NEWS AND NOTES		
SUNDAY CROW DOWN: Brewers no. 23-rated prospect Coleman Crow will make his 10th Triple-A appearance and ninth start for the Sounds this year in Sunday's series finale against Norfolk. It'll be his third start against the Tides this season and he enters the night 1-0 with a 1.74 ERA agianst the Tides. Across 10.1 IP he has struck out 13 while surrendering just four walks and allowed two earned on seven hits. In game two of a doubleheader against Norfolk at First Horizon Park on April 30, the right-hander worked 5.2 scoreless innings while allowing one hit and matched his season high with seven strikeouts. BROCKET LAUNCHER: Brewers no. 19-rated prospect Brock Wilken launched his ninth home run of the season and ended an 0-for-14 stretch at the plate since his last hit left the yard with a grand slam July 10 on the road in Charlotte. Wilken leads the club with 51 RBI this season and is in a four-way tie for eighth in the Brewers farm system in RBI. He has tied his single-season career-high in RBI, a mark he set in 2024 in 108 games with Double-A Biloxi and reached 51 RBI this season in just 81 games. Of his nine home runs this season, six have been go-ahead home runs. NO LIES: Right-hander Lyon Richardson set his Sounds-high with four strikeouts over 2.0 IP in relief of Colton Gordon on Saturday night. The four strikeouts were his most since striking out five on	May 13 against Indianapolis when he was pitching for Triple-A Louisville. It was his eighth appearance without allowing a hit and just the second in which he worked 2+ innings along with retiring all eight he faced on April 15 also with Louisville against Toledo. BETTER LATE: For the second straight night, Tyler Black had to wait until his last at-bat to extend his on-base and hitting streaks. Black singled in the bottom of the eighth on Saturday night to reach base for the 23rd consecutive game and push his hitting streak to nine games. He is now the only Nashville player this season to have multiple hitting streaks of 9+ games after also recording a team-best 11-game hitting streak earlier this season (3/28-5/14). Since beginning his on-base streak on June 13, Black is hitting .295 (23-for-78) with nine XBH, 16 RBI, 19 BB, and 22 runs scored and has a hit in 18 of his last 23 games. The 23-game on-base streak for Black remains tied for the sixth-longest active streak in the International League. Brewers no. 8-rated prospect Jeferson Quero also extended his already season-long hitting streak to six games with a single in the bottom of the ninth. HURTS TO BE: Jacob Hurtubise appeared in his first game with Nashville since May 31 and proceeded to record his fourth multi-hit game with the Sounds this season. Hurtubise finished the night 2-for-3 with a double, walk, and run scored. Saturday night was his 27th appearance of the season with Nashville and he	had 26 games with Double-A Biloxi where he hit .317 (26-for-82) with four doubles, four triples, and 19 RBI. Saturday night was his first XBH of the season with the Sounds. He hit in the leadoff spot for the first time with Nashville this season and his first time in the starting lineup hitting higher than the 7th spot. NUKE ADAMS: Luke Adams belted his 12th homer of the season with a solo shot to left field in the bottom of the second inning Friday night. The 12 homers for Adams are the most on the current active roster this season and a new single-season career-high with a single affiliate, passing the three other times he finished with 11 homers for Double-A Biloxi (2025), High-A Wisconsin (2024) and Single-A Carolina (2023). His 15 home runs in the minors this year are the most in a season during his five year professional career and are tied for the fifth-most in the farm system this season along with Eric Bitonti (WIS). His second inning solo blast marked his first career hit against the Tides in nine at-bats in his first year of Triple-A ball. THE HARD WAY: Tyson Hardin tossed his fifth quality start of the season for the Sounds and sixth overall this year on Friday night. He went 6.0 innings, allowed a run on three hits and struck out two, facing 22 total batters. It marked his 12th career quality start in his three-year career. Hardin is tied for fifth in the International League this season in quality starts and tied for ninth in Triple-A.
