 FOUR HOMERS POWER FRISCO TO VICTORY:

The Frisco RoughRiders belted a season-high four home runs in an 11-7 win over the Springfield Cardinals on Saturday at Riders Field. Frisco (30-37) launched three homers in the fifth inning alone, including back-to-back long balls from Brad Miller and Thomas Saggese. Trevor Hauver added a third solo home run later in the inning. Josh Hatcher added to the party with a two-run home run in the seventh inning. Springfield (34-34) won the first three games of the series but now Frisco has a chance to split the series with one game remaining on Sunday. Juan Mejia got his first start of the season and cruised through three innings without a hit allowed. He put just one runner aboard on a walk and finished his day with a 5-0 lead through three frames. Danny Duffy (2-1) followed with one run allowed over two innings. Triston Polley took care of two innings of his own without a run allowed and three strikeouts. Wilfredo Pereira (5-4) suffered the loss with six earned runs in 4.1 innings. Saggese collected a single, double and homer before walking in his final plate appearance. His hitting streak is now at 13 games this season, the longest of the year for the team. Evan Carter tacked on two hits with an RBI and a walk. Hauver scored three times to lead the team. Josh Hatcher led the team with three RBIs, including his first Double-A home run. Hatcher has four hits in his first three games since getting called up from High-A.

## CONSISTENCY NEEDED:

With Juan Mejia's start yesterday for the RoughRiders, he became the 10th different starting pitcher in June for Frisco, which is the most in the league this month. Over their last 11 games, the Riders starting staff has just one game of at least five innings with a 8.84 ERA (36ER/36.2IP). In June, Frisco has a starters ERA of 7.12 (63ER/79.2IP) over 21 games. The good news is the bullpen has been very strong in June, owning a 3.88 ERA in June.

RISP-ECT THIS:
This season, the Riders are just eighth in the 10-team Texas League in batting average with runners in scoring position, hitting .254, though Frisco is fourth with 265 RBIs with RISP. Over the last 10 games ( $4-6$ record), Frisco is hitting just . 252 ( 24 -for-95) in those situations.

## THOMAS THE TANK ENGINE:

Thomas Saggese has been incredible for the RoughRiders on offense. Over a 13-game hitting streak, Saggese is hitting . 453 (24-for$53) / .516 / .830 / 1.346$ with three doubles, five home runs, 15 RBIs, seven walks, 10 runs scored and a steal. Since June 10th, he is fourth in all of MiLB in batting average, hitting .453. Among those who have played at least 50 games, Saggese is first on the team with a 309 batting average and .868 OPS.

## THE SPEAS THAT PLEASES:

Reliever Alex Speas now has an ERA under 1.00 at 0.68 over 22 appearances. In 26.2 innings, he has struck out 45 to 12 walks
Opponents are hitting just. 140 against him and he has not allowed an earned run over his last 13 outings. During that span, he has struck out 30 to five walks over 16.1 innings. On the season, righties are just hitting .121 ( 8 -for-66) against him on the season with a .374 OPS.

## AMBUSH EARLY AND OFTEN

Thomas Saggese has been fantastic on first pitches this season, leading the Texas League with a .619 average (13-for-21) when he puts the first pitch of an at-bat in play. He has a 1.684 OPS on the first pitch, which is first in the league as well. Luisangel Acuña has also been great, hitting .426 ( 20 -for-47) on the initial offering while his 20 hits on the first pitch lead the league.

## SPEED KILLS

Luisangel Acuña leads the league in steals with 30 and is on pace for a career-best 61 swipes. The RoughRiders are second in Texas League steals with 98 bases in 115 attempts ( 85 percent).

## ONE HOME RUN, PLEASE. AND MAKE IT GRAND:

The RoughRiders have had a knack for grand slams this year with Thomas Saggese hitting Frisco's seventh grand slam of the season on last Friday. They are one of two teams with seven grand slams in all of Minor League Baseball. Six different players have accounted for the grand slams (Hicks, Luisangel Acuña, Jax Biggers, Dustin Harris, Trevor Hauver, Thomas Saggese (2)).

## ACUÑA MATATA

RoughRiders infielder Luisangel Acuña has been on fire at the plate. The Rangers No. 3 prospect is hitting .294 ( 75 -for255)/.357/.435/.792 through the first 59 games. Over his last 55 games, he is batting .304/.370/.456/.826. When the 21-year-old arrived in Frisco in 2022, he had a wRC+ of 68 while it has nearly doubled this season (110).

WALK THIS WAY:
On the season, Frisco's 336 walks are first among Texas League teams while their . 354 team OBP is third in the Texas League. Dustin Harris is still first in the league with 44 walks despite being promoted to Triple-A Round Rock on Tuesday.

-Went to Northgate High School in Walnut Creek, California (across the Bay from San Francisco, east of Berkeley). His senior season, he went 6-5 with a 2.20 ERA over 11 games
-Krauth then went to the University of New Mexico for the 2018 season, where he was teammates with current RoughRiders pitcher Justin Slaten.
-After New Mexico, transferred to Diablo Valley College in Pleasant Valley, California where he went 5-4 with a 2.20 ERA. Following that strong season, he transferred again, this time to the University of Connecticut, where he was one of the best pitchers in the country for the 2020 season before it was cut short due to COVID. In his four starts, he went $4-0$ with a 0.36 ERA and a . 167 BAA. This included five one-run innings against the No. 1 Michigan Wolverines on February 23rd.

Due to the 2020 MLB Draft getting shortened to five rounds, Krauth went undrafted and signed with the Rangers as a free agent on June 15th.
-Brother, Ben Krauth, pitched for the San Antonio Missions in 2022, making nine starts and recording a 7.18 ERA. In two starts against Frisco, the RoughRiders touched him up for a combined seven runs, six earned, over 7.2 innings while handing him two losses. Ben was released by the Padres organization at the end of the year and retired after six seasons of MiLB experience.

## 2023 SEASON

-Krauth made first appearance of the season out of the bullpen on Friday, April 7th, allowing three runs over four innings.
-In his first start, Krauth went shutout five innings at San Antonio on April 14th to earn the first win among RoughRiders starting pitchers.
-Threw four scoreless innings on April 20th before game was suspended due to rain in the top of the fifth with the Riders up $9-0$, ending his night early. The Riders and the Travelers went on to finish the game on April 21st with Frisco winning 13-5.
-Allowed a run in the fourth inning against Amarillo on April 26th, snapping a 14.2 -consecutive innings scoreless streak dating back to April 7th.
-Joined Triple-A Round Rock on May 2nd for a spot start and make two appearances. In his start, he went $3.2 \mathrm{IP}, 2 \mathrm{H}, 0 \mathrm{R}, 0 \mathrm{ER}, 3 \mathrm{BB}, 1 \mathrm{~K}$. Allowed a grand slam to David Freitas of Oklahoma City in relief appearance.

## 2022 SEASON

-Spent time as both a starter and reliever, going $4-7$ with a 5.38 ERA in 17 starts and l-0, 2.25 ERA out of the bullpen.
-An extreme groundball pitcher, Krauth rolled groundballs at a $50.2 \%$ clip with the Crawdads.

## 2021 SEASON

-Showing his durability, Krauth led the Low-A East and the Rangers organization with 102.2 innings pitched. He also made a team-high 20 starts.
-Earned Low-A East Pitcher of the Week twice, including once for a complete-game, onehitter on August 28th vs. Fayetteville (9.0 IP, 1 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 2 BB, 9 K).
