## Columbia Fireflies (36-37) at Charleston RiverDogs (52-21)

**Tonight's Game:** The Charleston RiverDogs (affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays) continue a 14-game homestand by welcoming the Columbia Fireflies (affiliate of the Kansas City Royals) to The Joe for the fourth game of the series. The RiverDogs enter tonight's game holding a five-game winning streak. **RiverDogs-Fireflies Season Series in 2021: Overall:** RiverDogs 12, Fireflies 7. **At The Joe:** RiverDogs 5, Fireflies 2.

**Last Time Out:** A pitcher's duel turned into a back-and-forth affair late as the RiverDogs walked off with a 3-2 win to earn a fifth straight victory. With the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth and the score tied 2-2, Alika Williams hit a fly ball to right field that caromed off the glove of Columbia right fielder Burle Dixon and allowed the winning run to score from third. With runners on the corners, Columbia chose to intentionally walk Johan Lopez, setting up Williams with the opportunity to win the game. The RiverDogs scored first on a safety squeeze bunt from Lopez in the fifth inning to break free from a scoreless draw. Columbia had struggled at the plate all night, but took the lead with two runs off Angel Felipe in the eighth inning. Heriberto Hernandez tied the game with a two-out RBI double to center that set the stage for the walk-off win in the final frame.

**Coming up Clutch:** Entering this week's series, the RiverDogs had won a game in walk-off fashion just once. With last night's walk-off sacrifice fly from Alika Williams, the RiverDogs have now won back-to-back games in this fashion. Osleivis Basabe won Tuesday night's contest with a bases loaded RBI single to right. Batting in the bottom of the ninth has not been a common occurrence for the RiverDogs this season, having lost just nine games at The Joe and holding a run differential of 148 this season.

**Loving the Long Ball:** The home run has been a big part of the RiverDogs offensive success this season and they are receiving plenty of pop from multiple sources in the lineup. The RiverDogs lead the Low-A East and are fourth in all of Low-A with 80 home runs this season. Brett Wisely, Heriberto Hernandez and Diego Infante are tied for the team lead with nine home runs, while Nick Schnell and Abiezel Ramirez both have eight.

**Top of the Heap:** The RiverDogs enter play tonight leading all of Minor League Baseball in winning percentage and tied for the most wins with Bowling Green. They have won 33 of their last 41 games. Bowling Green, the Rays High-A affiliate owns a 52-22 record. The Rays farm system leads all organizations with a .651 winnings percentage.

**Honor Roll:** For the second time this season, the RiverDogs swept Low-A East honors for Player and Pitcher of the Week (July 19-25). Brett Wisely was named player of the week after hitting .524 with a double, two home runs and eight runs batted in, while working three walks, stealing two bases and scoring six runs. He is in the midst of an 11-game hitting streak. Trey Cumbie was the league's top pitcher, picking up two wins out of the bullpen. The southpaw struck out 12 batters over 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed just two hits. The RiverDogs have now had six players receive a weekly honor from MiLB as well as the first two Low-A East Pitchers of the Month.

**Setting the Standard:** Minor League Baseball in Charleston began in 1980. In the 40 years that make up the franchise's history, the RiverDogs have only played in the league's championship series on three occasions and have never won a title. Currently holding a .712 winning percentage, the best in MiLB, the 2021 RiverDogs are on pace to set a new team record in that category. The current high-water mark was set by the 1988 Charleston Rainbows who posted a .616 winning percentage. The RiverDogs will surpass that mark by finishing 23-24 or better.

**Series of Successes:** To this point in the season, the RiverDogs have lost just one series. The only team to beat them more than three times in a six-game set was the Down East Wood Ducks in mid-May. Aside from that series, the RiverDogs have swept two series, won nine series and split two. The team has not dropped three straight games at any point.

**Prized Pups:** The RiverDogs roster contains eight members of MLB Pipeline's Top 30 Rays prospects. The highest ranked of that group is starting pitcher Cole Wilcox who came in at #7. Outfielder/catcher Heriberto Hernandez is the most highly regarded position player at #10. The rest of the list is filled out by starting pitchers Seth Johnson (#12), Taj Bradley (#17) and Ian Seymour (#19), shortstops Osleivis Basabe (#20) and Alika Williams (#21) and outfielder Nick Schnell (#26).

# **RIVERDOGS FIELD STAFF**

## **Manager: Blake Butera**

Butera is in his first season as the manager of the RiverDogs after two seasons at the helm in Hudson Valley with the Rays former short-season affiliate. He led the Renegades to a postseason berth in both seasons, including a league-most 45 wins in 2018 and a share of the league's best record in 2019. Butera coached with the Leones del Escogido in the Dominican Winter League following the cancellation of the 2020 minor league season. At the time he received the managerial job in Hudson Valley, Butera was the youngest manager (25) in all of Minor League Baseball. The native of Metairie, Louisiana was drafted by the Rays in the 35th round of the 2015 Amateur Draft out of Boston College and appeared in 80 minor league games over two seasons. At Boston College, he was voted team captain his senior year and finished his career as the Eagles' all-time leader in walks (112) and at-bats (774). His father, Barry, reached Triple-A with the Red Sox and his brother, Barry, spent two seasons in the Astros minor league system after being selected out of Boston College in the 2009 Amateur Draft.

## **Pitching Coach: R.C. Lichtenstein**

Lichtenstein begins his first year as the pitching coach for the RiverDogs and his 17<sup>th</sup> year in the Rays organization. Lichtenstein has served as pitching coach at several stops in the Rays farm system including Southwest Michigan (2005-06), Vero Beach (2007-08), Bowling Green (2009-11) and Double-A Montgomery (2012-19). Throughout his career in baseball, the 52-year old has also coached in the Milwaukee Brewers organization and managed two independent squads.

## **Hitting Coach: Wuarnner Rincones**

Rincones enters his first season with the RiverDogs after spending the 2019 season in the same role with the Princeton Rays. In total, he has spent six years as Princeton's hitting coach and four seasons with the GCL Rays. In his playing days, Rincones, spent two years (1994-95) in the farm system of the Chicago White Sox, compiling a .278 batting average over 129 career games.

## **Coach: Sean Smedley**

Smedley enters his first season on the RiverDogs staff after serving as an assistant for the Short-Season Hudson Valley Renegades in 2017 and 2018. He received his first opportunity post-playing career with the Rays as the video coordinator of the Princeton Rays in 2016 before transitioning to the coaching staff in 2017. He was slated to be the manager at Princeton before the 2020 season was canceled. As a player, Smedley was signed by Tampa Bay as an undrafted free agent in 2013 out of Texas A&M International. He played parts of three seasons in the Rays minor league system, reaching Low-A Bowling Green in 2014-15.

## **Athletic Trainer: Tsutomu Kamiya**

Kamiya enters his first season as the athletic trainer for the RiverDogs after holding the same role for two seasons with the short-season Hudson Valley Renegades. Kamiya was slated to rejoin Hudson Valley in 2020 before the season was canceled.

## **Strength Coach: James McCallie**

McCallie enters his first season as the strength and conditioning coach for Charleston and his eighth with the Rays organization. He spent 2017-19 in the same role with the Low-A Bowling Green Hot Rods. McCallie has also served as strength and conditioning coach for the GCL Rays and Port Charlotte. He graduated from the University of Alabama at Birmingham with a B.S. in Exercise Science. He holds his CSCS and RSCC through the National Strength and Conditioning Association as well as his USAW Level 1 through USA Weightlifting.
