The Trash Pandas Media staff can also be reached at media@trashpandasbaseball.com.

Credentials: 2024 Rocket City Trash Pandas media credentials will be issued only to accredited media members at the discretion of the Trash Pandas Media staff. Any media wanting to cover an individual game must communicate their intentions to the Trash Pandas no later than 24 hours before the first pitch of any game. Credentials must be visibly worn at all times. In order to obtain a credential, all media members must complete and sign the 2024 Minor League Baseball Terms and Conditions of Credentials for Professional Development League Events.

Photographers: Photo credentials will be issued to legitimate news organizations and to photographers authorized by the Trash Pandas. All photos MUST be for news-gathering purposes or for companies licensed by Major League Baseball/Minor League Baseball. Priority will be given to news organizations on deadline. Photographers are prohibited from placing equipment on the playing field, in the dugout, or in the clubhouse.

Media Entrance: Media may pick up their credentials at the Trustmark VIP Gate at Toyota Field and may enter the ballpark through the VIP gate. All bags are subject to inspection upon entry. Valid photo ID will be needed to pick up credentials. Media will have access to the Northrop Grumman Press Box, but seating is limited.

Clubhouses: Per 2024 rules imposed by Major League Baseball, the clubhouses are off limits to all members of the media at all times.

In-Season Interviews: Before Trash Pandas home games, players and coaches will likely be available for in-person interviews at the conclusion of batting practice (around 4:15 p.m. for a 6:35 p.m. game). Media seeking interviews must submit their request to the Trash Pandas ahead of time. Pre-game interviews will be conducted in the area near the Trash Pandas dugout. No starting pitchers will be made available pre-game on a day in which they are starting. Requests for interviews with players/coaches from visiting teams must go through the visiting team's Media Relations staff.

Postgame Interviews: Following each Trash Pandas home game subject to availability, Trash Pandas Manager Andy Schatzley and select players will be available for interviews. Media wishing to talk to any Trash Pandas player or coach must communicate that request to a member of the Trash Pandas Media Relations staff before the conclusion of the game.

Television Policy: TV stations wishing to have a live pre-game guest for their newscasts must contact the Trash Pandas no later than noon on game days for night games, or by 6 p.m. the day prior to day games. Roving cameras are allowed with permission from the Trash Pandas. Cameras are permitted throughout the public areas but must not block any aisles or the view of any fans. Camera lights may be turned on unless facing the field of play.

Use of Photography/Video: Media outlets needing use of Trash Pandas photography or Trash Pandas video may contact Logan Bourandas. Accredited members of the media may use Trash Pandas photographs for non-endorsement projects only.

Autograph Policy: Under no circumstances are credentialed media members permitted to seek autographs, foul balls, or other baseball equipment at any point. Members of the media found to be in violation of this policy may have their credentials revoked by a member of the Trash Pandas staff.

*All Media guidelines for the 2024 are subject to change at any point and for any reason.

The Trash Pandas Pre-Game Show will air 15 minutes prior to the first scheduled pitch. Coverage is also available on the Talk Radio WZZN app.

WHAT IS A TRASH PANDA?

The name was chosen in a name-the-team contest and is a reference to the area's association with the space industry and the determination and ingenuity of raccoons, aka Trash Pandas.

Trash Pandas, slang for raccoon, was included in the original 10 nominations following several Brandiose-led focus groups in Madison and Huntsville. The ballot descriptor read: Our community is known for engineering, and no creature in our galaxy is as smart, creative, determined and ingenious a problem solver - dedicated to the challenge at hand - as our local raccoons!

In July 2018, after the results from several focus groups in Madison and Huntsville, 10 names were selected, based on their uniqueness and how each name relates to the characteristics of the area: (Alphabetically) Army Ants, Comet Jockeys, GloWorms, Lunartics, Moon Possums, Puffy Head Bird Legs, Space Chimps, Space Sloths, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas. The focus groups were led by San Diego-based Brandiose, the Minor League Baseball industry's premiere branding partner.

Over the next few weeks, two rounds of online voting took place. The first round narrowed the list to Comet Jockeys, Moon Possums, Space Chimps, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas.

Trash Pandas won the final round with 44.75 percent of the vote to ThunderSharks 19.25 percent. Moon Possums was third (12.57 percent); Space Chimps fourth (12.05 percent); and Comet Jockeys fifth (11.38 percent).



By the way, Trash Pandas dominated both rounds.

More than 28,500 nominations and votes were recorded. According to Brandiose, this represented - by far - the largest community participation in a Name the Team contest in the history of Minor League Baseball.

The team name was announced at a local microbrewery in September 2018 with nearly 1,500 fans on hand. Trash Pandas was nominated by Matthew Higley of Lacey's Spring, Ala. He received two box seats for the first five seasons and threw out the ceremonial first pitch at a Trash Pandas home game.

The regional identifier was also chosen by the community. Out of 13,559 votes cast, 67.4 percent chose Rocket City over North Alabama (18.09 percent) and Madison (14.51 percent).

TRASH PANDAS CELEBRITIES



SPROCKET - MASCOT

It all started on a run-of-the-mill October Day in Alabama. Kids were playing, birds were chirping, everything was normal in the world, until it wasn't.

At a local waste dump lived a little bandit-eyed rascal named Sprocket. He spent his mornings moving from trash can to trash can looking for that day's "breakfast."

This particular morning was going just as he had planned when, CRASH! A pile of hazardous waste came raining down upon this tiny raccoon, but something was different.

This tiny raccoon was no longer tiny. In a matter of seconds, Sprocket had grown five feet in length and was walking on his two back feet. So how did Sprocket react to this rapid transformation?! He started dancing!

Sprocket's favorite baseball movie is *Angels in the Outfield*. His favorite color is red, and his favorite song is *Sweet Home Alabama* by Lynyrd Skynyrd.

SALLY, BUZZ, NEIL & MAE

SALLY (Blue): The first female racer, Sally's rides to victory are often neck and neck with fierce rival Buzz. With her youthful spirit, Sally is never deterred in her quest to reach the finish line.

BUZZ (Orange): Usually running neck and neck with rival racer Sally, Buzz uses a measured approach in the nightly Astronaut race. Buzz is never first out of the gate, and as the first of the racers with a doctoral degree, relies on his smarts to compete in his quest for victory at Trash Pandas games.

NEIL (White): After getting off to a quick start, Neil's all or nothing approach stumbles more often than not in the nightly race at Toyota Field. Although his path to victory is often clouded in misfortunes, Neil's rare upset wins are always memorable and inspiring.

MAE (Silver): The reigning rookie of the year, Mae, didn't take long to get comfortable with the Astronaut Race after being introduced midway through the 2023 season. Mae uses her patience and intelligence to wait for the perfect moment to make a move to the front.

TRASH PANDAS TIMELINE

October 2017: The Southern League approves the sale of the Mobile BayBears to BallCorps LLC, setting up an eventual move to Madison.

November 2017: BallCorps LLC closes on the purchase of the Mobile BayBears.

January 2018: The Madison City Council signs a deal with BallCorps LLC for a \$46 million multi-use stadium.

May 2018: The Southern League approves relocating the Mobile BayBears to Madison for the 2020 season.

June 2018: Nearly 2,000 people are on hand for the stadium's groundbreaking ceremony at the Town Madison development site.

September 2018: After more than 28,000 votes were cast in a name-the-team contest, BallCorps LLC announces the team will be called Rocket City Trash Pandas.

October 2018: The first concrete for the stadium is poured. Hundreds of fans turn out at Madison's Dublin Park for a logo reveal celebration.



November 2018: Trash Pandas open the Emporium at Bridge Street Town Centre for the holiday season and set Minor League Baseball merchandise sales records before closing at the end of the year.

May 2019: Team passes \$1 million in merchandise sales.

June 2019: Trash Pandas unveil the team uniforms at Huntsville's Big Spring Park in front of several hundred fans.

August 2019: Trash Pandas release inaugural season schedule and inaugural mission logo.

October 2019: First seat is installed in Toyota Field; Sod is laid for the berm and the infield and outfield grass; Toyota Field naming ceremony held.

November 2019: Final concrete pour is made; Trash Pandas mascot Sprocket is named.

December 2019: Center field Batter's Eye installed; Trash Pandas surpass \$2 million mark in merchandise sales; Home plate field box seats installed; Right- and left-field foul poles installed; Kids Zone completed.

January 2020: Jay Bell is named the team's first manager.

March 14, 2020: Toyota Field is open to the public for the first time; single-game tickets go on sale.

March 18, 2020: The Trash Pandas front office closes in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

May 4, 2020: The front office returns to Toyota Field to begin plans for the summer with the season still in flux.

June 1, 2020: The Trash Pandas host their first event since coming out of the shutdown with a week-long Kids Camp.

June 6, 2020: The Trash Pandas hold their first event open to the general public with a Block Party at Toyota Field. The party draws approximately 1,500 fans.

June 17, 2020: The first baseball game at any level is played at Toyota Field as the Trash Pandas host The Rocket City Classic.

15 travel select teams play over a five-day span. The first game is between Viper Baseball Academy (VBA) and 43 at 3 p.m.

June 30, 2020: The inaugural 2020 season is cancelled due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

February 12, 2021: The Trash Pandas sign a Player Development License with the Los Angeles Angels, keeping Rocket City an Angels' affiliate through 2030.

April 1, 2021: The Trash Pandas surpass the \$4 million mark in merchandise sales.

May 5, 2021: After a rainout on May 4, the Trash Pandas take the field for the first game in team history, one year and one day after the Trash Pandas front office returned to Toyota Field following the shutdown due to the pandemic. David MacKinnon leads off with a single and comes home to score the first run in team history, but Rocket City falls to the Lookouts 6-1.

May 11, 2021: Liftoff at Toyota Field as a sold-out crowd of 7,500 enjoys the first Trash Pandas home game, a 4-3 loss in 10 innings to the Tennessee Smokies.

February 25, 2022: Andy Schatzley named the second manager in Trash Pandas history.

March 9, 2022: SEC baseball comes to Toyota Field for the first time, with Auburn defeating Tennessee Tech 4-3 in front of an energetic crowd of 6,710

April 8, 2022: The second season in Trash Pandas history begins on a high note with an 8-2 road victory over the Birmingham Barons at Regions Field.

June 19, 2022: Rocket City defeats Montgomery 7-2 at Toyota Field, clinching the First-Half North Division title and the first playoff berth in team history. Bryce Teodosio gave the Trash Pandas the lead in the seventh inning with a go-ahead inside-the-park home run, the first Trash Pandas inside-the-park home run.

September 3, 2022: Chase Silseth, Luke Murphy, and Eric Torres combine on the first no-hitter in Trash Pandas history in an 8-0 win over Biloxi at Toyota Field.

September 15, 2022: Trash Pandas clinch Second-Half North Division title with a 5-2 win over Birmingham at Toyota Field.

September 20, 2022: Trash Pandas go on the road and beat Tennessee 9-5 at Smokies Stadium in the first playoff game in team history.

September 22, 2022: Trash Pandas drop first playoff game in Toyota Field history, 4-2 to Tennessee.

September 23, 2022: The Trash Pandas are eliminated with a 3-1 loss to Tennessee, dropping the North Division series two games to one.

October 15, 2022: Toyota Field is transformed into a gridiron for the first football game in the facility, a 47-31 Jacksonville State win over North Alabama in a unique one-way game in front of 10,124 fans.

April 8, 2023: Trash Pandas throw second no-hitter in franchise history in 7-5 loss against Chattanooga.

August 18, 2023: Angels 2023 first-round pick Nolan Schanuel is selected to the Angels roster from Rocket City just 40 days after he was drafted, becoming the fastest promotion since 1995.

GARRETT FAHRMANN
EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT & GENERAL MANAGER

After a stellar baseball career at Concord College in Athens, WV, Garrett Fahrman coached for three years at his alma mater before leaving the field for the front office and his first stop as stadium operations manager for the Carolina League's Potomac Cannons.

Originally from Latimer, Iowa, Fahrman earned a Master's in Sport Management from Slippery Rock University before climbing up the MiLB ranks. Fahrman then went west to join the Fresno Grizzlies as Senior Vice President of Operations. At the time, the Grizzlies were the Triple-A affiliate of the San Francisco Giants.

Following nearly six years in Fresno, opportunity arose for Garrett, this time back East - another 3,000-mile trek across the country.

With the best wishes of the Grizzlies staff, Fahrman was to take the reins as Director of Operations for the Lehigh Valley IronPigs. The IronPigs, whose logo was created by Brandiose, the creator of the Trash Pandas' logos, are the Philadelphia Phillies' Triple-A affiliate.

After four years in Lehigh Valley, Fahrman went back out west for one season to Salt River Fields in Scottsdale, AZ. Spring Training home of the Colorado Rockies and Arizona Diamondbacks. From there, he headed back out west and was out of baseball, working as a real estate agent and for a property insurance company before the allure of the Trash Pandas got him back in the game. He began in Rocket City in July 2019 and was named General Manager in August.

With his strong baseball management background and outstanding business background, Garrett has the perfect combination to be the Trash Pandas first general manager. Garrett and his wife Natalie, make their home in Madison with daughters Riley (12) and Kinsley (10).



LINDSEY KNUPP
EXECUTIVE VICE PRESIDENT

To say Lindsey "brought home the bacon," is, well the truth.

Before arriving in the Rocket City, Knupp oversaw what many observers call the best in-game experience in Minor League Baseball. Through her efforts, the Lehigh Valley IronPigs won the 2019 Larry MacPhail Award, recognizing the top promotional effort in the sport. No stranger to personal accolades herself, she was the 2015 recipient of the Rawlings Women Executive of the Year award, which is presented annually by Minor League Baseball to the woman who has made outstanding contributions to her club, league, or the sport in general.

A graduate from Shippensburg (PA) University where she was also a two-time All-American in field hockey, Knupp is the caretaker of the Trash Pandas' public image, heading the team's marketing, game promotions, giveaways, and all entertainment in Toyota Field, ensuring the experience in the ballpark is second to none.

In fact, her title could very well be Vice President of Fun. That "title" followed her from Lehigh Valley where she came up with the idea of a cap with a strip of bacon on the front. It turned out to be the team's best merchandising campaign.

And, because of ideas such as those over her 12 years with the IronPigs, the team won five Golden Bobblehead Awards for its promotions in that span, including: Best Non-Game Day Event (2011), Best In-Game Promotion (2013), Best Theme Night (2016), Best Digital Campaign (2018) & Best Overall Promotion or Event (2018).

Her promotions have been noticed by the likes of The Wall Street Journal, USA Today, Sports Illustrated and ESPN, where sports business analyst Darren Rovell said Lindsey is among the "Best Marketers in Minor League Baseball."

Prior to joining Rocket City in November 2019, Knupp was the Director of Sales and Marketing for the Lehigh Valley Zoo. She also worked for the Reading Phillies for three seasons before joining the IronPigs in 2007.



ROB STERNBERG
VICE PRESIDENT, PRODUCTION & ENTERTAINMENT

Born during Game 2 of the 1986 World Series, Rob was destined for pro baseball.

Entering his 13th season in Minor League Baseball, his previous stops include the Binghamton Mets, Northwest Arkansas Naturals, Omaha Storm Chasers and most recently the Lehigh Valley IronPigs.

Currently, he has worked for a team in every league at both the Double-A and Triple-A levels.

Un 2018, Rob helped the IronPigs win the coveted Golden Bobblehead for best promotion, LV Wants LeBron James. The next year, Rob worked with Lindsey to help win the Larry MacPhail Award.

A graduate of Emerson College in Boston, Massachusetts, Rob has contributed in a number of roles for Minor League Baseball clubs including Public Relations, Marketing and promotions, though his true passion lies in producing the in-game atmosphere.

Rob also has a podcast, The Minor Side, based on life in Minor League Baseball. It can be heard on minor-side.com.

Josh has developed a pedigree of his own, broadcasting college and pro sports. During the baseball offseason, Josh can be heard calling Alabama and UAB athletics on ESPN+

Most recently, he was the football and men's basketball play-by-play voice at Stony Brook University on Long Island, and the Hudson Valley Renegades, then the Class-A Short-Season affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays.

He also has the Braves in his own background, spending a season as the Gwinnett Braves TV broadcaster and two years as the radio broadcaster for the Rome Braves.

Rounding out his resume, Josh was a football broadcaster for Birmingham-Southern, studio host at IMG for Tulane University football and basketball, as well as UNLV basketball.

The season-long event is designed to embrace the culture and values that resonate most within Minor League Baseball teams' local U.S. Hispanic communities.

Rocket City will wear new Lunaticos uniforms, complete with jerseys and caps for three home games at Toyota Field during the 2023 season:

- Sunday, May 26 at 2:35 p.m. vs. Montgomery
- Sunday, July 14 at 4:05 p.m. vs. Pensacola
- Sunday, August 11 at 4:05 p.m. vs. Birmingham

With the unveiling of the new Lunaticos identity, the Trash Pandas are now the only professional sports team in the state of Alabama with an alternate identity playing homage to its local Hispanic community. The Trash Pandas have hosted Hispanic Heritage night at Toyota Field in each of the first three seasons in team history.

Over the Trash Pandas' first three seasons, 22 percent of players are of Latin descent. Players from 14 different countries have taken the field for Rocket City, including six Latin countries such as Colombia, Cuba, Puerto Rico, Venezuela, the Dominican Republic and Mexico.

Three former Trash Pandas represented Latin countries at the recent World Baseball Classic, with Gustavo Campero and Adrian Almeida taking the field for Colombia and Jhonathan Diaz representing Venezuela. Eight former Trash Pandas with Latin heritage reached the Major Leagues in the past three seasons, all making their MLB debut with the Los Angeles Angels.

SPROCKET APPEARANCES

In addition to Trash Pandas games, mascot Sprocket loves to spend his time making visits to local community members. Appearances in 2023 included school visits, youth sporting events, Huntsville Havoc games and community parades! Sprocket is available for appearances at events of all sizes.

COLLECTION DRIVES

In 2023, the Trash Pandas hosted numerous different collection drives, with the items donated to local nonprofit organizations. The drives included toiletries, school supplies, toys, and canned food.

The Trash Pandas will host collection drives during the following dates in 2024: May 12, June 6, June 22, July 13 and July 25.

DOG DAYS

Each Wednesday, fans are invited to bring their four-legged friends to the park for Dog Day. For a \$1 donation to an animal-related nonprofit, dogs were allowed entry and all proceeds went back to that nonprofit of the night. This season, general admission tickets will be \$8 and reserved box seats Sections 1 and 2 start at \$16 per ticket. In 2023, the Trash Pandas hosted eight dog days raising over \$500 for those organizations.

COMMUNITY CLUBHOUSE SALE

During the 2023 season, the Trash Pandas Foundation hosted two Community Clubhouse Sales which offered a variety of autographed and game used memorabilia to fans in a garage style fashion. Items included mystery autographed baseballs, autographed baseball cards, batting practice gear, specialty jerseys, game worn caps, and more. Those sales raised over \$12,200 for the foundation.

The Rocket City Trash Pandas Foundation was established in 2022 as the non-profit charitable arm of the Rocket City organization. Operated by our community relations team under the direction of Community Relations Director Maddison Kendrick, the foundation spearheads outreach around North Alabama through initiatives such as mascot appearances, jersey auctions, ballpark tours, team experiences, and more.

The Rocket City Trash Pandas Foundation is a 501c3 organization dedicated to educating and promoting healthy lifestyles through sport and to positively impact communities in the North Alabama region.

JERSEY AUCTIONS

One of the most popular fundraisers were jersey auctions. In 2023, the Trash Pandas wore five specialty themed jerseys. Throughout the game, fans near and far had the opportunity to bid on the game-worn and autographed jerseys. Over \$65,000 was raised through the auctions, with the proceeds being split between the Trash Pandas Foundation and a local nonprofit. Specialty jerseys in 2023 included Star Wars Night, Armed Forces Night, Marvel Night, Space Night and a Huntsville Stars Throwback!

In 2024, Jersey Auction dates will be on May 7, June 21, July 26, August 10 and September 7.

YOUTH INSTRUCTIONAL CAMP

The Trash Pandas have held an annual youth instructional camp over the past three years. Over the course of two days, campers had the opportunity to learn baseball skills and fundamentals from Trash Pandas players.

This years camp dates are June 5-6 for ages 7-9 and June 19-20 for ages 10-12.

CONCESSIONS FUNDRAISING

Nonprofit organizations had the opportunity to fundraise for their organization during games by volunteering in our concession stands. Each volunteer was paid by the hour, with that money going directly to their organization. Through this program, over \$53,000 was raised.

COMMUNITY DONATIONS

The Trash Pandas are proud to support local nonprofits and fundraisers through additional give back programs such as our in-kind donation program, and service opportunities for our front office staff. Anyone hosting a fundraiser is eligible to apply for tickets, autographed memorabilia, and other Trash Pandas swag to help raise funds for their event. To date, over \$10,100 of in-kind donations have been donated.

2023 TRASH PANDAS NOTES

LAUNCHED TO THE LEAGUE: First baseman Nolan Schanuel was drafted in the first round by the Angels in 2023. It only took five combined games between rookie ball and Single-A Inland Empire for Schanuel to get the call to Rocket City. During his 17 games as a Trash Panda, Schanuel torched the Southern League slashing .333/.474/.467 while collecting 12 RBI and walking more than he struck out. That was enough for Schanuel to be called directly up to the big league club just 40 days after he was drafted. His promotion is the fastest for a position player since 1978 and the fastest overall since 1995. A surprise to few, Schanuel would continue to impress once with the Angels as he hit for a .275 average while setting the table for MVP's Mike Trout and Shohei Othani.

INNINGS EATER: After a strong season in the rotation in 2022, Brett Kerry spent a majority of 2023 in Rocket City and once again proved himself as a more than reliable starter. Kerry finished inside the top 10 in several Southern League categories including innings pitched, ERA and quality starts. The three-year Trash Panda had made 20 starts and pitched in over 100 innings for the second consecutive season. Kerry was reawarded for his strong performance with his first call-up to Triple-A Salt Lake in September.

KYREN REWRITES RECORD BOOKS: Following a brief stint in Rocket City towards the end of the 2022 season, Paris shined in 2023 as a mainstay in the Trash Pandas lineup. Paris finished top 10 in the Southern League in doubles, stolen bases and walks. In four different hitting categories, Paris set single season hitting records including his 88 walks and 44 stolen bases. Midway through the season, Paris was selected to the 2023 Futures Game as a starter and hit fifth in the lineup. The historic season came to an end for Paris in September, but for good reason as Paris was selected to make his MLB debut.

NEW KIDS IN THE OUTFIELD: Aproximately a fifth of the Trash Pandas hits in 2023 came from outfielders David Calabrese and Tucker Flint. Both players made their Rocket City debut in 2023 after spending the prior season in Single-A Inland Empire. Calabrese was a 2020 third-round pick and Flint a 2022 13th-round pick both by the Angels. Both players were included in the opening day starting lineup and would go on to appear in over 120 games throughout the season. The two also combined for over 100 RBI in 2023.

Silseth got the start and took a perfect game into the seventh, retiring the first 20 hitters he faced. Murphy and Torres each pitched a scoreless inning to finish the historic feat with an 8-0 win over Biloxi on September 3, 2022. The pitching trio combined for 15 strikeouts in the first no-hitter by the Angels' Double-A affiliate since Mobile no-hit Birmingham at Hank Aaron Stadium on 5/14/2018.

2023 TRASH PANDAS NOTES

NO APRIL SHOWERS IN MADISON: The Trash Pandas would start 2023 on a strong note as the team went 12-9 in April. Rocket City shined on the road during the month winning both series away from home against Birmingham and Chattanooga. April also featured a season-high five game win streak. The Trash Pandas held a share of first place in the North Division for 15 of a possible 24 days during the month.

DIRECT FLIGHT TO CITY OF ANGELS: In 2023, the Trash Pandas saw a record 12 former players make their MLB debut. That number grew from seven the prior season. Among the 12 players to get the call, seven of those players were sent to the big leagues directly from Rocket City. Each player made their big league debut with the Angels organization.



CONSISTENCY FROM THE BULLPEN:

The Trash Pandas were the only team in the Southern League to have three pitchers make 40 appearances this season. Both Luke Murphy and Kenyon Yovan made 44 appearances for the Trash Pandas while Ivan Armstrong recorded 43. All three were in the top five in the Southern League in that statistic. Yovan served as the primary closer for the Trash Pandas in 2023 as he picked up 10 saves to lead the team in his first season in Rocket City. Yovan would earn a call-up to Triple-A Salt Lake on September 1. Murphy and Armstrong were both returning Trash Pandas having pitched for the team in 2022.

COMPLETE(LY) DOMINANT: The Trash Pandas joined Montgomery as one of just two teams in the Southern League to have two players toss a complete game during the 2023 season. Mason Erla and Jack Kochanowicz both went the distance in games that took place during the first half of the season. Erla took advantage of a shortened game on May 11 as he tossed six innings and allowed just two runs on the road against Biloxi. Kochanowicz meanwhile, went the distance in a full nine inning contest. On May 20, Kochanowicz tossed the full nine against Birmingham allowing just one run and four hits while striking out five in a Trash Pandas victory.

NETO LEAVES STRONG IMPRESSION: While not staying with the Trash Pandas for long in 2023, Zach Neto was able to put the finishing touches on an impressive stint in the Angels minor league system. Neto spent the first seven games of the season with the Trash Pandas and recorded a hit in five of those games and had multiple hits in four games. A two-homer game with 5 RBI against Birmingham was enough to earn a call straight to the show the next day on April 15. Neto would remain a regular in the Angels lineup throughout the remainder of the 2023 season.

AGE IS JUST A NUMBER: Listed as the oldest player on the Trash Pandas roster, former Major Leaguer Tyler Payne played a big role for Rocket City at the catching position. Payne saw a large majority of playing time after a trade that send Edgar Quero to the Chicago White Sox. In 44 games, Payne compiled a .313 average with 26 RBI in his first season with the Trash Pandas following an eight-year stint with the Chicago Cubs organization.

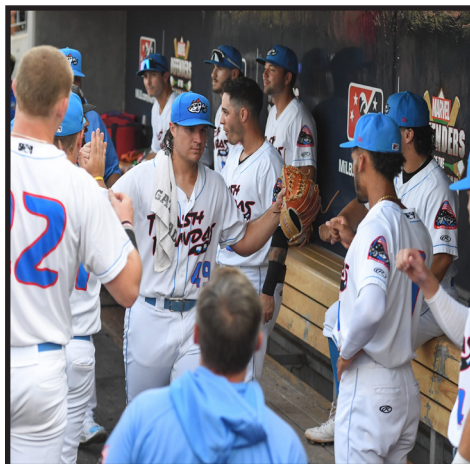

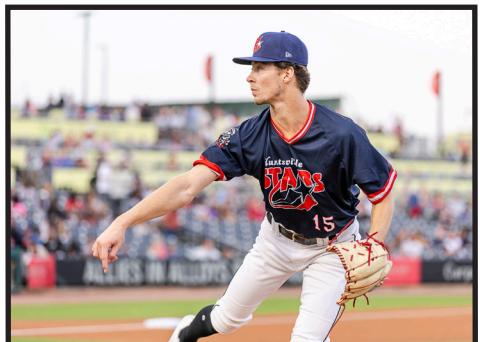

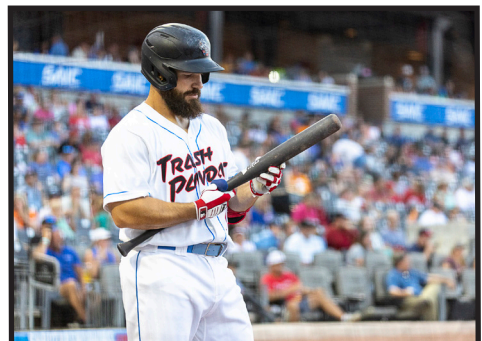

In 1984, Larry Schmittou brought baseball to Huntsville in a series of transactions that moved the then Double-A Nashville Sounds up to Triple-A, and resulted in the forming of the Huntsville Stars. The team began play at Joe W. Davis Municipal Stadium in 1985. Beginning their tenure as the Double-A affiliate of the Oakland A's, the Stars got off to a hot start in 1985, taking home the Southern League crown in their inaugural season. After becoming a Milwaukee Brewers affiliate in 1999, the Stars remained a Brewers affiliate at Joe Davis Stadium until 2014 before moving to Biloxi in 2015 to become the Shuckers. Due to construction delays in Biloxi, the Shuckers played 15 home games at Joe Davis Stadium in 2015, with the final game being a 7-2 Biloxi win over Birmingham on May 25, 2015.

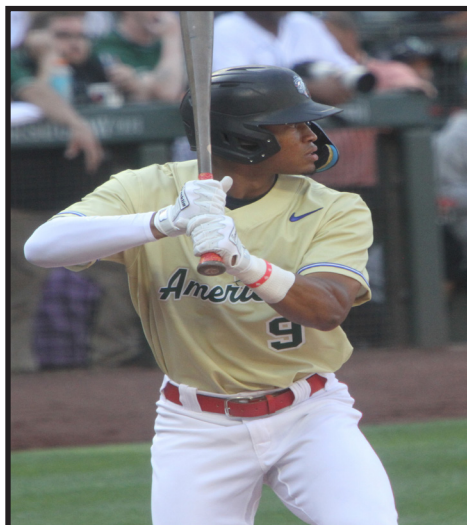

In a ceremony prior to the first game at Toyota Field 5/11/21, the Trash Pandas retired the number 5 in honor of Huntsville baseball legend Don Mincher. A Huntsville native who played 13 MLB seasons, Mincher went on to serve as the Huntsville Stars' first President and General Manager before serving as President of the Southern League from 2000-2011. As a player, Mincher was a two-time All-Star first baseman in 1967 and 1969 before winning a World Series in his final season as a player with the Oakland A's in 1972. Mincher's number 5 was previously retired by the Huntsville Stars. Jackie Robinson's number 42 was retired across baseball in 1997 for breaking baseball's color barrier and for his tremendous contributions to the game. Both numbers hang atop the Inline Electric Rock Porch in right field.

Additionally, a handful of player with previous Major League experience joined the Trash Pandas, and then went on to return to the big leagues. Those players are:

- 1. RHP Chris Rodriguez** - Began the 2021 season with the Angels, optioned to Rocket City on 6/21/21 to be stretched out to a starter from a reliever, before being promoted to Triple-A Salt Lake on 7/22/21 and eventually back to the Angels as a starter on 8/2/21.
- 2. RHP Tyler Danish** - Made his MLB debut for the Chicago White Sox in 2016 and appeared in 11 MLB games from 2016-18. Signed with LAA and joined Rocket City on 5/20/21, pitched in 3 Rocket City games before a promotion to Triple-A Salt Lake on 6/11/21. Finished the 2021 season in Salt Lake. In 2022, signed with Boston and made 32 MLB appearances for the Red Sox, going 3-1. He became the first former Trash Pandas player to play against the Angels when he earned a hold on 6/8 at Angel Stadium.
- 3. OF Aaron Whitefield*** - Appeared in three games for the Minnesota Twins in the pandemic-shortened 2020 season in his MLB debut. Signed with the Angels for the 2022 season and began the year with the Trash Pandas. Was promoted straight to the Angels and made his Los Angeles debut on 5/9/22, becoming the first position player to reach the Major Leagues after playing for Rocket City.

2024 SOUTHERN LEAGUE PLAYOFF PROCEDURES

The Southern League Championship season will be played as a split season (i.e., the season will be divided into two halves). For a season consisting of 138 games (Double-A), the final game of the first half is the originally scheduled game #69 and the first game of the second half is the originally scheduled game #70. Any game that is suspended or postponed during the first half must be completed or made up prior to the first date of the second half, otherwise such game shall be cancelled. Win-loss records will be reset at the beginning of the second half. For the Trash Pandas, the first half will end on Sunday, June 23 vs. Biloxi and the second half will begin on Tuesday, June 25 at Chattanooga.

The format for the Southern League Postseason will consist of four teams per participating in a best-of-three Division Series, followed by a best-of-three Championship Series. The four playoff participants will be the winners of each division from both halves based on the best winning percentage of each half. In the event the same Club wins both halves, the Club with the next best full season winning percentage in that division will advance. In the event of any ties, the following tiebreakers will apply in the order below:

1. Head-to-head record (if 3 or more Clubs, best winning percentage in games among the Clubs).
2. If the Clubs remain tied, best overall winning percentage over the last 20 games.
3. If the Clubs remain tied, best overall winning percentage over an additional game (i.e., the last 21 games, the last 22 games, etc.) until one emerges with a better winning percentage in that span.

The winners of the first half in each division will host game two and, if necessary, game three of the Division Series. The winners of the second half in each division will host game one of the Division Series. The winner of the Division Series from the North division will host game two and, if needed, game three of the Championship Series; the other Division Series winner will host game one.



RECENT MINOR LEAGUE BASEBALL RULE CHANGES

Major League Baseball announced a variety of experimental playing rules which were implemented starting during the 2023 season throughout each Professional Development League (PDL). Consistent with the preferences of fans, these changes are designed to enhance the quality of the game on the field by increasing action, providing additional opportunities for players to showcase their athleticism, and improving the pace of play. Below were the rules that were first introduced to the Southern League in 2023.

PITCH TIMER: To encourage a crisp pace of play, Pitch Timers will be used at all full-season PDL levels. The Pace of Game Procedures that will be used in 2024 are very similar to the regulations that were used at the PDL levels during the 2022 season. In the Southern League, the pitch clock will be 14 seconds between pitches with the bases empty, 18 seconds between pitches with runners on, and 30 second between batters. Inning breaks and pitching changes come with a two minute and 15 second timer. Batters will be required to be in the batter's box and alert to the pitcher with 8 or more seconds remaining on the Timer, which is a change from the 9-second threshold used at all PDL levels in 2022. If the pitcher makes a pickoff attempt at any base, feints a pickoff, or otherwise steps off the rubber with runners on base he shall be charged with a Disengagement. To ensure that pitchers do not circumvent the Pitch Timer regulations by stepping off the rubber, pitchers at all PDL levels shall be limited to a total of two Disengagements per plate appearance with runners on base. Consistent with the Disengagement Rule in use during the 2022 PDL season, the Disengagement count will not reset until the following plate appearance, even if a runner advances or is retired during a plate appearance.



BIGGER BASES: 18-inch bases will continue to be used at all full-season levels of play in the 2024 season after debuting in 2022. Previously, bases were 15 inches square. This change has the effect of reducing the distance between first and second base and reducing the distance between second and third base.

RESTRICTIONS ON INFIELD POSITIONING: At all PDL levels, a minimum of four infielders (not including the pitcher and the catcher) will be required to be positioned within the outer boundary of the infield with two infielders entirely on each side of second base. Additionally, infielders may not switch sides during an inning unless there is a substitution for a defensive player other than the pitcher.

ENHANCED-GRIP BASEBALLS: During the 2021 season, MLB began working with the Dow Company, a materials science leader, to develop an alternative to the Delaware River mud currently applied to the baseball. The objective of this project was and remains to develop a treatment process that allows pitchers to secure a better grip on the baseball – particularly in extreme environmental conditions – while not altering performance properties. The baseballs that undergo this treatment process (“Enhanced-Grip Baseballs”) are Major League baseballs manufactured by Rawlings and are identical to the baseballs that will be in use during the 2024 Major League season. To evaluate the potential for these Enhanced-Grip Baseballs to be used at the Major League level in the future, Enhanced-Grip Baseballs will be used in the Southern League from Opening Day through July 13 (i.e., prior to the All-Star break). When games resume after the All-Star break, teams in the Southern League will use standard mudded Major League baseballs. This experimental design provides the best opportunity to collect feedback from players and coaches early in the season and to determine the impact that the treatment process has on performance properties (e.g., spin rate, drag).

BASEBALL CALCULATIONS

ASSISTS

An assist shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects a batted or thrown ball in such a way that a putout results, or would have resulted except for a subsequent error by any fielder. Only one assist and no more shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects the ball in a run-down play which results in a putout, or would have resulted in a putout, except for a subsequent error.

BATTING AVERAGE

Divide the numbers of at-bats into the number of hits.

SLUGGING PERCENTAGE

Divide the total bases of all safe hits by the total number of at-bats.

ON BASE PERCENTAGE

Take the total number of hits, walks, and hit-by-pitches and divide by the total number of at-bats, walks, hit-by-pitches, and sacrifice flies. Times awarded first base on interference or obstruction are not figured into on base percentage.

CONSECUTIVE GAME HITTING STREAK

A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if all the player's plate appearances result in a walk, hit batsman, defensive interference or a sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if the player has a sacrifice fly and no hit.

CONSECUTIVE GAMES PLAYED STREAK

A consecutive-game streak shall extend if the player plays one half-inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running appearance shall not extend the streak.

DETERMINING THE MAGIC NUMBER

Determine the number of games yet to be played, add one, then subtract the number of games ahead in the lost column of the standings from the closest team.

EARNED RUN AVERAGE

Multiply earned runs by 9 and then divide by innings pitched.

FIELDING PERCENTAGE

Divide the total putouts and assists by total putouts, assists and errors.

SAVES FOR RELIEF PITCHERS

Credit a pitcher with a save when he meets all three of the following conditions:

- He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club; and
- He is not the winning pitcher; he must be credited with at least 1/3 of an inning pitched and
- He qualifies under one of the following conditions:
 1. He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning; or
 2. He enters the game, regardless of the count, with the potential tying run either already on base, at bat or on deck; or
 3. He enters the game, regardless of how large the lead is, and pitches effectively as he completes the last three innings of the game.

No more than one save may be credited in each game.

WINNING PITCHER

The starting pitcher will be credited with the win only if he has pitched at least five complete innings and his team not only is in the lead when he is replaced, but remains in the lead the remainder of the game. When the starting pitcher does not meet the preceding criteria and more than one relief pitcher is used, the victory shall be awarded on the following basis:

- When, during the tenure of the starting pitcher, the winning team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game, credit the victory to the relief pitcher judged by the scorer to have been the most effective.
- Whenever the score is tied, the game becomes a new contest insofar as the winning and losing pitcher is concerned.
- Once the opposing team assumes the lead, all pitchers who have pitched up to that point are excluded from being credited with the victory except the current pitcher.
- The winning relief pitcher shall be the one who is the pitcher of record when his team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game.

EXCEPTION: Do not credit a victory to a relief pitcher who is ineffective in a brief appearance, when a succeeding relief pitcher pitches effectively in helping his team maintain the lead. In such cases credit the succeeding relief pitcher with the victory.
