Today: It's the 2025 home finale, as the Lugnuts go for a fourth straight victory in the last of a six-game series with Lake County, a Capital City Market Kids Day with postgame Kids Run the Bases and an Extra Inning of ice cream and music with Big Lug across Michigan Ave. at Capital City Market.

Yesterday: Lugnuts 3, Captains 0. Six pitchers – Jake Garland, Wei-En Lin, Jack Mahoney, Yehizon Sanchez, Henry Gómez and Hunter Breault – combined on a three-hit whitewashing, Lansing's second consecutive shutout, to lead the Nuts to a third straight win over Lake County in front of a Fan Appreciation Night crowd of 5,888.

On Deck: The Lugnuts enjoy a league-wide off day tomorrow before traveling to Dayton, Ohio, for the final series of the season, playing the Dragons from Tuesday, September 2 through Sunday, September 7. And then... that's it. No more Lugnuts baseball until next April.

LUG•NOTES

Prospecting: The Lugnuts' roster has five of MLB Pipeline's revamped Top 30 Athletics prospects: No. 14 **Steven Echavarria**, No. 18 **Ryan Lasko**, No. 21 **Wei-En Lin**, No. 22 **Carlos Pacheco** and No. 24 **Kenya Huggins**. Additionally, No. 1 **Leo De Vries**, No. 3 **Gage Jump**, No. 8 **Tommy White**, No. 11 **Joshua Kuroda-Grauer** and No. 20 **Nate Nankil** played for the Lugnuts earlier this season and are now with Double-A Midland.

Congratulations! Before today's game, the Lugnuts Booster Club will honor its August Player of the Month, second baseman **Casey Yamauchi** (33-for-99, .333 avg. in August, 29-game on-base streak), as well as its Player of the Year, closer **Mark Adamiak** (league-leading 20 saves, 41 appearances). The full year of Booster Club Players of the Month: April - **Kyle Robinson**, May - **T.J. Schofield-Sam**, June - **Nate Nankil**, July - **Corey Avant**.

Home Magic: The Nuts are 35-30 at home this year... and if you take out the Luggies' nine games (and 1-8 record) against West Michigan, they're a marvelous 34-22 in Michigan's state capital.

There's No Place Like Home: Lansing has by far and away the best home offense in the Midwest League, leading the league with a .273 batting average, 585 base hits, 848 total bases and a .756 OPS in 65 games. (On the other hand, the Nuts are 11th in the league on the road, batting .215 with only 416 hits, 590 total bases and a .613 OPS in 60 games.) Notably, **Casey Yamauchi** is hitting .327 at home, compared to .234 on the road; **Pedro Pineda** bats .340 at home, .120 on the road; and **Mario Gómez** is hitting .346 at home, .067 on the road.

But Who's Counting? Entering play today, the Lugnuts have drawn 271,117 fans at home, averaging 4,236 per game... average attendance by month: 2,112/game in April; 3,917/game in May; 4,807/game in June; 5,805/game in July; and 5,235/game in August.

Playoff Ramifications: The Nuts are missing the postseason for the sixth consecutive season, but are still influencing the East Division race. Their two straight shutout victories over Lake County combined with two straight Great Lakes wins over West Michigan have catapulted the Loons a half-game over the defending champion Captains for the final East playoff berth. This is all building to a climax: Great Lakes finishes the season with a six-game series at Lake County.

Zeroes: Not only has Lansing shut out Lake County in back to back games, the Lugnuts have limited the Captains to just one run over the past 31 innings stretching back to Wednesday. Captains broadcaster Logan Potosky did the math: the Caps are hitting a mere .149 (15-for-101) during the past 31 innings.

Vladdy and Bo: Teenage teammates on the 2017 Lugs, **Vladimir Guerrero Jr.** is currently 3rd in the American League in OBP (.384) while **Bo Bichette** is 1st in the Majors in base hits (172), 3rd in batting average (.308, behind 2023 Lugnut **Jacob Wilson's** .310 average) and 2nd in doubles (40).

Black and Blue: **T.J. Schofield-Sam** has been hit by 30 pitches this year, most in the Midwest League and third in Minor League Baseball to leader Michael Arroyo (33) of Arkansas. In contrast, the MLB leader Randy Arozarena has been plunked 23 times.

3... 2... 1... Contact: The Nuts are the hardest team to strike out in Minor League Baseball, averaging a scant 7.14 strikeouts per game (892 in 125 games). The offense is on track for its first sub-1,000 strikeout season since 2006.

In the Field: The Nuts are 2nd for most double plays (114) in the MWL, trailing only Wisconsin (117). Additionally, the Lugnuts have allowed only 117 stolen bases this year, ranking 3rd in the league.

TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2012: Noah Syndergaard struck out nine South Bend Silver Hawks in five innings of one-hit shutout ball, and the Lugnuts scored five runs in the 7th for a 5-4 win at The Cove in South Bend.

2016: The Lugnuts welcomed Bill Johnston, their 8,000,000th fan and Michigan Lottery Lugnut, to Cooley Law School Stadium, part of a crowd of 4,704 that watched the Nuts defeat Bowling Green, 3-1.

2022: The pitching matchup featured 2022 fourth-rounder Jacob Watters in his Nuts debut (1 IP, 1 UER, 3 BB) against MLB rehabber Wade Miley for South Bend, but the game was decided by a two-run Pablo Aliendo homer in the fifth in a 4-2 loss at Four Winds Field.

Personal: Tzu-Chen initially gained notice as a soccer star, earning a spot on the Taiwanese National Team before reaching high school... undrafted out of high school, debuted in college in 2022 with four perfect innings / nine strikeouts at National Taiwan Sport University (the same university attended by former Lugnut Chen Zhong-Ao Zhuang)... named Best Pitcher at the 2022 MeiHuaQi College National Tournament... signed with the Athletics a few months later for \$370,000 plus \$30,000 to be put toward scholarship... part of the same A's international signing class as former Lugnut Luis Morales, now in the Majors.

Family Highlight: On July 5, with his father and brother watching him pitch in the Minor Leagues for the very first time, earned first High-A victory with five innings of two-hit, one-run ball vs. Fort Wayne (Brandon Butterworth solo HR in 3rd inning).

Last Game: Starting August 26 vs. Lake County in the first game of this series... took the loss, allowing seven hits and five runs in four innings... gave up two-run homer to Ryan Cesarini in three-run 2nd... 76 pitches, 42 strikes... Nuts lost, 6-2.

Pro Ball: Debuted with the Arizona Complex League A's in 2023 (June 6, 3 IP, 4 H, 0 R, 0 BB, 4 K at ACL Reds), earning way to Stockton for a July 26 California League debut (4 IP, 2 H, 0 R, 2 BB, 3 K vs. Lake Elsinore)... spent all of 2024 with Stockton, piggybacking Will Johnston on the second day of the season... returned to Stockton to open this season and debuted as part of a combined no-hitter at Fresno, following Jefferson Jean's five hitless innings with three perfect innings/six strikeouts before yielding to Wilfrid Alvarado for a perfect ninth in a 2-0 win... promoted to Lansing to replace Nathan Dettmer in the starting rotation on June 23.

Players from Taiwan in MLB: The only Taiwanese players to see time in the Majors this season are Kai-Wei Teng (SF) and Tsung-Che Cheng (PIT)... there have been 18 Major Leaguers all-time from Taiwan, the first being Chin-Feng Chen of the Dodgers, who played from 2002-2005... the Yankees' Chien-Ming Wang (2005-09, 2011-13, 2016) has the most career wins (68), the Orioles/Marlins' Wei-Yin Chen (2012-19) has the most career innings pitched (1,064 2/3), and Cleveland's Yu Chang (2019-23) has the most offensive records, from games played (235) to runs (72) to hits (121) to homers (20).

Players from Taiwan in Lansing: The first Taiwanese Lugnuts are franchise record-holders – Po-Hsuan Keng, who pitched primarily out of the bullpen for the Nuts from 2005-2007, and Chi-Hung Cheng, who served as a starting pitcher in 2005-06 and 2008... in 2024, Brock Whittlesey broke Keng's franchise record of most career appearances; Whittlesey pitched in 103 games from 2021-23, while Keng appeared in 94... Chi-Hung Cheng owns the Lugnuts' franchise record for most career innings pitched (374), with Keng ranking second (202); Cheng also ranks first in games started (67), career wins (23), losses (20), starts (67), strikeouts (367), runs (188), hits (360), and walks (189). Last season, the Lugnuts had Chen Zhong-Ao Zhuang, who sparked with a 2.56 ERA in nine appearances, six starts, spanning 31 2/3 innings, posting a 29.3 K:BB ratio.

ADDITIONAL LUG•NOTES

200 to The Show: Seven former Lugnuts players have made it to the Majors this season, most recently 2023-24 Lugnuts right-hander **Luis Morales** on August 1st for the A's, bringing the total to **200 Lugnuts all-time** who've reach the Majors. Morales joined **Max Muncy, Gunnar Hoglund, Jack Winkler, Denzel Clarke, Jack Perkins, Colby Thomas** and broadcaster **Adam Jaksa** to debut in MLB this season.

Roll Call: The 2025 Lugnuts have featured 50 different players, 26 position players and 24 pitchers (plus one position player pitching). 18 players have stolen a base, 15 players have hit a home run, 12 pitchers have started a game and five pitchers have recorded a save.

DK at the Helm: The 19th manager in Lugnuts history is **Darryl Kennedy**, entering his second year in the A's organization. Kennedy distinguished himself as a catcher at Manatee Community College before starring at the University of North Florida and was named an NCAA All-American in 1991 en route to North Florida's Hall of Fame, inducted in 2017. Kennedy played in the Minor Leagues for seven seasons, including parts of four seasons in Triple-A. Following his 1997 retirement, he immediately began managing, leading the Gulf Coast League Rangers to the 1998 GCL Championship. Kennedy won a second title with the GCL Rangers in 2000, moving on to stops in the Florida State League, Northwest League and Texas League through 2006. Upon joining the Royals' organization, Kennedy managed in the Appalachian League, Carolina League, Pioneer League, Arizona League and Texas League through 2020. He served as bench coach for the KBO's Hanwha Eagles from 2021 through 2023 before joining the A's as Double-A Midland's assistant hitting coach in 2024.

Filling Out the Staff: **Dave Burba**, the Lugnuts' pitching coach, walked on at Ohio State, pitched in the Big Ten Championship game as a freshman, was drafted by the Mariners one round after Ken Griffey, Jr. in 1987, and won 115 games in 15 MLB seasons before spending 13 seasons as a pitching coach in the Colorado Rockies' organization. **Rubén Escalera** is in his second year as hitting coach and his 30th season in the A's organization; he simultaneously serves as a scout for the A's in Puerto Rico. And the pride of Yuba City, Calif., **Cooper Goldby** comes to the Lugnuts after two seasons serving as the Dominican Summer League A's manager. The catcher/utilityman was drafted out of Lewis-Clark State in the 35th round in 2017.

Get to Know These Names: If the past is any indication, the Athletics' 2025 draft picks will be making a Midwest League impact sooner rather than later. This year, the A's selected Florida State southpaw **Jamie Arnold** with the 11th overall pick, following up with a pair of impact slugging outfielders: Indiana Hoosier **Devin Taylor** (the No. 30 prospect) at pick 48 and Oregon State Beaver **Gavin Turley** (the No. 78 prospect) at pick 110. Both outfielders are playing for Single-A Stockton.

The Mutant Cycle: The best individual performance of the season was achieved against the Lugnuts by now former Nut **Leo De Vries**, who went 5-for-5 on April 22nd for Fort Wayne, with a single, a double, two home runs, a sacrifice fly, and - in the top of the ninth inning - a go-ahead two-run triple to both give the TinCaps the win and culminate the third cycle in Fort Wayne franchise history. De Vries finished the game with eight RBIs, tying the Fort Wayne single game franchise record. De Vries also is the only player in Fort Wayne history to have two four-walk games.

Walk-Off Wonders: The Nuts have walked off with a win on four different occasions this year:

- Jared Dickey's two-run single in the 12th inning to beat Great Lakes, 12-11, April 13th
- Sahid Valenzuela's RBI single in the 10th inning to beat Lake County, 1-0, May 4th
- Rodney Green, Jr.'s RBI single in the 10th inning to beat South Bend, 7-6, May 13th
- Jared Dickey's RBI fielder's choice in the bottom of the 9th to beat West Michigan, 4-3, June 11th

All-Star Representation, Futures Edition: A pair of Lugnuts now in Double-A, **Tommy White** and 2025 Opening Day starter **Gage Jump**, represented the Athletics' organization at the **2025 All-Star Futures Game** on July 12th at Truist Park. White went 0-for-1 with a strikeout while Jump needed only four pitches to strike out Padres No. 1 prospect Leo De Vries and induce a groundout from Cubs No. 1 prospect Owen Caissie - coincidentally to White at third. White, the A's No. 6 prospect, joined Luis Morales (2024), Denzel Clarke (2022), Vladimir Guerrero Jr. and Bo Bichette (2017) and Angel Perdomo (2016) as active Lugnuts to play in the Futures Game.

All-Star Representation, Present Tense: Four Lugnuts were named Major League All-Stars - American League starting shortstop **Jacob Wilson** (2023), A.L. starting first baseman **Vladimir Guerrero, Jr.** (2017), A.L. reserve catcher **Alejandro Kirk** (2019), and N.L. starting pitcher **Matthew Boyd** (2013). It was Vladdy's fifth All-Star appearance, Kirk's second, and the first apiece for Wilson and Boyd. Wilson was the first A's starting shortstop in an All-Star Game since Bert Campaneris (1974) and the first rookie starting shortstop in an All-Star Game since Ron Hansen in 1960.

Still Shoving: 45-year-old **Rich Hill** pitched for the Lugnuts in 2003 (0-1, 2.76, 15 G, 4 GS, 29 1/3 innings, 14 H, 36 walks, 50 strikeouts, 9 wild pitches). On July 13, Hill struck out 10 Toledo Mud Hens in five innings, becoming the first 45-year-old to strike out at least 10 batters in a game since the Texas Rangers' Nolan Ryan whiffed double-digit Athletics on August 6, 1992. Hill is in his 20th professional season and with his 14th different MLB organization.

The Butler Did What: 2021-2022 Lugnut **Lawrence Butler** led off July 8th's game for the A's vs. Atlanta with an inside-the-park home run, the Athletics' first inside-the-park homer since Mark Kotsay achieved the feat on October 4, 2006; the first leadoff inside-the-park home run for the A's since Elmer Valo in 1943; and the first A's player to have both an inside-the-park home run and an over-the-fence home run in the same game since Billy Williams on August 23, 1975. When the Giants' Patrick Bailey delivered a walk-off inside-the-park home run to end the night in baseball, it was the first time in Major League Baseball history that a leadoff inside-the-parker and a walk-off inside-the-parker were hit on the same day.

Dubious History: 2018 Lugnut **Vinny Capra** was former Great Lakes Loon Clayton Kershaw's 3,000th strikeout victim on July 2. Capra, a 20th-rounder from Richmond in 2018, had been claimed off waivers by the White Sox from the Milwaukee Brewers on May 15.

Simply Electric: 2022 Lugnut **Denzel Clarke** won the MLB Chevrolet Electric Play of the Week each of his first four weeks in the Majors.

Happy Trails: 2012 Nut **Kevin Pillar** announced his retirement on July 2 following a 13-year playing career with 10 different teams. A 32nd-round selection in 2011, Pillar went 6-for-6 with a grand slam in a 6-RBI night at the Dayton Dragons on May 13, 2012, and found a fire extinguisher in his locker after the game. He went on to be the 2012 Midwest League Most Valuable Player.

What a Crowd! The Lugnuts' July 4 crowd of 10,527 was...

- Larger than any crowd drawn by the Tampa Bay Rays this season.
- 18th largest crowd in Minor League Baseball this season.
- Larger than 15 Triple-A teams (Round Rock, Lehigh Valley, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, Gwinnett, Jacksonville, Reno, Omaha, El Paso, Worcester, Louisville, St. Paul, Memphis, Salt Lake, Tacoma, Sugar Land).
- Larger than 29 Double-A teams (everyone except Frisco).
- Largest crowd in High-A. (No one else drew over 9,000.)
- Larger than 29 Single-A teams (everyone except Fresno, which used to be in Triple-A and edged Lansing by four: 10,531).

What a Crowd, Part II: The Nuts drew 8,863 for Grand Slam School Day III on May 28 vs. Beloit, an attendance that ranks the 31st largest crowd in Minor League Baseball this year. If Lansing's July 4 crowd is excluded, the May 28 attendance would rank larger than any crowd in High-A this season except for a West Michigan Whitecaps gate of 9,049 on June 7.
