Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Heath Fillmyer to the mound tonight, looking to halt a two game skid. Toledo will counter with RHP Ricardo Pinto. The Clippers are 20-20 (.500) against right handers this year. Pinto has faced the Clippers six times in his career, going 2-2 with a 5.87ERA (23.0IP, 28H, 15R, 15ER, 11BB, 20K).

vs. the Mud Hens

Columbus went 14-9 against the Mud Hens in 2019, snapping a two year losing streak (7-13 in 2018, 10-13 in 2017), while posting a margin of 4.6 in wins (seven by 4+) and losing by an average of 5.6 (six by 4+). Of the last 19 played between the two, 10 have been decided by at least five runs. Andres Gimenez has hit .333 (16x48) with 5HR and 12RBI against Toledo this season (11G).

Cooling Off

Over the last 20G, Columbus and Toledo are tied for the best record in the IL (13-7). The Clippers came into the series as the hottest team in the IL, but have lost two straight to the Mud Hens (led 1-0 after first two innings of the series, outscored 12-2 since). At the plate, the Clippers have drawn only 3BB in the last 2G (5-10 with 2BB or fewer) to go against 23K (11-18 with at least 10K).

Getting the Call

Alex Call was promoted from Akron Tuesday and has gone 4x9 with 2HR in 2G. Call used a hot June (.329, 27x82) to climb into the top ten of the EL batting race (9th, .310) and also populated the top ten in OBP (10th, .389), doubles (7th, 13), runs (6th, 34) and steals (2nd, 12) at the time of his call up. His 2HR game last night was his second of the month (6/4 vs. Erie) and fourth of his career.

Hammering Gimenez

Andres Gimenez homered in each of six games from 6/13-6/19, after never having homered in consecutive games in his career (7HR, 19RBI and an .806SLG since 6/13, all tops in the IL). Prior to his surge, Gimenez laid down three sac bunts over four games from 6/6-6/9 (3-0 when Gimenez executes a sac bunt, 6-2 when he homers). However, Gimenez has missed his last four sac bunt attempts.

7-7-7 Jackpot

Through 6/24, only Ernie Clement had posted a hitting streak of at least 7G for Columbus. Daniel Johnson reached 7G on 6/25 (lost it the next night; .346, 9x26 from 6/18-6/25), Gabriel Arias hit 7G on 6/28 (ended at 8G; .400, 12x30 from 6/19-6/29) and Andres Gimenez hit 7G on 6/29 (now 8G; .393, 11x28 since 6/22). Gimenez has now hit in 14 of his last 15 (.355, 22x62).

Work to Do

Owen Miller has six hitless games in 13 chances since his return to Columbus (four hitless games in 16G before promotion), batting .200 (8x40). He went hitless in four straight from 6/18-6/22 (14AB) and has seen his average sink to .327 (season low). Miller is 10PA short of qualifying for the batting title and adding them as hitless at bats would place him in 9th (would rank 9th in OBP).

Take Two

The double from Nolan Jones last night was his IL-best 17th of the year (Oscar Mercado is tied for 4th, 13). As a team, the Clippers doubled in 26 straight from 5/22-6/20 and 46 of 49 on the year (doubleless in 25 games during 2019, 11 times in first 48). Jones is slugging .595 over his last 22G, collecting 12 doubles, a triple, 3HR (6XBH through first 26G) and only 18K (had 43K in first 26G).

Welcome Sight

Ryan Lavarnway is back in the lineup tonight, after a brief trip to Cleveland (6/17-6/23, DFA'd on 6/24). In Lavarnway's absence, Clipper catchers went a combined 5x41 with 0XBH and 5RBI (Roberto Perez was 2x9 on rehab). Lavarnway had struggled over his last 6G in Columbus, going 2x19 with an RBI after reaching .300 on 6/4, but was 3x11 with a double in the Major Leagues.

Road Warrior

Connor Marabell reached base in nine of 10 on the Indy-lowa roadtrip, batting .387 (12x31). He kept up his hot hitting on the road with a double last night, with his career average in opposing IL parks at .299 (44x147), compared to a dismal .194 (33x170) in Huntington Park. Marabell was hitting .286 after the Toledo series on 6/20, but went 2x16 vs. St. Paul to sink to .263 (2x7 in the current series).

This Date in Clipper History

Ronny Rodriguez hit a pair of go-ahead homers, a solo shot in the 3rd and a 3-run blast in the 6th, to lead the Clippers to a 5-4 win at McCoy Stadium in Pawtucket. After hitting 2HR through 6/30 (261AB), Ronny hit 8HR over the rest of the year (189AB) to turn in his 4th season of double digit homers in six years. Unfortunately for the Clippers, he got hurt right before the IL Playoffs and appeared in only one game.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (967 to 925).

Record Destruction

The Clippers broke the established mark for homers in a season (182 in 1983) on 8/7/19 and finished with a total of 213 (most in the IL). From 5/14-6/2, they homered in 20 straight games (44HR total) and they had seven straight multi-HR games from 6/14-6/21 (22HR). On the mound, they broke the record for homers allowed (156 in 1998) on 7/31/19, giving up 198 for the year (2nd most in the IL).

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in win percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 10-26 (.278) in games in which they trail, ranking

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; two straight extra-inning losses following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.22 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.76ERA at Huntington Park is by far the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Doing Damage

In 2019, the Clippers ranked tied for 5th in the IL with 112RBI with the bases loaded, while carrying a .252 average (10th, 36x143, 4HR). In both 2017 and 2018, the Clippers led the IL in RBI with the bases loaded (243RBI total) and paced the circuit in grand slams (16 total, no other team had more than eight).

Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 5th (475K, 37 off the pace, St. Paul). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.69K per game.

That's More Like It

In 2019, the Clippers were 50-30 (.625) when playing errorless baseball, while turning in a 31-29 (.517) mark with at least one error. Contrary to logic, in 2018 they actually had a worse winning percentage when playing mistake free (.514), than when committing at least one error (.530). The Clipper defense finished 1st in 2019 (.983) after falling to 6th in the IL in 2018, ending a run of three consecutive seasons ranked among the top three (2015-17 resulted in the three best seasons in franchise history).

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). From 4/13-4/20/19, the Clippers hit 16 leadoff doubles over 72 innings, including four straight innings in a win at Louisville on 4/15/19.

Good Baseball

Oscar Mercado advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/26 vs. St. Paul and the runner came around to score in the loss (3-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes, Eric Haase, Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 53-72 (.424), 23-26 with Columbus (.469).
