A multi-level building in right field provides ticket-buyers with an extraordinary view of the game and some delectable food options, makes the Jumbo Shrimp Souvenir Store accessible on the street level and also includes an incredible space that is Jacksonville's newest spot for banquets and meetings. Personally, I am so excited to try all of the new, delicious options we are providing for fans this season.

On the field, we look forward to again watching Triple-A baseball in Jacksonville. JUMBO SHRIMP UNVEIL 2026 SCHEDULE Season begins March 27 at VyStar Ballpark against Rochester

The 2026 season for the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp can now be marked into the calendar for members of Crustacean Nation, as the club has released their 2026 schedule on Monday. The campaign will begin on Friday, March 27, at VyStar Ballpark against the Rochester Red Wings (Washington Nationals).

The 150-game regular season features 75 contests at VyStar Ballpark, including 39 home weekend games (Friday-Sunday). Similar to the last five seasons, each series will be six games in length with the exception of the season-opening series with Rochester from March 27-29 at VyStar Ballpark and July 17-19 when Jacksonville visits Rochester's Innovative Field. As in years past, Mondays will be a league-wide designated off-day.

The campaign will run through Sunday, September 20, when Jacksonville completes a six-game series at the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders (New York Yankees).

For the first time in club history, Jacksonville will compete against a Pacific Coast League team, the Sugar Land Space Cowboys (Houston Astros), who the Jumbo Shrimp host from March 31- April 5 at VyStar Ballpark. The 2026 slate also pits Jacksonville against the Syracuse Mets (New York Mets) and Worcester Red Sox (Boston Red Sox), with the Mets visiting VyStar Ballpark from August 11-16.

As in the 2021-25 seasons, the Jumbo Shrimp also have common International League adversaries like the Charlotte Knights (Chicago White Sox), Durham Bulls (Tampa Bay Rays), Gwinnett Stripers (Atlanta Braves), Memphis Redbirds (St. Louis Cardinals), Nashville Sounds (Milwaukee Brewers) and Norfolk Tides (Baltimore Orioles) on their slate.

Jacksonville will play 24 games against Gwinnett and Memphis. The Jumbo Shrimp also have 18 games against Norfolk, Charlotte and Durham, respectively and 17 games against Nashville. Additionally, there are nine dates with Rochester and six apiece against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, Syracuse and Worcester.

Season ticket packages, mini plans, group outings and game times for the 2026 season will be announced in the coming weeks, with a full promotional calendar to be released at a later date.



It was early in the 2025 season, and Morgan McSweeney was facing the uncertain future of his baseball career. Released by the Orioles the previous season and grinding through the independent leagues, he wasn't just chasing a spot on the roster, he was also chasing a lifelong dream.

McSweeney joined the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp on June 26, 2025, marking an important milestone in his journey back to affiliated ball. After being released from the Baltimore Orioles in July 2024, McSweeney spent a year as a free agent. During his time in the independent leagues, he said reality began to sink in for him.

"When you're playing independent ball and calls aren't coming in you begin to realize how much the game means to you," he said.

This motivated McSweeney to grow as a player and fine tune his skills as a pitcher to earn his spot back in affiliated ball, this time with a whole new perspective on the game. Nearly a year later, not only did he return to Triple-A, but he has also earned a spot as one of Jacksonville's most reliable starters.

Originally a reliever, McSweeney had to adjust on his approach to the mound to improve his performance and transition into a starter's role. One of the biggest adjustments, he says, to improve his pitching was learning to approach each outing with longterm endurance in mind.

"It's about navigating through the line up two or three times and being ready to throw 100 pitches a game, as opposed to every day," said McSweeney.

He has also worked on developing his patience on the mound, developing the willingness to switch up pitches and hold something back for later innings. One thing that has not changed for McSweeney: the adrenaline rush he gets when he strikes out a batter with a fast ball down the middle.

McSweeney, a native of Hudson, Massachusetts, attended Worcester Academy, where he quickly established himself as one of the top high school arms in the state. In 2016, he was named Rawlings-Perfect Game Honorable Mention All-American. He was also ranked as the No. 8 draft prospect from the state (college and high school) going into the 2016 MLB Draft. In his senior year, he went 5-0 over seven starts, posting a dominate 1.21 ERA with 76 strikeouts in just 40 innings.

McSweeney continued his career playing collegiate ball at Wake Forest University from 2017 to 2019. Entering his senior season, his coach Tom Walter told him, "Enjoy this now, because this is the last time this isn't going to be a job." This quote hit home for McSweeney, especially now as a professional, where roster turnover is constant.

"College is the last time you finish a season with the same guys you stepped on the field with at the beginning of the season" said McSweeney.

He was drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the 17th round, (498th overall) of the 2019 MLB Draft. He reached Triple-A Norfolk in 2022, but seemed stuck there as a middle reliever for three seasons.

Since arriving in Jacksonville, things have changed. McSweeney has shown discipline, growth and tenacity, quickly becoming a key component for the Bold City.

McSweeney's gameday routine is intentionally flexible. For one, he had never started a game in his professional career until this season. He likes to switch things up every day to avoid falling into superstitions. What never changes about his ritual is getting lots of sleep the night before, eating good food and taking other steps to ensure he is physically and mentally ready to perform. Despite his best efforts to avoid creating a superstition, he does admittedly wear the same button-down and pants on days he starts. He was quick to assure fans that he does in fact wash them between outings.

During the offseason, McSweeney takes time to return home and spend time with his family in Boston. Once winter sets in and the snow starts to fall, he returns to Florida, where he spends the offseason continuing his training, playing golf and reconnecting with friends. For McSweeney, the offseason is his chance to recharge mentally and physically before the grind of another season begins.

Growing up near Boston, McSweeney dreamed of one day pitching at Fenway Park. Today, one of his

bucket-list stadiums to pitch in is loanDepot park in Miami, because he has never played in an indoor stadium. As for his walkout song? McSweeney's would be, "Joker and the Thief" by Wolfmother, specifically for the quitar solo.

McSweeney's favorite game so far since joining the Jumbo Shrimp was also his first with the club. He described his debut as the most excited and nervous he had felt in a long time.

"I hadn't played affiliated ball for a year," he said.

The game took place on June 28 against the Nash-ville Sounds. McSweeney delivered an impressive performance, pitching 6.2 scoreless innings, striking out four batters, and leading Jacksonville to an 8-0 shutout victory against the Sounds.

From a year in independent ball to being a key component in the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp rotation, Morgan McSweeney career has been anything but conventional. His journey is a testament to his perseverance and the power of hard work. With a new mindset, sharpened skills, and a deeper appreciation for the game, McSweeney is in a new reality: he's not just back in affiliated ball, he's thriving in it.

Bragan Field at VyStar Ballpark, which opened in 2003, is one of the premier Minor League ballparks in North America.

The ballpark was the first completed project of the Better Jacksonville Plan. Featuring an old-fashioned design, brick facade and a grass seating berm, VyStar Ballpark reminds fans of the days of yesteryear and preserves all of the wonderful tradition baseball has to offer. The vivid sight lines capture the action up-close while providing fans with comfortable seating and easy access to concessions and restrooms.

VyStar Ballpark features 12 luxury skyboxes, four skydecks, and a one-of-a-kind Tiki Terrace at the left field corner. It also has an HD videoboard and LED fence display in left field and two ribbbon displays along the baselines of the suite level

In 2016, owner Ken Babby invested \$1.8 million into the ballpark to add a new groups area directly behind the home bullpen, a Tiki Terrace near the left-field foul pole, renovations to all 12 private suites and expansion of the suite-level, third-floor lounge to give all fans a climate-controlled space to overlook the playing field.

In conjunction with the City of Jacksonville and ASM Global, the Jumbo Shrimp announced in 2024 a \$31.8 million publicly-funded renovation plan to VyStar Ballpark as part of Project NEXT. The project added a new office structure and seating experience in right field, a new fan-friendly main gate in center field and a new premium space area behind Homeplate. Project NEXT is the first major renovation to the ballpark since its opening in 2003.

The ballpark features nearly 6,000 stadium-style chairs and had accommodated more than 11,000 fans. Ballpark is also completely wheelchair accessible, including the dugouts, camera wells and playing field.

The ballpark has hosted three Major League Baseball exhibitions (2006, 2010, 2015), four ACC Baseball Tournaments (2006-09) and two Southern League All-Star games (2003, 2013). The 2013 Southern League All-Star game boasted a league-record 9,373 fans in attendance.

Since 2007, VyStar Ballpark has hosted a game in the annual college baseball series between in-state rivals, Florida State and Florida. The annual installment brings capacity crowds to VyStar Ballpark for their storied rivalry.





HOW TO KEEP SCORE



BASEBALL BASICS: HOW TO KEEP SCORE

DIFFERENT FANS have different methods of keeping a scorecard, and many use their own notations. But here's a simple method:


If the hitter grounds out to shortstop, for example, write in "6-3," which shows the shortstop threw him out at first base. If the hitter flies out to left field, write a "7."

If the batter gets a hit, write in the hit according to which base he reached. Each corner of the box represents a base, with the lower-right corner being first.

If he singles, put a "-" in the lower right. If he doubles, write a =" in the upper right, and so on. For a walk, use "BB" in the lower right. As the runner advances, mark the appropriate symbol in the appropriate corner.

If a runner scores, put a circle at the bottom of the box, and inside the circle put the symbol of the play and/or the player that drove him in. For example, if the No. 5 hitter drives in two runs with a single, mark his single in the bottom right of his box and mark a circle with the number "5" in it in the boxes of the runners who score. (Some people like to use uniform numbers here, so you can tell who did what, even after lineup changes.)

At the end of each inning, total the hits and runs for that inning only. At the end of the game you'll be able to add the innings total to get the game score.



Baseball always elevates itself after the regular season wraps up and postseason baseball begins. This is the time where everything is put on the line to win, and the purest form of baseball is played. The pitching is better, there is less of a need to save pitchers' arms in the bullpen; hitters look to produce runs any way; fielders put their bodies on the line to make outs. Meanwhile, managers strategically maneuver so their team can live to play another day.

The fans, after enduring the triumphs and tribulations that come with playing 162 games fill the stands and spiritually root, root, root for the home team. The stakes are high. The magical nature of playoff baseball is undeniable and certainly will be present at VyStar Ballpark during the third week of September for the International League Championship Series.

Several of the 2025 Jumbo Shrimp have past playoff experience.

Right-handed pitcher Zach McCambley helped the Marlins' Double-A affiliate Pensacola Blue Wahoos win the Southern League title in 2022, lefthander Patrick Monteverde advanced to the Super Regionals with Texas Tech in 2021, and southpaw Robby Snelling led his high school football team to a state championship.

These guys are familiar with the enahanced factors that play out in the postseason.

The 2022 Blue Wahoos were talented; a number of guys from that team have since made their bigleague debut. But beyond the stacked roster, it was the camaraderie and cohesion in the clubhouse that allowed them to claim the Southern League title according to McCambley.

He senses a similar vibe this year in Jacksonville. This is a tight group who celebrates the success of others. McCambley understands that "baseball is an individual game," especially at the minor league level, where personal development and advancement is the goal.

"It's easy to come to the park and be happy for everyone," said McCambley. "And I think that attitude is contagious, and that's the reason we're playing so well."

McCambley realizes that his "success doesn't affect someone else's performance" so why not be happy for them? In his experience, being a supportive teammate coupled with "making it fun and having friendly competition" is what builds a champion.

"The closer the group, the better the team plays," McCambley remarked.

Monteverde's vision for playoff success aligns with McCambley's: "The culture in the clubhouse."

"What happens behind those closed doors is extremely important," Monteverde says, and behind those doors, Monteverde finds "35 brothers."

Outside the clubhouse, Monteverde has an even bigger family, who he "gives a lot of credit to" for their unwavering support throughout his baseball career. Being from Pittsburgh, he naturally roots for the Steelers and in the middle of his season at Texas Tech, his cousin brought a Terrible Towel to his start for good luck.

A week later in his next home start for Texas Tech, he took the mound in the first inning with 200 Terrible Towels in the stands. By season's end, they had almost the entire stadium waving Terrible Towels for him and his Red Raider teammates.

Monteverde's Red Raiders advanced to the Super Regionals. He was amazed by the vastness of their support and how it propelled Texas Tech into a deep run.

"It was probably some of the most adrenaline I had at that time," said Monteverde.

"It's pretty much the whole west side of Texas as a fan base, and we have some really loyal fans. We were disappointed we let them down, but it was still cool."

Similar to Monteverde, when Snelling led his high school football team to a state championship his senior year, he deemed that to be "one of the biggest moments of his life" with a caveat that if Jacksonville wins the title this year "that would take over."

Snelling acknowledges that "playoffs, no matter where you're at, is a special time and not everybody gets to do them." He knows to take nothing for granted. `Snelling also recognizes and anticipates an "extra amount of pressure," which he finds "healthy." He wants to remain "composed and not try and get too big or too caught up in the moment."

His ability to be "mentally tough," whether he's on the rubber or taking a snap from center, is what has helped him achieve success, especially in base-ball—"the ultimate failure sport."

"There's definitely a lot more anticipation that comes with playoff games and excitement," Snelling adds. He's found that staying even keeled in high-strung situations is just of the "fun, little, underlying ways" these sports overlap.

The magic of the postseason is created by the camaraderie, adrenaline, and anticipation of those playing and watching the game. There's a special feeling in the air for all who enter the ballpark. Those who get to experience the unique playoff atmosphere whether as a player, coach, front office staff, or fan are lucky and deserving, because they have endured what it takes to get there. As the Jumbo Shrimp chase the towns first International League title since 1968, it's always important to remember that postseason baseball is different, in the best possible way.




