RHP Bradley Blalock (1-1, 8.51) vs. RHP Matt Waldron (0-1, 6.75)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes hold a 1-0 series lead after a 3-2 victory in 10-innings last night ... Albuquerque has won three-straight, eight of its last 10 and 11 of 17 ... Bradley Blalock is expected to start for the Isotopes while Matt Waldron is slated to take the hill for the Chihuahuas.

RUN DIFFERENTIAL: Albuquerque's run differential on the year is -7, tied for 5th-best in the Pacific Coast League. On June 4, 2024, the club held a -146 run differential.

WIN STREAKS: The Isotopes have two three-game win streaks within a 10-game span for the first time since June 15-22, 2024, seven game stretch (last two vs. El Paso and first against Oklahoma City and then three-straight over the Comets).

.500: The club is just three-games under .500, it's best mark since April 25 (11-14).

ONE-RUN GAMES: Albuquerque improved to 11-10 in one-run games last night and 4-8 on the road. Have won three-straight one-run games dating back to May 24. The Isotopes have won two-straight games by one run for the second time this year (also: May 15-17 vs. Tacoma when the club completed three-straight walk-off wins).

EXTRA: The Isotopes are 3-0 in extra-inning games this year and 2-0 against El Paso in such contests (also: April 20, Game 1 of doubleheader, 4-3, 8 innings).

RISP: Despite the win last night, Albuquerque went 0-for-6 with runners in scoring position, the 12th time this year the club has failed to record a hit with a runner in scoring position and third in its last six games.

-It's the team's first triumph without a hit with a runner in scoring position since April 4, 2024, at Oklahoma City (5-4) and third since 2023 (August 29, 2023, at Sacramento, 5-0).

LAST 10: Over Albuquerque's last 10 games, the club is first in Triple-A in homers (21) and total bases (209), second in runs (70), doubles (27) and third in hits (111).

LAST AT-BAT: The Isotopes recorded their ninth last at-bat victory of the season yesterday, second-straight, and the third that did not come via walk-off (others: May 2 vs. Salt Lake and June 1 vs. Sugar Land).

FIRST FRAME: The Isotopes have permitted first-inning runs in three of their last four games and two-straight (six runs overall during four-game stretch).

RIT: Ryan Ritter extended his career-long hit streak to 17 games Sunday, longest active in MiLB. During streak is slashing .453/.500/1.027 with 10 doubles, three triples, nine homers and 29 RBI ... Longest hit streak by an Isotope since Greg Jones (18, Aug. 25-Sept. 15, 2024).

-During hit streak leads MiLB in hits, total bases, doubles, homers, RBI, OPS and slugging ... Has 23-game on-base streak, longest active streak in PCL ... Has 13 multi-hit games in his last 16 contests and team-leading 20 in 2025 ... Has an extra-base hit in 15 of his last 16 contests ... Has increased batting average from .218 to .307 during streak.

-Since May 1, slashing .386/.447/.911 with 11 doubles, three triples, 12 homers and 33 RBI after hitting .224 over first 26 games. During stretch, leads all of MiLB in slugging, total bases, extra-base hits, tied for 1st in home runs, RBI and second in OPS.

BIG MIKE: Michael Toglia played in his first Triple-A game last night since June 4, 2024, and recorded an RBI double to tie the game while tallying two punchouts.

MR. BRUIN: Sean Bouchard registered a double and two walks yesterday. Recorded a hit and two walks in a game twice with Albuquerque in 2025 (also: May 20 at Reno). Has double in two-straight games for first time since July 26-27, 2024, vs. RR.

THE VET: Austin Nola made his return from the Injured List last night after missing 21 games and went 1-for-4. Has a hit in eight of his last nine contests.

AMADOR: Adael Amador went 1-for-4 last night with an RBI and a walk. Has a hit in 11 of 14 games with Albuquerque. Has four RBI in his last three contests.

WARMIN' UP: Warming Bernabel recorded two hits Sunday for the second-straight evening ... His sixth time in 2025 with back-to-back multi-hit games ... Has a hit in seven of his last nine games (12x31 with four doubles and five walks).

STERLIN: Sterlin Thompson is slashing .381/.487/.683 with six doubles, two triples, three homers and 12 RBI in his last 17 games. Has 11 hit-by-pitch, the most in the PCL.

PCL LEADERBOARD: Ryan Ritter is 1st OPS (1.059), slugging (.643) and XBH (32), 2nd in homers (16) and total bases (128), T-2nd in runs (44) and RBI (45), 5th in OBP (.416), T-6th in triples (3), 7th in hits (61) and 8th in walks (34) ... Warming Bernabel is T-5th in doubles (16) ... Sterlin Thompson is T-6th in triples (3) ... Julio Carreras is 10th in stolen bases (11).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

AARON MUNOZ: Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

First Isotopes pitcher to go into the eighth inning at home since Jeff Criswell (7.2 IP) on Aug. 20, 2023 vs. El Paso ... 111 pitches were the most for any Isotopes hurler since Ryan Carpenter (117) on Aug. 22, 2017 at Sacramento
