

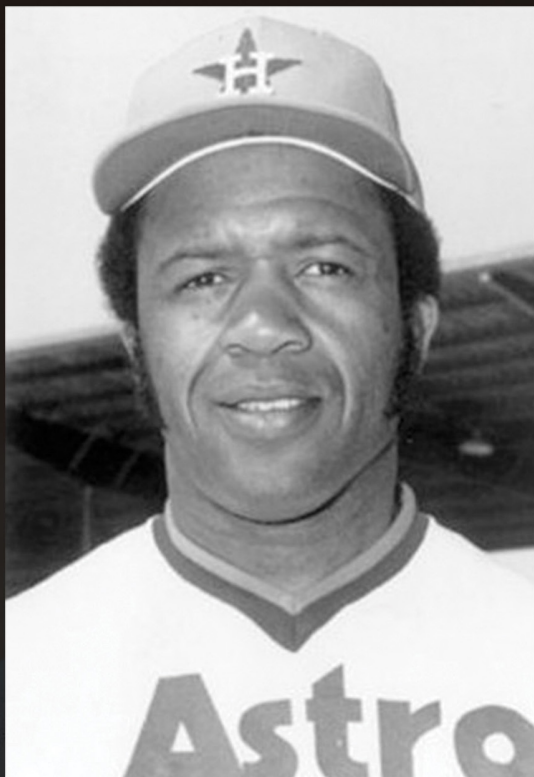

# MICKEY STOREY

# 17 MANAGER

## COACHING CAREER

Development Coach, Buies Creek (2016); Manager, Quad Cities (2018); Manager, Round Rock (2019); Manager, Sugar Land (2021-present)

Storey enters his sixth year as the manager of the Astros Triple-A affiliate and fourth in Sugar Land. He reached the 300-win mark in his managerial career on September 2, 2022, with a 9-2 win over the Albuquerque Isotopes. Storey has recorded a winning record in three of his first five seasons in his MiLB managerial career. Following the 2022 season, Storey managed the Surprise Saguaros of the Arizona Fall League. He led Surprise to a 19-10 record, good for the best record in the Arizona Fall League, and managed the Saguaros to the Arizona Fall League title with a 7-6 win in 11 innings over Glendale.

Storey was named Sugar Land's manager prior to the 2021 season and guided the team to a 75-55 record and a Triple-A West, East Division title in the franchise's first campaign as an Astros' affiliate. The Skeeters tied for the sixth-best record in all of Triple-A with Storey at the helm.

During the pandemic-shortened 2020 season, Storey was the manager for the Astros Alternate Training Site upon in Corpus Christi. He also led the Astros Alternate Training Site at the beginning of the 2021 season, prior to the start of the Minor League season in early May.

The former Major Leaguer helped lead Triple-A Round Rock to the top record in the Pacific Coast League in 2019 (84-56) while winning the American Southern Division. Round Rock defeated the Iowa Cubs in five games in the Divisional Round, advancing to the Pacific Coast League Championship Series before ultimately falling to the Sacramento River Cats.

Storey first began coaching in the Astros system in 2016 as a development coach for Class-A Advanced Buies Creek. He received his first managerial job in 2018 with Class-A Quad Cities. He led Quad Cities to an 81-59 record in his lone season as the manager, which was the second-best record in the Midwest League, winning the Western Division.

Prior to his coaching career, Storey logged a nine-year professional career as a right-handed pitcher. He made his Major League debut in 2012 with the Astros and appeared in the Majors in 2013 as well as a member of the Toronto Blue Jays. He made a total of 29 appearances at the Major League level (all in relief), including 26 with the Astros. Storey had his best Major League season with the Astros in 2012, going 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA and striking out 34 batters through 30.1 innings pitched.

The Oakland A's selected Storey in the 31st round of the 2008 MLB Draft from Florida Atlantic University. His professional career spanned from 2008-16, pitching in the A's organization (2008-11), Astros (2011-12), Blue Jays (2013-14), Los Angeles Dodgers (2015) and independent Somerset Patriots of the Atlantic League (2015-16). Storey also appeared in the Mexican Pacific Winter League, the Venezuelan Winter League, Dominican Winter League and the Arizona Fall League. He amassed a total of 385 appearances at the professional level, recording a career 3.52 ERA (682.1IP) with 44 saves. During his time as a player, he pitched in the Pacific Coast League for the Sacramento River Cats and the Oklahoma City RedHawks.

Storey finished his career at Florida Atlantic second on the school's all-time strikeout list and tied for second in wins. He also finished top 10 in school history in strikeouts per nine innings, games started, fewest walks per nine innings and innings pitched. He was selected by the Minnesota Twins in the 22nd round of the 2007 MLB Draft out of Florida Atlantic as well but did not sign.

## COACHING CAREER

Head Baseball Coach, Pleasant Valley HS (Chico, CA) (2016-2018); Pitching Coach, Fayetteville (2019-2020); Director of Player Development/Director of Camps, University of Arizona (2021); Pitching Coach, Corpus Christi (2022); Assisting Pitching Coordinator, Houston Astros (2023-present); Pitching Coach, Sugar Land (2024)

Whitsett joins the Space Cowboys coaching staff for his first season at Triple-A in 2024. The former right-handed pitcher spent the 2023 season as an assistant pitching coordinator for the Astros' Minor League system. In 2022, Whitsett rejoined the Astros organization as the pitching coach for the Double-A Corpus Christi Hooks.

Whitsett spent one season outside of the Astros organization, serving as the Director of Player Development/Director of Camps for the University of Arizona Wildcats baseball team.

Heading into 2020, Whitsett was scheduled to return to Single-A Fayetteville as the teams' pitching coach prior to the cancellation of the Minor League season due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

2019 was the first season for Whitsett in the Astros organization, serving as the pitching coach for High-A Fayetteville in the Carolina League. Prior to joining the Astros, Whitsett was the head coach at Pleasant Valley High School in Chico, California from 2016 to 2018.

During his playing days, Whitsett was a right-handed hurler at UNLV from 2008 to 2010. In his freshman year with the Runnin' Rebels, Whitsett appeared in 18 games, starting 13 of them, which tied for the team lead. He also led the staff in innings pitched in 2008, throwing 75.1 frames.



# AARON WESTLAKE

## COACHING CAREER

Development Coach, FCL Astros (2021); Hitting Coach, Corpus Christi (2022); Hitting Coach, Sugar Land (2023-present)

2024 is Westlake's second season as the hitting coach for the Space Cowboys. In 2023, he handled the duties as hitting coach for Sugar Land and saw the Space Cowboys homer in 17 consecutive games from June 6 through June 24, the most consecutive games with a home run in franchise history.

Prior to joining the Space Cowboys, Westlake was the hitting coach for Double-A Corpus Christi, where the Hooks finished third in the Texas League in walks, fifth in runs scored and fifth in OPS. Westlake first joined the Astros organization in 2021, working as a development coach for the Florida Complex League Astros at the Astros Spring Training Complex in West Palm Beach.

Westlake was the owner of 'Driven Elite Baseball' from July 2020 to November 2022 and also co-owned 'Driven Elite Fitness & Health' from June 2015 to December 2021 in North Texas.

As a player, Westlake played four years at Vanderbilt. He redshirted in 2008 during his freshman season, missing the final two months of the season because of a blood clotting issue. In 2009, Westlake was named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American and named to the All-SEC Freshman Team after batting .377 in 63 games with 10 home runs, 57 RBI and 53 runs scored. He won the SEC batting title while playing catcher for the Commodores, tying for the team led in home runs.

He continued his hot hitting in 2010, batting .308 with 16 doubles, 14 home runs and 61 RBI, leading Vanderbilt in home runs for a second consecutive season. Westlake was named to the SEC All-Tournament Team and was recognized as part of the NCAA Louisville Regional All-Tournament Team. He was drafted in the 22nd Round of the 2010 draft by the Toronto Blue Jays but did not sign.

In his last year at Vanderbilt, Westlake hit .344 with 18 home runs, again a team high, bashing eight home runs in SEC play. He helped Vanderbilt reach the College World Series for the first time in program history in 2011. Following the 2011 season, he was selected in the 3rd Round of the 2011 Draft by the Detroit Tigers. He played four season in the Minor Leagues, primarily playing as a first baseman, slashing .255/.316/.406 with 90 doubles, seven triples, 35 home runs and 203 RBI, last playing for Double-A Erie in 2014.

## COACHING CAREER

Coach, Greenville Astros (2014 & 2016); Coach, Gulf Coast League Astros (2015); Manager, Gulf Coast League Astros (2017-2019); Manager, Florida Complex League (2021); Interim Manager, Fayetteville (2021); Development Coach, Sugar Land (2022-present)

Sutil begins his third season as the Space Cowboys developmental coach in 2024, working as the team's defensive coach, first base coach and primary base running coach. Under Sutil's tutelage in 2023, the Space Cowboys posted their highest fielding percentage (.981) in franchise history, which tied for the second-best fielding percentage in the Pacific Coast League that season.

A veteran of the Astros' organization as a coach since 2014, Sutil worked as the manager for the Florida Complex League Astros in 2021 and served as the manager of the Florida Complex League Astros in 2017, 2018 and 2019, compiling a 107-109 record. He also spent a season as a coach for the Florida Complex League Astros, sandwiched between two seasons as a coach for the Rookie-Level Greenville Astros of the Appalachian League in 2014 and 2016.

Sutil had a 10-year professional career as an infielder, spending eight seasons in the Astros system and one in the Arizona Diamondbacks system. He reached Triple-A with both the Astros and Diamondbacks. Sutil also had stints in the Venezuelan Winter League and the independent Atlantic League. While in the Astros minor league system, Sutil was named to five All-Star teams, including being named a Texas League Midseason All-Star on three occasions, as well as a Texas League Postseason All-Star and New York Penn-League All-Star. Sutil was also selected to the Atlantic League All-Star game while with the Southern Maryland Blue Crabs. Sutil was a base-stealing threat throughout his career, surpassing 20 stolen bases in five of his seasons within the Astros minor league system. He hit .269 with 261 RBI, 194 stolen bases and a .337 on-base percentage throughout his MiLB career, and is the Corpus Christi all-time leader in hits (341) and second all-time in stolen bases (69).

# TJ Burgmann

## BULLPEN CATCHER

Burgmann enters his first season as the Space Cowboys bullpen catcher. Along with catching bullpens throughout the day and during Space Cowboys game at home and on the road, Burgmann helps with advanced scouting and pitcher preparation.

# 2023 CLUB NOTES

**ABOUT THE 2023 SEASON:** The Sugar Land Space Cowboys finished the season 61-89 overall, going 33-42 in the first half and 28-47 in the second half... The Space Cowboys longest winning streak in 2023 was six games on two occasions, first from 6/7 through 6/13 and then from 9/17 to 9/23... Sugar Land's season-long losing streak was 10 games from 8/10 through 8/20.

**SERIES-OSUPLY SPEAKING:** Sugar Land went 6-15-2 in six-game series in 2023, 0-1 in seven-game series and 1-1 in three-game series... The Space Cowboys went 4-8-1 overall at Constellation Field in 2023.

**DEBUT SEASON:** Three members of the 2023 Space Cowboys made their Major League debut with the Houston Astros in 2023... RHP JP France was called up on May 4 and made his Major League debut on May 6 vs. SEA... INF Grae Kessinger had his contract selected on June 6 and made his debut on June 7 @ TOR... Finally, RHP Shawn Dubin was recalled on June 18 and debuted the following night on June 19 vs. NYM.... Four other former Space Cowboys made their Major League debuts in 2023, with OF Corey Julks making the Astros Opening Day roster and debuting on 3/31, C César Salazar also made the Astros' Opening Day Roster and debuted on April 2, INF Enmanuel Valdez debuted with BOS on April 19 and RHP Nick Hernandez made his Major League debut with SD on September 12.

**PROSPECTING:** Sugar Land ended 2023 with nine of the Astros' Top 30 prospects on their roster, including RHP Spencer Arrighetti (#3), OF Joey Loperfido (#6), LHP Colton Gordon (#7), RHP Rhett Kouba (#9), OF Pedro León (#13), OF Justin Dirden (#14), INF Will Wagner (#15), INF Shay Whitcomb (#25) & RHP Misael Tamarez (#30).

**LOWDOWN ON LOPERFIDO:** OF Joey Loperfido was promoted to Sugar Land on August 15 and finished off his 2023 with the Space Cowboys in which he was named the Astros' Minor League Player of the Year by the Astros' Player Development department and the Astros' Minor League Player of the Year by Baseball America.

Loperfido reached safely in 25 of 31 games that he started with Sugar Land and hit safely in 20 of his 31 starts, slashing .235/.333/.403 with 5 doubles, 5 home runs, 16 RBI and 15 runs scored.

The 24-year-old led the Astros' organization in hits (130), extra-base hits (55) and doubles (27) while finishing 2nd in home runs (25), RBI (78) and total bases (238), 3rd in average (.278), slugging percentage (.510) and OPS (.880), T-3rd in runs scored (79), 4th in OBP (.370) and walks (65) & 5th in stolen bases (27).

**ARRIGHETTI OF MEATBALLS:** RHP Spencer Arrighetti was named the Astros' Minor League Pitcher of the Year and made 15 of his 28 appearances in 2023 with Sugar Land... Between Corpus Christi and Sugar Land, Arrighetti went 9-7 with a 4.40 ERA, throwing a career-high 124.2 innings and striking out 141 batters... The righty was 2nd in the Astros' organization in wins, 3rd in strikeouts, games started, innings pitched & batting average against (.217), 4th in WHIP (1.25) and 6th in ERA... Arrighetti made Constellation Field a fortress, going 2-1 with a 1.93 ERA in nine appearances, throwing 42.0 innings and allowing just nine total runs.

**WHIT-BOMB:** INF Shay Whitcomb hit 35 total home runs between Sugar Land (23) and Corpus Christi (12) in 2023, claiming the Joe Bauman Award for the most home runs in Minor League Baseball in 2023.

His 35 home runs were the most home runs for an Astros' Minor Leaguer since Kyle Tucker hit 34 in 2019 with Round Rock, and was tied for the second most home runs for an Astros' minor leaguer since 2002 (Mike Hessman, 35, 2012; Jon Gaston, 35, 2009) trailing only George Springer's 37 home runs in 2013.

Additionally, with 102 total RBI, Whitcomb is just the 7th Astros' farm hand with over 100 RBI since 2014 (Justin Dirden, 101 in 2022; AJ Reed in '18 (108), '17 (104) & '15 (127); Matt Duffy, 101 in 2015; J.D. Davis, 101 in 2015) and was one of just 10 players in MiLB with at least 100 RBI.

The 25-year-old led the Astros' organization in home runs, RBI & total bases (253), was 2nd in Hits (129) & extra-base hits (54), T-3rd in runs scored (79), 5th in slugging (.470) & 9th in OPS (.771).

**HISTORY FOR BLANCO:** On 9/12, RHP Ronel Blanco rewrote the Sugar Land history books, striking out 12 batters in 6.0 scoreless innings of work, the most in a single game in franchise history... Blanco was on the front foot all night, throwing a first pitch strike to 15 of the 22 hitters he faced.

Blanco concluded his 2023 season with Sugar Land on 9/23, hurling 6.0 scoreless innings with six strikeouts, extending his scoreless innings streak to 19.0 innings to end the year, the longest scoreless streak for a Space Cowboys' pitcher in 2023.

The righty was named the Pacific Coast League Player of the Month for September, leading the Pacific Coast League in ERA (0.82), strikeouts (27), batting average against (.111) and WHIP (0.95). He also tied for the PCL lead in wins (3) and finished fifth in innings pitched (22.0).



# 2023 CLUB NOTES

**QUIET A FIRST IMPRESSION:** INF Will Wagner was promoted to Sugar Land on Tuesday, 9/19, and made his Triple-A debut that evening, going 2-for-4 with a double... Wagner followed it up with a four-hit night on 9/20, and collected four more hits on 9/22, including a game-winning single... The 25-year-old reached safely in all six games with Sugar Land, hitting safely in five of them with five multi-hit games while totaling 15 hits, the most in MiLB during that week... For his performance, Wagner was named the Pacific Coast League Player of the Week, going 15-for-26 (.577) with three doubles and four RBI.

**SEEING 20-20-20:** Both Pedro León (23 2B, 21 HR) and Joey Loperfido (27 2B, 25 HR) posted seasons in which they had at least 20 doubles and 20 home runs while stealing at least 20 bases (León - 21; Loperfido - 27)... They were two of just 23 players in Minor League Baseball to have at least 20 doubles, 20 homers and 20 stolen bases, with Corpus Christi OF Kenedy Corona joining them (21 2B, 22 HR, 32 SB)... INF Shay Whitcomb came just one double shy of joining that group, but along with León and Loperfido was one of just 33 players with at least 20 steals and 20 home runs.

**RIDE THE BIKE!:** On 6/24 @ SL, Pedro León hit for the cycle in reverse order, homering in the 3rd, tripling in the 5th, doubling in the 7th and singling in the 8th... It was the first cycle in Space Cowboys' history and the first for León at any level in his career... The La Habana native also reached on a walk and a hit-by-pitch and scored all six times he reached, setting a new single-game record for runs scored in Space Cowboys' history.

**WHAT A WEEK:** The Space Cowboys had the most prolific week for any team in MiLB this season during their trip to Albuquerque from 5/2-5/7, hitting .395 with 100 hits and 76 runs scored. Here is how their offensive output ranked compared to every other single-week high among full season MiLB teams.

**RECORD SETTING DAY IN ABQ:** On 5/7 @ ABQ, the Space Cowboys topped several franchise records in a 24-8 win over the Albuquerque Isotopes. They included:

- Most Hits in a Game: 30
  - Most Extra-Base Hits: 14
  - Total Bases: 60
  - Most Individual Hits in a game: Korey Lee - 6
- Sugar Land also tied the franchise record for runs scored in a game (24) and individual at bats, with three different players recording 7 trips to the plate.... This came just three days after Sugar Land had set new single-game records for doubles in a game (9), extra-base hits (13) & at bats (50) in a game on Thursday, 5/4.

**GRAND DAY FOR DIRDEN:** Outfielder Justin Dirden had a career day on 5/4 against ABQ, going 4-for-5 with 3 doubles, a grand slam, 6 RBI and 2 runs scored... The six RBI were a new career high for Dirden... The former SEMO Redhawk also tied two single-game Space Cowboys franchise records at the time with three doubles and four extra-base hits.

**SEVENTH HEAVEN:** In the seventh inning on 5/5 @ ABQ, the Space Cowboys rallied for seven runs, charging back from an 8-2 deficit for a 9-8 win. Justin Dirden delivered the go-ahead hit with a grand slam, his second consecutive day with a grand slam. It was the first time the Space Cowboys have hit grand slams on back-to-back days. The closest grand slams were the first and second slams hit in Sugar Land's affiliated history on 5/13 & 5/17 (G2) @ RR in 2021, both hit by Jose Siri.

**MATIJEVIC'S CAREER NIGHT:** On 5/2 @ Albuquerque, INF JJ Matijevic re-wrote the Sugar Land Space Cowboys record books, going 5-for-6 with a double, 2 triples, 8 RBI and 2 runs scored. Since the Sugar Land franchise joined the affiliated ranks, Matijevic was the first player to record five hits in a game, surpassing the 17 times a player had registered four hits in a game, which had most recently been done by Matijevic on 4/5/23 vs. RR... His 8 RBI also establish a new single-game franchise record for Sugar Land, overtaking the 7 RBI recorded by Lewis Brinson on 8/3/22 @ LV. Matijevic also recorded two triples, the first player to record two three-baggers in single game. In the series finale on 5/7 @ ABQ, Korey Lee surpassed Matijevic with six hits in a game.

**SINGLETON AND THE 'STROS:** INF Jon Singleton was signed to a Minor League contract by Houston on 6/24 and started that night in Salt Lake for Sugar Land... It was the first game Singleton had played in the Astros' organization since 9/4/17, and in his return the designated hitter went 2-for-3 with a double, a home run, 3 RBI, 3 runs scored and 3 walks.

Prior to having his contract selected by the Astros on August 8, Singleton homered in 6 of his last 15 games with Sugar Land, hitting 7 total, and reached safely in 17 straight contests, going 24-for-66 (.364) with a .475 OBP, hitting 5 doubles, 7 home runs and driving in 13.

In his 33 games with Sugar Land from 6/24 to 8/7, Singleton led the Pacific Coast League in SLG (.692) & OPS (1.138), was T-1st in HR (12), 2nd in Total Bases (83), T-2nd in Walks (26), 3rd in OBP (.446), 4th in Hits (40), T-4th in RBI (28) & Extra-Base Hits (19), 5th in Runs Scored (27) & 6th in Avg (.333). Singleton also hit the first of two walk-off home runs of the season for the Space Cowboys, a three-run blast on 7/22 vs. Albuquerque.

# SUGAR LAND RETIRED NUMBERS

## 8 - GARY GAETTI

Gary Gaetti, a 20-year Major League Veteran and the first manager of the Sugar Land Skeeters, had his Number 8 retired on August 21, 2021. Gaetti managed the Skeeters from 2012 to 2017, their first six seasons as an independent franchise, going a combined 448-391. He led the Skeeters to their first Atlantic League Championship in 2016 and was twice named the Atlantic League Manager of the Year. In 2013, the Skeeters won 95 games, still the most wins in a single season by any team in Atlantic League history.

Under Gaetti's direction, over 50 players had their contracts purchased from the Skeeters by Major League organizations. That included former Astros outfielder Jason Lane, who made a return to the Majors as a pitcher, as well as Houston native Scott Kazmir, who went on to make an MLB All-Star appearance after playing for the Skeeters.

As a player, Gaetti was named to two All-Star teams, won four Gold Gloves, a Silver Slugger award and was named the MVP of the 1987 American League Championship Series with the Minnesota Twins.



## 4 - DEACON JONES

Deacon Jones had his Number 4 - worn during his playing career - retired on August 3, 2019. It was the first retired in Skeeters history. All Skeeters players wore that Number 4 during the game in a special-edition jersey that featured some of Jones' favorite and iconic sayings. Jones, who had a three-year MLB career and coached in the Major Leagues, was an integral part of bringing professional baseball to Sugar Land. Jones brought credibility to the process of creating the Skeeters with his vast baseball knowledge, along with his reputation as a community leader.

From 2012 until his passing in 2023, Jones served as an ambassador for the organization, greeting fans at Constellation Field throughout the season to go with the grassroots efforts marketing the team throughout the Houston area.

Jones played in the Major Leagues for the Chicago White Sox in 1962, 1963 and 1966. As a Minor League player, Jones set the Midwest League record for batting average in a season, hitting .409 with the Dubuque Packers.

After his playing career, Jones was the hitting coach for the Houston Astros from 1976 to 1982 before serving as the hitting coach with the San Diego Padres from 1984 to 1987. He then transitioned into a role as an advanced scout for the Chicago White Sox from 1988 to 2008. He was also the first black player recognized by the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, when he was honored as the American Legion Player of the Year in 1951, hitting .408 as a catcher.



# SUGAR LAND AFFILIATED HISTORY

**2021:** In their inaugural season as the Astros' Triple-A affiliate, the Sugar Land Skeeters compete in the Triple-A West, Eastern Division. Sugar Land wins their first ever Triple-A game on May 6 at Albuquerque, a 9-4 victory over the Isotopes, part of three consecutive wins to begin the campaign and a 7-1 record in their first eight contests. Outfielder Jake Meyers excels, batting .343 in 68 games with 17 doubles, a triple, 16 home runs and 51 RBI, registering the first three-homer game in franchise history before having his contract selected on July 31. Meyers is named a Triple-A West Postseason All-Star and a MiLB.com Organizational All-Star.



Jose Siri leads Sugar Land in RBI (72) and stolen bases (24) and ties Meyers for the team lead in homers (16). INF C.J. Hinojosa leads the Triple-A West in doubles (35) while batting .316 in 104 games. Michael Papierski leads the Triple-A West in walks with 64. Towards the end of the season, INF Jeremy Peña is activated from the IL on August 27, and in 30 games hits .287 with four doubles, two triples and 10 home runs. Peña's signature moment comes on September 21 against Albuquerque where he went 4-for-5 with three home runs, including an inside-the-park homer and a walk-off homer over the batters eye in center field at Constellation Field.

On the mound, RHP Peter Solomon is named the Triple-A West Pitcher of the Year, going 8-1 with a 4.70 ERA in 21 games, 18 starts, finishing third in the league in strikeouts with 112. RHP Ronel Blanco is named a Triple-A West Postseason All-Star after finishing second in the league with 22 saves in 27 save opportunities in 42 appearances.

Alex Bregman, Marwin Gonzalez, Jason Castro, Zack Grienke, Lance McCullers Jr., Framber Valdez, Jose Urquidy, Jake Odorizzi, Brooks Raley and Joe Smith all appear on rehab assignments at various times throughout the 2021 season with Sugar Land. Sugar Land clinches the Triple-A West, East Division title, going 75-55 to take the division by 7.5 games over Oklahoma City and Round Rock. Due to the modified format after the canceled 2020 season, no postseason games are held, and Sugar Land finished three games back of Tacoma for the best record in the league.

**2022:** Playing under the Space Cowboys brand for the first time, Sugar Land goes 73-75, finishing fourth in the Pacific Coast League East Division. Corey Julks becomes the first player in franchise history to hit at least 30 home runs in a season, knocking 31 homers to finish tied for third in the Pacific Coast League in home runs. Julks also ties for the league lead in runs scored with 100. David Hensley leads the Pacific Coast League in on-base percentage (.420) while sitting fourth in batting average (.298). C Yainer Diaz is named the Astros Minor League Player of the Year, after he was promoted to Sugar Land on June 20 and batted .294 in 48 games with nine doubles, a triple, 16 home runs and 48 RBI.



RHP Hunter Brown is named the Pacific Coast League Pitcher of the Year after compiling a 9-4 record with a 2.55 ERA in 23 games, 14 starts, striking out 134 batters in 106.0 innings. He finishes third in the PCL in strikeouts and has his contract selected on September 1. RHP JP France strikes out 136 hitters, the second most in the Pacific Coast League, going 3-4 with a 3.90 ERA in 34 games, 15 starts. Out of the bullpen, RHP Enoli Paredes is named a Pacific Coast League Postseason All-Star after recording 12 saves in 17 opportunities, going 5-4 with a 2.63 ERA in 50 games.

Jose Altuve, Aledmys Díaz, Jake Odorizzi, Ryan Pressly and Lance McCullers Jr. all appear on Major League rehab with Sugar Land.

**2023:** Sugar Land finishes 61-89, the worst record in the Pacific Coast League. Pedro León hits for the first cycle in Space Cowboys history on June 24 at Salt Lake City, also setting a single-game record with six runs scored. INF Shay Whitcomb wins the Joe Bauman Award, hitting 35 total home runs to lead Minor League Baseball, including a team-leading 23 homers with Sugar Land.

Jon Singleton re-signs with the Astros and is assigned to Sugar Land. The first baseman bats .333 in 33 games with seven doubles, 12 home runs and 28 RBI, including a walk-off homer on July 22 vs. Albuquerque, before having his contract selected on August 8.

RHP Spencer Arrighetti is named the Astros Minor League Pitcher of the Year, going 2-5 with a 4.64 ERA in 15 games, 13 starts, with the Space Cowboys, and OF Joey Loperfido earns a late season promotion to the Space Cowboys, playing in 32 games with Sugar Land before being named the Astros Minor League Player of the Year.

Jose Altuve, Yordan Alvarez, Michael Brantley, Phil Maton, Ryne Stanek and José Urquidy all make rehab appearances with Sugar Land.

- Observe credential regulations at all times. Media should only be on the field when access is granted and supervised by the Space Cowboys communications department.

### MEDIA SERVICES

**PARKING:** Working media may park in Lot A at Constellation Field, accessed from Stadium Drive. Constellation Field parking attendants will have all season and daily media members on a list that will allow entry.

**MAIN PRESS BOX:** The main press box at Constellation Field is located on the stadium's concourse level, directly behind home plate.

**CLUBHOUSE:** Both the home and visiting clubhouse at Constellation Field are CLOSED at all times, unless permission is granted by the Space Cowboys or a visiting communications department. Player and manager pre-game availability will be conducted on-field during each team's batting practice. Post-game availability will be conducted at a designated area.

**PHOTOGRAPHERS/PHOTO WELLS:** Access to photo wells is available for still photographers as well as videographers. All media should make appropriate accommodations to camera operators for the Space Cowboys broadcast and are not to interfere with lines of sight or camera movement. There are photo wells located on the far side of each dugout. All photographers and videographers must remain in the photo well while the game is in progress. Photographers and videographers are only permitted to change photo wells in-between innings.

**NOTES:** Game notes, statistics, lineups and rosters are available in the main press box. All information is also available online on the Space Cowboys 'Media Information' page at SLSpaceCowboys.com



**WIFI:** Wireless Internet access is available in the main press box at Constellation Field. Information on how to access wireless Internet will be available in the press box.

## DRESS GUIDELINES

In line with Major League Baseball's dress guidelines, media covering Space Cowboys games are requested to dress in an appropriate and professional manner that reflects their respect for their colleagues, the teams and the players they are covering. Dugouts, press boxes, clubhouses and the playing field are working areas and members of the media are expected to adhere to a business casual dress code. In that regard, media members are requested to adhere to the following dress guidelines:

- T-shirts bearing offensive, disrespectful or inappropriate messages are not permitted.
- Clothing bearing MLB club logos should not be worn in the press area.
- Jerseys of any kind should not be worn in the press area.
- Clothing should be appropriate for a business casual work environment. The following are some non-exclusive examples of apparel that should be avoided:
  - Sheer or see-through clothing
  - Excessively short skirts, dresses or shorts
  - Tank tops, muscle shirts, one-shouldered or strapless shirts
  - Clothing exposing bare midriffs or visible undergarments.

## SPACE COWBOYS BROADCAST TEAM

### Garrett Greene: Radio Play-by-play

2024 is Garrett's second season as the lead play-by-play broadcaster for the Space Cowboys and eighth season as a Minor League Baseball broadcaster. Garrett joined the Space Cowboys in March of 2023 after serving as the lead play-by-play broadcaster and media relations manager for the Biloxi Shuckers, the Double-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, from 2018 - 2023. He also worked as the play-by-play broadcaster and media relations director for the Rookie Level Helena Brewers in 2017 and was a broadcasting and media relations associate for the St. Paul Saints in 2016. Prior to working in the minor leagues, Garrett was an on-air host and producer at 104.9 The Horn in Austin, Texas while also calling baseball, basketball and football games for high schools and colleges in Austin. A 2013 graduate of the Moody College of Communications at the University of Texas at Austin, Garrett is a two-time Mississippi Association of Broadcasting award winner and has called games on ESPN+ for college baseball, volleyball and soccer.



### Gerald Sanchez: Radio Play-by-play

Sanchez returns to the broadcast booth for 2024, his fourth season as a play-by-play broadcaster for Sugar Land. After working as the broadcaster for the Constellation Energy League in 2020, Gerald has broadcasted for Sugar Land since the team became the Triple-A affiliate of the Houston Astros. Sanchez will be on the call for all 75 Space Cowboys home games in 2024. A native of Victoria, TX, Sanchez has called games for the University of Houston and Rice University in his multiple decades of broadcasting and is the owner of Legacy Sports Network which broadcasts Houston-area high school sports.



# CONSTELLATION FIELD

The 2024 season marks the 13th season Constellation Field has hosted baseball in Sugar Land and the fourth season hosting the Triple-A affiliate of the Houston Astros. Constellation Field has hosted the World Series Champion Houston Astros for an exhibition game on March 27, 2023 along with the Atlantic League All-Star game, collegiate baseball games from prestigious programs such as the University of Texas, Rice University and the University of Houston and numerous special events. The venue will once again host JJ Watt's Charity Softball game in 2024 after previously hosting the event in 2013, 2014 and 2015, and has routinely hosted cultural festivals, weddings, extreme sporting events and graduations.



## Constellation Field

Since 2014, Constellation Field has hosted Sugar Land Holiday Lights, a nearly three-month event that features over 3.5 million lights displayed around the ballpark that has turned into the signature non-baseball event at Constellation Field.

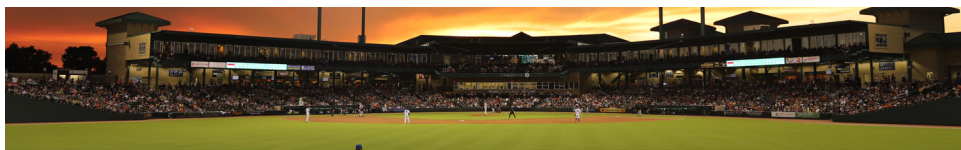
Constellation Field was the home of the Sugar Land Skeeters from 2012-2019 as a member of the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. In 2020, the ballpark hosted the four-team independent Constellation Energy League after the COVID-19 pandemic cause the cancellation of the Atlantic League season.

In December 2021, it was announced that the Astros and Constellation reached a long-term agreement to keep Constellation as the naming rights partner for the ballpark.

**LOCATION:** Constellation Field is located on 1 Stadium Dr. near the intersection of US Route 90 and Highway 6. It is located just over a mile away from the original Imperial Sugar factory and less than five miles from Sugar Land City Hall and Town Square. It's located approximately 23 miles from Minute Maid Park, making the Space Cowboys one of the closest minor league affiliates in terms of mileage to their parent club.

**INDEPENDENT HISTORY:** Constellation Field hosted over 2.5 million fans through nine seasons as the home ballpark for the independent Sugar Land Skeeters. The ballpark set Atlantic League records for full-season attendance (465,511) and average attendance (6,650) in its inaugural season in 2012. It also set the league record for single-game attendance on July 4, 2016 (8,606). Constellation Field was named the Atlantic League Ballpark of the Year in 2012 and 2018 and reached the Final Four of Ballpark Digests "Best of Ballparks" in 2018. The ballpark hosted its one and only Atlantic League All-Star game in 2014 as the Skeeters took on a collection of All-Stars from other Atlantic League teams, with NBA legend Tracy McGrady appearing as a pitcher in the game for the Skeeters.

**RENOVATIONS:** The City of Sugar Land and Houston Astros agreed on a lease for Constellation Field prior to the 2021 season. As part of the lease, over \$10 million were invested in renovations to improve the facilities player development areas. The renovations included completely reconstructed home and visitor clubhouses, batting cages, weight room, home and visitor dugouts, wall padding and playing surface. It also included the additions of a kitchen and dining area for the home clubhouse, a video/meeting room, a staff locker room, a female locker room and the Bullpen Patio, located in right-center field. Ahead of the 2022 season, a new phase of renovations included the reconstruction of Constellation Field's club/suite level, a new dining and entertainment area in left-center field, a reconstructed playground area, a reconstructed team store and the addition of loge boxes throughout the field-level seating.

**BUD LIGHT ICE HOUSE:** Located in right-center field, the Bud Light Icehouse is open for every regular season game at Constellation Field. The Icehouse is open to all ticketed fans and includes a full-service bar with numerous TVs. The Icehouse also includes a rocking chair seating area, providing a unique viewing experience in right-center field.

**KIDDIE CORRAL:** The playground and splash pad beyond the right-center field and left-center field walls have been a staple for family-friendly entertainment since Constellation Field's opening in 2012. Both areas got significant renovations ahead of the 2022 season to match the Space Cowboys brand and stands as one of the largest playground areas in all of Minor League Baseball. The area is open to all fans attending games at Constellation Field and are key to the organization's mission to provide entertainment for all ages when attending Space Cowboys games.

**CLUB LEVEL:** Constellation Field features a world-class club level on the second level of the stadium, including a banquet seating area with a gourmet buffet for all games and access to a full-service bar. The Constellation Field club level also features an exclusive balcony seating section. The club level underwent a full renovation heading into the 2022 season to match the Space Cowboys brand, along with all Skybox suites at Constellation Field.

**VIDEOBOARD:** Constellation Field had its new LED high-definition videoboard - located in center field - installed prior to the 2020 season. The videoboard measures approximately 25 feet high by 57.5 feet wide. It provided a 17 percent increase in the resolution over the previous videoboard.

**GRASS LAND:** The berm in right field provides a unique lawn-style seating area just above the home and visitors bullpen.

**KARBACH CANTINA:** The Karbach Cantina was added to Constellation Field beyond the left-field wall as part of the ballpark's 2022 renovations. The outdoor beer garden features a steel-roofed canopy to provide shade, along with strung lighting and picnic-style seating. Similar to the Bud Light Icehouse, the Karbach Cantina is an ideal spot to take in a Space Cowboys game while enjoying a drink and exploring Constellation Field. The Karbach Cantina also features concession carts that include an assortment of ballpark fare.

**MOONSHOT ALLEY:** Added to Constellation Field in 2022, Moonshot Alley provides fans a free, simulated baseball experience through HitTrax. Fans can place themselves in different ballparks throughout Major League Baseball and take swings with real metrics such as projected distance and exit velocity in real time. Bar-top seating is available along the side of the batting cage, creating an optimal viewing area to watch friends and family take their swings.

**GALAXY GIFTS:** The official team store for the Space Cowboys moved from its location at the front gate to the concourse area behind home plate. The Galaxy Gifts name is a nod to the name of the first Houston Astros team store at the Astrodome. The new team store, added as part of the 2022 renovations, provides a bigger area for Space Cowboys merchandise and is centrally located on the Constellation Field concourse.

# INDEPENDENT HISTORY YEAR-BY-YEAR

## 2012

The Sugar Land Skeeters play their first season as an independent franchise in the Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They played their first-ever game on April 26, 2012, with a 3-2 loss to the York Revolution. The franchise set Atlantic League records for total season attendance and average attendance for a season. Seven-time Cy Young Award winner and former Houston Astros great Roger Clemens made his final professional appearance with the Skeeters on Sept. 7, with his oldest son, Koby, serving as the team's catcher. Roger Clemens received the win, throwing 4 2/3 scoreless innings in a 4-0 victory over the Long Island Ducks. Constellation Field was named the Atlantic League Ballpark of the Year and former Astros outfielder Jason Lane was named the Skeeters Most Valuable Player. Lane spent the majority of the season converting to a pitcher, going 8-4 with a 2.98 ERA through 17 starts. He also hit .275 with nine home runs and 31 RBIs through 229 at-bats. Houston native and former first-round pick Scott Kazmir made 14 starts with the Skeeters before having his contract purchased by the Cleveland Indians. Kazmir went on to appear in five more seasons as a Major Leaguer following his stint with the Skeeters, including an All-Star selection in 2014 while with the Oakland A's.



## 2013

The Skeeters set Atlantic League records, winning 95 games and accumulating a .679 winning percentage (95-45). The Skeeters were swept in the first round of the Atlantic League postseason by the Somerset Patriots. Koby Clemens became the first player in franchise history with a 20-homer season, hitting 21 homers on his way to being selected Second Team All-Atlantic League. Gary Gaetti was named the Atlantic League Manager of the Year.

## 2014

The Skeeters made headlines as former Houston Rockets icon and Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Famer Tracy McGrady made the team's opening day roster as a right-handed pitcher. McGrady made four starts, recording a 6.75 ERA through 6 2/3 innings pitched. McGrady also started the Atlantic League All-Star Game, which was played at Constellation Field for the first and only time in Atlantic League history. Rather than a traditional All-Star Game, a selection of Atlantic League All-Stars took on the Skeeters. McGrady picked up a strikeout through 1 1/3 innings pitched and the Skeeters won the game, 5-3. The Skeeters advanced to the Atlantic League Championship Series for the first time in franchise history. They defeated the York Revolution in five games in the best-of-five opening round before being swept by the Lancaster Barnstormers in the Championship Series.



## 2015

Another marquee Major League Baseball name appeared with the Skeeters. Four-time All-Star and three-time Gold Glove Rafael Palmeiro went 2-for-4 with an RBI in a 10-4 Skeeters victory over the Camden Riversharks on Sept. 18 at Constellation Field. Palmeiro's son, Patrick, played third base in the game while Rafael served as the designated hitter. Patrick went 2-for-5 with a home run and four RBIs playing alongside his father. Patrick appeared with the Skeeters in both the 2015 and '16 seasons. The Skeeters were awarded Atlantic League Grounds Crew of the Year. Chris Wallace and Delwyn Young were named Atlantic League Postseason All-Stars. The Skeeters had their two-season playoffs streak snapped.



## 2016

The Skeeters win their first Atlantic League Championship, sweeping the Long Island Ducks in the best-of-five Atlantic League Championship Series. The Skeeters made a late push to enter the postseason, winning the Freedom Division Second Half Title. The Skeeters swept the York Revolution in the opening round of the playoffs before defeating Long Island. Juan Martínez was named the Atlantic League Championship Series Most Valuable Player, going 3-for-10 (.300) with a home run and four RBIs in the series. Jeremy Barfield, son of former Major League All-Star Jesse Barfield, became the first player in Skeeters history to win the Atlantic League MVP Award. Barfield led the league and set the Skeeters' single-season record with 27 home runs, while also collecting 85 RBIs. Barfield also set the Skeeters' independent record for slugging percentage (.533), while also posting the third-highest batting average in the team's single-season history (.306). Barfield and right-hander Andrew Johnson were named Atlantic League Postseason All-Stars and the Skeeters were once again awarded Atlantic League Grounds Crew of the Year. The Skeeters' mascot, Swatson, was named Atlantic League Mascot of the Year as well.



## 2017

In their final season under manager Gary Gaetti, the Skeeters were unable to reach the postseason and defend their Atlantic League Championship. Josh Prince was named an Atlantic League Postseason All-Star and set the Skeeters' independent single-season record with 55 stolen bases. Skeeters President Jay Miller was named Atlantic League Executive of the Year and the Skeeters were awarded the league's Club Community Service Award for the organization's charitable efforts in response to Hurricane Harvey.

## 2018

The Skeeters hired College Baseball Hall of Famer and former Major Leaguer Pete Incaviglia as the second manager in the organization's history. In his first season, Incaviglia led the Skeeters to their second Atlantic League Championship while also overseeing a franchise-record 12 players having their contracts purchased by Major League organizations.

The Skeeters won both First Half and Second Half Freedom Division Title. They defeated the Lancaster Barnstormers in five games in the best-of-five opening series before once again defeating the Long Island Ducks in five games in the best-of-five Atlantic League Championship Series. Left-hander James Russell, who tossed a complete game in Game 5, was named the Atlantic League Championship Series Most Valuable Player. Incaviglia was named Atlantic League Manager of the Year, Constellation Field was named the Atlantic League Ballpark of the Year and the Skeeters were once again awarded the Atlantic League Grounds Crew of the Year. Matt Chavez set the Skeeters single season record with a .320 batting average and was named an Atlantic League Postseason All-Star. Former Astros right-hander Felipe Paulino collected 33 saves, setting the organization's single-season record, and was named an Atlantic League Postseason All-Star. Outfielder Anthony Giansanti rounded out the Skeeters' Atlantic League Postseason All-Stars.



## 2019

In their final season competing in the Atlantic League, the Skeeters reached the Atlantic League Championship Series in back-to-back seasons but were defeated by the Long Island Ducks in their quest to repeat as league champions. Under manager Pete Incaviglia, the Skeeters re-set their organizational record with 13 contracts purchased by Major League Baseball organizations. For the first time in the organization's history, a player appeared with the Skeeters and in the Major Leagues in the same season. Infielder Ryan Court began the season in Sugar Land and went on to make his Major League debut with the Seattle Mariners on July 26. The Skeeters defeated the York Revolution in four games in the opening series before losing in five games to Long Island in the best-of-five Championship Series. Denis Phipps paced the offense with 21 home runs, tying Koby Clemens for the second-most in a single season in Skeeters history. Major League veteran and Houston native James Loney made the Skeeters Opening Day roster and spent the first month of the season as a pitcher and position player before announcing his retirement. During the second half of the season, the Atlantic League made history, using an automated ball-strike system to call balls and strikes rather than a traditional home-plate umpire. The automated ball-strike system was one of many rule changes implemented in the Atlantic League in 2019, along with rules on shifting, the duration a relief pitcher must stay in the game, the size of the bases and others.



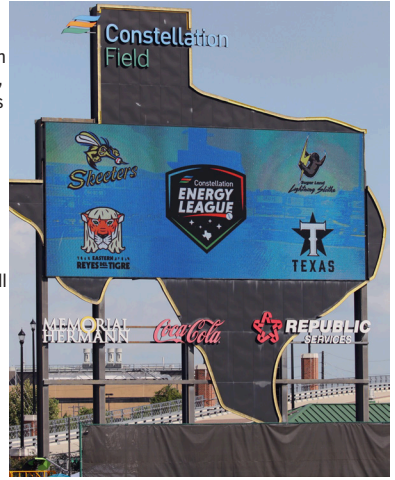


## 2020

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Atlantic League canceled its 2020 season. Without an Atlantic League season, the Skeeters hosted their own four-team independent league – hosted exclusively at Constellation Field – called the Constellation Energy League. Along with the Skeeters, other team names included the Lightning Sloths, Team Texas and Reyes Del Tigre. Each team was scheduled to play 28 games throughout the two-month season.

Former Major Leaguers Greg Swindell and Dave Eiland managed the Lightning Sloths and Reyes Del Tigre, respectively. Koby and Roger Clemens managed Team Texas. Pete Incaviglia returned to manage the Skeeters. Kody and Kacy Clemens played for Team Texas, joining their father and brother. Due to the cancellation of the Minor League Baseball season in 2021, teams allowed their minor leaguers under contract to take part in the Constellation Energy League. Tampa Bay Rays prospect Ford Proctor was named the League's Most Valuable Player after hitting .346 on the season. Other notable players that participated in the league included: Trei Cruz (son of Jose Cruz Jr.), Brantley Bell (son of Jay Bell), David Huff (8-year MLB veteran), Scott Kazmir (3-time MLB All-Star), RHP Adam Kloffenstein (Top-10 Toronto Blue Jays prospect), Preston Palmeiro (son of Rafael Palmeiro), Ryan Reynolds (son of Shane Reynolds), Fernando Rodney (17-year MLB veteran), Robbie Ross (6-year MLB veteran), Cameron Rupp (5-year MLB veteran), Robby Scott (4-year MLB veteran) and Joe Wieland (4-year MLB veteran).

Rodney, RHP Chase De Jong, RHP Brett Eibner, LHP Matt Dermody and LHP Zac Rosscup each had their contracts purchased by MLB organizations during the season. Eibner, De Jong and Dermody each reached the Major Leagues in 2020. Despite the ongoing pandemic, the league was able to complete its season without any stoppages due to a COVID-19 outbreak. Unlike in 2019 with the Skeeters, there were not any rule changes enacted for the Constellation Energy League. The only non-traditional baseball rule that was adopted was that games that exceeded nine innings were decided by a home run derby between the two teams, rather than extra innings. The league's opening day was broadcast nationally through AT&T and was broadcast locally on AT&T SportsNet Southwest. Over 50,000 fans were in attendance throughout the Constellation Energy League, which was one of a handful of professional sporting leagues that were active in the summer of 2020.
