF **Abraham Toro**, RHP **Hector Velazquez**. All but Velazquez have appeared at the Majors with the Astros.

PROSPECT POWER: The Skeeters have nine players ranked as Astros top-30 prospects (per MLB Pipeline): RHP **Tyler Ivey** (No. 9), RHP **Shawn Dubin** (No. 11), RHP **Peter Solomon** (No. 14), RHP **Jojanse Torres** (No. 20), IF **Taylor Jones** (No. 21), RHP **Brett Conine** (No. 23), RHP **Austin Hansen** (No. 24), RHP **Nivaldo Rodriguez**, (No. 25), OF **Ronnie Dawson** (No. 29)

PUT IT ON THE MANTEL: **Ronnie Dawson**, **Alex De Goti** and **Peter Solomon** each made their Major League debuts with the Astros this season. Dawson went 1x5 with a run through 3 G, De Goti went 2x6 with a run and RBI through 6 G and Solomon tossed a scoreless 2 IP in relief, allowing just one hit and striking out two.

WELCOME TO ABQ: The Skeeters are making their first trip to Albuquerque in franchise history. The Skeeters and Isotopes are scheduled to play each other 30 times this season and are both in the East Division of Triple-A West. The Isotopes visit Constellation Field in Sugar Land for the first time from May 27-June 1.

DEEP IN THE HART: The 27-year-old is in his sixth season within the Astros organization and is beginning his second season at the Triple A level. He spent the entire '19 campaign with the Round Rock Express (AAA) and went 6-7 with a 5.84 ERA (75 ER/115.2 IP) and two saves

WHAT UP, ABQ: Despite spending the entire '19 season with Round Rock (AAA) in the Pacific Coast League, this will be Hartman's first career appearance against the Albuquerque Isotopes.

SOUTHPAW: Hartman is the only left-hander slated to make a start in the Skeeters' opening series in Albuquerque. He's one of two leftys on the Skeeters roster, along with reliever, Kit Scheetz.

TRIPLE A VET: Hartman is the first Skeeters starter this season with previous Triple A experience.

MR. RELIABLE: Hartman led Round Rock (AAA) in '19 in both games started (19) and innings pitched (115.2)

BEND BUT DON'T BREAK: Hartman has held opponent's to a .214 average (71x332) over his five-year professional career

WINTER LEAGUE: Hartman appeared with the Caribes de Anzoategui of the Venezuelan Winter League in the 2018-19 offseason ... Went 0-1 with a 5.14 ERA (8 ER/14.0 IP) in five starts

BANNER YEAR: Was selected as a Baseball America Double-A All-Star, Texas League Midseason and Postseason All-Star and Texas League Picher of the Week (6/24) during the '18 season ... Spent entire season with Corpus Christi and went 11-4 with a 2.69 ERA (36 ER/120.2) ... Won the Texas League ERA title ... Led the Texas League in strikeouts (143), was tied for first in wins and was second in WHIP (1.08).
