Gauthier Gets On: Austin Gauthier ranks atop many hitting statistics in the Midwest League. He ranks first in average (.418), first in hits (33) and first in on-base percentage (.529) in 22 games played. The 23-year-old currently has a 15-game on-base streak that started on April 15th. He is the only man batting .400 in the MWL.

STONE TO THE SHOW: Gavin Stone made his MLB debut on Wednesday for the Los Angeles Dodgers getting the start against the Philadelphia Phillies. Stone pitched four innings, permitting four runs. The right-hander made his mark in Midland across the 2021 and 2022 seasons, pitching 56 innings and attaining 65 strikeouts.

Mr. 100: Michael Busch became the 100th former Great Lakes Loon to reach the majors. Busch started as the designated hitter for the Los Angeles Dodgers on April 25th at PNC Park against the Pirates. He went 1-3 with an RBI single in a 8-7 win. LHP Jose Hernandez became the 99th former Loon to reach the majors on April 1 with the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Oh What a RUSH: Dalton Rushing was named the Midwest League Player of the Week for April 17-23. The Dodgers seventh ranked prospect according to MLB Pipeline, had three home runs, drove in 10 runs and walked eight times. Rushing's 17 RBI and .433 on-base percentage currently ranks tied for seventh and fifth respectively in the Midwest League.

Tice is Nice: Yon Castro was named the Midwest League Pitcher of the week for April 24 through April 30. The right hander (nicknamed "Tice" or "Tys" after boxer Mike Tyson due to a similar resemblance) worked five innings against the Fort Wayne TinCaps on April 29. He permitted just one hit, with no runs and four strikeouts.

MiLB Saves Leader: Reliever Jake Pilarski leads all of Minor League Baseball with eight saves in nine attempts. It is the 24-year-old's first year in affiliated baseball after being signed by the Dodgers in December 2022.

Bullish Bullpen: Great Lakes relievers have worked 55 innings in the last 11 games. Posting 62 strikeouts while capping opponents to just 17 runs and 36 hits. Nine of those 11 games were Loons wins, seven of the nine winning pitchers were Great Lakes relievers.

Loons not too late: Great Lakes has scored nearly 46 percent of their 123 runs this season in the seventh inning and beyond. 20 in the seventh and 24 in the eighth, while nine have come in the ninth and three in the tenth. The Loons have plated 11 runs in the seventh inning and beyond in this series.

Every Day is K Day: Through the first 25 games, the Great Lakes Loons lead all the Midwest League in pitcher strikeouts with 282. They were the first team to reach 200.

Walk-a-thon: Loons hitters have walked 132 times this season, leading the Midwest League. 35 times through the first five games this series. Great Lakes pitching has issued the most walks in the Midwest League with 142. That's an average of 5.4 base on balls allowed per game.

21 HR in 25 Games: The Loons are tied for third in the MWL with 21 home runs. 13 on the road and eight at Dow Diamond.

One Hit, That's It: Great Lakes permitted just one hit in Dayton, Ohio in April 14th's 1-0 win. Ben Casparius, Braydon Fisher, Antonio Knowles and Jake Pilarski combined to strikeout 10 Dragons on just 105 pitches. The most recent one-hitter before that was June 15, 2022 when GL defeated Wisconsin 5-0.

Knowles Knows: The June 15, 2022 one-hitter was a combination effort from Carlos Duran, Emmet Sheehan, Antonio Knowles, Jeff Belge and Kevin Malisheski. So Knowles has been apart of the last two one-hitters in Loons history.

Loons Coaching Staff

MANAGER

Daniel Nava

The Los Angeles Dodgers announced Daniel Nava as the Loons' tenth manager in the 16-year history of the franchise. Nava, 39, enters his third year coaching in the Dodgers organization after managing the ACL Dodgers in 2021 and serving as bench coach for Single-A Rancho Cucamonga in 2022. The switch hitting outfielder played parts of seven seasons in the Major Leagues and won a World Series in 2013 as a key contributor for the Boston Red Sox. In that championship season for Boston, Nava finished eighth in the American League in batting average (.303). He famously powered a grand slam on the first pitch he saw in his Major League debut in June 12, 2010 for the Red Sox. Nava, a native of Redwood City, CA, also played in the big leagues for the Tampa Bay Rays (2015), Los Angeles Angels (2016), Kansas City Royals (2016) and Philadelphia Phillies (2017). He finished his Major League career with a .266 batting average, .357 on-base percentage, 29 home runs and 206 RBIs. His final professional season as a player was in 2019 with the independent Kansas City T-Bones. After playing baseball at St. Francis High School in Mountain View, California, Nava enrolled at Santa Clara University. He attempted to walk-on to the baseball team unsuccessfully and became the equipment manager. After two years, Nava enrolled at the College of San Mateo, a junior college, due to no longer being able to afford Santa Clara's tuition. Santa Clara would bring Nava back on a full scholarship after being an All-American at San Mateo. Despite a stellar senior season, Nava went undrafted, and signed with the Chico Outlaws of the now defunct Golden Baseball League in 2007. His 1.100 OPS there led to the Red Sox discovering and signing Nava to a minor-league deal, after Boston paid the one dollar rights fee.

PITCHING COACH

David Anderson

David Anderson continues his rise through the ranks of the Dodgers organization as the pitching coach for the Loons in 2022. Anderson, 27, joined the L.A. system as a development coach in 2020, and was assigned as the pitching coach for the organization's Arizona Complex League team last season. He led his staff to the fourth-lowest ERA in the ACL at 4.06, the third-most strikeouts (617 in 488.0 innings pitched), and the second-best walks and hits per innings pitched. Anderson, a 2015 graduate of Muhlenberg College, got his start in coaching at his alma mater, serving as pitching coach for the NCAA Division III school in Allentown, Pa., for two years immediately after his graduation. After that, he became a volunteer assistant for Cornell in 2017 before landing at Atlanta's Emory University, serving as the school's pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. While in the college ranks, Anderson also got head coaching experience in summer collegiate ball as manager of the Watertown (N.Y.) Rapids of the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League in 2018, leading the team to a 26-21 record in its inaugural season. He then went on to manage the now-defunct Fayetteville (N.C.) SwampDogs of the Coastal Plain League in 2019. Anderson, a native of Syracuse, N.Y., tossed four seasons at Muhlenberg. As a junior in 2014, he posted a 3.14 ERA over 63.0 innings, all as a starter. He walked just seven batters that season while striking out 28. He served as team captain as a senior, and led the team that year in innings pitched and strikeouts. After college, Anderson tested the waters in independent baseball. He appeared 16 times for the Newburgh Newts of the North Country Baseball League, with a stellar 2.38 ERA and seven saves. He then threw to a 2.67 ERA with the Bridgeport Bluefish of the Atlantic League, an MLB Partner League.

PITCHING COACH

Richard De Los Santos

Richard De Los Santos returns for a second year as a member of the coaching staff after serving as Assistant Pitching Coach last season. This year, Anderson and De Los Santos will share the title of Pitching Coach. The 38-year-old De Los Santos had a nine-year minor league career as a right-handed pitcher, mostly in the Tampa Bay system. He played a portion of the 2005 season for the Southwest Michigan Devil Rays in Battle Creek, who would be purchased in 2006 by the Michigan Baseball Foundation and become the Loons in 2007. De Los Santos pitched in 36 games over three seasons for Triple-A Durham, racking up 99 strikeouts in 169 1/3 innings at MiLB's highest level. Over the course of nine seasons in affiliated baseball, the Dominican Republic native accumulated up over 400 strikeouts on the mound.

HITTING COACH

O'Koyea Dickson

O'Koyea Dickson, 33, returns to Dow Diamond in a coaching role after spending the 2012 season as a player with the Loons. He was drafted in the 12th round of the 2011 draft by the Dodgers, and made his Major League debut with the club in 2017. 2023 marks Dickson's second year coaching in the Dodgers organization after he worked with Manager Nava with Single-A Rancho Cucamonga in 2022 as the team's Hitting Coach. The 2022 Rancho Cucamonga team had the most hits and RBIs in the California League under Dickson's direction. The California native made his Major League debut in September of 2017 for the Dodgers, and appeared in a total of seven games after an injury cut his time in Los Angeles short. His lone hit in the big leagues came off Madison Bumgarner of the San Francisco Giants on September 23, 2017. He hit 24 home runs and drove in 76 runs in that 2017 season for Triple-A Oklahoma City. For the next two years, Dickson had stints in Nippon Professional Baseball, the Atlantic League, the Mexican League and the Pacific Association before entering coaching. Notably in 2007, as a fifteen year old sophomore at George Washington High School, Dickson became the first high-schooler to hit a home run at Oracle Park, then AT&T Park.

BENCH COACH

Elían Herrera

Former Loon Elían Herrera is back for a third season as the bench coach for Great Lakes. Herrera, a four-year big leaguer, begins his fifth season as a coach within the Dodgers' organization. The second baseman played over 20 games with the Loons in a span of two separate seasons, including the inaugural 2007 Great Lakes Loons, along with nine other future Major Leaguers. He also returned to the Loons for a portion of the 2009 season. From 2012-2018, Herrera played in 324 games at the AAA level, holding a .310 batting average in nearly 1200 plate appearances. Herrera made his major league debut on May 15, 2012 at Dodger Stadium, in a game where Kirk Gibson managed the Arizona Diamondbacks vs. Don Mattingly's Dodgers. Before joining the Loons staff in 2021, Herrera was the bench coach for the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in 2019, helping lead the team to the playoffs after an 81-57 finish in the regular season, good for first in the South division of the California League.

2022: Called up from Low-A Rancho Cucamonga on May 28 in corresponding move to Jose Hernandez's promotion.

2021: Appeared in just five games in pro ball logging three innings each in the ACL and in Low-A Rancho Cucamonga.

Draft: Selected by the Los Angeles Dodgers in the 5th round (162nd overall) of the 2021 draft signing for \$247,500.

College: Spent first two years of his collegiate career at North Carolina, where he went two-way. Hit .260/.348/.323 in 96 ABs over two seasons. Tossed 27.0 innings and allowed 10 ER. Transferred to UConn after 2019, and sat out in 2020 due to transfer rules after his waiver was denied by the NCAA. Transitioned to pitcher-only for 2021. Named to second-team all-Big East in 2021, with a 4.03 ERA in 91.2 IP in 15 starts. He also tallied 127 strikeouts in his 2021 junior season which is second in single-season UConn history.

Summer Ball: Split time in 2019 with the Ocean State Waves of the NECBL and the Falmouth Commodores in the Cape Cod League. Spent 2020 with the New Britain Bees of the Futures League where he was teammates with current teammate Emmet Sheehan.

High School: Went to Staples HS in Westport, CT where he led the Wreckers to the Class LL state title. No. 1 overall player in CT per Perfect Game. Named 2017 Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year. All-time hits leader in the state of Connecticut.
