Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Trenton Denholm to the mound tonight, looking to become the first 10-game winner in the IL (0-2 in last 7GS). The Cubs will counter with RHP Andrew Wantz. Columbus is 55-39 (.585) versus right handers this year. Wantz has never pitched against the Clippers in his career, as tonight will be his 37th game in the IL (51G with Salt Lake in the PCL, 2021-24).

vs. the Cubs

Since a 5G win streak against Iowa from 5/12-6/14/24, the Clippers are 22-20 opposing the I-Cubs (37-27 in the last 64G). Individually, Milan Tolentino has hit the Cubs at a .339 clip (37x109) with 10HR and 27RBI in his career (31G). Kahlil Watson has hit .313 (20x64) with 4HR and 12RBI in 17G, while Kody Huff has hit .303 (27x89) with 2HR and 17RBI in 23G (Cooper Ingle has 3HR, 10RBI in 13G).

Start with a Bang

Over the last 32G, the Clippers have plated 229 runs (most in the IL, 7.2 per), with 152 (66%) tallied in the first four innings of the game, including 52 in the 1st. Opponents have only 72 in the first four innings of the last 32G, but are outscoring the Clippers 108-77 thereafter. Taking a lead into the 8th inning, Columbus has won 62 straight (last loss: 8/22/25) and 76 straight when leading into the 9th (8/7/25).

Back to the Launch Pad

Columbus leads all of pro baseball in homers hit since 7/28 (69, accounting for 49% of runs: 112 of 229) and have allowed the 9th most (53, 2nd in IL; accounts for 45%: 81 of 180). Huntington Park has been breached 80 times in the last 20G, but only six times in 4G this week (all for the Clippers; Columbus pitching has not had 5G with 0HR at home since a 5G run from 5/24-6/5/25, 2G vs. Iowa).

Always On

Cooper Ingle has lost 35 points on his batting average over his last 21G (.167, 12x72) and 84 points from his slugging, with only 2XBH (last HR on 8/6, 66AB since), but his OBP has dipped only nine points in that time, as he has 28BB in 100PA (.400OBP in last 21G). He ranks 2nd in the IL in walks (80; Christian Cairo is 1st with 85BB), having accumulated them in only 414PA (19%, Cairo has 486PA).

Big Time Production

Kyle Manzardo has hit safely in each of 17G since 8/15 (.343, 23x67, 3HR), while collecting 21RBI (RBI in 13G of streak). In his career with Columbus, Manzardo has played only 128G (563PA), but he has still managed 69XBH (.560SLG), including 31HR, against just 57 singles. Additionally, he has scored 100 times with 91RBI, while keeping his strikeout rate under 20% (108K, 19%; 86BB, 15%).

King Ralph

Dating to 7/28, Ralph Velazquez leads the IL in HR (17, +5), RBI (41, +7) and SLG (.798, +62) and, aside from going 0x21 in 6G at St. Paul (7/21-7/26), is hitting .332/.418/.663 since 6/18 (20HR, 55RBI). Though Velazquez has not homered in the last 6G (17AB), he has 9BB in 27PA (9BB in prior 28G, 122PA) and has 11RBI in his last 11G (1HR in 38AB, had 16HR and 30RBI in previous 20G, 76AB).

Another High

A day after his 20G on base streak was snapped (tied career long, .382OBP from 8/2-9/1), Kody Huff has gotten back to work with hits in each of his last 2G. Huff is hitting .395 (15x38) over his last 10G, including a 4x4 performance on 8/23 vs. St. Paul, after a 19G slump from 7/26-8/22 (.134, 9x67). He has yet to go deep on the current hotness (5HR during slump), though he does have 6XBH (.579SLG).

Power and Speed

Milan Tolentino got to the doorstep of 20HR on Tuesday and picked up his 18th steal last night, as he attempts to secure the second 20-20 season in franchise history. He scored the first such season last year and, since the start of 2025, he is tied for 1st in the IL with 40HR (25th with 38SB). Kahlil Watson is sitting at 17HR (career high, had 11HR through 5/29) and 22SB (three off career best).

Busting Out

Dayan Frias was 1x25 (.040) with an RBI triple from 8/20-8/28, but has gone 5x20 with 4HR and 7RBI since (.341SLG coming into tonight is season high). Blake Perkins was 3x25 (.120) with a HR and 3RBI in 7G from 8/19-8/29, but is 5x14 (.357) with a HR and 4RBI in 4G since. Dom Nunez was 2x33 (.061) with an RBI in 10G prior to going 2x4 with an RBI double on Sunday (first game since 8/20).

This Date in Clipper History

9/5/1991

The Clippers put nine runs on the board in the 1st inning of the Governors' Cup Finals on their way to an 11-2 win over Pawtucket. **Jim Walewander** was the offensive star, going 2x5 with a double, a homer, a steal and 3RBI. Walewander led the IL with 54 steals in 1991, a year after swiping 49 bases for Columbus (103 steals rank 3rd all-time). Columbus went on to sweep the PawSox, outscoring them 25-7 in the series.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,494 to 1,445).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 185-147 (.557) in pitch reviews, with batters going 93-87 (.517) and pitchers/catchers going 92-60 (.605). They have run out of challenges in 48G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 846, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 161 through 133G (on pace for 178SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 47CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (52; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 188 runs while crafting a .893OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 121 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +67 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 305-189 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 80 grand slams and 1,997RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.39 through 133G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 202HR (would be 2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 8th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 72G this season (42-30, .583), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 8th most last at bat wins this year (15, three off the lead) while playing in the 13th most games decided in the last at bat (28, Norfolk has 39). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 102G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 49-53 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 458-467 (.495), 428-421 with Columbus (.504).

500K:

On 8/1 vs. Toledo, Denholm racked up 8K for the third time this year, crossing 500 in his career in the process (8.4K/9IP). He has seen that rate bump slightly this season (8.9K/9IP), while his 3.58K/BB ratio ranks 5th in the IL among 48 pitchers with at least 80.0IP (0BB to 67BF from 7/21-8/7).

Great Start:

Denholm's season debut, 4/1 vs. Indianapolis, was his 100th career game and his second at the Triple-A level (367 days between Triple-A games). He needed only 69 pitches to record a quality start (6.0IP, 1ER), giving the Clippers their first of the season (5th game, did not have a quality start until 41st game last season). Columbus has 18QS on the season (20QS through this point last year, on the way to 23), with **Rorik Maltrud** (8), **Logan Allen** (4) and Denholm (3) accounting for 83%.

In Relief:

Denholm pitched exclusively in relief during May and June, but each appearance came on starter's rest, as he averaged 56.0 pitches per outing (ranged from 38-84, while recording 2.0-5.0IP). In total, he was 7-0 with a 1.95ERA over 9G (32.1IP, 30H, 9R, 7ER, 5BB, 35K). He led the IL in wins from May-June and, among 76 pitchers with at least 30.0IP, his ERA was 2nd best (also 2nd with 7.00K/BB and 6th with a 1.08WHIP). On 5/20 vs. Louisville, Denholm notched his first save in Triple-A (4.0IP, 1ER) and the fifth of his pro career.

90 is the New 100:

On 8/7 at Syracuse, Denholm threw 91 pitches to mark the only time in the last 78G that a Columbus pitcher has crossed 90 (staff had seven such outings through first 55G, maxing out at 93 pitches three times; no 100 pitch games since **Peyton Battenfield** on 9/2/22, 597G ago). Denholm was one of two Clipper starters averaging over 80 pitches per start through 8/12 (**Logan Allen**), but he has since dropped to 79.5 (last 3GS have averaged 69.3 pitches per).

Tough Ones:

On 4/12, Worcester hung 7ER on Denholm, tying a career high (third time), while also connecting for 2HR (both to same batter, Allan Castro). He followed up with a quality outing next time out, 4/18 vs. Iowa (6.0IP, 3ER), throwing a season high of 92 pitches. Denholm closed out April by giving up 7ER again, this time to Toledo on 4/30, while giving up 3HR for the first time in his career. Since leaving April with a 6.60ERA (30.0IP, 22ER), he has registered a mark of 4.37 (82.1IP, 40ER).

Limiting the Longballs:

From 4/12-4/30, Denholm surrendered 7HR to 90BF (one per 12.9BF), accounting for 15 of 19ER (6HR with men on base, including a grand slam on 4/12 at Worcester). He allowed only 2HR to the next 188BF from 5/7-7/12 (94.0BF per) before surrendering a pair in the 3rd inning at Lehigh Valley on 7/12. Including those IronPig homers, Denholm surrendered bombs in each of 3GS from 7/12-7/26, giving up 5HR to 57BF (one per 11.4BF; 3HR to 114BF since the start of August).
