About Last Week: The Loons dropped four of six, including the final three in a row, to the Lake County Captains (CLE) in Eastlake, Ohio. Great Lakes outscored Lake County 38-35 over the course of the series, thanks to a 14-4 victory Wednesday. The Loons bullpen was superb to begin the series, surrendering seven earned runs in 23 innings in the first five games, but ceded 11 earned in seven innings in game six. Great Lakes hit 10 home runs over the series, including five on Wednesday, but allowed 14 Lake County longballs.

Playoff Bound: The Great Lakes Loons have clinched a playoff spot by winning the first half in the Midwest League Eastern Division. The Loons came back from 8 1/2 games back with 14 to play, and clinched the spot a day early, gaining 9 1/2 games in the standings over a 13 game span. The Loons have won their second first-half title in franchise history (2019) and are in the postseason for the sixth time in the last nine years. It is the eighth playoff berth in franchise history.

She Talks Like June: In the month of June, the Loons had the best record in Minor League Baseball at 19-7. Great Lakes pitching racked up 300 strikeouts in the month, and held opponents to a .203 batting average, good for first and second in the Minors, respectively. Offensively, their .268 average and .827 OPS ranked fourth and second in High-A, respectively. 165 runs led the MWL.

CYCLE: On June 16th, Alex De Jesus became the second Loon in franchise history to hit for the cycle and the first to do it at Dow Diamond. The 20-year-old started the game with a double, home run, and triple in the first five innings. He singled in the 7th inning and finished the game 4-for-6 in a 13-4 win over Wisconsin.

Got 'em Looking! The Loons pitching staff has racked up 1,154 strikeouts through 107 games this season. That's an average of 10.8 K/gm putting them on pace for 1,431 strikeouts this season, which would set the franchise record (1,256 - 2014). The Loons are currently 3rd in MiLB in strikeouts.

Dodgers on the Farm: When combining the records of the MiLB affiliates with the MLB parent clubs record, the Dodgers organization has the best record in baseball at 405-288. Excluding rookie-level affiliates, the Dodgers' system also leads baseball at 321-220.

Run It Up: On June 28, the Loons scored a team-record 18 runs in franchise history to hit for the cycle and the first that number twice in the last two years. Before September 7, 2021, the Loons hadn't scored 18 runs in a game since the 2009 season.

Pace of Play: Last year, the average 9-inning game in the Midwest League lasted 3 hours, 7 minutes. This season, the average game is being played in 2 hours, 33 minutes. The Loons last year played just 5 9-inning games in under 2:33. This season, they've played 32-of-85 9-inning games under 2:33.

In the Rear View: Since a 5-10 start to the season, the Loons have gone 59-33. That's the best record in the Midwest League by 5.0 games (Lake County) and is the third-best record in Minor League Baseball (3.0 GB of Charleston).

Double-Decker Salami Sandwich: Imanol Vargas became the first Loon in franchise history to hit a grand slam in consecutive games, with a slam on June 30 and July 1 vs. Dayton. Vargas is the first Great Lakes player to hit three grand slams in the same season.

Thrice as Nice: On June 3rd, the Loons turned the 5th triple play in franchise history and the first since 7/31/12. It also marked the first time the Loons had turned three at Dow Diamond. The Loons took advantage of numerous base-running errors by the Fort Wayne TinCaps and converted the triple play 8-6-2-4-5-8 (Ismael Alcantara ->Eddys Leonard->Ryan January->Max Hewitt->Jorbit Vivas->Alcantara).

Baseball is Like a Box of Chocolates: The Loons have lost a series 5-1 where they outscored their opponent 30-26 (@PEO in April) and won a series 5-1 in which they were outscored 25-24 (@WMM in April).

Protected Pitchers: Loons starting pitchers have logged just 376.1 innings this year - the third-fewest in MiLB. The Dodgers' Single-A affiliate in Rancho Cucamonga has the fewest starter innings this year at 292.2.

Future Nostalgia: C Diego Cartaya, the No. 1 prospect in the Dodgers organization, was named to the roster for the 2022 All-Star Futures Game at Dodger Stadium, joining former Loons RHP Bobby Miller (Double-A Tulsa, LAD No. 2) and 3B Miguel Vargas (Triple-A OKC, LAD No. 5). Other current Midwest Leaguers to get the nod include Antoine Kelly (WIS/MIL), Pete Crow-Armstrong (SB/CHC), Robert Hassell III (FW/SD), Elly De La Cruz (DAY/CIN) and Denzel Clarke (LAN/OAK).

MANAGER

Austin Chubb

The Los Angeles Dodgers announced Austin Chubb will return as manager of the Great Lakes Loons in 2022. Last year, he became the Loons' ninth manager since the team's inaugural 2007 season, and this year becomes just the third to manage more than one season in Midland. In his first season at the helm of the Loons, Chubb led the team to a 63-57 record and amassed the best run differential in the High-A Central Eastern Division. Chubb is the only Loon to play for and now manage the club, with a brief stint as a player in 2015. Chubb, 32, enters his sixth season coaching in the Dodgers' organization. Los Angeles tabbed Chubb to manage the A-affiliate Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in 2020, before the season was cancelled. Chubb proved himself as a promising manager when he led the Dodgers' former Rookie-Advanced affiliate Ogden Raptors to a franchise-best 54-22 record in 2019, earning the Pioneer League Manager of the Year. Prior to Ogden, Chubb spent two seasons managing the Dodgers' Dominican Summer League club from 2016-2018. Before joining the Dodgers as a player, Chubb's road to Midland began when he was selected by the Washington Nationals in the 21st round of the 2012 draft after a collegiate career at Florida Southern. In 2012, Chubb served as a catcher for the rookie-level Gulf Coast League Nationals before joining the Auburn Doubledays in the New York-Penn League. Chubb would finish his Nationals journey after a 2014 season for the now-defunct Hagerstown Suns. Los Angeles signed Chubb to a minor league contract before 2015. A 2015 minor-league season saw Chubb appear in three different Dodger-affiliate jerseys, including Great Lakes, Oklahoma City, and Rancho Cucamonga. A native of Lake Mary, Fla., the right-handed catcher spent the most time with the Quakes, helping Rancho Cucamonga secure the 2015 California League Championship. Entering the 2022 season, Chubb has logged over seven years as either a player or coach within the Dodgers organization.

PITCHING COACH

David Anderson

David Anderson continues his rise through the ranks of the Dodgers organization as the pitching coach for the Loons in 2022. Anderson, 27, joined the L.A. system as a development coach in 2020, and was assigned as the pitching coach for the organization's Arizona Complex League team last season. He led his staff to the fourth-lowest ERA in the ACL at 4.06, the third-most strikeouts (617 in 488.0 innings pitched), and the second-best walks and hits per innings pitched. Anderson, a 2015 graduate of Muhlenberg College, got his start in coaching at his alma mater, serving as pitching coach for the NCAA Division III school in Allentown, Pa., for two years immediately after his graduation. After that, he became a volunteer assistant for Cornell in 2017 before landing at Atlanta's Emory University, serving as the school's pitching coach and recruiting coordinator. While in the college ranks, Anderson also got head coaching experience in summer collegiate ball as manager of the Watertown (N.Y.) Rapids of the Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League in 2018, leading the team to a 26-21 record in its inaugural season. He then went on to manage the now-defunct Fayetteville (N.C.) SwampDogs of the Coastal Plain League in 2019. Anderson, a native of Syracuse, N.Y., tossed four seasons at Muhlenberg. As a junior in 2014, he posted a 3.14 ERA over 63.0 innings, all as a starter. He walked just seven batters that season while striking out 28. He served as team captain as a senior, and led the team that year in innings pitched and strikeouts. After college, Anderson tested the waters in independent baseball. He appeared 16 times for the Newburgh Newts of the North Country Baseball League, with a stellar 2.38 ERA and seven saves. He then threw to a 2.67 ERA with the Bridgeport Bluefish of the Atlantic League, an MLB Partner League.

HITTING COACH

Dylan Nasiatka

Dylan Nasiatka moves up to his third team in as many years in the Dodgers' organization, serving as the Loons' hitting coach in 2022. Nasiatka, 32, spent last year as the hitting coach of the Low-A Rancho Cucamonga Quakes, where he led the team to a league-high 6.75 runs per game. His hitters also paced the league in doubles, home runs, total bases, slugging percentage and OPS. The Bakersfield, Calif., native joined the Dodgers system prior to the 2020 season, for which he was assigned to be the hitting coach for the Ogden Raptors. Nasiatka earned a bachelor's degree from Cal State Bakersfield in kinesiology & exercise science in 2014, and achieved his master's degree in exercise science from California University of Pennsylvania the next year. Before joining the Dodgers' organization, Nasiatka worked as an assistant coach at Bakersfield College, a two-year school in his hometown, for seven seasons. Nasiatka played collegiate ball for three different schools, starting at Bakersfield College before moving to Hofstra and eventually South Carolina-Beaufort. He was a versatile player, with reps at catcher and on the infield. Nasiatka set a Bakersfield College record with a .473 batting average as a redshirt sophomore in 2010, belting 17 doubles, two home runs, and driving in 33 runs in 41 games. He was named a Junior College All-American by the American Baseball Coaches Association that season. In his lone season at Hofstra, he continued to rake, hitting .303 with 19 RBIs in 45 games, mostly as a designated hitter. He found more success at USCB, hitting .335 with 18 extra-base hits and 29 RBIs over 53 games.

BENCH COACH

Elian Herrera

Former Great Lakes Loon and Los Angeles Dodger Elian Herrera returns to the Great Lakes Loons 2021 field staff in his second season as bench coach. Herrera, a four-year big leaguer, begins his fourth season as a coach within the Dodgers' organization. The second baseman played over 20 games with the Loons in a span of two separate seasons. Herrera was a member of the inaugural 2007 Great Lakes Loons, along with nine other future Major Leaguers. Herrera would return to the Loons for a portion of the start of the 2009 season. From 2012-2018, Herrera played in 324 games at the AAA level, holding a .310 batting average in nearly 1200 plate appearances. Herrera made his major league debut on May 15, 2012 at Dodger Stadium, in a game where Kirk Gibson managed the Arizona Diamondbacks vs Don Mattingly's Dodgers. Three other former Loons appeared in the 5-1 loss for the Dodgers: Javy Guerrero (RHP, '09), Dee Strange-Gordon (SS, '09), and Scott Van Slyke (OF, '07) Before joining the Loons staff last season, Herrera was the bench coach for the Rancho Cucamonga Quakes in 2019, helping lead the team to the playoffs after an 81-57 finish in the regular season, good for first in the South division of the California League.

ASSISTANT PITCHING COACH

Richael De Los Santos

Richard De Los Santos joins the Dodgers' organization for the first time as assistant pitching coach for the Loons in 2022. The 37-year-old had a nine-year minor league career as a right-handed pitcher, mostly in the Tampa Bay system. De Los Santos pitched in 36 games over three seasons for Triple-A Durham, racking up 99 strikeouts in 169 1-3 innings at MiLB's highest level. Over the course of his nine seasons in affiliated baseball, the Dominican Republic native struck out over 400 batters. De Los Santos played a portion of the 2005 season for the Southwest Michigan Devil Rays in Battle Creek, who would be purchased in 2006 by the Michigan Baseball Foundation and become the Loons in 2007.

Stuff: Sheehan's best pitch is his fastball, according to Baseball America, which has been dialed as high as 97 mph. "His fastball rides up in the zone longer than hitters expect, so he generates a lot of empty swings when he elevates with his heater, and that's how Sheehan gets a lot of swings and misses."

2021: Primarily pitched with Low-A Rancho Cucamonga:

5G, 13.0 IP, 10 H, 6 ER, 5 BB, 17 K, 4.15 ERA, 1.15 WHIP

College: Spent three years at Boston College playing in Chestnut Hill, Massachusetts for head coach Mike Gambino. Pitched out of the bullpen as a freshman before earning a spot in the starting rotation as a sophomore and junior. In total, Sheehan logged 105.0 innings with a 4.80 ERA and 142 strikeouts. Sheehan set the BC single-game record with 15 strikeouts against Pittsburgh on May 7, 2021.

Draft: Selected by the Dodgers in the 6th round of the 2021 MLB Draft (192nd overall) as a draft-eligible junior, coming as the 6th consecutive pitcher taken by LAD. He signed for \$244,500 (\$2,500 below slot value). 17 of the Dodgers' 19 players picked were pitchers, with two position players coming as two of the final five picks. Sheehan is one of seven players from the 2021 draft that has reached High-A Great Lakes.

Summer Ball: Spent 2019 with the Danbury Westerners of the New England Collegiate Baseball League and 2020 with the New Britain Bees in the Futures Collegiate Baseball League. While with the Bees, he played with fellow 2021 Dodgers draft pick Ben Casparius, who was promoted to Great Lakes on May 28.

High School: Spent first two years at Fordham Prep in the Bronx. A private, Jesuit, boys college-preparatory school located on the Rose Hill campus of Fordham University. Notable alumni include Vin Scully (c/o 1944) and MLB HOF'er Frankie Frisch (c/o 1916). Finished HS career at Salisbury School in Connecticut which is considered to be one of the most expensive private schools in the United States.

Hometown/Personal: Darien is the smallest town on Connecticut's Gold Coast with a population of ~20,000. New York Yankees GM Brian Cashman, Vineyard Vines CEO Ian Murray, and SoFi CEO Anthony Noto all currently reside in Darien. Mother, Maureen, played college volleyball at Georgetown.
