LHP Josh Rogers (NR) vs. RHP Walker Buehler (0-1, 8.10)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque needs to win the final two games of the series to avoid losing their second-straight series after Oklahoma City has taken three of the first four contests ... Josh Rogers is expected to take the hill for his first start of the year while Walker Buehler is slated to make his second rehab start with Oklahoma City.

SWIPIN' BAGS: The Isotopes stole three bases last night. Albuquerque is 9-of-10 over the four games against Oklahoma City after stealing 40-of-50 last year against the club. Additionally, the Isotopes has swiped a bag in all seven contests in 2024. The club's 13 stolen bags (one caught stealing) are tied for the thirdmost in Triple-A.

THREE-BAGGERS: Albuquerque has a Triple-A-leading eight triples on the year ... They have seven games played this season. They have a three-bagger in four of the

CLOSE CALLS: Albuquerque's first seven games have all been decided by either one or two runs, the first occurrence of this ever taking place. Five contests have been decided by one run.

DEFICIT: Albuquerque (2-5) has lost five games this season by a combined seven runs

RISP: Last night, the Isotopes went 2-for-7 with runners in scoring position. Additionally, the club is just 6-for-45 with RISP over the last four games.

FIRST FRAME: For the fourth-straight game, the Isotopes plated a run in the first frame, tallying a single run in the frame in each of the first four contests of the series ... The last time the club scored a run in four-straight was May 2-5, 2023, vs. Sugar Land.

EXIT VELO: Of the seven batted balls registered at 100 MPHplus yesterday, the Isotopes recorded four of them, with just two going for base hits. Hunter Goodman's sixth-inning single (108.1 MPH) and Sean Bouchard's first-inning double (107.7 MPH) were the second and third hardest hit balls of the night, respectively.

ERROR 404: After committing just one error over their first four games, the Isotopes have made eight over their last three contests, including two last night and three in each of the previous two games

BULLPEN: Albuquerque's bullpen has allowed just one earned run over its last 8.2 frames.

NO WALK FOR YOU: The Isotopes did not walk a batter last night, the first time doing so since Aug. 5, 2023, vs. Las Vegas.

BOUCHIE THE BRUIN: Sean Bouchard recorded two hits, including a double, and an RBI yesterday. Has tallied an extrabase hit in all six games he's played to begin the year (four triples and four doubles). The last player to have a longer extra-base hit streak was teammate Sam Hilliard (seven-straight, April 2019). Bouchard has four multi-hit games this year to lead the team.

TOTAL BASES: Bouchard's 24 total bases are tied for the thirdmost in Triple-A (leader: Heston Kjerstad, 38). He is also one of 12 Triple-A players to have an active hit streak of at least six games to begin the season.

MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck went 1-for-3 Thursday with a double, two RBI and a walk, ending a four-game streak with two punchouts in each contest. He tallied his third multi-RBI game of the year and second-straight game with a double. He has reached base in all six contests he's played this year.

BECK EXIT VELO: Beck tallied two exit velocities over 100 MPH Thursday: 108.2 MPH double and 101.9 MPH flyout. Out of his 13 balls in play, nine have been over 100-MPH

IT'S ALL GOOD, MAN: Hunter Goodman registered two hits last night for his second multi-hit game of the year. Has reached base in 18 of the 21 Triple-A games he's played while tallying a hit in 16. Of Goodman's 16 balls hit into play this year, seven have an exit velocity over 100-MPH ... In seven career games at Chickasaw Bricktown Ballpark, he is 15-for-32 with nine-extra base hits and 14 RBI.

ON-BASE STREAK: Coco Montes' 19-game on-base streak came to an end last night after going 0-for-4 with two punchouts ... He has gone hitless in two-straight games for the first time since Sept. 1-2, 2023.

STARTERS: The 5.0 frames completed by Ty Blach yesterday tied the longest start for Isotopes (three times; last: Noah Davis, April 3 at Oklahoma City).

PUT IT ON THE BOARD: Albuquerque was held to one run or fewer for the first time since being shutout at Oklahoma City Aug. 27, 2023.

TIME OF GAME: Last night's game lasted just 2:01, the fastest nine-inning contest since the 2023 season finale against Oklahoma City Sept. 24 in the Duke City.

2024 FIRST-HALF SCHEDULE: The Isotopes will face six teams over the 75 games in the first half, which ends June 23, with 45 contests against Oklahoma City (24) and El Paso (21).

PROTONS & NEUTRONS BY THE NUMBERS

Of the 264 all-time meetings between the Isotopes 79 Redhawks/Dodgers/Baseball Club, 79 (29%) have been decided by one run. Albuquerque is 38-41 in such contests.

Sam Hilliard, 62 dingers, is four home runs away from tying the Isotopes all-time individual record by a player, set by Jordan 62 Patterson from 2016-18.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
